## Edna Eversull LeRoy

Born and reared in Cincinnati, Mrs. Edna Eversull LeRoy was graduated from Woodward High School. She earned her liberal arts and teaching degrees at the University of Cincinnati, from which she was graduated in 1922. Standing scholastically among the highest in her class, she was honored with election to membership in Phi Beta Kappa.

Mrs. LeRoy joined the Hughes faculty in 1924, teaching Spanish combined with classes in commerce and

industry. Succeeding Mrs. Elma R. Roberts, she was appointed Dean of Girls in 1947, and held that position until her illness in the spring of 1954. Mrs. LeRoy fought for her life, and had at one time come so far along the road to recovery, that she considered a return to the Hughes faculty.

Then, one day in August of 1955, God's need of her superseded ours, and she passed from this life into one of everlasting peace.
