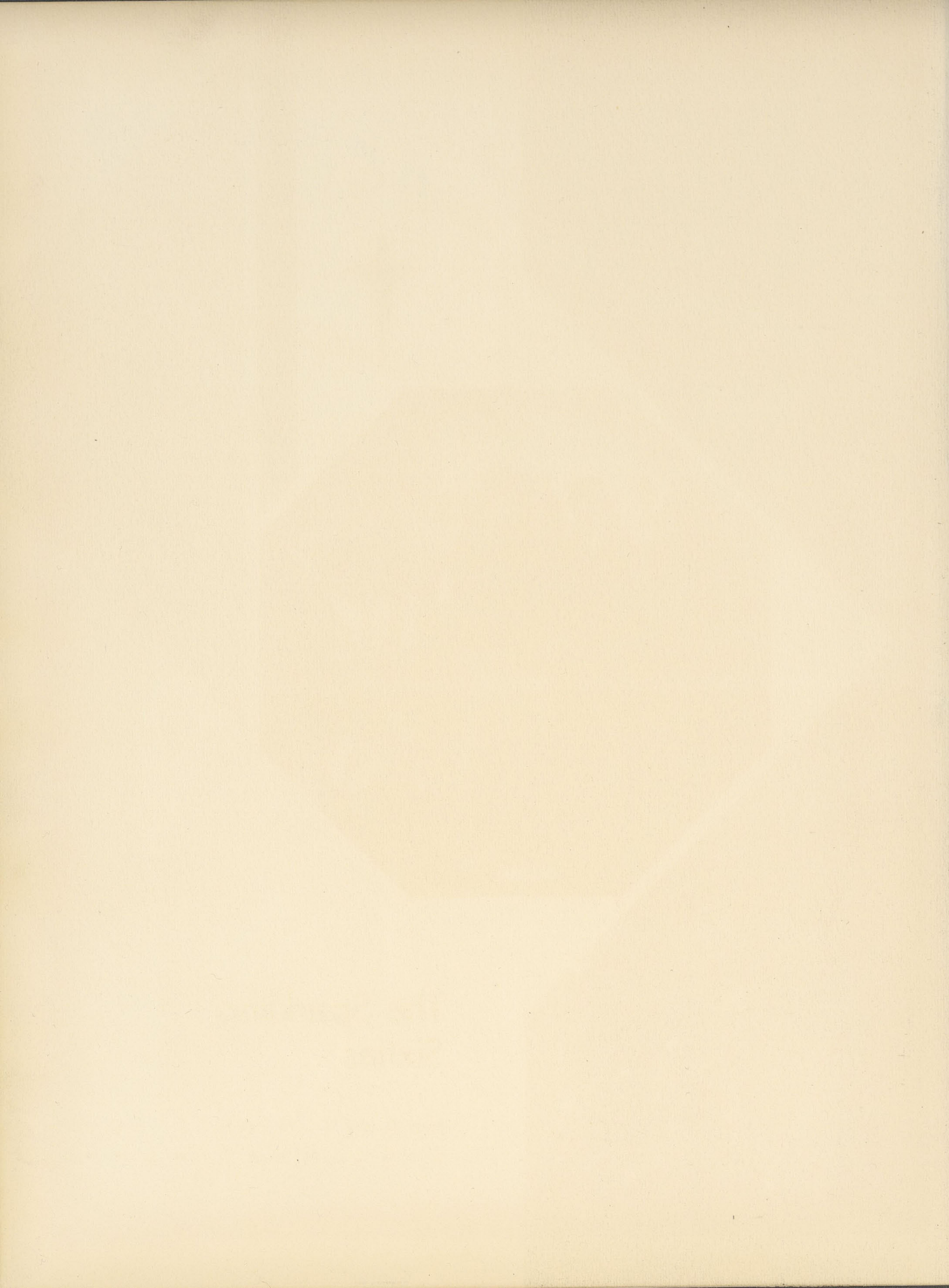

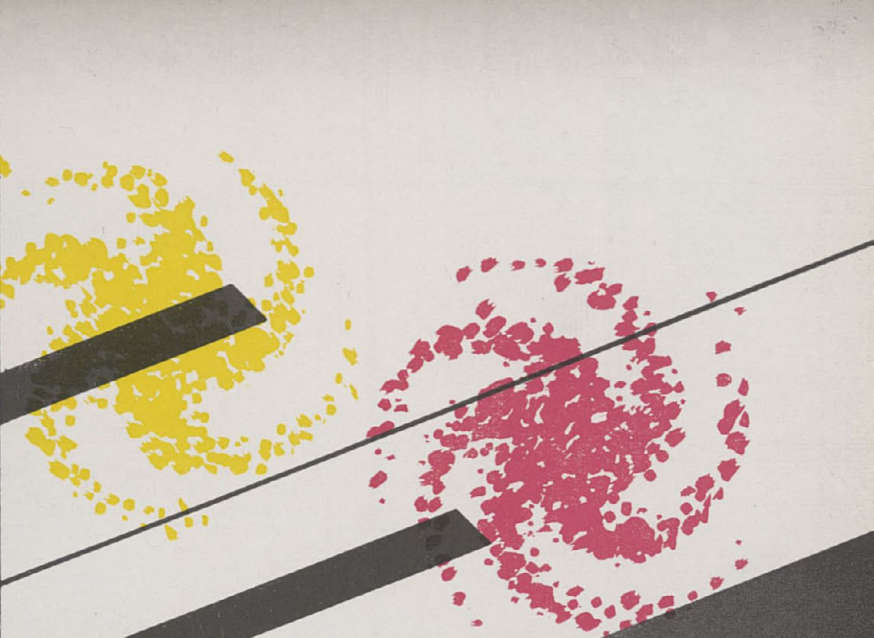


# We Step Into the Sparkling Sixties

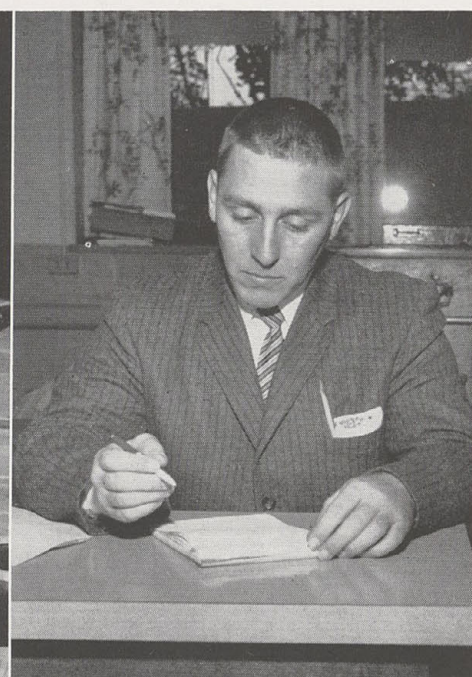

Miss Fisher and Mr. Rammelsberg pave the way for girls and boys to enjoy a successful journey through junior high.

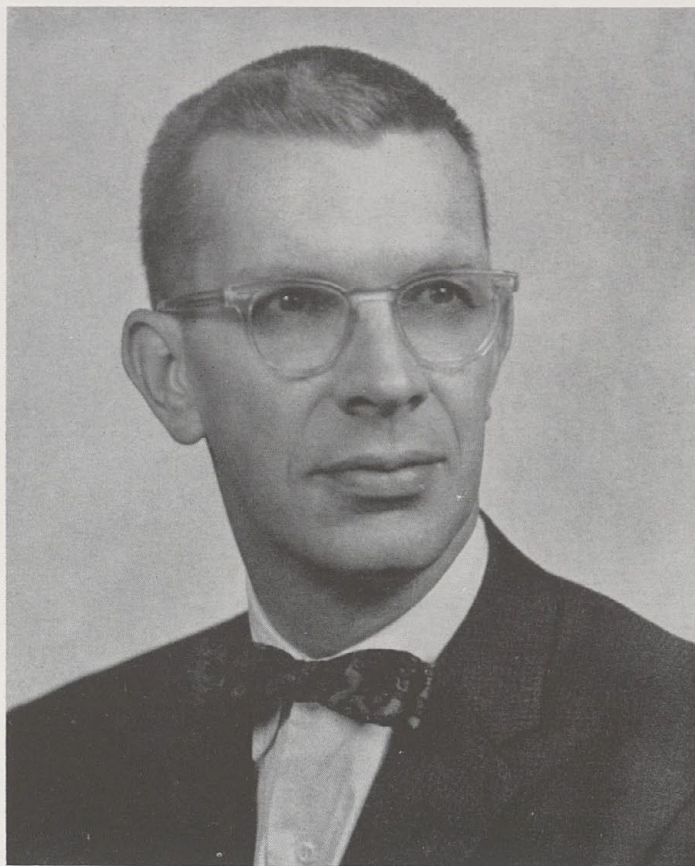


## Mr. Edwin Stephens

Graduated from Westminster College and the University of Cincinnati, Mr. Stephens is well-qualified to cope with problems of a growing population at Hughes.



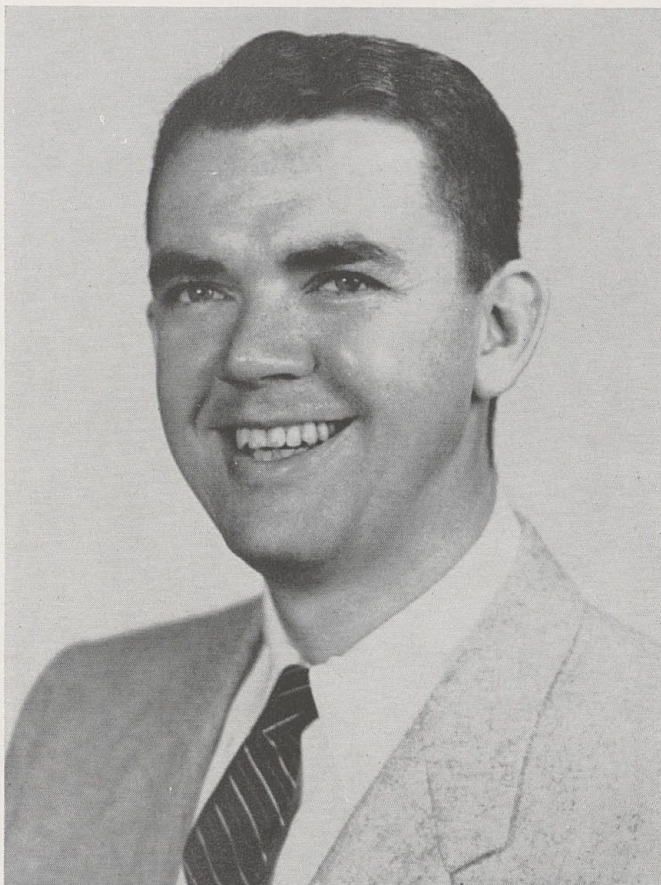

## Books Link Modern Reader to Life, Past and Future

Again this year Miss Matilda Pennington, librarian, and Mrs. Helen Mason, assistant librarian, have tried to build interest around the students' needs. They add enjoyable and helpful books to the library and give individual help with reference problems.

But what a job it would be to run the library efficiently from 8:00 o'clock in the morning till 4:00 o'clock in the afternoon without the help of the student library pages! The nine pages are paid for their time before and after school, but they give their time during the six study periods. Their jobs not only entail putting away, checking out, and finding books, but also writing overdue notices and keeping back issues of the magazines in order.

A "browsing table", displaying interesting and valuable books on special themes, has been made available. Another advantage for Hughes students to enjoy is room 214, the annex to the library, which is used during classes for more information on classroom work. In advance, the librarians place in this room many books dealing with the topic being studied. The teacher may then supervise the work done on the assigned research project. Also, for students studying a foreign language as well as English, records have been made available.

Some of the annual displays arranged by the librarians are for Book Week, Careers Conference, National Poetry Day, and special holiday celebrations.



In a nuclear age, when nations are becoming more and more interdependent, it is necessary for Americans to become proficient in the use of foreign languages. Hughes is doing its part in developing linguists through its excellent Foreign Language Department, composed of Miss Gladys Busch, Mrs. Mary Howell, Mrs. Gwendolyn McCullough, Mrs. Jannet Murphy, and Mr. John Purcell. Instruction in French and Spanish may begin in the seventh or eighth grade for those students following a college preparatory course.

Latin students, under the leadership of Miss Busch, become imbued with knowledge of an ancient culture and acquainted with the basis of many of our English words. Under the guidance of Mrs. Mary Howell, students learn French cultures as well as the French language. In Mrs. Murphy's German classes, students gain an understanding of the development of the Germanic nation and learn to speak the language which was the native tongue of many Cincinnatians' forbears. Mr. John Purcell and Mrs. Gwendolyn McCullough acquaint their students with the cultures of many Spanish-speaking countries, in addition to teaching the language itself.

Recordings play an important part in many of the language classes. Through the use of them, students hear the language spoken by natives of the foreign countries and thereby learn the correct pronunciations. Mr. Purcell's classes, in addition, had the unique experience of tape-recording their own voices in Spanish and then hearing the recordings for the purpose of correcting errors.

Hughes High School can be proud of its contribution in language instruction.

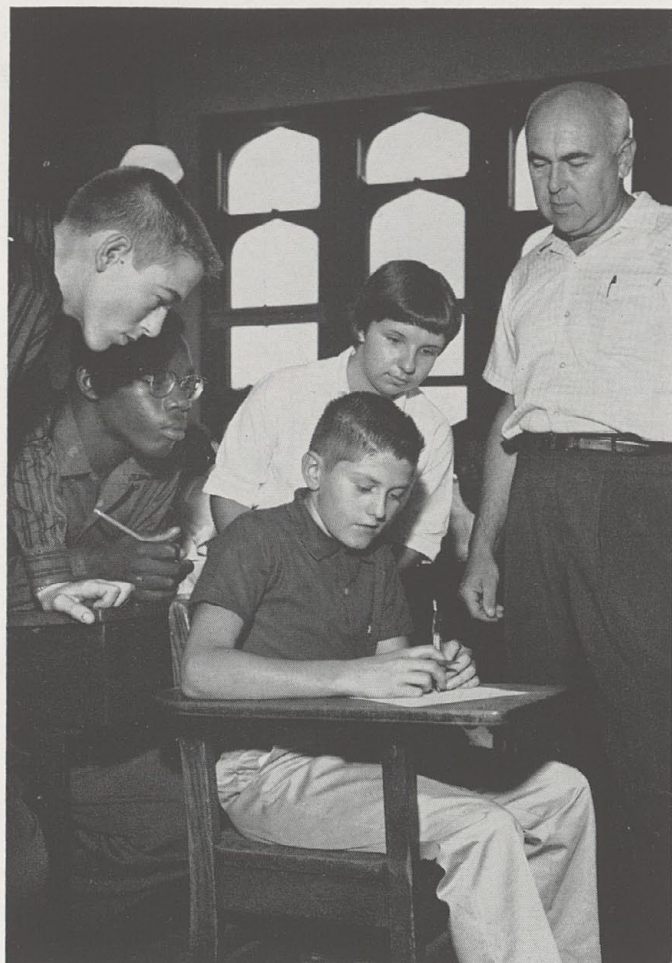

# Mathematics Leads to Advancement in Today's World



I wonder who invented this gadget!

Numbers, what an important part they play in our lives! Some sort of math is always appearing in our daily experiences. Hughes' Mathematics Department realizes the importance of math and offers many splendid courses to teach the student the basic fundamentals and also more advanced concepts of mathematics.

The Mathematics Department introduces its courses in the junior high school where arithmetic courses are required of all students in the seventh and eighth grades. In the upper grades, students who plan a career in the business world after high school, rather than college, might include in their schedules general mathematics, business mathematics, and consumer mathematics. The latter two courses are devoted to the study of the uses of mathematics as in insurance, taxation, and buying, from the point of view of both business and consumer. For those students preparing for college, the Mathematics Department offers first year algebra, plane geometry, Math III, which includes second year algebra and trigonometry, and Math IV, including trigonometry, solid geometry, and advanced algebra. Hughes also offers an accelerated course in mathematics for qualified students. This course provides for them the chance for advanced placement in mathematics in college. This year, for the first time, the accelerated classes in all the high schools are receiving instruction on television two days a week from Dr. Gaylord Merriman, head of the Mathematics Department at the University of Cincinnati.

Students taking Math III or Math IV are encouraged to join Math Club under the sponsorship of Miss Austin and Miss Kloak. The club's activities include speakers and student presentations on subjects concerning mathematics.

The Mathematics Department at Hughes is training its students so that they will be able to meet successfully any experiences with mathematics that they encounter during and after the Sparkling Sixties.

