Books are Keys for the Mind

In 1924, John Dempsey, President of the Hughes' Alumni Association, appointed a committee to devise a suitable memorial for Clara B. Jordan, a former Hughes Latin teacher. Charles M. Merry, principal at the time, received the committee's report, which designated the decorating of a library with a beautiful central window. This main window, which is the focal point of the library, was created at a cost of \$7,000. In 1930, the other windows were added at a cost of \$2,500. Other teachers memorialized in the windows in the library are Mary B. Furness, Alan Sanders, George Baumann, and Arthur E. Breece.
