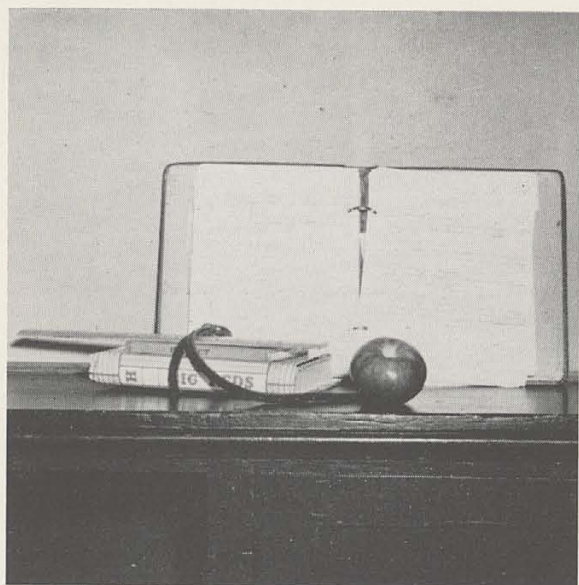

The English Department, including Speech, Journalism, and Dramatics, is the largest department at Hughes. Students are offered the study of their own language in many courses from the seventh through the twelfth grade. Remedial classes, special classes and commercial classes are included to accommodate individual differences and desires of all students. Until the twelfth grade English is a required subject, seniors may elect English IV or follow their interests in Public Speaking, Journalism or Dramatics. The Classics are an essential part of the general English courses, and during his six years at Hughes a student meets and enjoys the company of Shakespeare, Tennyson, Browning, Bacon and the other greats of the English language. Each student, at

some time during his stay at Hughes, tries his hand at composition, and is given an opportunity to write for "The Gargoyle." Speech and Dramatic students participate in assembly programs throughout each school year. Through his contact with the finest in reading and through his own experience in writing and speaking the Hughes student develops an understanding and appreciation of his own language. During all six years grammar is highlighted because in college and career the correctness of the written and spoken word often spells the difference between success and failure. For the student who will take advantage of his opportunities, the Hughes English Department is as complete as any in the state.