Science is becoming more and more important in this age of discovery and progress. 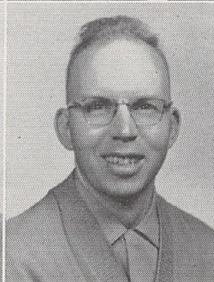
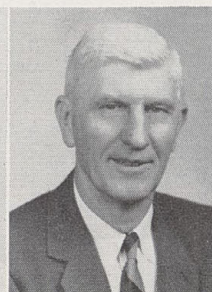

Good citizenship and the practical application of social studies in solving problems is stressed. Students preparing for college are given a good background in economics, sociology and history.

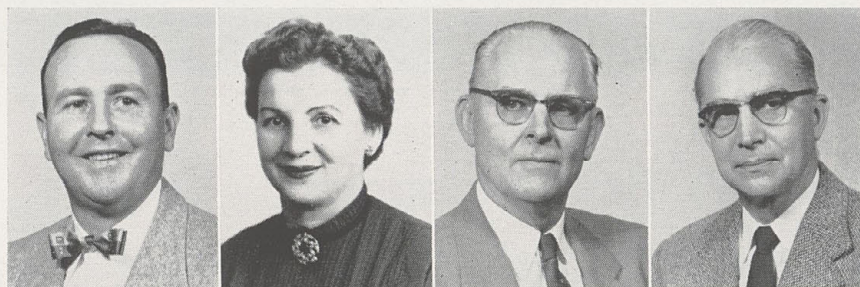
The curriculum includes geography, history, and civics for junior high students. Senior high subjects are world history, world geography, American history, American government, American problems, and economics and sociology.

Interest in current events and foreign affairs is stimulated in the Fireside College and the Junior Council on World Affairs. The Fireside College, a current events club, is sponsored by Mrs. Lenore Follinger. The Junior Council on World Affairs, under the sponsorship of Mr. Gray, helps to develop in students a desire to understand the happenings of the world.

Mr. Arthur Gray heads the social studies department. He is well-qualified for this position, with a B.A. degree from Indiana State Teachers College and a Master's Degree from the University of Chicago. Mr. Gray has taught at Hughes for the last twelve years.

A clear knowledge of history, geography, and government is necessary if nations are to live in peace during the Sparkling Sixties.

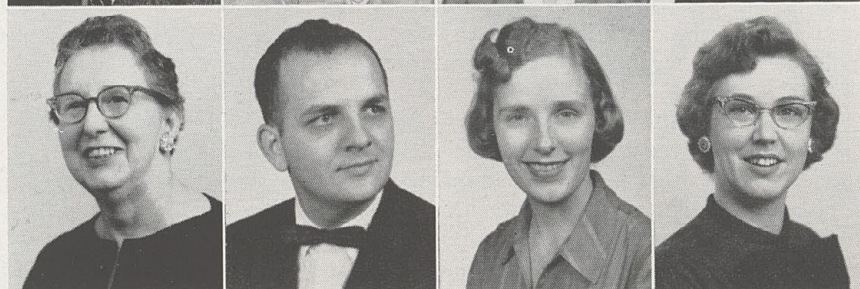

## Business Courses Prepare Efficient Office Helpers

The Commercial Department at Hughes is one of the finest and best-equipped in the city. Its curriculum includes those subjects necessary for the student preparing to enter the business world: typing, shorthand, office practice, bookkeeping, merchandising, and consumer education. Typing and shorthand possess a twofold purpose, helping also the student in pursuit of a college career.

The Hughes student never lacks equipment in his business studies. Electrical and hand-operated machines help students to make rapid calculations; the duplicating machines reproduce typewritten materials and drawings; and the dictaphone is used to give mechanical dictation to the student.

The student learns how to manage his money and his employer's through the excellent course offered in bookkeeping. Office practice classes teach the students how to work various machines they will use in an Office. They also learn the art of filing, a real aid in the employer's office. The merchandising course, under the direction of Mr. Siddall, is for a selected group of students who are interested in the buying and selling of merchandise. Students taking this course leave school at noon on three days during the week to work in downtown stores. In this way they gain first-hand experience in selling.

The Production Staff is under the direction of Miss Sarah Levine, head of the Business Department. The staff is made up of advanced business students who do all sorts of clerical work for teachers and the office such as: typing and filing, cutting stencils and mimeographing, and typing programs, bulletins, and booklets.

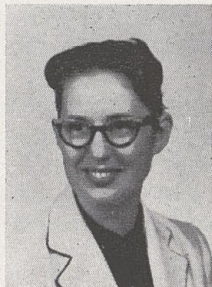

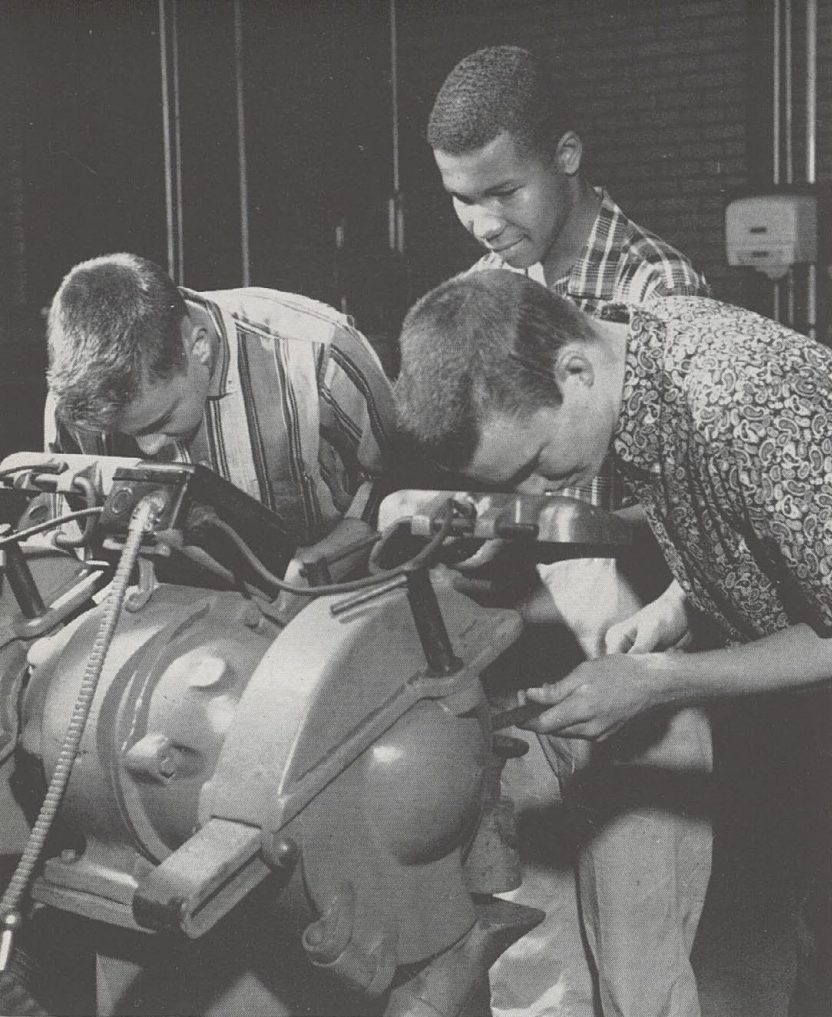

## Shops and Drawing Boards Train Boys For Industry

Walking through the back basement hall of Hughes, one can hear some familiar noises like the roar of the bandsaw or the rhythmic beat of a hammer. These sounds are coming from one of the fine industrial arts shops, which provide a place where boys can learn a life-time skill. Here the craftsmen of the Sparkling Sixties are being trained. The future leaders of industry are learning how to design and build useful and beautiful articles.

The four shops at Hughes are electricity, metal work, printing, and woodworking. Here, under the supervision of capable and sympathetic teachers, students acquire manipulative experience with tools and materials and learn processes related to industry.

Another division of the industrial arts department is mechanical drawing. After the first year, which is devoted to the fundamental aspects of construction, the work becomes specialized. Students branch into either architectural or engineering drawing. In this way students can train for whichever field interests them most.

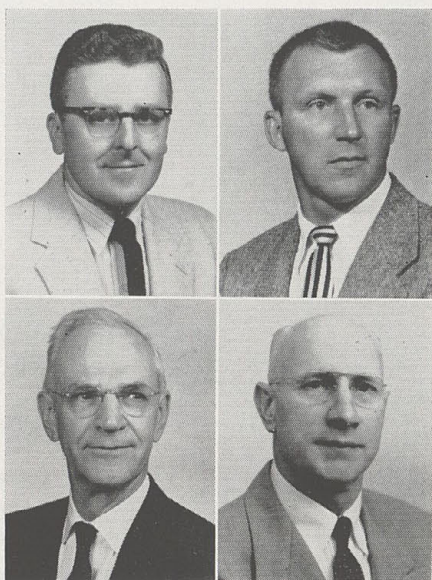

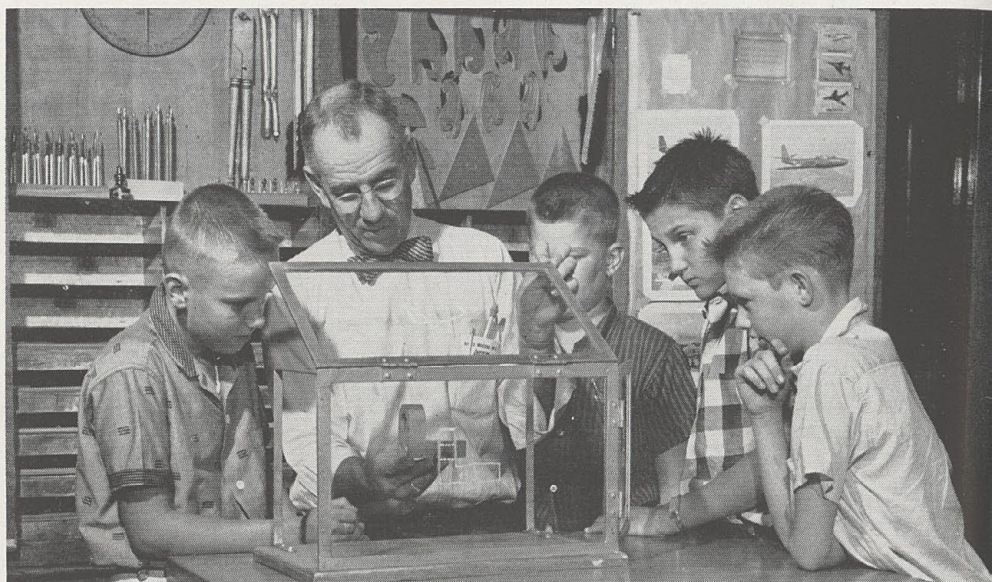

## Girls Learn to Cook, Sew

In preparing future homemakers for life during the Sparkling Sixties, Hughes uses modern equipment and gives helpful instruction to guide students in the right direction. Courses in the field of home economics are available to all girls from the seventh through the twelfth grades. The department is headed by Miss Florence Volkmer, a member of the Ohio Association of Home Economics, who has spent many years as a popular and respected teacher of home economics.

The students learn about correct table settings, the basic seven foods groups, planning well-balanced meals, room arrangement, color combinations, budgeting, and the different types and qualities of fabrics. The girls also study good grooming, child care, and development of desirable personality traits. They also have an opportunity to make clothing to add to their wardrobe. A special course called home-making is offered to senior girls who have never had training in home economics. This course teaches the girls the fundamentals of becoming a good housewife.

What a big job it is for Mrs. Holscher, head dietitian, to feed over 2,000 students in a limited lunch period from 11:30 to 1:00 o'clock.

Under Mrs. Holscher's employ are twenty-two women, who prepare the delicious food, serve it cafeteria-style to the students, and make ready for the next day, after the noon rush has departed. Thirty students give their time at noon to help in the lunchroom, working as cashiers and lunchline guards. Also assisting Mrs. Holscher are the dietetic interns from General Hospital, who take three weeks of their training at Hughes.

After graduating from Michigan State University in Lansing, Mrs. Holscher gained much experience as head dietitian for a dormitory, housing fifteen hundred men. For the splendid job she has done this year, "The Sparkling Sixties" now pays tribute to Mrs. Holscher, who came to Hughes from Cutter Junior High School in April 1959.

## Pupils Get Special Help

Hughes High School offers several different kinds of special classes. It is the only city high school with courses for deaf students. With Mr. John McDaniel as teacher, the deaf students learn to use the manual alphabet and sign language. They also learn to lip read by imitating their teacher.

Mrs. Myrtle Jones and Mr. Thomas Moore are each in charge of a tenth grade special education class. In these classes, started only this year, pupils who find the regular curriculum too difficult can fulfill the requirements for a special high school diploma while preparing themselves to earn a living after they graduate.

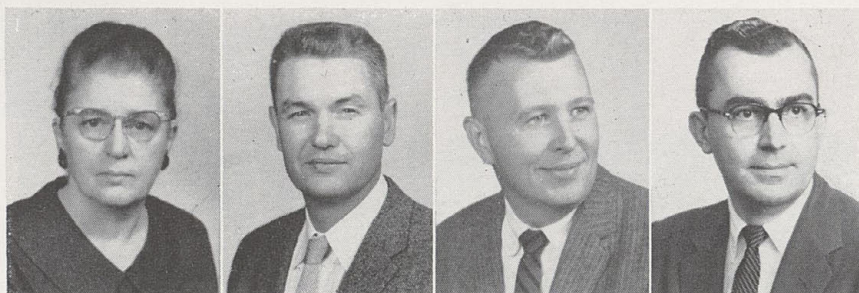

# Health, Driver Education Teach Habits and Skills

Health is a requirement in the tenth and twelfth grades. First aid instruction in emergency assistance leads the students to a Red Cross Certificate. This course is planned to improve personal hygiene and increase safety. This is an essential course in helping to prepare students for their future homes.

Driver education is taken for one semester in the sophomore year. The students are instructed in proper driving techniques, safety rules, mechanics of the car, and its proper care. When a student, usually a junior or a senior, acquires a temporary driver's license, he is eligible to take drivers' training. Here he experiences actual behind-the-wheel driving. This later leads to a driver's license and a reduced insurance rate.

It is the hope of the teachers that the students will be prepared for a better future in health and driver's education.

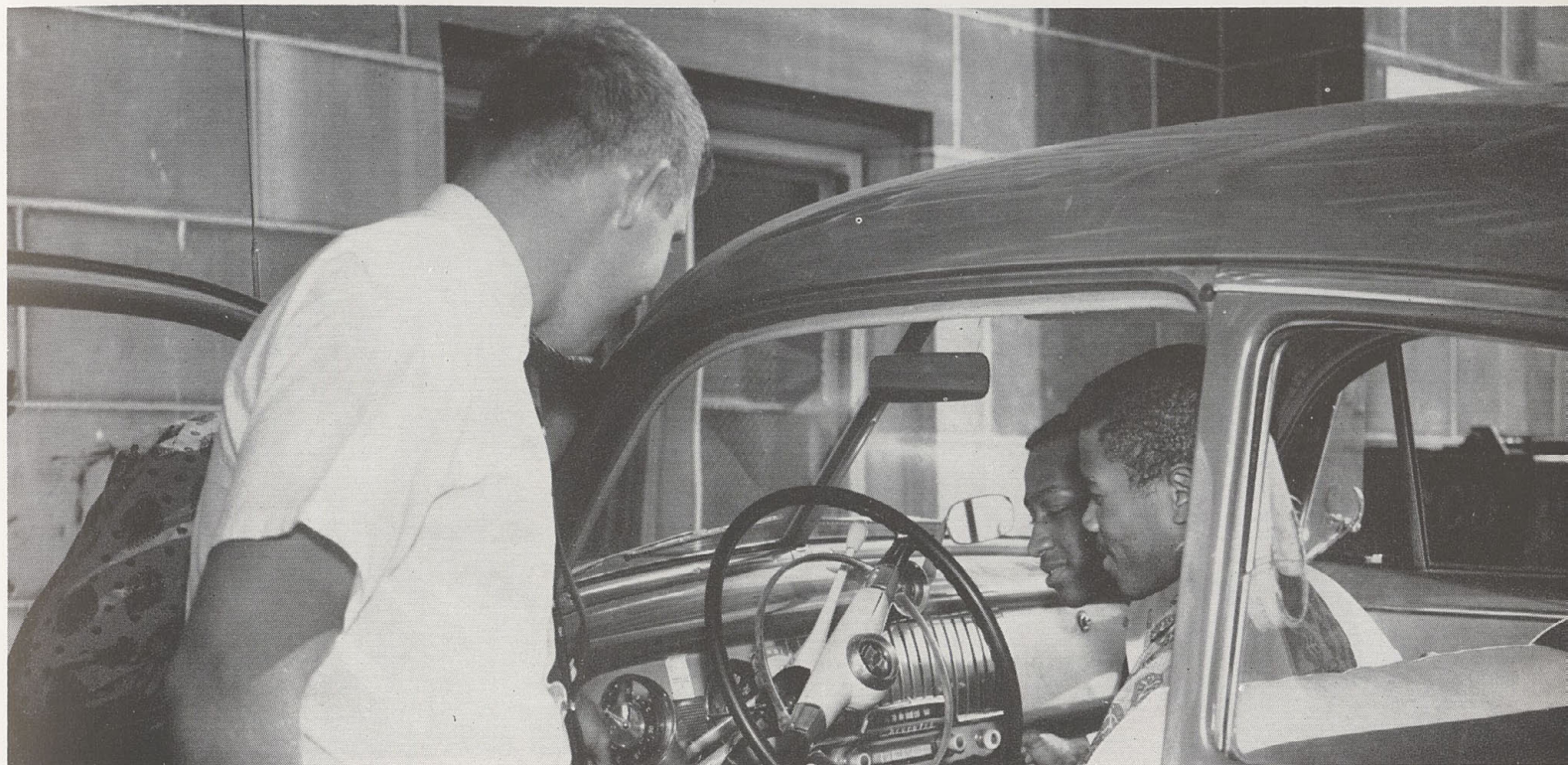

The Hughes Physical Education Department offers the chance for healthy exercise, along with participation in many sports. Students from the seventh through the eleventh grades, and ambitious seniors for whom gym is not obligatory, spend from two to three hours a week in the two gyms. Swimming courses are conducted in the boys' and girls' pools for interested students. During the warm spring and autumn months the gym classes walk down to Coy Field to enjoy the outdoor facilities of the Physical Education Department.

