After an exciting season's start, Hughes' Big Reds lost two of the last four games. They fought well enough, however, to share a second-place tie with Taft. But the biggest thing the Beg Reds boast about is the 8-7 victory over Woodward's champion Bulldogs. Coach Howard Thomas' boys did a yeoman job but couldn't hold their own in the tight race for first place. The team was tremendously bolstered by returning lettermen Charlie Neal, Bobby Williams, Tom Strunk, Larry Hughes and Larry Parks, plus the championship Reserve team of 1958. Charlie Neal brought honor to himself and Hughes by being selected as a guard on both the Enquirer and Post-Times-Star's All-City teams.