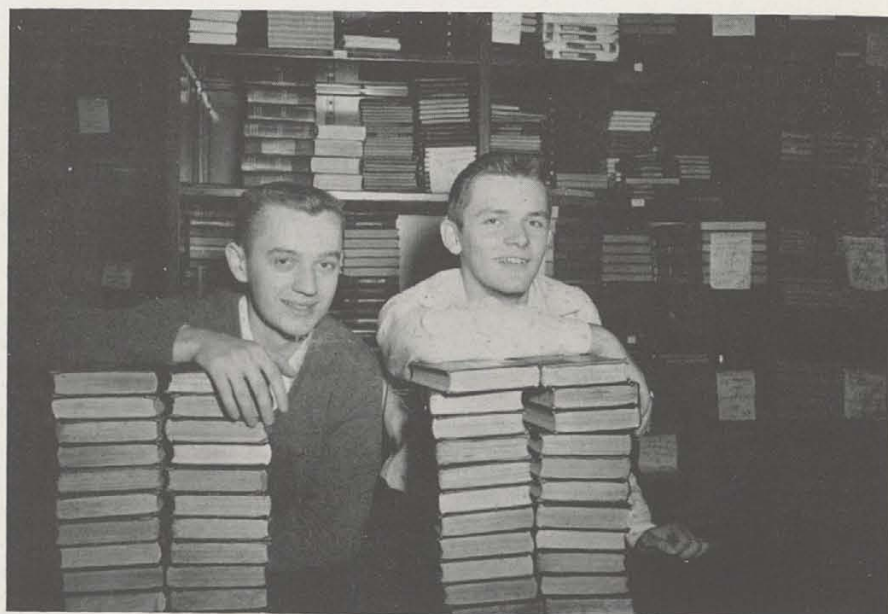

The Library

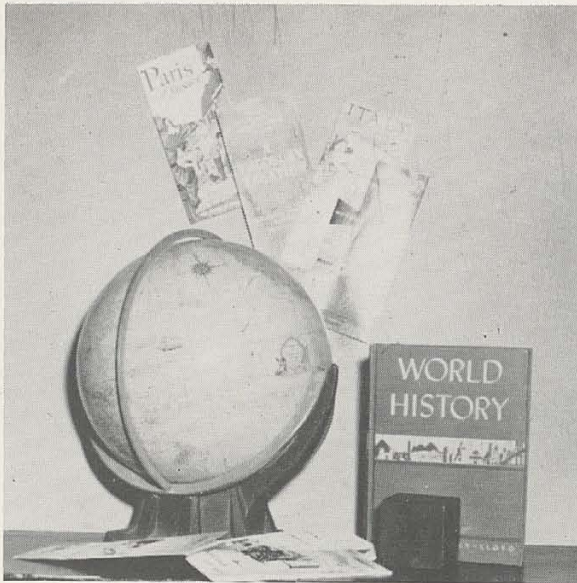

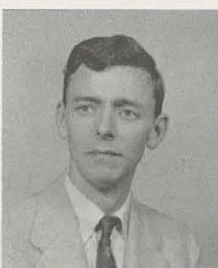


Students of Miss Busch's Latin class examine a bust of Caesar.

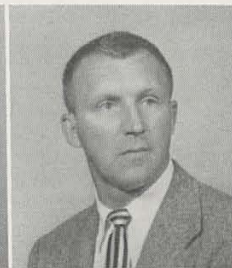

Home Economics

A special course in Homemaking, which is offered to senior girls who have had no previous training, teaches the basic fundamentals of becoming a good housewife. In completely equipped classrooms, with modern appliances and utensils, all girls in Home Economics learn to cook and sew, receive instruction in family relationships and consumer education, and prepare themselves for one of the most important jobs in the world, the making of a happy home.