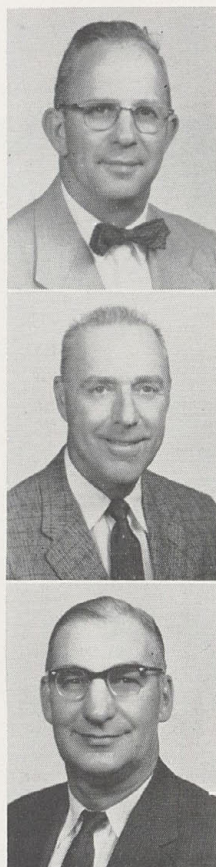
In the girls' gym classes, instruction is given in hockey, volleyball, basketball, softball, individual sports, and dancing. The boys' gym classes concentrate on football, volleyball, basketball, softball, track, tumbling, and calisthenics.

At the beginning of every year the Board of Education requires the girls to take the Physical Achievement Test and the boys to take the Pentathlon Test, to determine the individual ability of the students and to test their skill at various exercises. The same test is repeated at the end of the year to measure the amount of improvement each student has made.

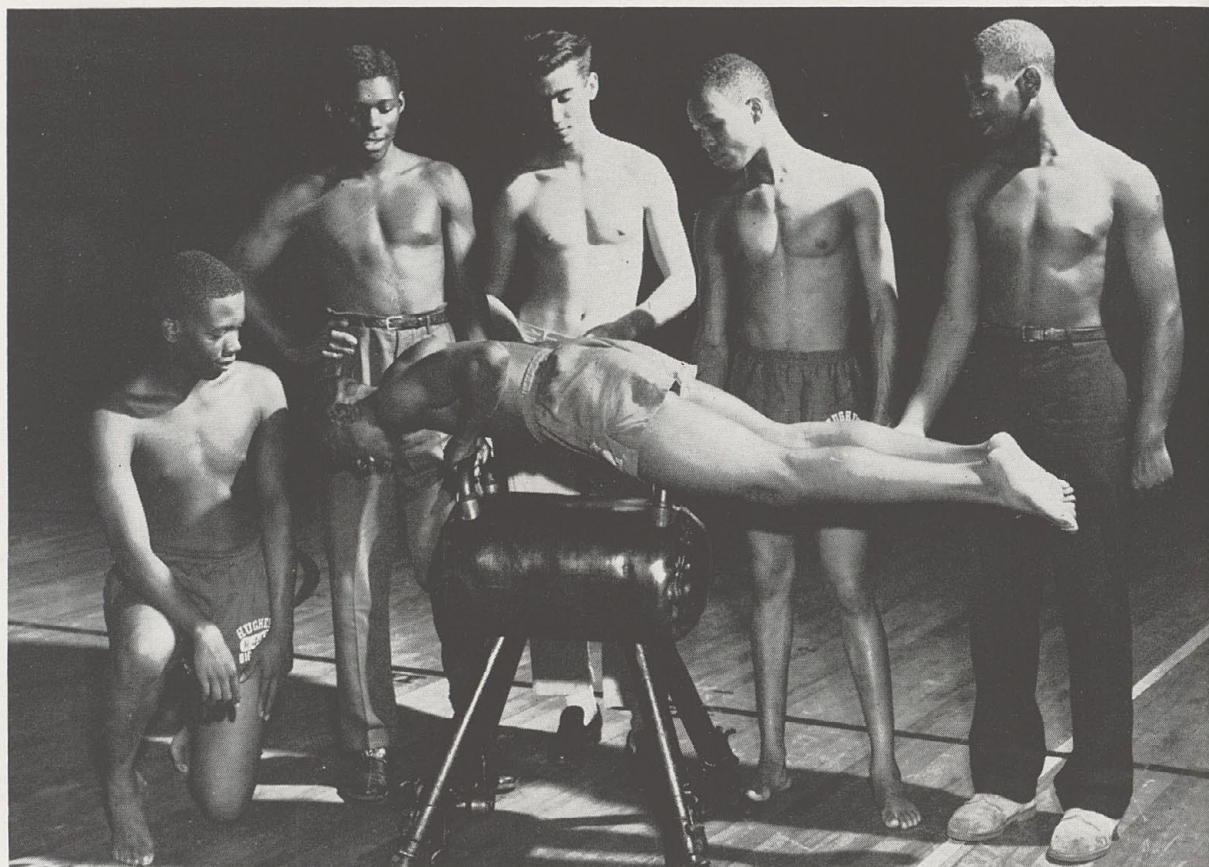
The Physical Education Department plays an important part in the education of the students. From participation in the various sports, students learn cooperation and team work and develop mental powers for making quick reactions.

