

Pass interceptions set up two of the three touchdowns Hughes made in powering to a 19-0 victory over the Tigers of Ironton, Ohio.

Crumrine scored after two interceptions, one by Stuber and one by Russell, to give Hughes a 13-0 lead at halftime. Huber made the final T. D. on a 50-yard off-tackle slant.

Charles Tharp, 220-pound lineman, intercepted a pass and galloped 80 yards before he was brought down just short of paydirt.

Scoring only in the first and second periods, and then clinging tightly to their advantage, the Big Reds downed Dayton Fairview, 12-0.

Spectacular runs of 49 yards and 81 yards by Ray Bell and Harry Huber respectively started what seemed to be a slaughter, but the Dayton defense buckled down and held the Huzites scoreless during the second half.

On the first play from scrimmage in the second half, Chuck Crumrine, Co-Captain, took the ball and raced unmolested to score the third and final Hughes touchdown. Two previous T.D.'s scored by Harry Huber, Co-Captain, in the first half gave Hughes the crutch it needed to win the game.

This victory was very dear to Hughes, because it was only the second time in local history that a Big Red squad sent a Bacon team down to defeat. The first time came last year when Stockhoff and company edged them, 20-18.

A touchdown pass in the final stanza sent an uninspired Hughes team its first defeat of the season. The loss came at the hands of St. Xavier, giant killers, by a 7-0 count.

The ironic thing about that TD was that it was the first scored against the Hughes defensive unit in $2\frac{3}{4}$ games. A seesaw battle, in which Hughes had opportunity after opportunity to score, provided the interest during the first three quarters.

The big TD came with about seven minutes left; and as the final gun sounded, Hughes was only yards from the tying touchdown.
