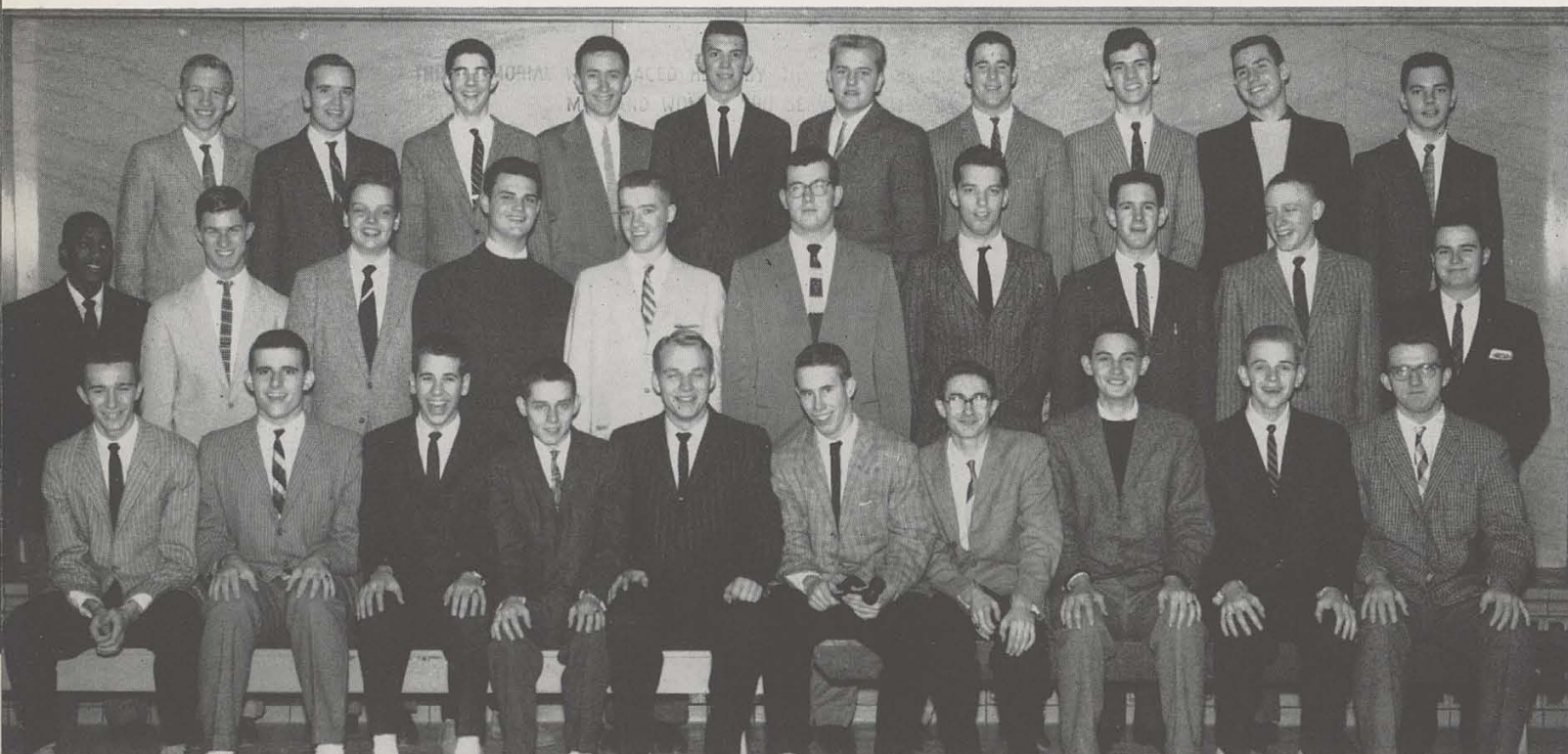
The event which all the boys look forward to most is the trip to Butler State Park near Carrollton, Kentucky, over Memorial Day week-end.