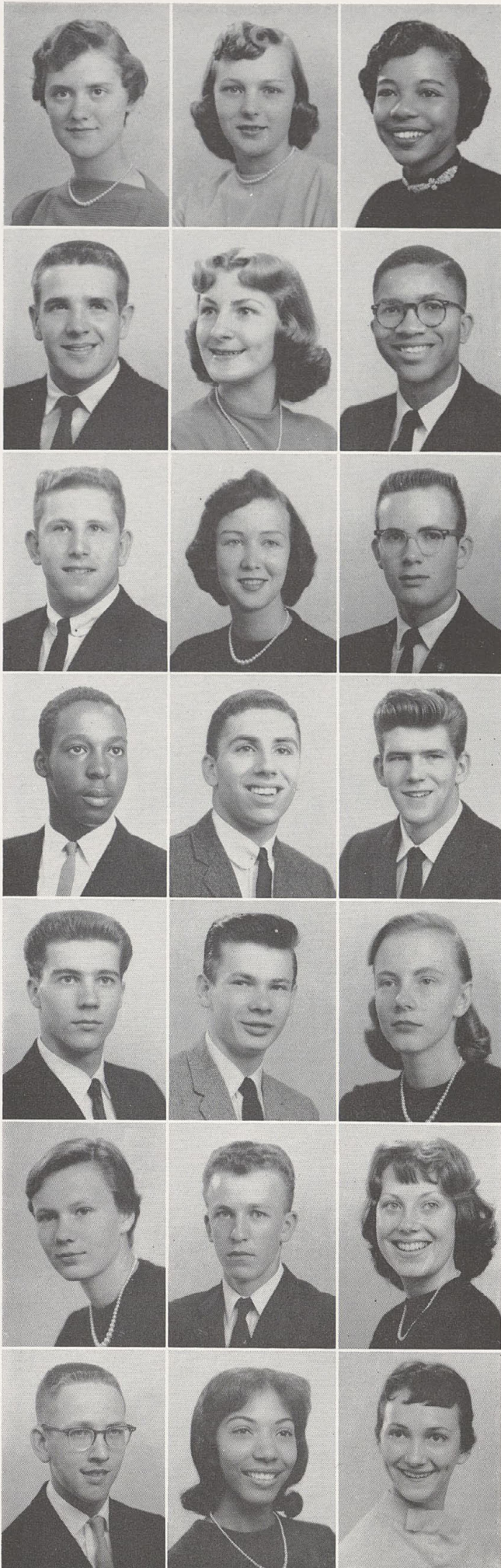

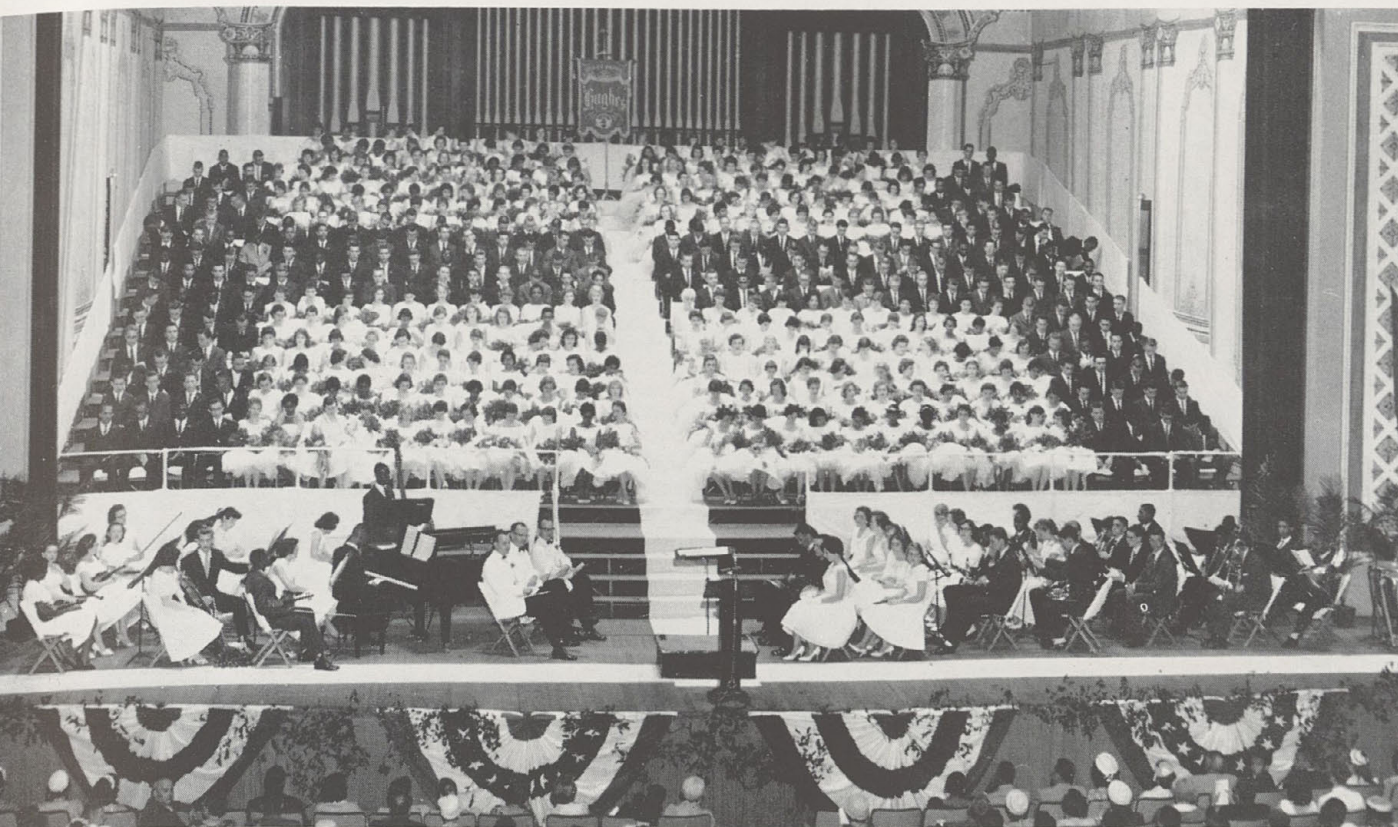

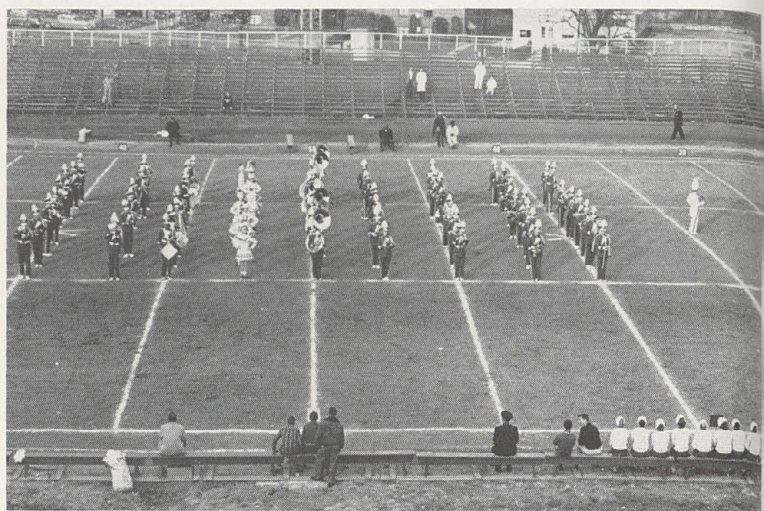

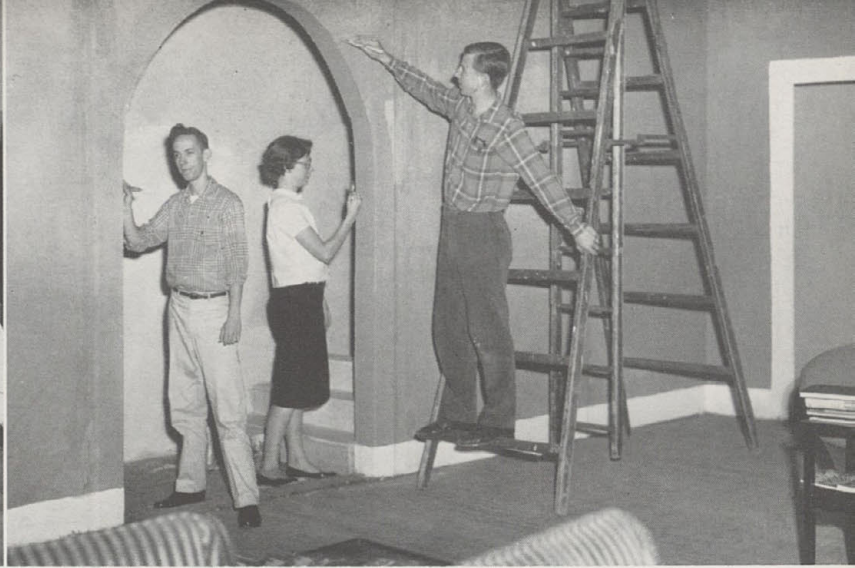

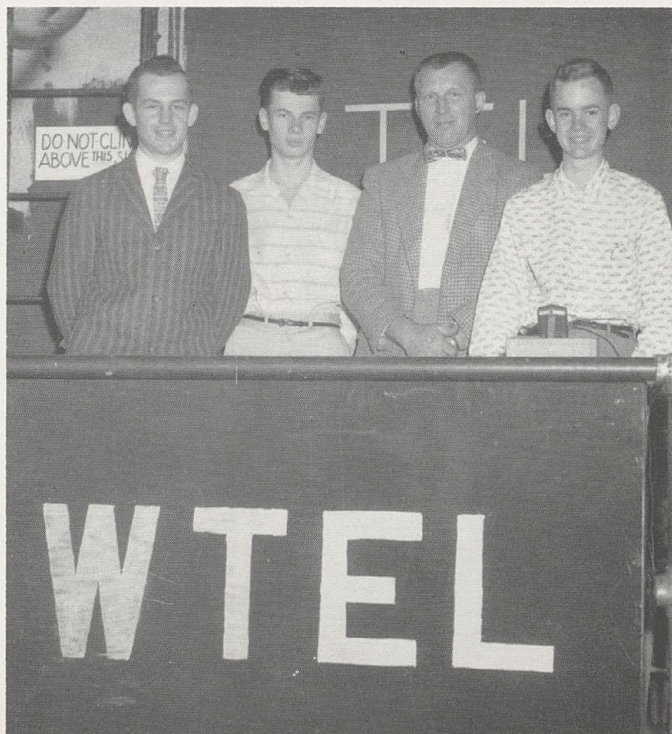

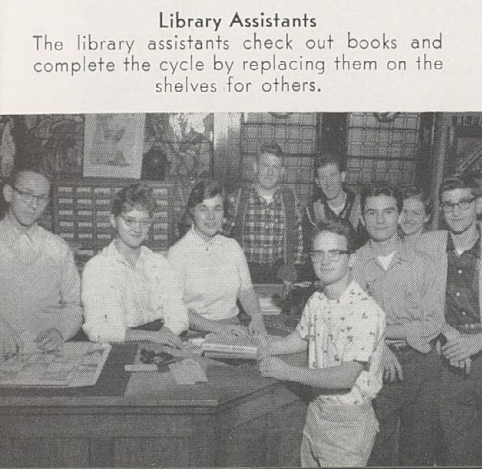

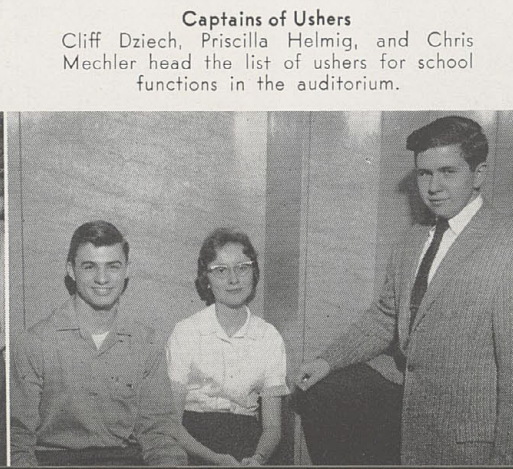

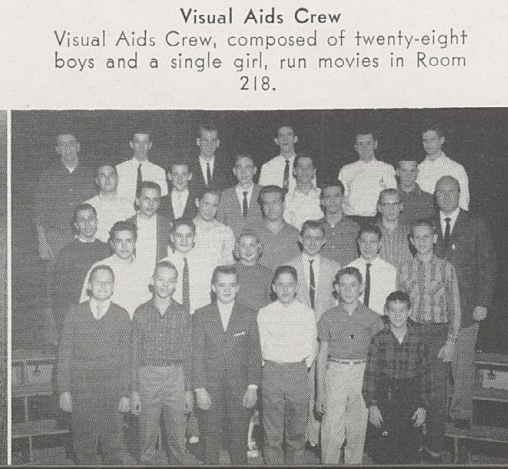

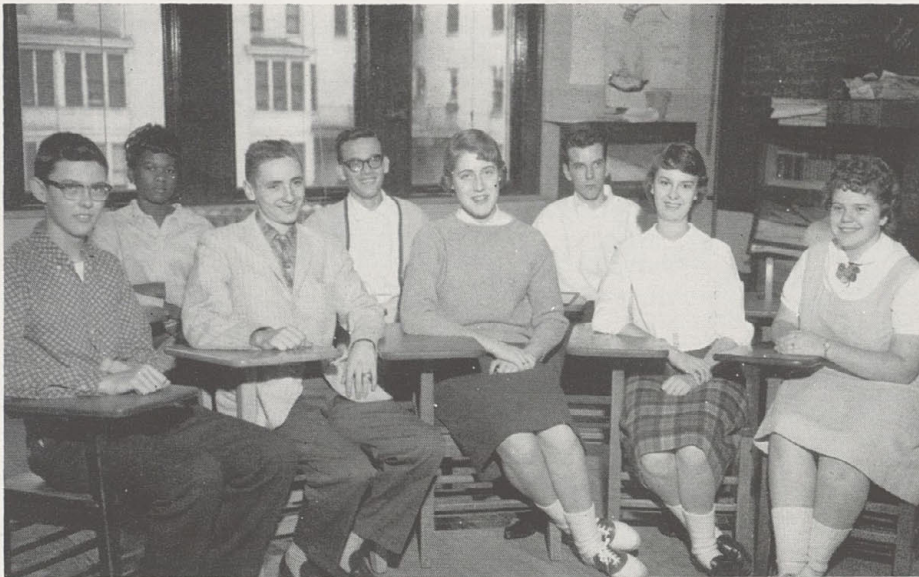

## Gargoyle Tells Hughes of the Latest News

One of the busiest spots in the school is Room 206, the "Gargoyle" Room. On Monday, Tuesday, and Wednesday afternoons journalists gather to prepare the news and features for the following week's "Gargoyle." The rhythmic clicking of typewriters, the animated conversations between page editors and reporters, and the rustling of papers create a distinctive atmosphere in the "Gargoyle" Room.

"Gargoyle" work has a two-fold value. It provides excellent training for those working on the paper, giving them a taste of journalism in all its phases. The writers develop a skill for expressing ideas clearly. It has the function of bringing Hughes students and faculty into a coordinated whole by its coverage of school news and by its special features, spotlighting faculty and students frequently.

Jan Gausmann, executive editor, heads this year's "Gargoyle" staff. The staff of editors consists of: Diane Deiters, front page; Sandy Bereskin, second or editorial page; Bill Wandmacher, sports page; and Debbie McKinley, fourth page. They lay out the pages, edit articles, write headlines, and proof-read the copy. Business staff workers become acquainted with the management of a business organization. Mary Jane Reitman and Pete Shultes head the business staff. They obtain advertisements for each week's "Gargoyle," bill the advertisers, and place the "ads" on the page. Gayle Biehle, circulation manager, supervises the distribution of the papers on Wednesday mornings. Ron Puckett provides the "Gargoyle" with photographs of school activities. Assistant editors, feature writers, reporters, and typists are the backbone of the newspaper. Much of the credit for excellent news coverage and presentation goes to Miss Hazel Koppenhoefer, the sponsor for thirty-three years.

During the winter of 1959, a change appeared in the "Gargoyle." The newspaper is now printed on larger, better quality paper with more photographs. These physical changes resulted from switching from a flat bed printing process to "offset," a process which involves photographing the pages.

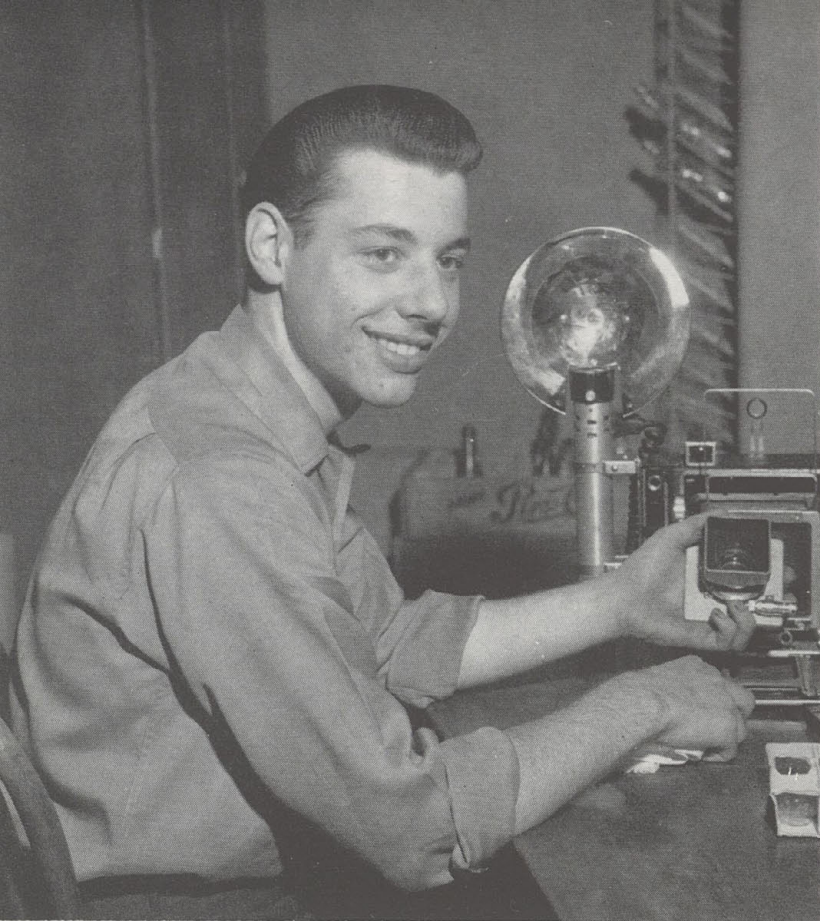

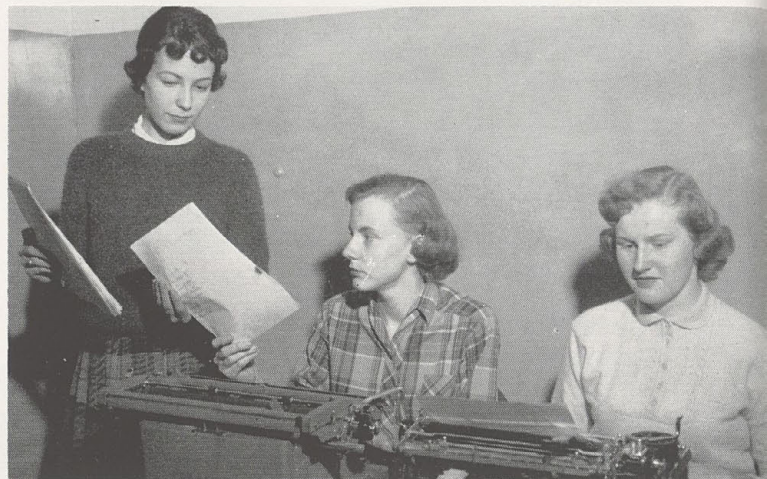

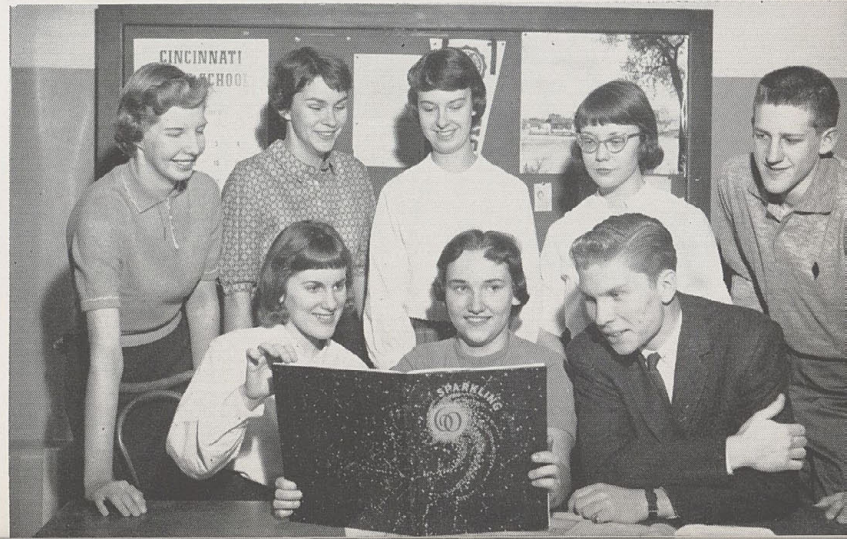

# Honor Society



One of the highest honors which any Hughes student can attain is membership in the Hughes Honor Society. This organization, which selects its members on the basis of grades alone, is composed of the top ten percent of the senior class and the six highest juniors. These juniors form the executive board. In February the Society holds a tea to which all Hughes students who have maintained a "B" average or better for the first semester are invited. Punch and cookies are served and several outstanding speakers encourage the students to maintain high scholarship.

Each year the grades of all seniors are averaged and ranked and those who qualify for membership in the society are invited to a special banquet held in the spring. At this banquet each new member receives his Honor Society insignia, which can be worn either as a necklace or a pin. Members of Honor Society are seated on the stage on Class Day and receive gold seals for their diplomas at graduation.