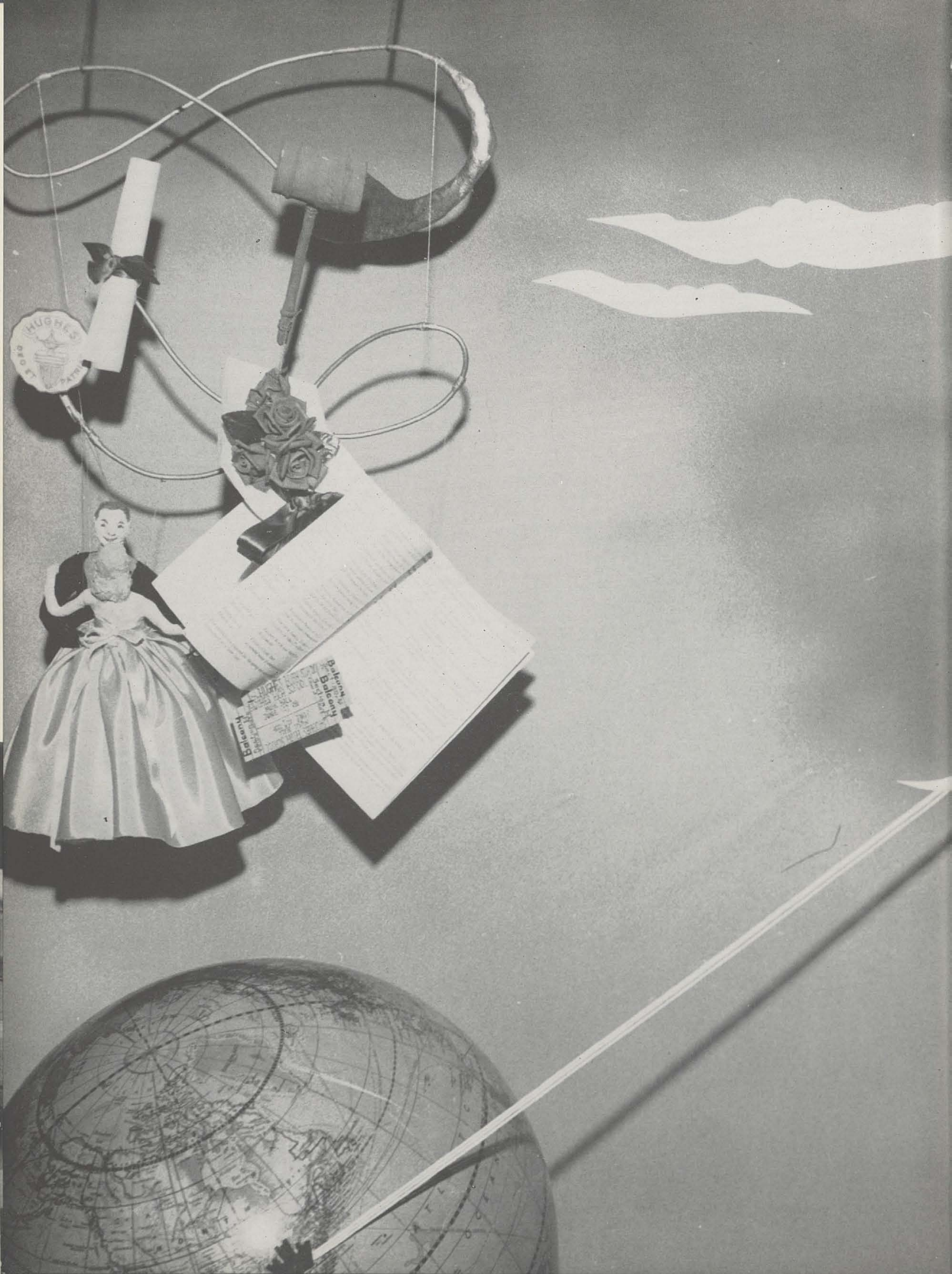

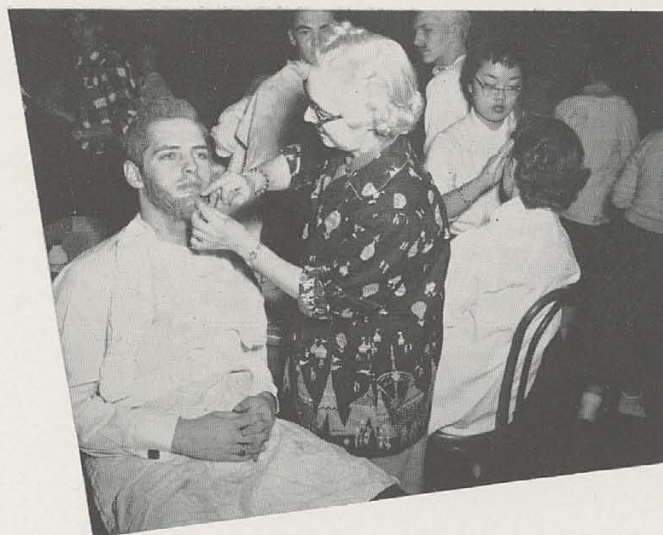
Under the expert direction of Miss Mary Pollard, the Hughes Dramatics Department staged the Broadway hit comedy, "The Man Who Came to Dinner."

