Triginta Optimi, which means "Thirty of the Best," was founded at Old Hughes in April of 1895. Triginta Optimi differs from other social organizations at Hughes in that it is not a Greek letter society but is rather of a Latin derivation.

The purpose of Triginta Optimi is to create and maintain a democratic high school fraternity through scholarship, good citizenship, and athletic achievement.

The red and gold colors symbolize the crimson of the ever-brightening dawn and the gold of the rising sun.
