The pin, which the girls proudly wear, has three white pearls mounted on a black background. The three pearls stand for love, honor, and loyalty to God and one another. Phi Chi strives to promote lifelong friendship among its members.

The social activities include a week at Chautauqua, a Christmas formal, "Mr. and Miss Popularity" dance, a mother and daughter tea, various date parties and slumber parties.

The Phi Chi girls try to bring joy into other persons' lives by collecting for the Crippled Children's Easter Drive. In 1957, Phi Chi adopted 16 six to eight-year-old boys at the General Protestant Orphanage. They often give picnics and parties for these boys.