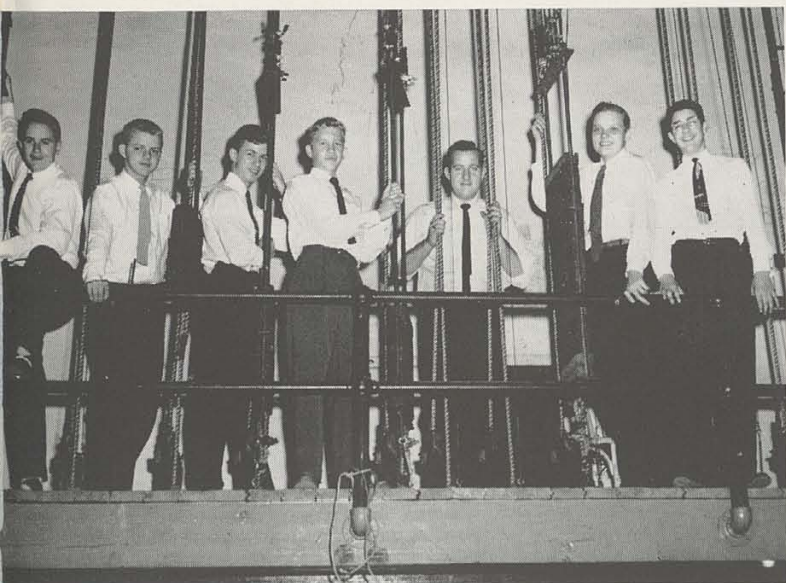

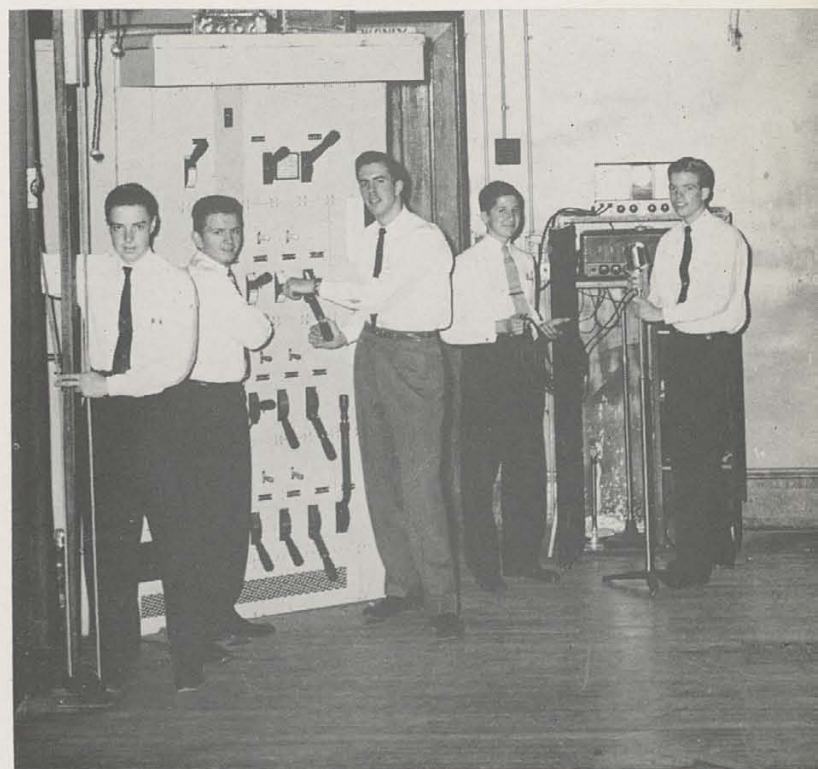

During Coach Thomas' six years at Hughes, he has coached two P.H.S.L. championship teams. Mr. Thomas spent six years at other schools before coming here. He feels that the Hughes football team's chances of being successful are very dim, unless more boys come out and try to make the teams.

Next to Mr. Thomas stands Coach Lloyd Williams, who has spent three years coaching the "Big Reds." He attended Miami University where he was captain of the Miami "Redskins" in 1953. Also included in his football career were such honors as "All-Ohio" guard and being voted the most valuable defensive lineman of 1952.

Coach Will Hundemer has been at Hughes for two years, and has been a varsity coach since his arrival. Previously, he coached at Northeast High School, in St. Petersburg, Florida. Mr. Hundemer attended Bellevue High School in Kentucky, where he achieved all-state honors in football, basketball, and baseball. While attending the University of Cincinnati, Mr. Hundemer played quarterback for the 1950 Sun Bowl team, and in 1951, played guard for the National Invitational basketball team.

Beside Coach Hundemer, stands Hughes varsity backfield coach, Mr. Ray Hartker, who has been at Hughes for the past six years. He attended Ohio State University, where he played seven years of professional baseball. It is Coach Hartker's belief that Hughes is only two years away from another great winning season in football.

