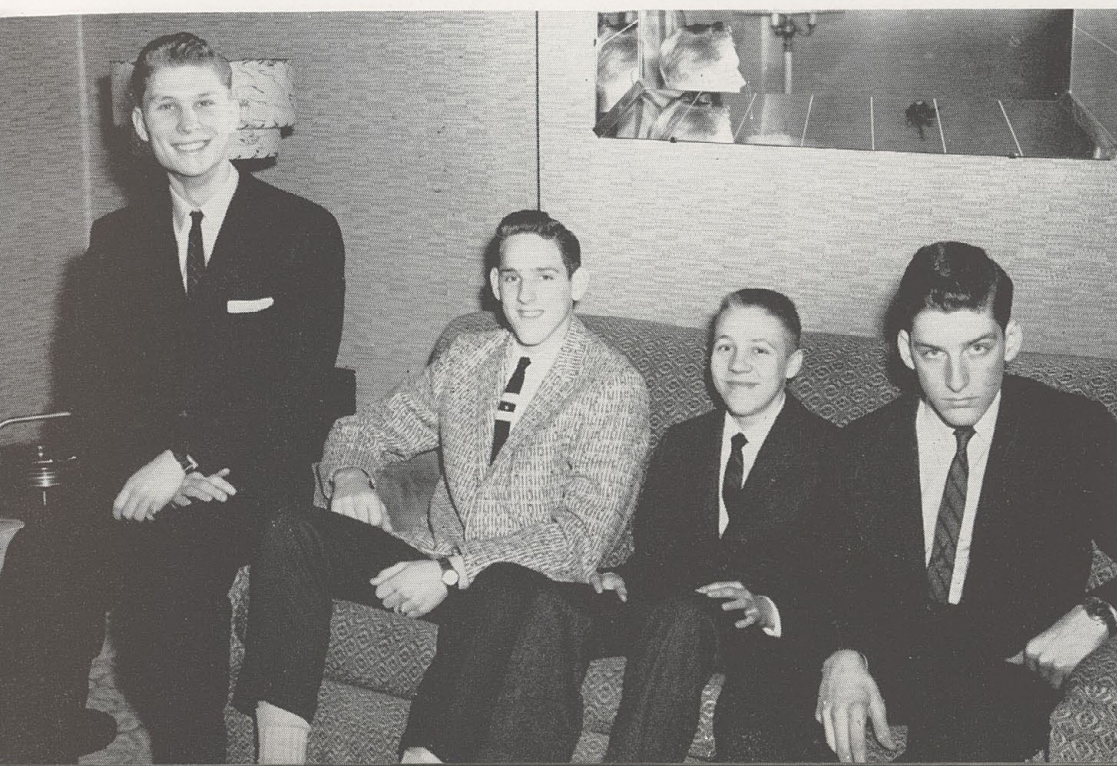
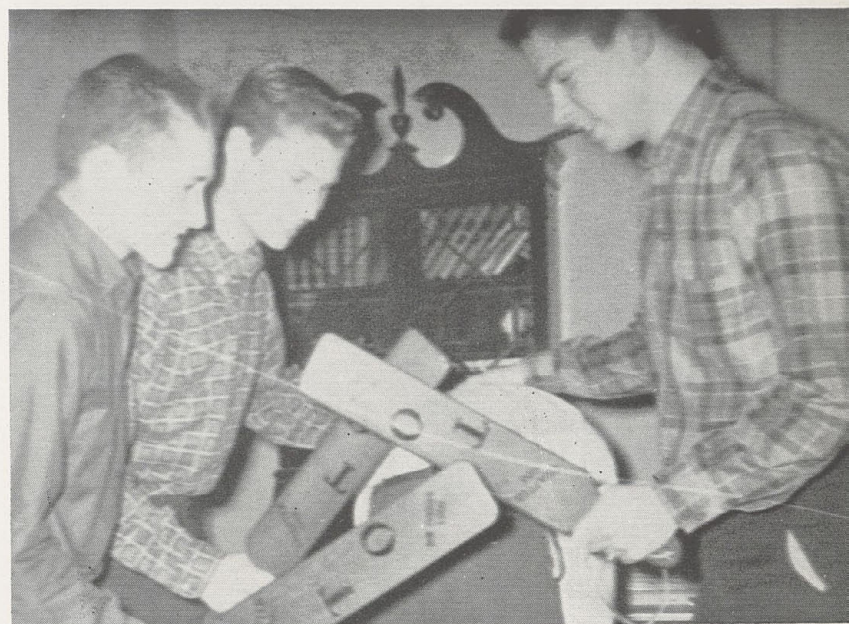
Triginta Optimi