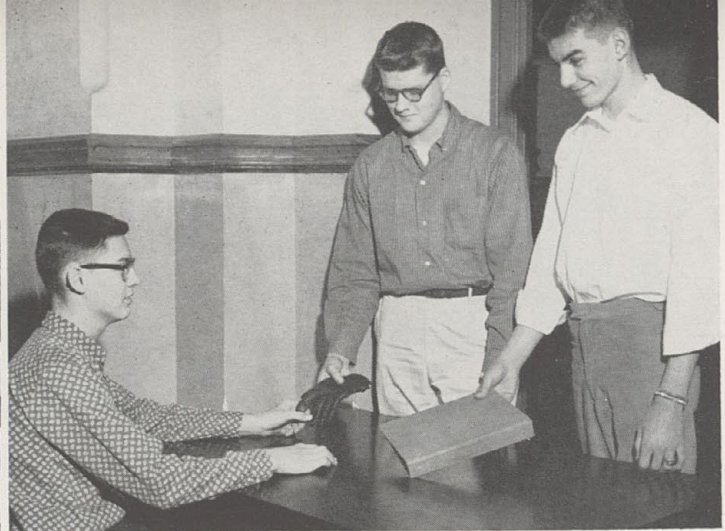

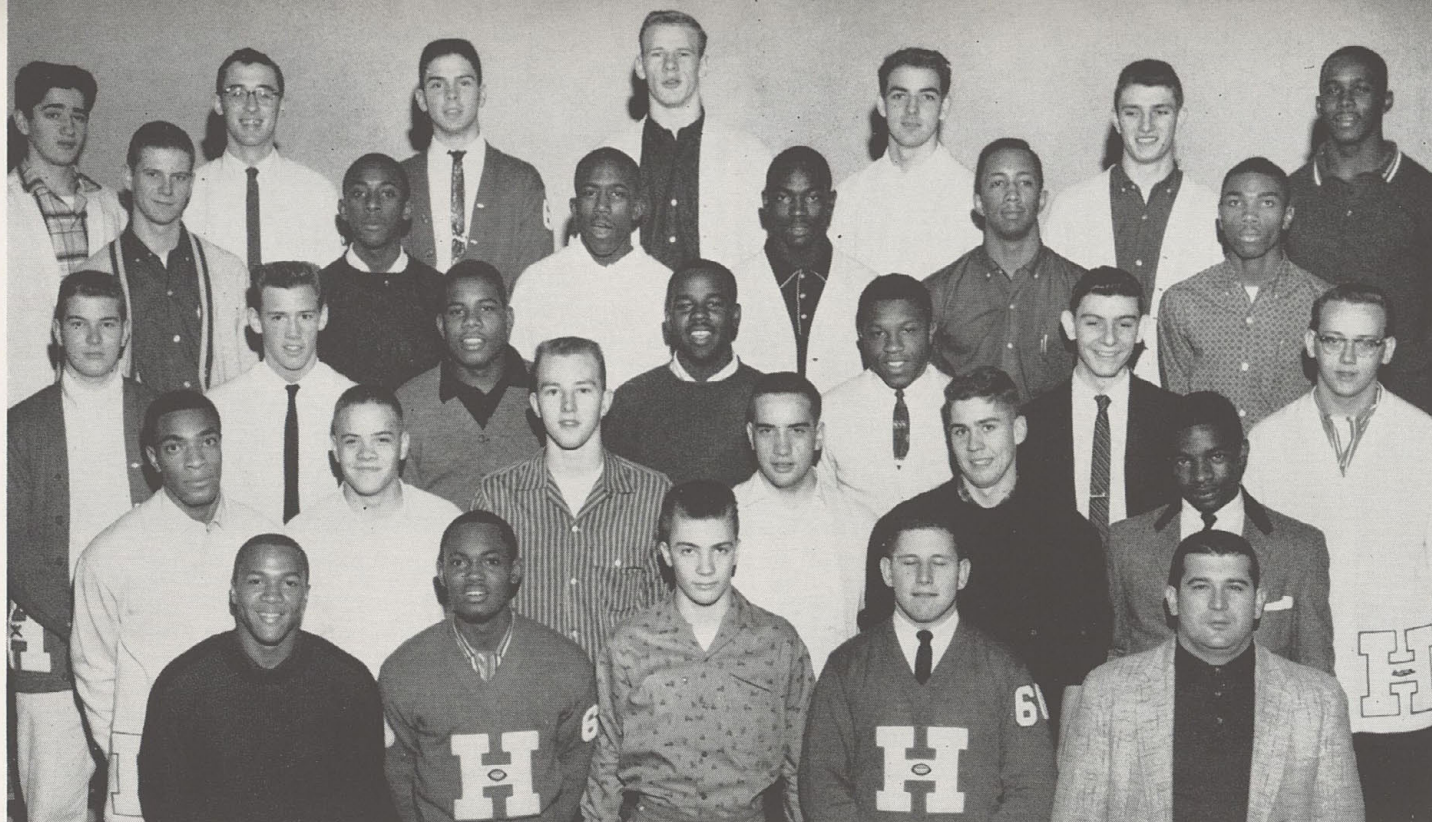

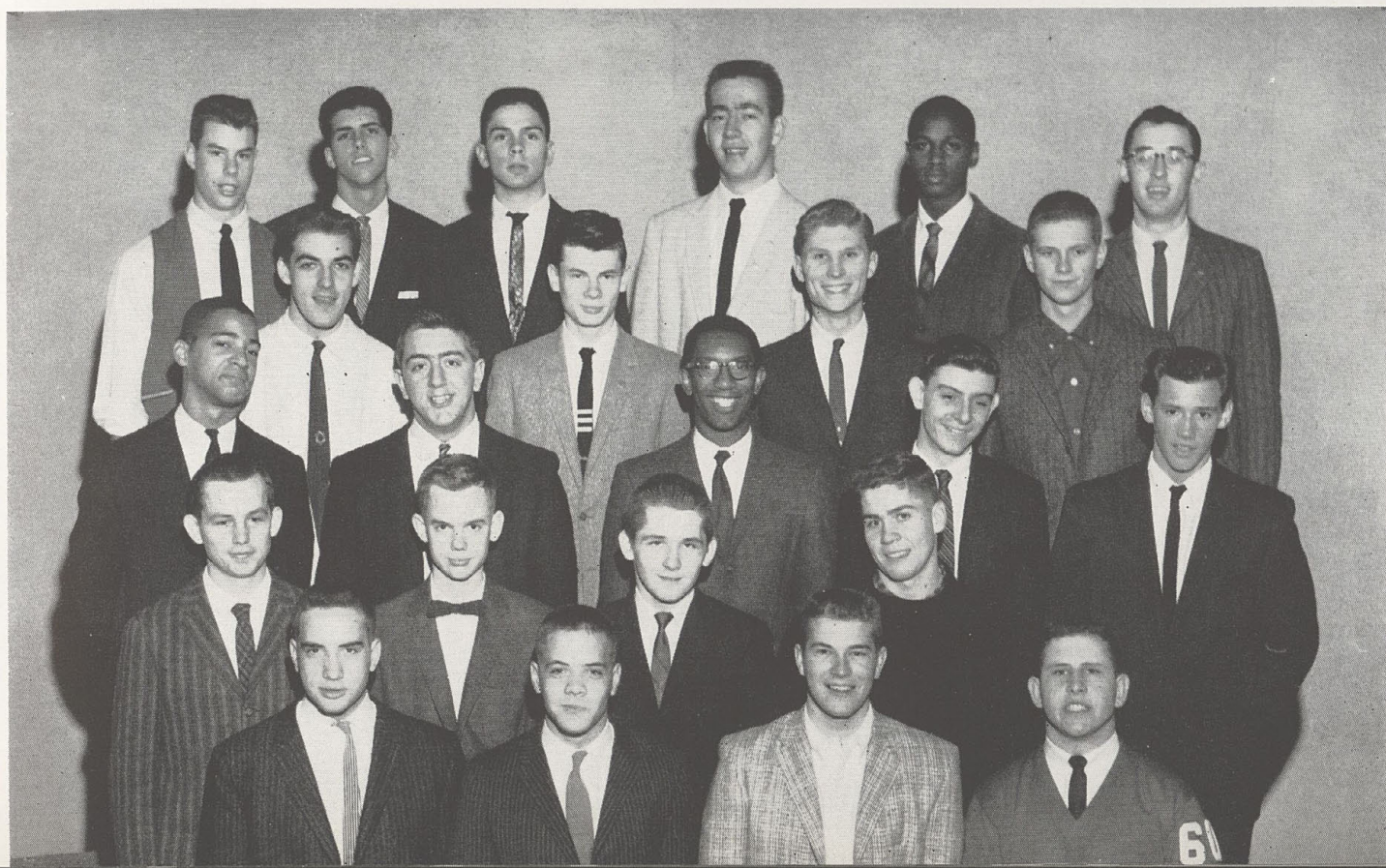
Each year, the club has sponsored a service project. They have given the school such items as a television set, a typewriter for the annual, and a trophy case.

## Beta Hi-Y

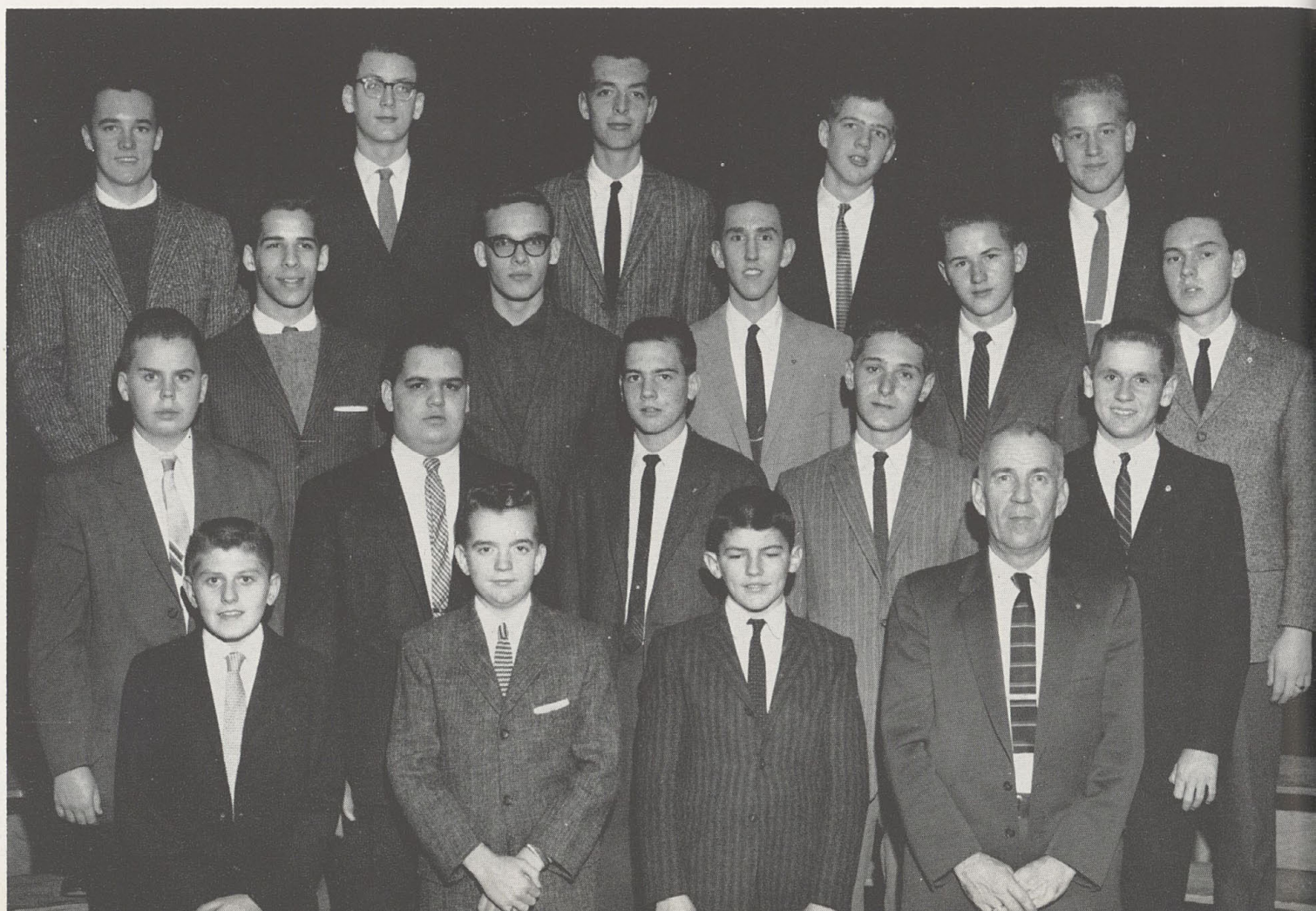

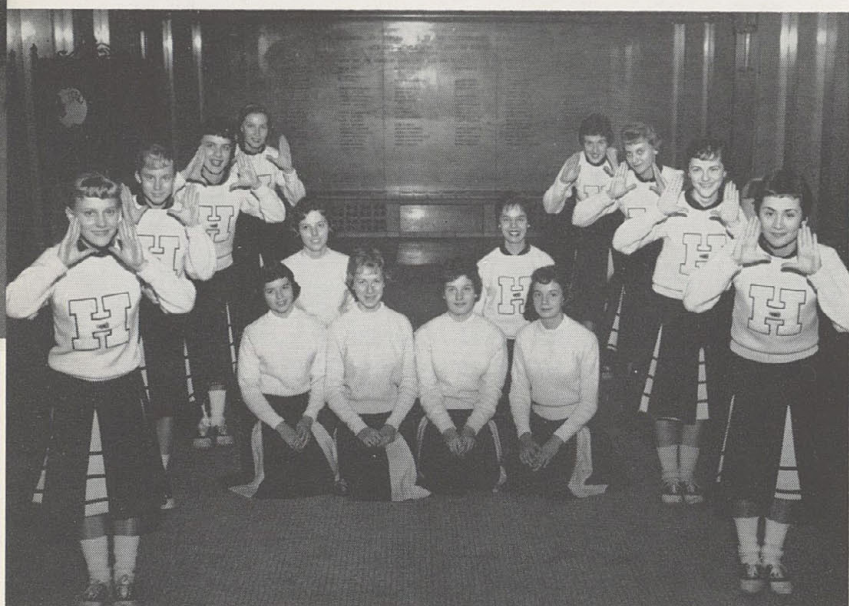

## Latin Club



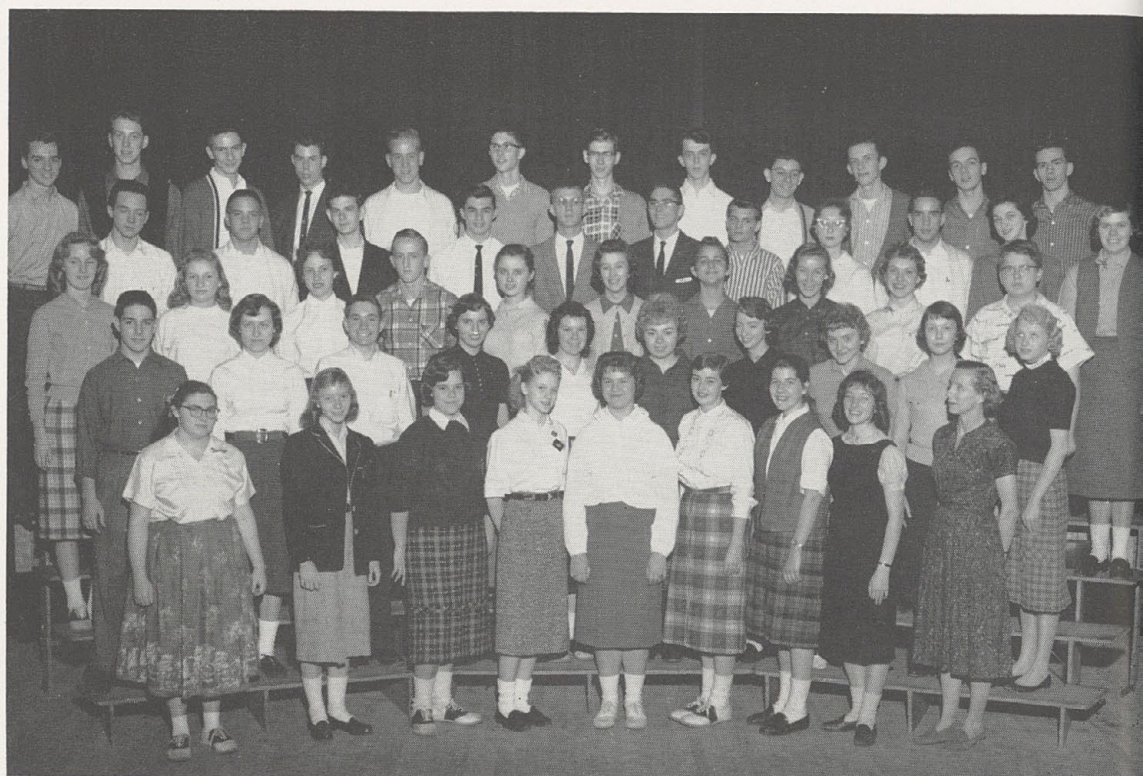

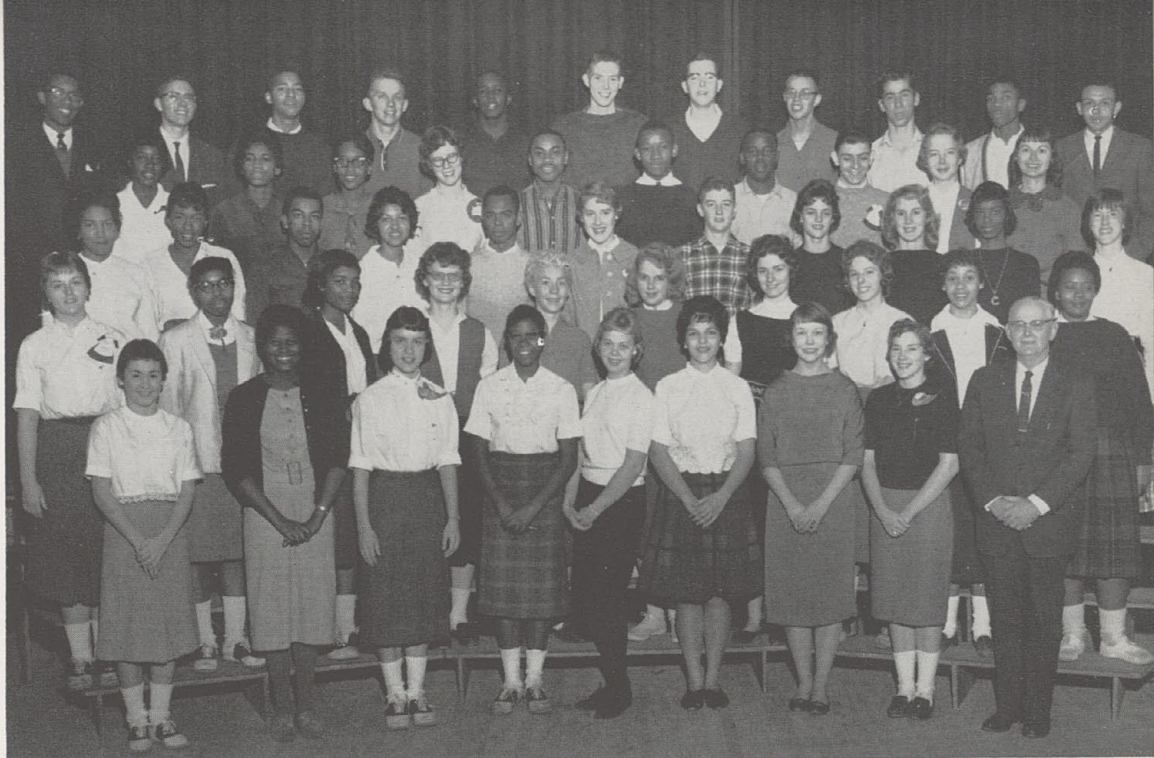

The council is made up of two representatives from each sorority and fraternity. The club registers the activities of the social clubs so that there will be no conflicting dates.