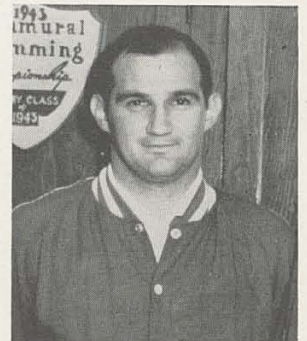

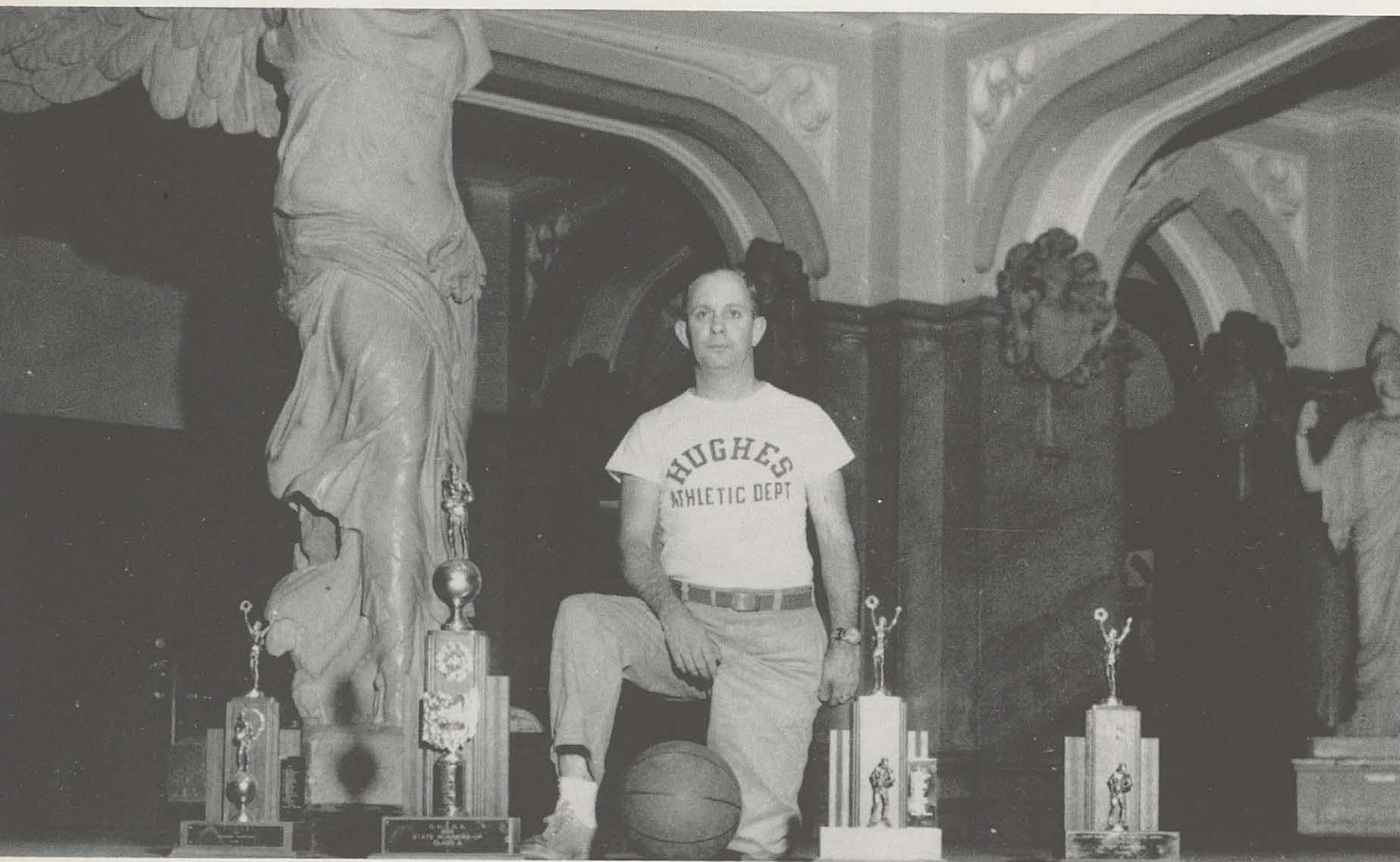

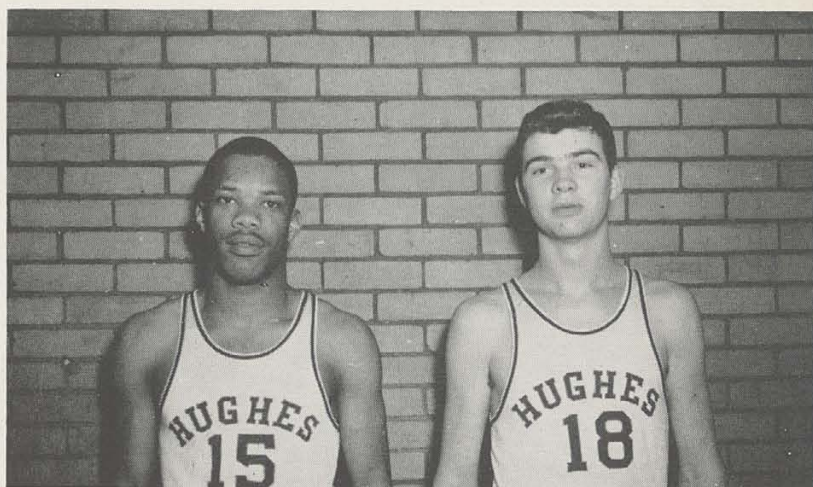
Mr. Grimes has an extensive career in basketball coaching. A few of his achievements include: Winches-

