Honor League, one of the oldest service organizations in the school, is composed of senior girls who have proved themselves good Hughes citizens, and have maintained a C average or above for two and a half years. The fifteen girls elected to the Honor League Board meet with the two sponsors, Mrs. Enolia Heile and Miss Aria Parke Schawe, on the second Tuesday of each month to carry on the work of the organization.

In June of each year the outgoing board and the fifteen Junior girls elected to the new board hold a joint picnic to formulate plans, especially for the Big and Little Sister Party, an event of early September. Each senior girl is given one or two seventh grade girls as "little sisters," and her duty is to befriend these newcomers and to help them to become properly oriented. At the party, the senior girls provide favors and an entertaining talent show.

The Freshie Aids and Information Desk helpers are selected by the Honor League. At Thanksgiving, baskets of foods are donated to needy families. This year, proceeds of the well-attended Fashion Show, which was a display of Easter wardrobes put on by Shillito's, aided the Honor League Scholarship Fund.

The Honor League Christmas Tea, held in the library, is always a much-welcomed social event where teachers, Honor League post graduates, Honor League girls, and their mothers mingle. This year all the decorations, even the Christmas tree, were in gold, turquoise, and white. The Hughes String Quartet furnished the musical background.