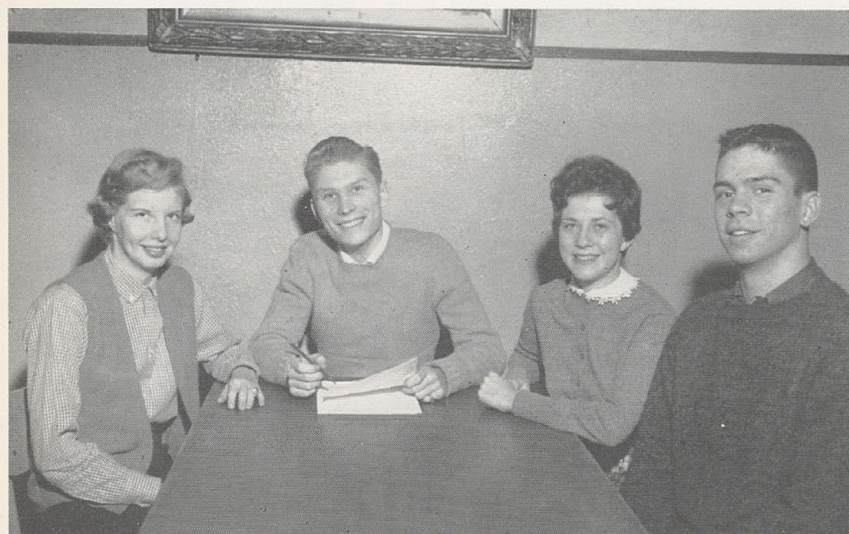

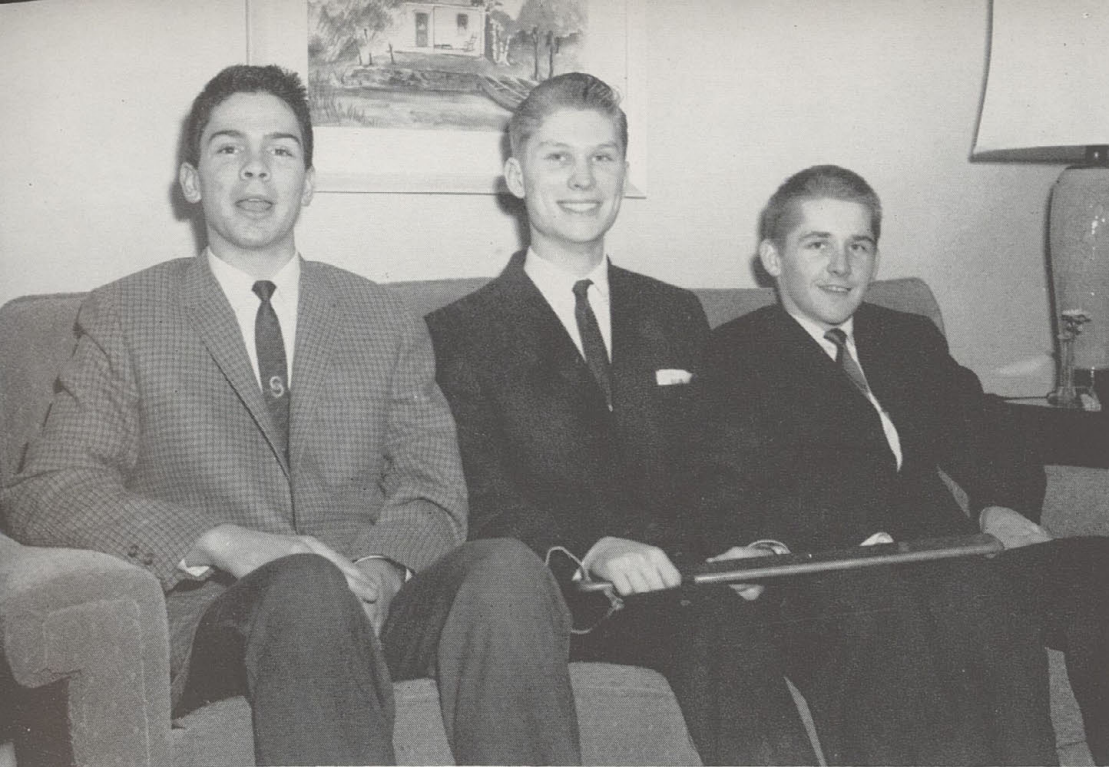


## Tri Chi

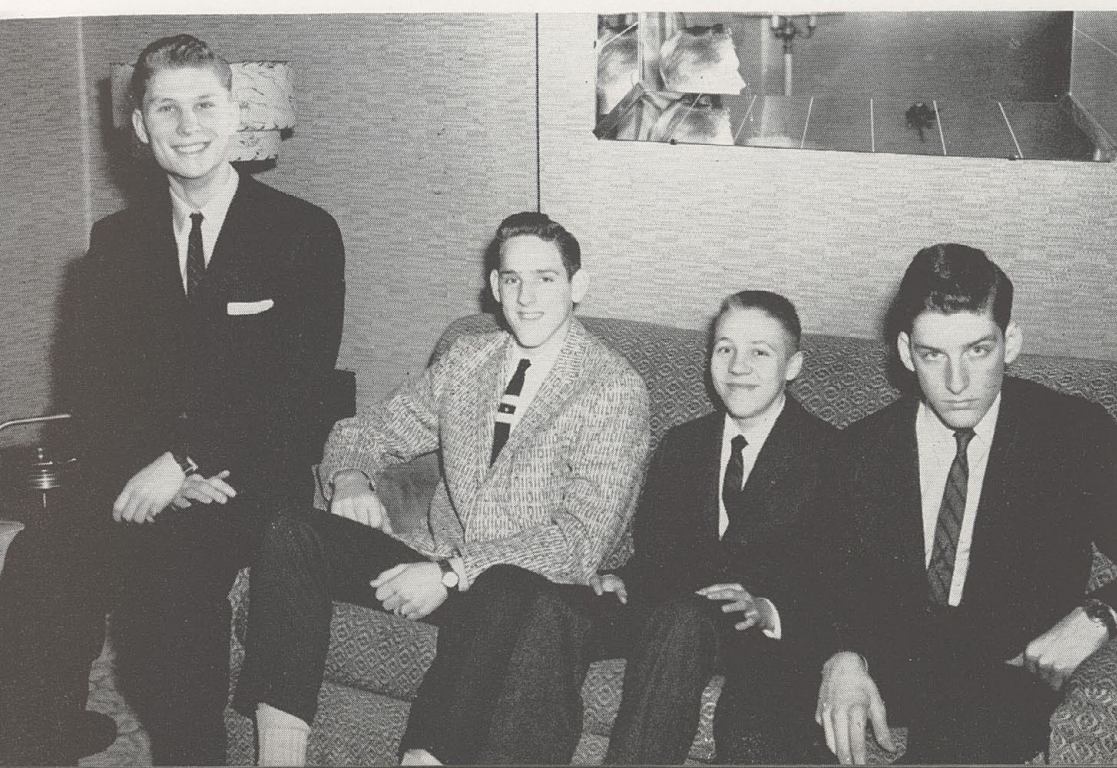
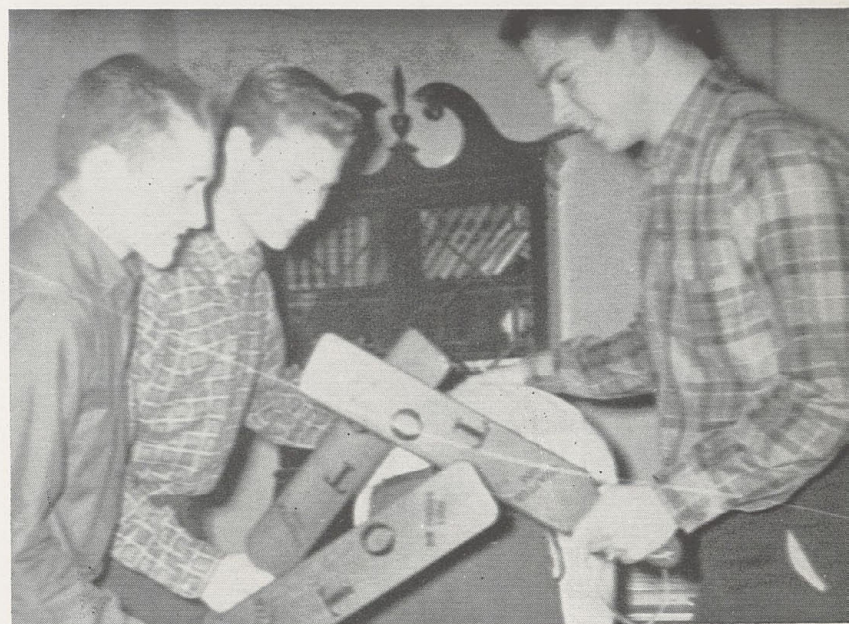
## Triginta Optimi

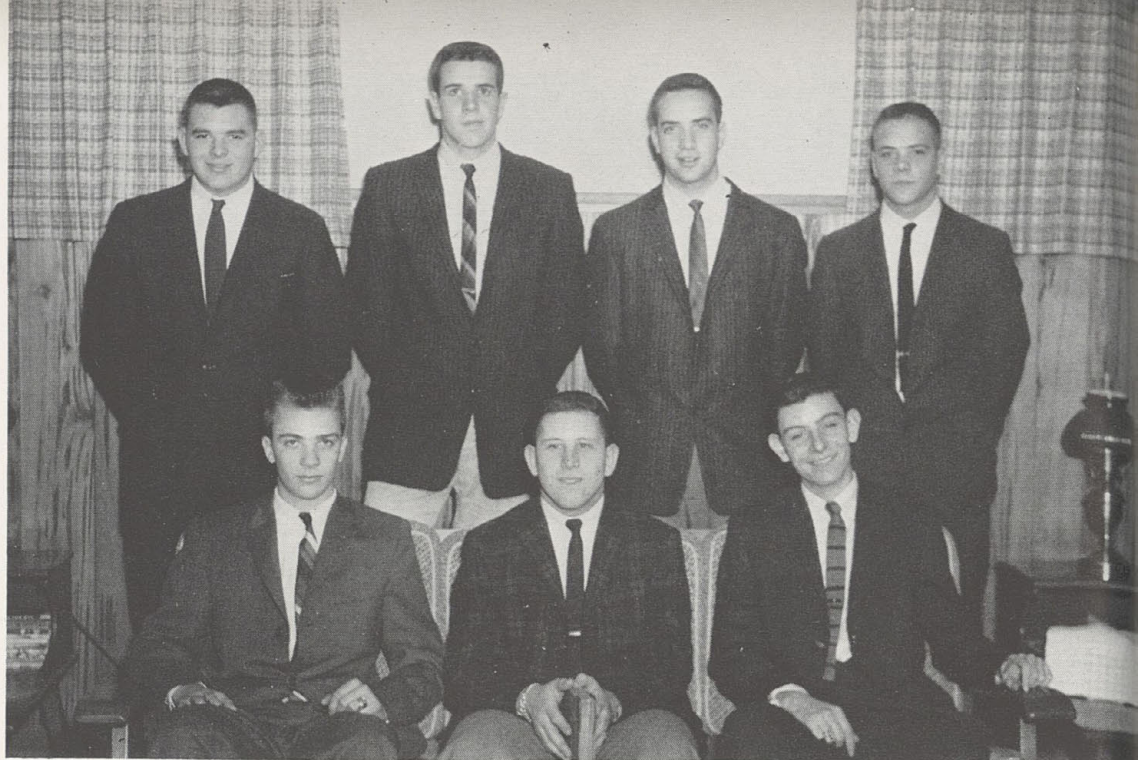

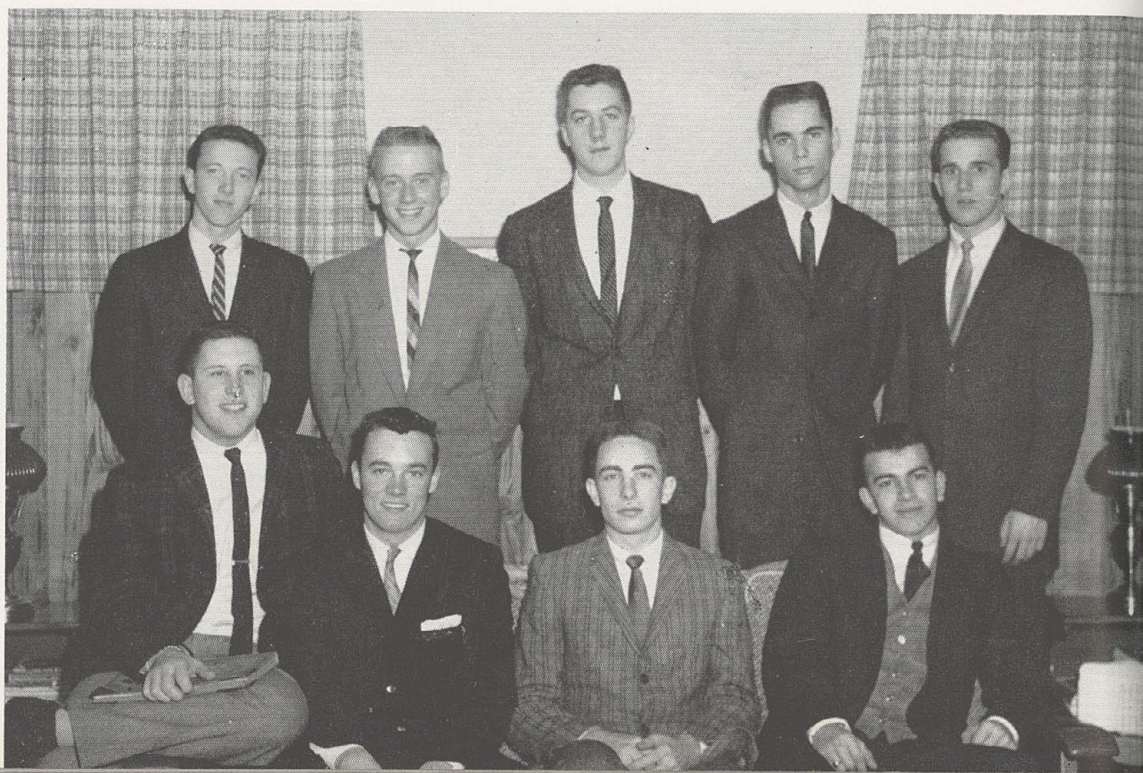
## Chi Omega Sigma

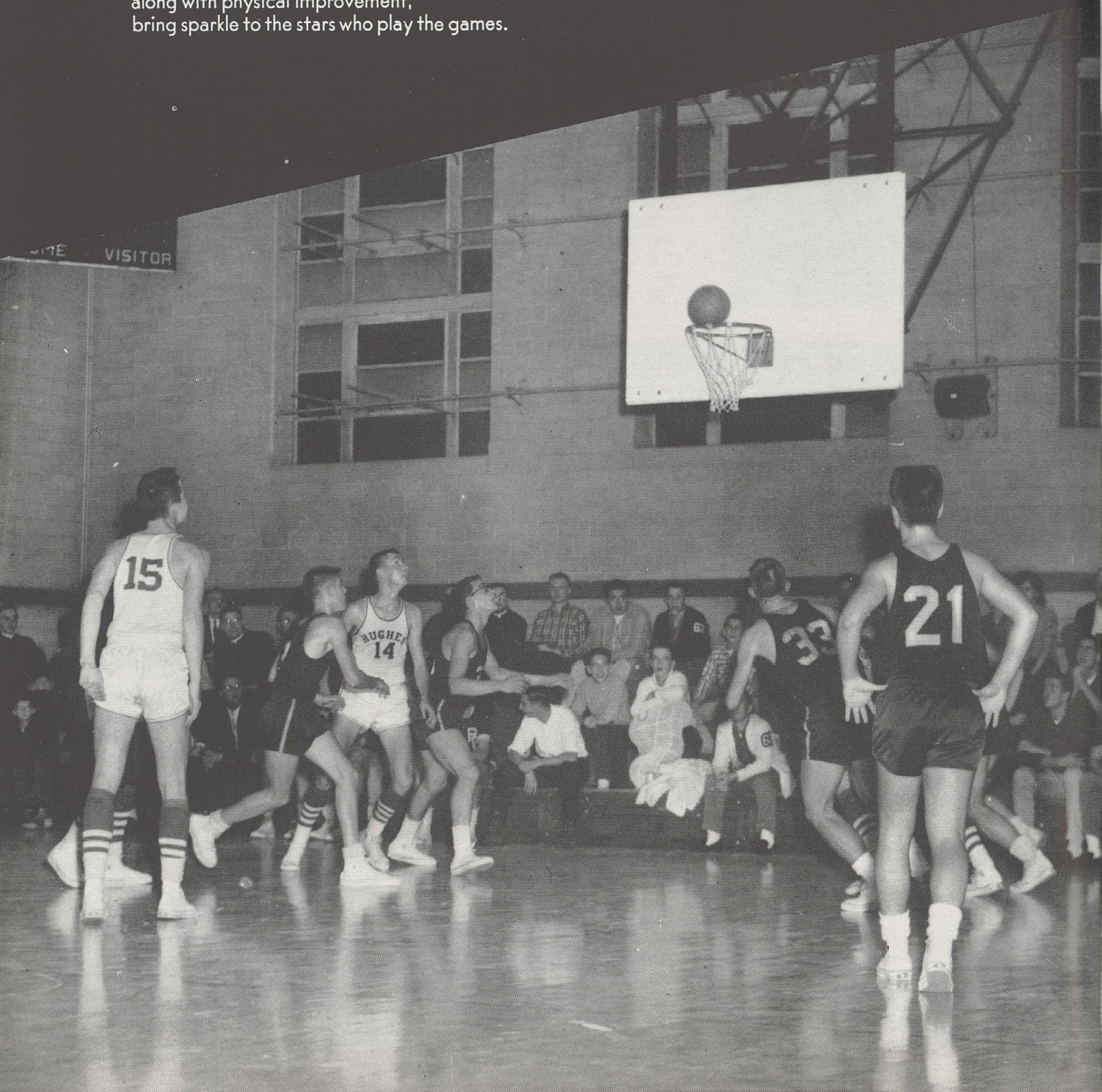


# Athletics

Bam! The gun sounds and over a hundred eager bodies leap forward and pick up momentum. Another cross country meet has begun. The Reserves, under the guidance of Coach Paul Richert, brought the laurels to Hughes as they finished first in every meet, compiling a total of 104 points, only ten less than the varsity winners from Withrow. Leading the squad were stalwarts Charley Reynolds, Al Greenman, Robert Murrell, Roy Skinner, Ken Jones, and Al Schneider.