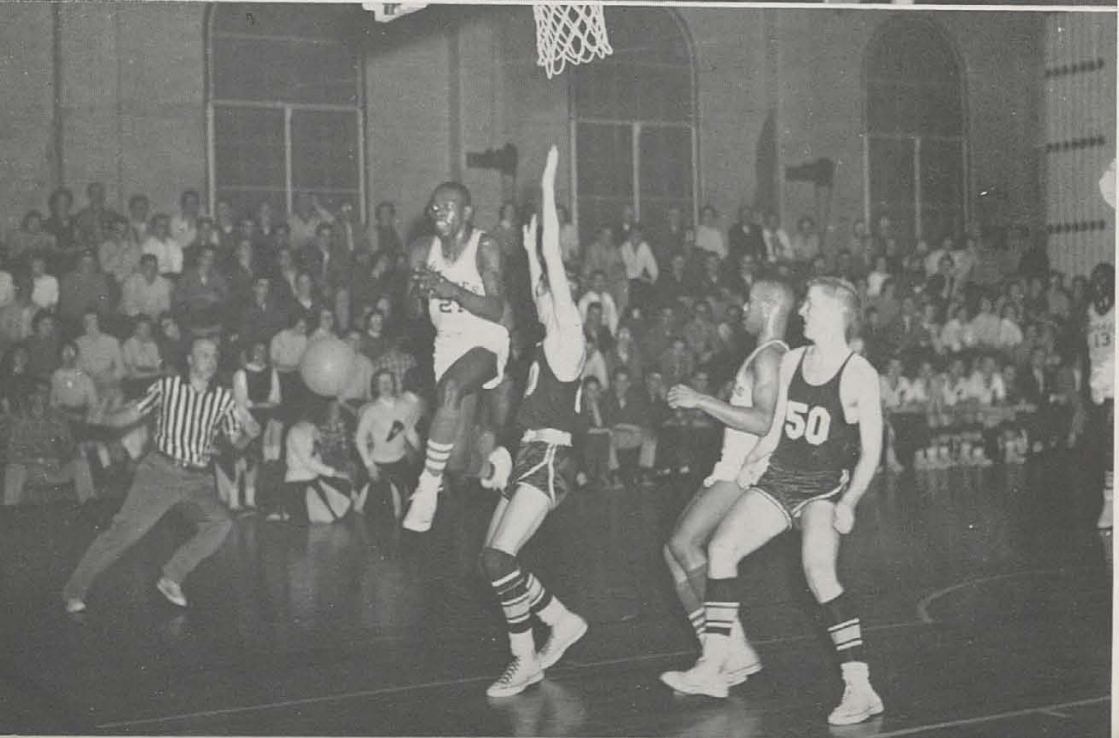

In tournament games, Hughes defeated Mariemont 74-55, but was edged out of the competition by Cincinnati Central, 67-68.

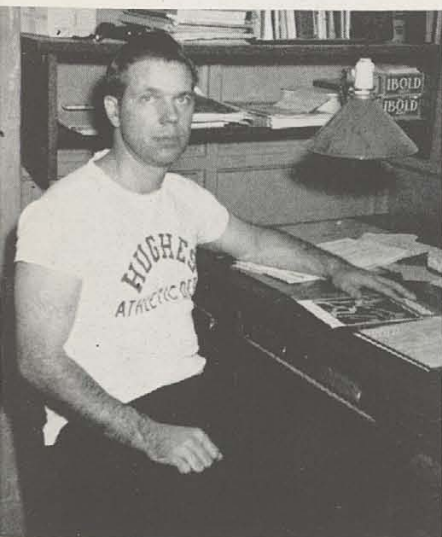
The Hughes High reserve squad, under the supervision of Mr. Lloyd Williams, finished third in the Public

