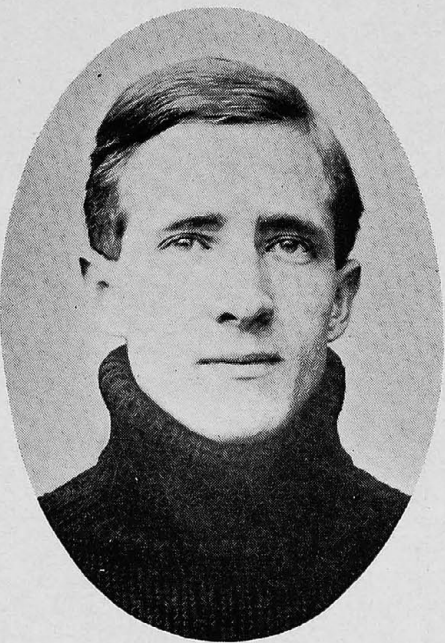
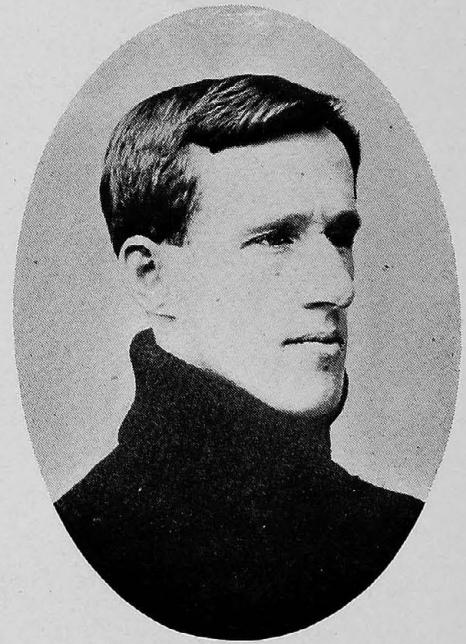


FRED SHOOP.