In cross country, the boys are numbered as they finish; therefore, the team with the lowest score wins. The Big Reds Reserve team showed their big brothers how to win as they compiled twenty-four points in their first meet, forty-two in the second, and thirty-four points in the third. There was no district meet for the Reserves.

This year's varsity squad, also ably coached by Coach Paul Richert, was captained by Dick Fischer. The team consisted of Captain Fischer, Ray Anderson, Alan Ransick, Roy Swift, Herb Walker, Len Cavens, and Aaron Malone. The squad had a good year despite the fact that two varsity members who were heavily counted on were forced to quit.

In three meets, the Big Red harriers finished second in two and third in the other. They placed second in the district meet. In the Public High School League, Withrow finished first with a respectable total of ninety-four points. Hughes' Big Reds finished second with 230, beating Taft out by fifteen points. The meets were held at Avon Fields on Reading Road, and twice the teams were hampered by muddy grounds.

The most consistent runners for the varsity were Dick Fischer, Ray Anderson, Alan Ransick, Roy Swift, and Herb Walker. Len Cavens and Aaron Malone rounded out the squad and greatly assisted the team performance. The best running time of the year for the Big Reds was Ray Anderson's ten minutes and fifty-six seconds over a course of a little more than two miles.

Coach Richert has high hopes for a winning team next year. Its nucleus will probably be built around Alan Ransick, Aaron Malone, and Herb Walker, plus the additions from the championship Reserve team. The harriers work hard and often go unsung. During the cross country season, they practice every day after school in Burnet Woods. The coach divides the runners into practice teams named the Red team, White team, and Blue team. These teams, with one or two varsity members on each, run against each other in Burnet Woods. That plus running laps around the gym and doing other exercises helps mold Hughes cross-country teams into shape.

A post-season race, run on November 25, was called the Thanksgiving Day Marathon. The course was six miles long and was run from Fort Thomas, Kentucky, to the Hotel Sinton. 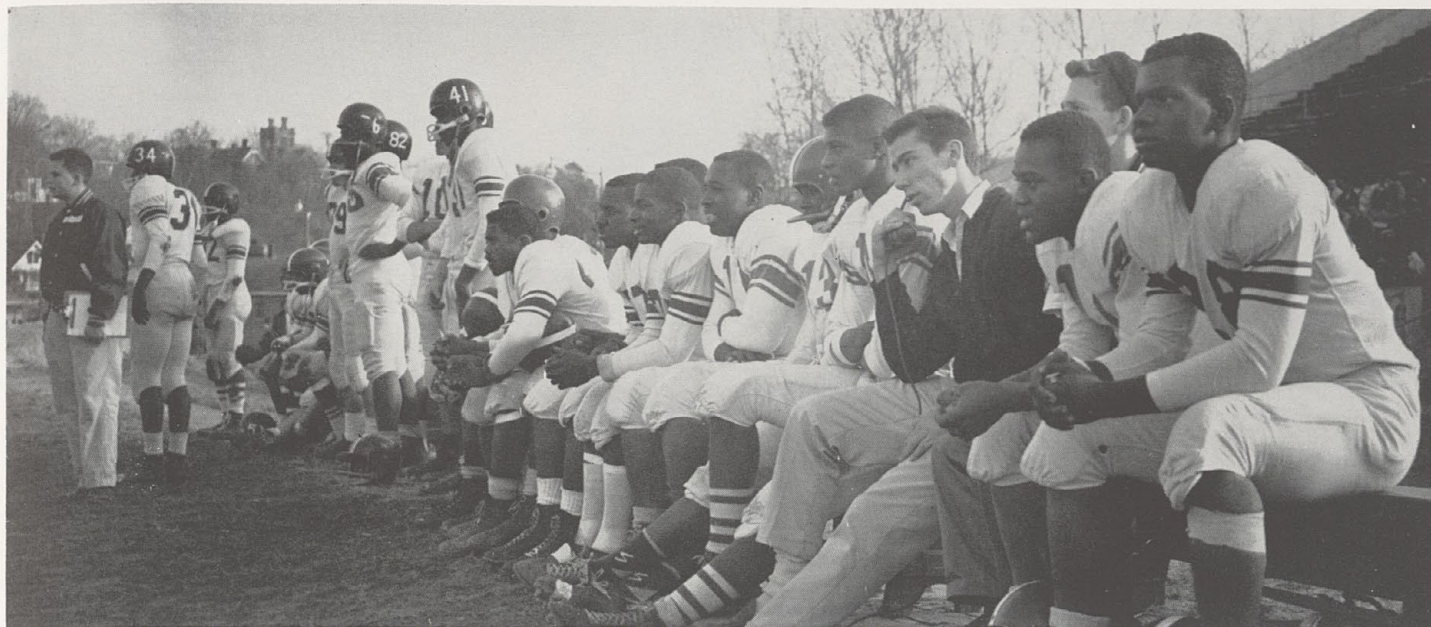

After an exciting season's start, Hughes' Big Reds lost two of the last four games. They fought well enough, however, to share a second-place tie with Taft. But the biggest thing the Beg Reds boast about is the 8-7 victory over Woodward's champion Bulldogs. Coach Howard Thomas' boys did a yeoman job but couldn't hold their own in the tight race for first place. The team was tremendously bolstered by returning lettermen Charlie Neal, Bobby Williams, Tom Strunk, Larry Hughes and Larry Parks, plus the championship Reserve team of 1958. Charlie Neal brought honor to himself and Hughes by being selected as a guard on both the Enquirer and Post-Times-Star's All-City teams.

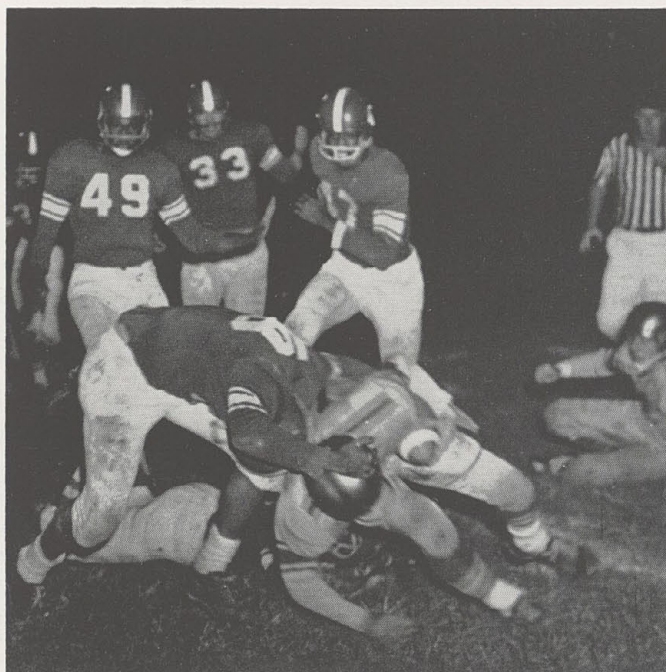

However, Hughes took the ensuing kickoff and marched 88 yards to pay dirt, climaxing the drive with a 54-yard run by Vic Moore. In the second half, Hughes drove 58 yards and scored on a jump pass over center from Parks to Williams. Parks outwitted the Knights with the same play and the Big Reds led, 14-6. Central tied the score again, but with minutes left, Winston Gray grabbed a partially-blocked Knight pass and raced 80 yards for the score and a 20-14 victory.

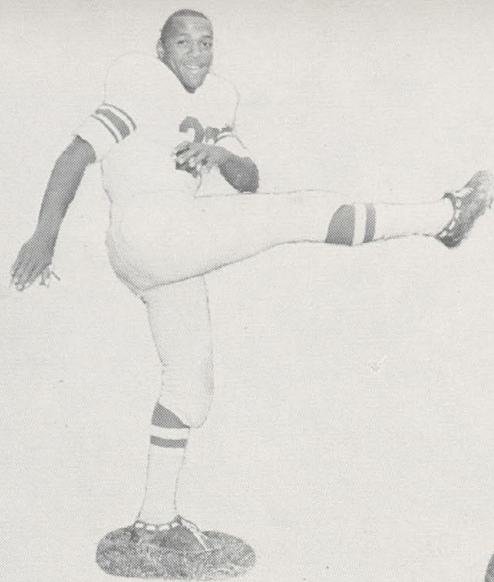
In Hughes' third league game, the Big Reds faced Woodward. Woodward scored first and added the point after

Larry Hughes is tripped up in the Preview by a Taft tackler.

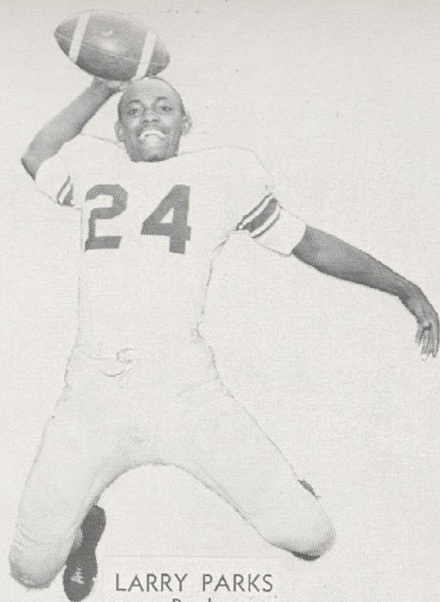

A short jump pass from Parks to Bobby Williams for the extra points was blocked. Hughes' defense was so potent that the Warriors never penetrated past Hughes' 25-yard line. This victory boosted the morale of the Big Reds for their last game.

Hughes' final encounter was with Taft. When the two teams met in 1958, Hughes was on top of the league and Taft was on the bottom. Hughes' over-confidence and Taft's determination combined to produce a most humiliating defeat for the Big Reds. This year Hughes was out for revenge. In the first game, Hughes trounced Walnut Hills 36-6. The second game found Hughes on top of Western Hills 6-0, with Keith Taylor scoring the only touchdown. With a championship Reserve team and many returning lettermen, Coach Howard Thomas hopes for a winning varsity season in 1960.

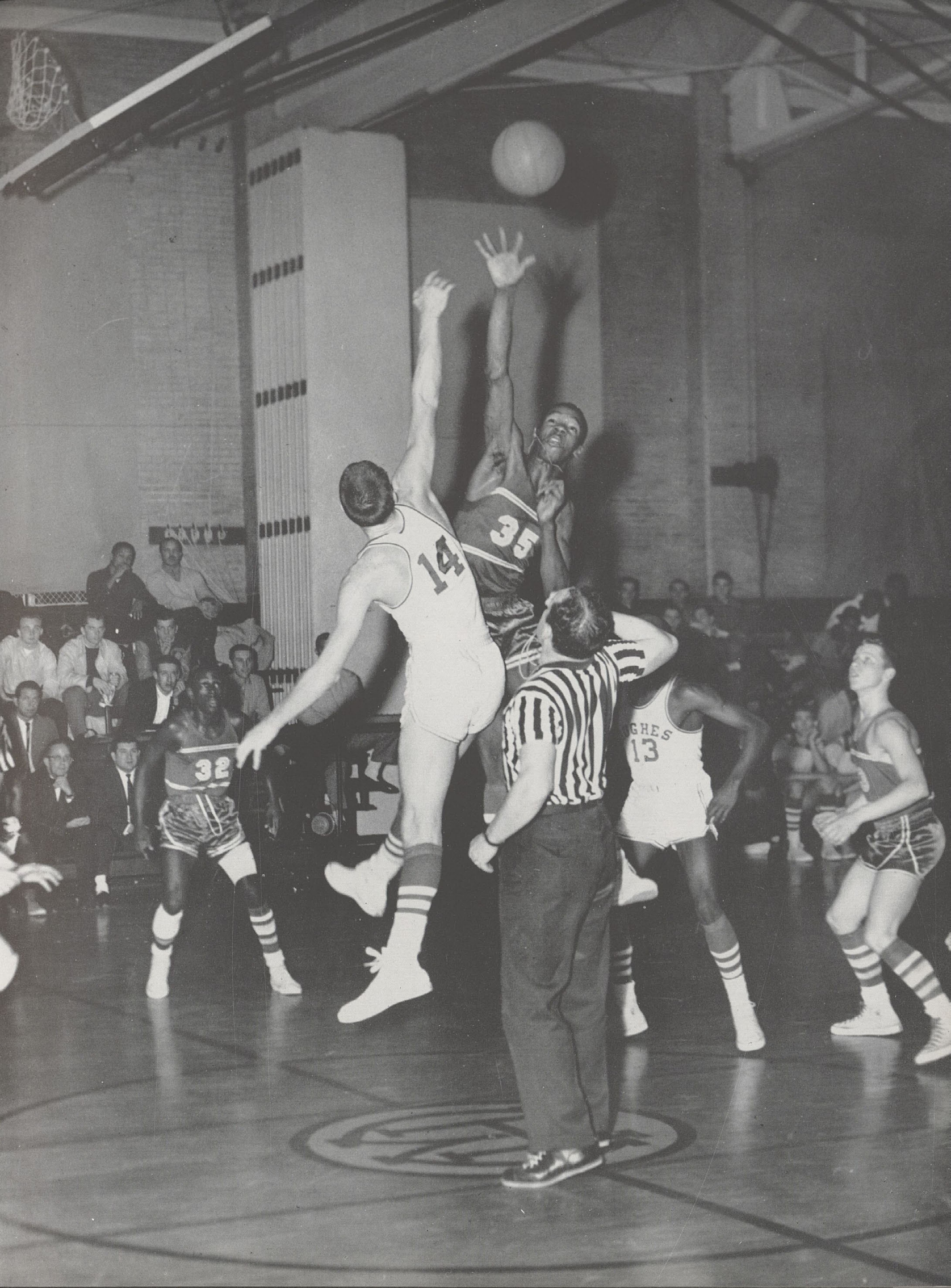

## Hoopsters' High Hopes For

Hughes's Big Red basketball team, showing real potential at the beginning of the season, disappointed their fans by winning only two league games, both over Walnut Hills. The only seniors returning to the squad were Ron Ward, Bob Williams, Dick Fischer and Floyd Simpson. Bob Standley, the junior whom Coach Grimes expected to produce the most points, came through and finished second in the PHSL with an average of 22.7. The team ended the season in fifth place in league play.

In the Preview at the Cincinnati Gardens, Hughes looked good in beating Woodward and Purcell in two different quarters. The Big Reds looked even better when they beat Monroe 77-49 on the loser's floor. Bob Standley got 23 points, the game high, with Ron Ward adding 20 more and Bob Williams, 14.

The next game Hughes played arch-rival Roger Bacon. Standley, Williams and Ward again led the way with 25, 20 and 13 points, respectively. The Big Reds, never in trouble, led all the way. Fischer and Simpson also broke into the scoring column, each adding four points. The final score was 75-66.

The night after the Bacon game Hughes tangled with a highly-touted Anderson team. After battling on nearly even terms in the first half, Anderson became torrid after intermission and finally defeated Hughes 65-36. Standley fell below his average with only 14 points that night, while Ward added eleven more points and Williams, nine.

Hughes faced Withrow's Tigers in their first league game. Hughes jumped to an early lead but the Tigers led by 10 at the half. Withrow then steadily pulled away and finally won 68-56. Williams was high-point man with 21 points. Then came Standley with 17, Ward with 10, Ragan, Caton and Hart each with two and Fischer and Simpson with one apiece.

With a 2-2 record, Hughes faced Central. The Knights, playing without Larry Elsaesser, managed to slip by Hughes 60-51. Hughes had a deficient second half, point-wise, and Central took advantage of it. Standley topped Hughes with 16 while Williams dropped 14 through and Ward 13.

At Oxford the next night, Hughes won 80-69 against Oxford Talawanda. Standley led the scoring with 29 points and Ward was close behind with 24. Williams got 18, Caton 6 and Fischer 2. Hughes now was 3-3 on the season.

Getting a lift from the Oxford game, Hughes slipped by Walnut Hills in overtime 72-68. All the scoring in the overtime was done by Bob Standley, who hit four of four foul shots. The scoring: Standley, 28; Caton, 17; Williams, 13; Ward, 8; Simpson, Ragan and Lewis each two.