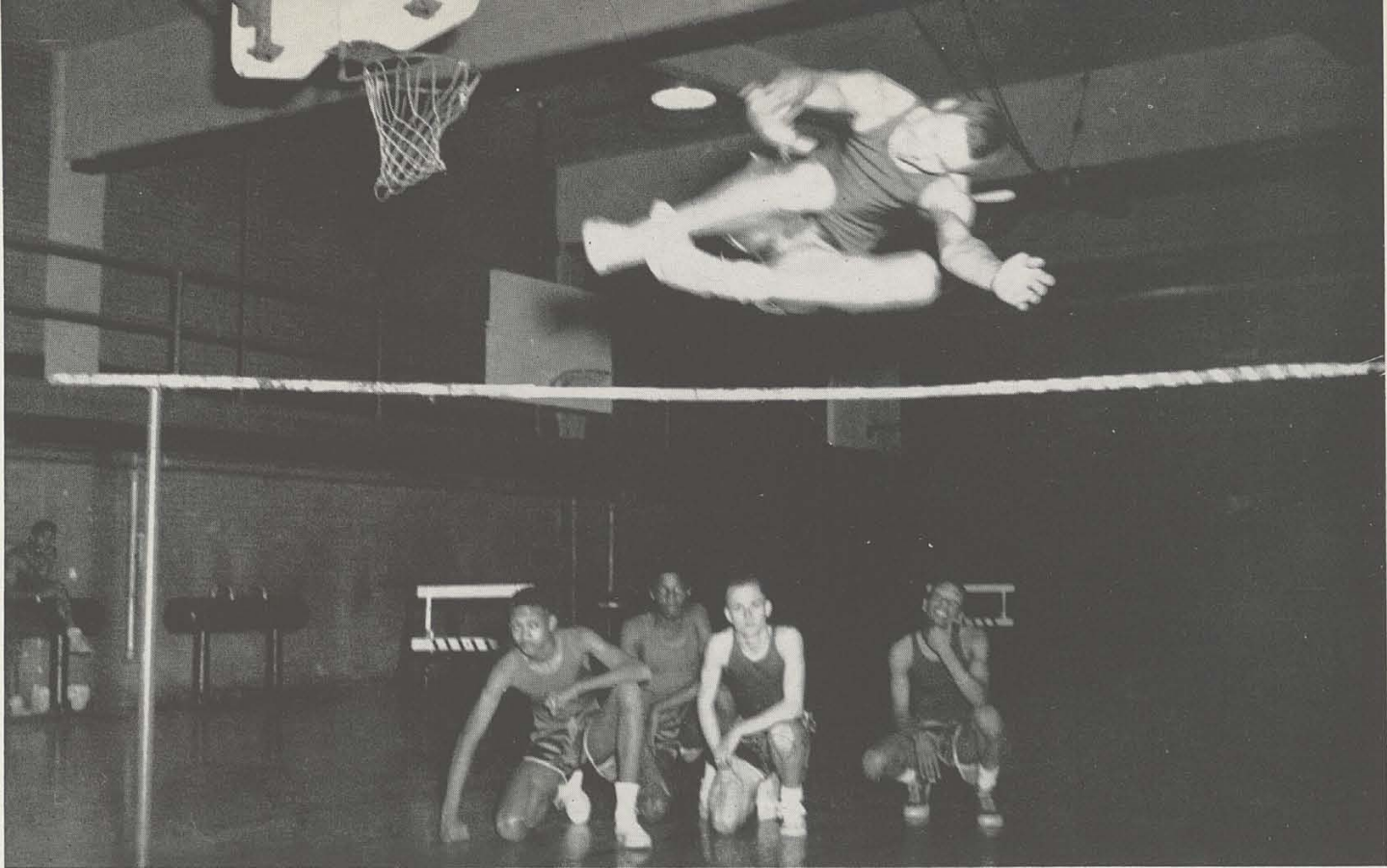

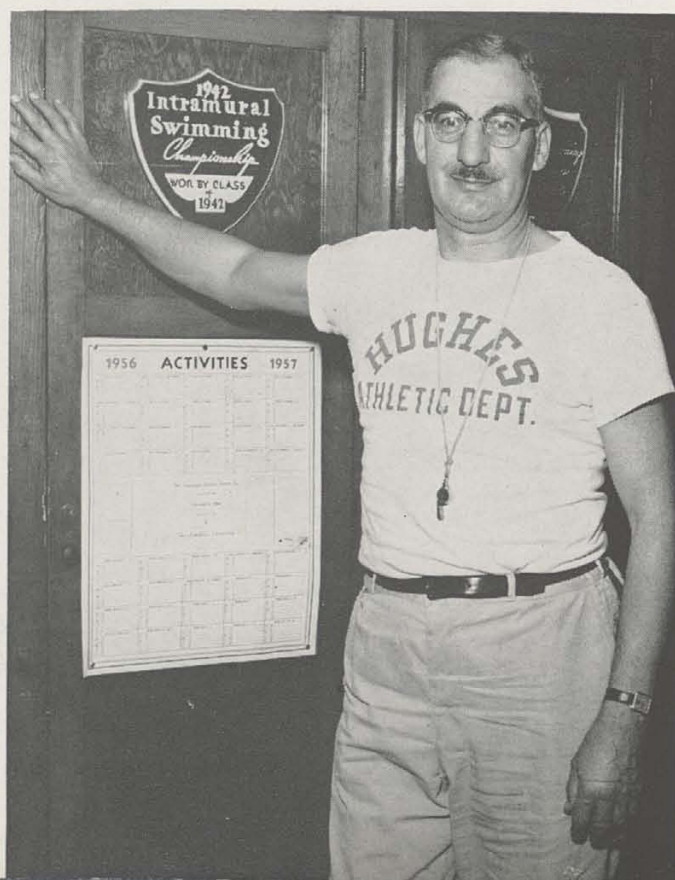

