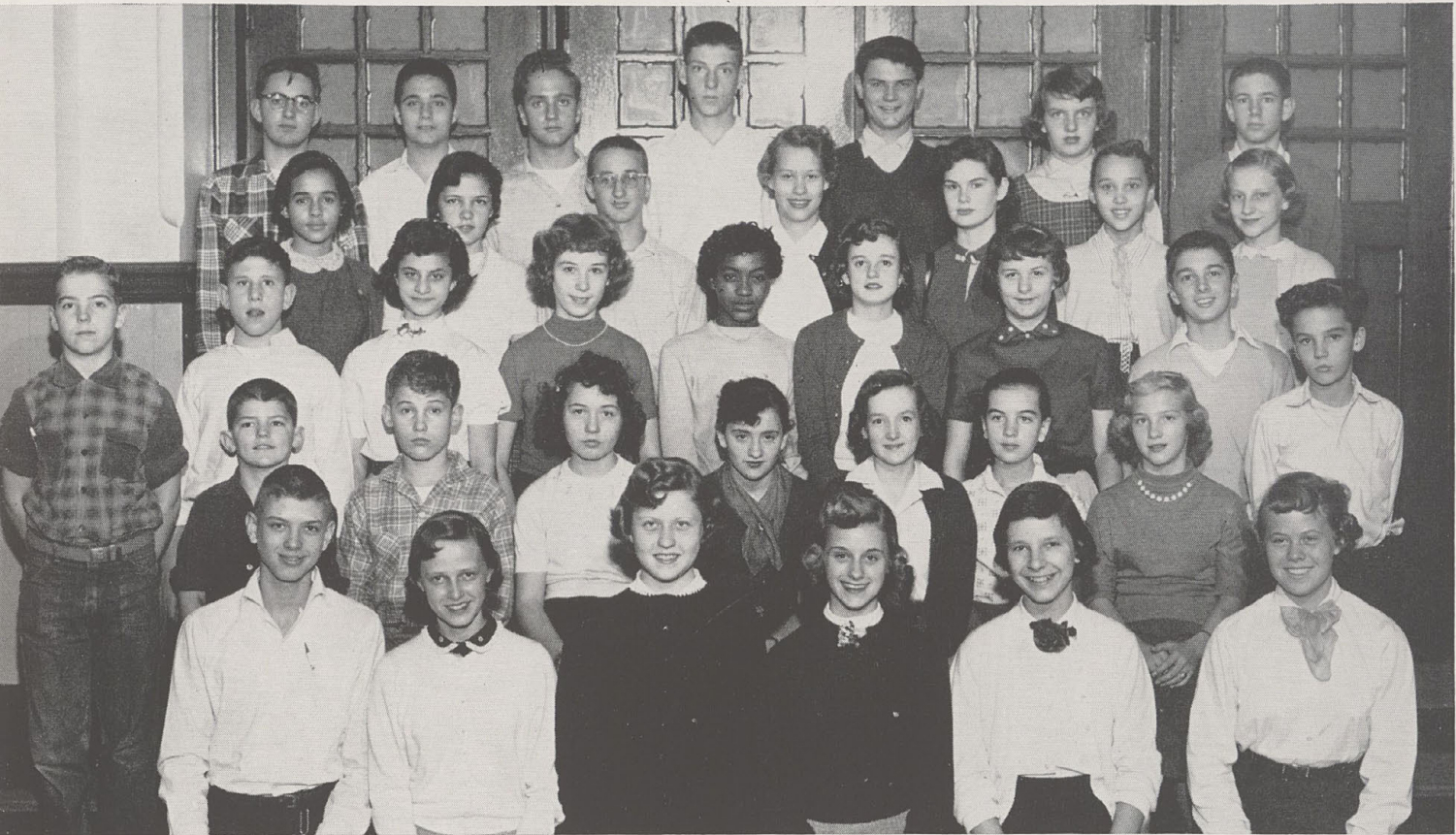


# Junior High voices views in school rule
