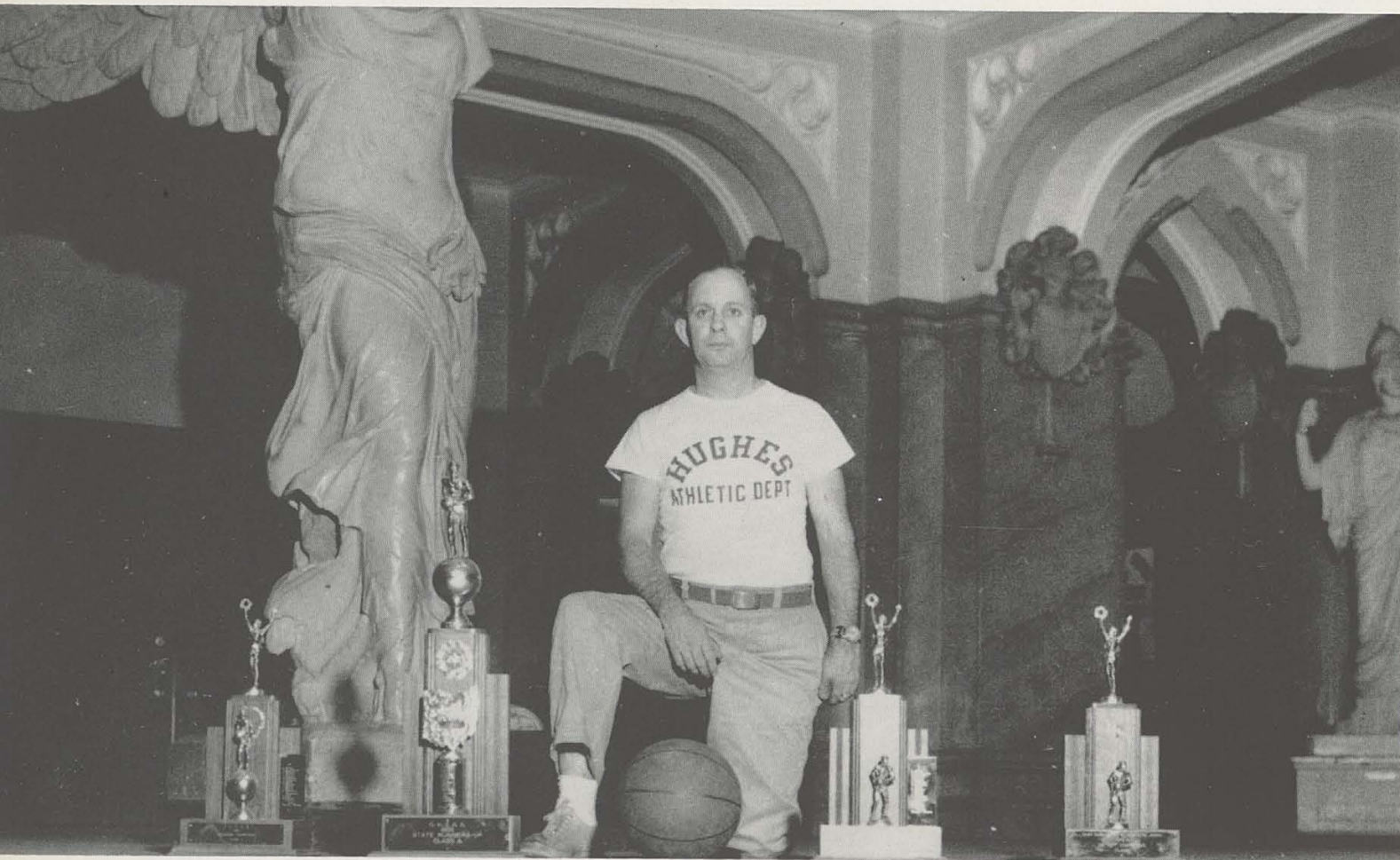


# Coach Howard "Burley" Grimes



Mr. Howard Grimes came to Hughes High in 1948, and assumed the responsibilities of coaching basketball. Since that time, he has coached many successful teams, and has had many talented ball players on his squads. Also he experienced coaching his son, Jim, who proved to be an excellent player and an asset to his team.

"Burley" feels that the poor, inadequate facilities do not make the outlook for basketball very bright. He stated that the majority of boys do not play basketball until they reach high school, and that Hughes does not have the space to train them. For example, the freshman team is allotted only two to three hours per week for practice.

Mr. Grimes has an extensive career in basketball coaching. A few of his achievements include: Winches-

ter, Ohio, where he coached three years, winning county runner-up titles for two years, and third in the district title the remaining year; Ripley, Ohio, where he coached the county runner-up team his first year, and county champs the two succeeding years; Bremen, Ohio, where he coached one county champ team and a runner-up squad in the state contest with a 25-1 record; Wyoming, Ohio, where his teams won two district championships; Hughes High School, where he has had two P.H.S.L., two district, one regional championship teams, and a state finalist squad in 1955.