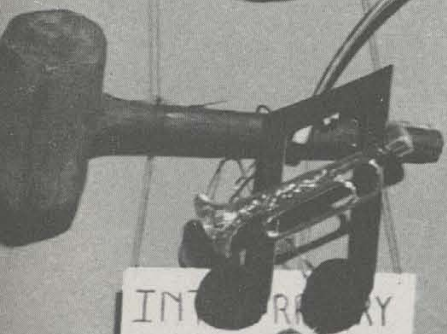

H- Club

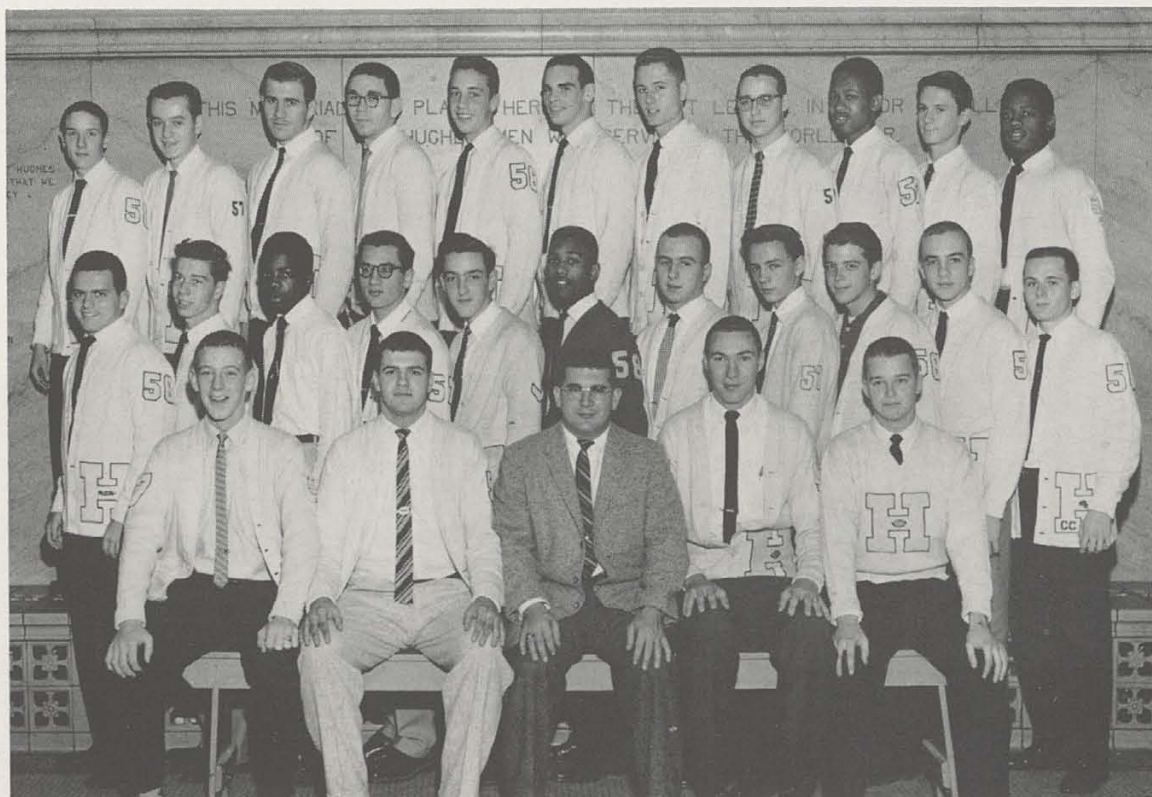
