## Hundemer's Reserves Pass and Punt to Co-Championship

The Big Red Reserves, under Coach Will Hundemer, copied a co-championship as they ended the season with a 5-1 record. Marvin Saylor guided the team as quarterback with Don Hardy and Larry Parks at the halfback spots and Wayne Swanson at fullback. Also on offense were William Heard, Clyde Wilkerson, and Willie Smith, guards; Tom Felder and Ralph Revels, tackles; John Adkins and Mike Marshall, ends; and Leroy Rutledge, center. In the defensive unit, the play of Larry Parks, Wayne Swanson, Keith Taylor, and Mike Marshall stood out. John Adkins usually did the kicking.

In the first game, Hughes trounced Walnut Hills 36-6. The second game found Hughes on top of Western Hills 6-0, with Keith Taylor scoring the only touchdown. In the third game, Hughes was beaten by Withrow 8-6 when the Big Reds could not convert the two extra points. The Big Reds scalped Woodward 36-0 in the fourth game as Swanson, Taylor, and Saylor all scored. Hughes defeated Taft in the fifth game 14-6, with Taylor and Saylor scoring. To end the season, Hughes came up with an 8-0 victory over Central.

The Hughes defense proved potent as it held opponents to a total of 22 points or an average of 3.7 points a game, while Hughes itself scored 106 points or an average of almost 18 points a game. Several passes were intercepted by the Reserve secondary, one of which was run back 80 yards by Larry Parks for a touchdown.

With a championship Reserve team and many returning lettermen, Coach Howard Thomas hopes for a winning varsity season in 1960.
