Fred Macklin drew the first Big Red score on a four yard run following Bob Houser's recovery of a Dunbar fumble. Bill Bentley, Dayton back, broke loose with a 70-yard jaunt to tie the score. Again Macklin and Bentley scored on dashes of 17 and 11 yards, respectively. During the third quarter, Bentley swept the end for 78 yards and the winning touchdown.

The Roger Bacon contest was a thriller as the Spartans edged the Big Reds 7-6.