Hughes' next game was with an ever-dangerous Taft team. Hughes, twelve down with only one minute left, staged a valiant rally but fell three points short as Taft won 59-56. None of the Hughes boys could hit as Ward and Williams both had 6 and Standley only 14. However, Ron Caton, an unsung junior pivot man who was continually fed by Beyer and Ragan, pumped in 19 points, 16 coming from the field.

Hughes then took on Woodward and were beaten 68 to 61. Woodward jumped out to a quick lead and was never seriously challenged by Hughes. In the late minutes the Big Reds whittled it to a three-point deficit but Woodward

Three days later Hughes met Withrow at the Gardens and the lopsided score of 73-57 belies the action in the game. At the half the Tigers led by only six, and at the end of the third quarter, the score was tied. Despite Standley's 27 points, Ward's 10, and Williams' and Bunton's six, Hughes could not stop Withrow's drive into the stretch.

Central, back strong as ever with Larry Elsaesser and company, stopped Hughes cold, 80-62. Hughes jumped into a quick lead in the first quarter but the balanced attack of the Knights told the tale as they steadily pulled away. Standley led Hughes with 21 while Ward added 12.

In a non-league game, Hughes faced St. Xavier but lost 77-66. Each team hit on the same number of field goals, but the Bombers outscored the Big Reds on free throws. Standley poured in 21 points while Ward added 15 and Williams 10. Caton added 6, Fischer and Bunton 5 apiece and Beyer and Ragan 2 apiece.

Hughes once again squeaked past Walnut Hills 67-65. Battling on even terms most of the way, Hughes was just one field goal better. Coach Grimes emptied his bench as Standley got 29; Williams, 11; Ward, 8; Simpson, 5; Fischer, 3; Caton and Rhoden, 2.

Hughes, again playing Taft at Taft, lost by the close score of 65-60. Before a slim crowd of Huzites, Taft put on a full-court press in the third quarter to shake the Big Reds up. The Senators scored 12 more points then, which told the story. Standley led with 19, and Williams contributed 17 and Ward 11.

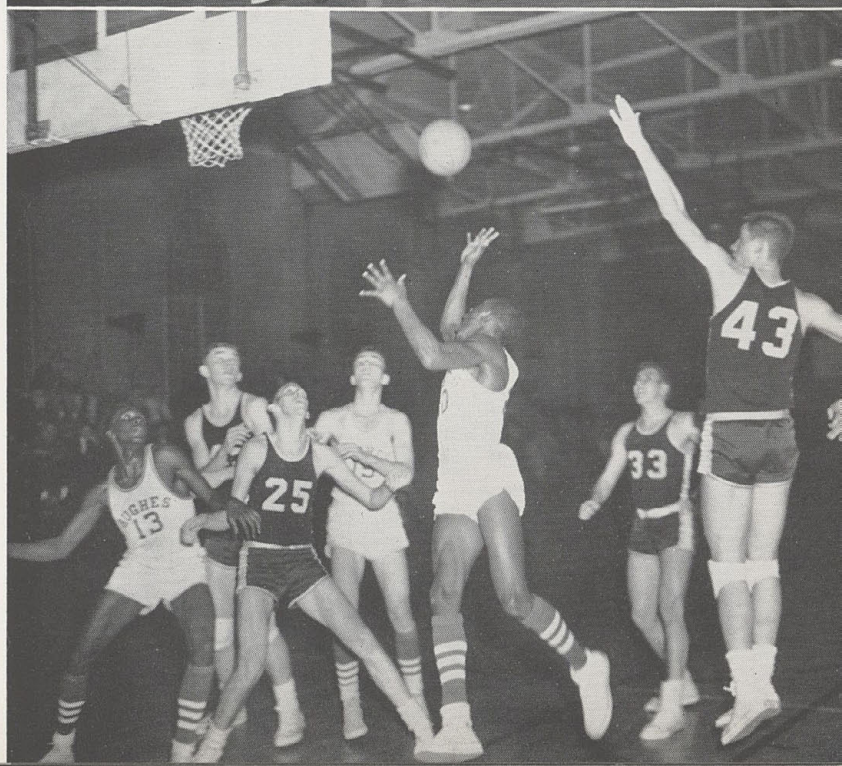
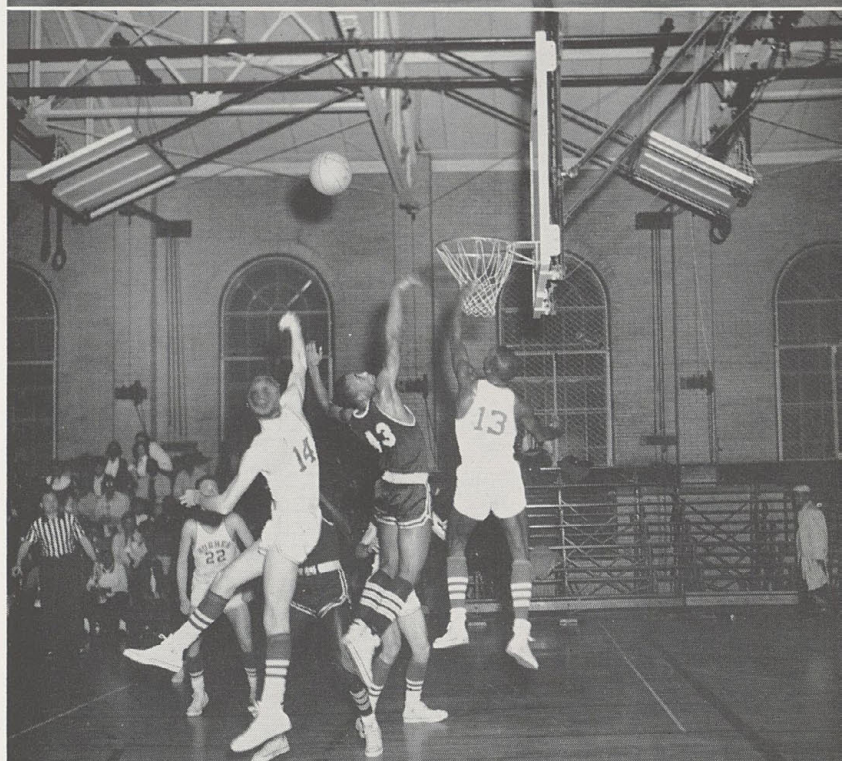
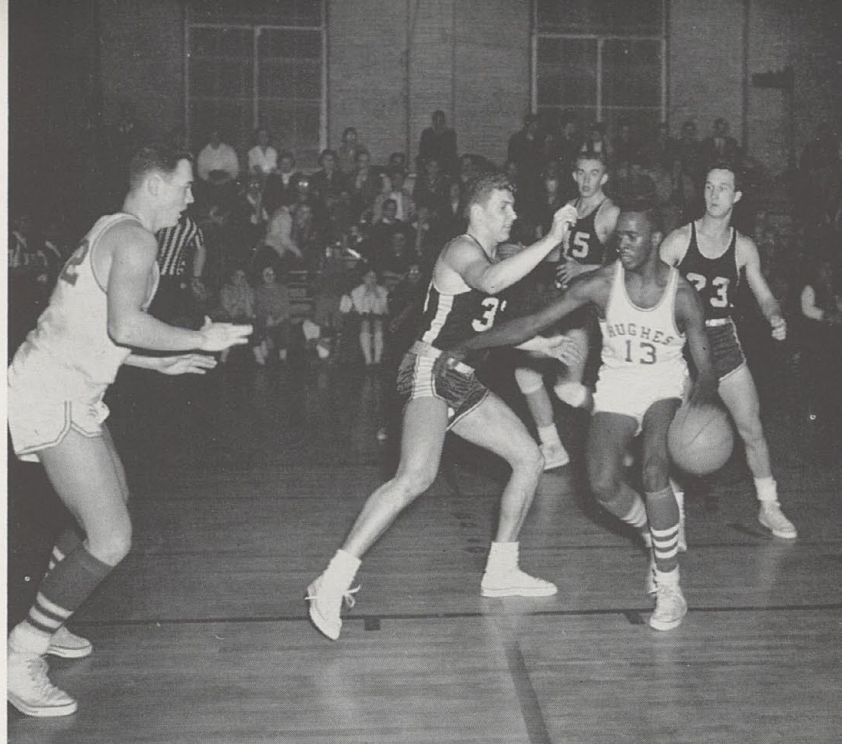

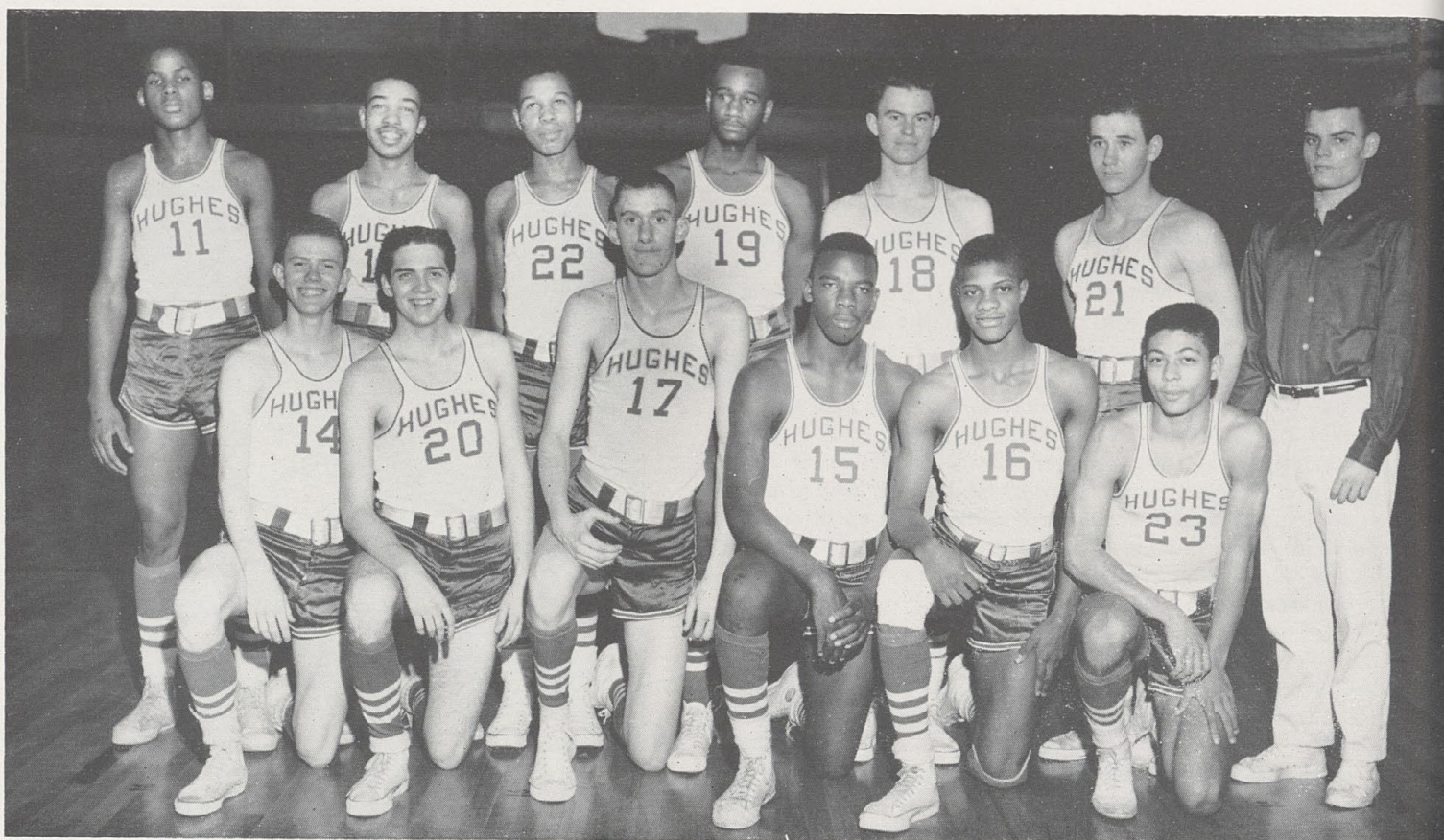

## Hard-Fighting Reserve Team Takes Second-Place Honors

The Hughes Big Red Reserve Team fared better than the varsity as it finished the season with a 9 won, 8 lost record. Hughes was second in the league with a 6-6 record, just behind Central and Taft, who were tied for first. Most teams in the PHSL have juniors on their teams but it is an unwritten rule at Hughes that the Reserve team is composed only of sophomores. Three scoring standouts this year include Kenny Hicks, Marvin Saylor, and Tom Mineard. Hicks at guard, sports a team high average of 12.9 points a game. Saylor, also a guard, is next with a 9.9 average and Mineard, Hughes' 6'8" center, averaged 9.1. 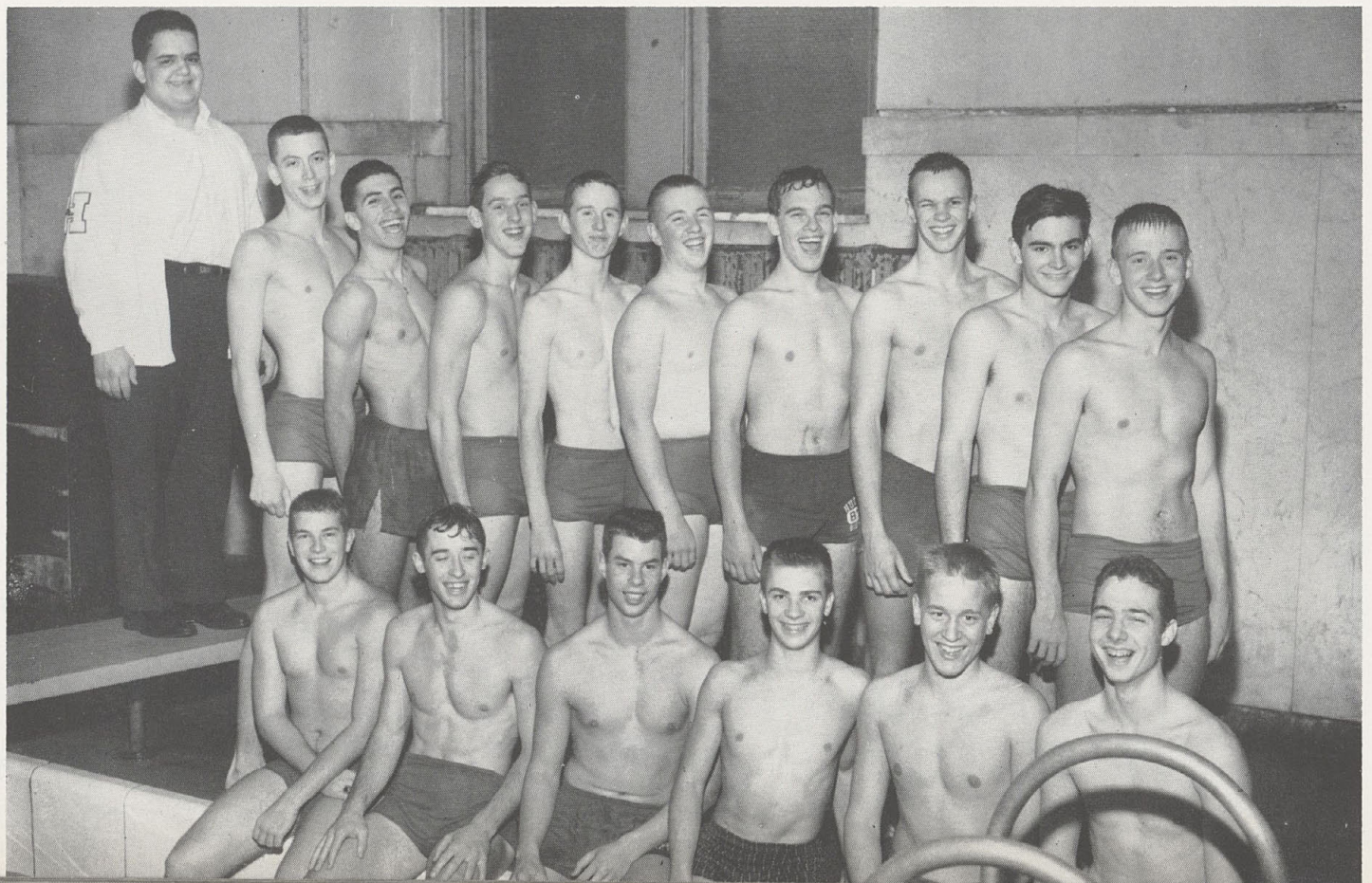

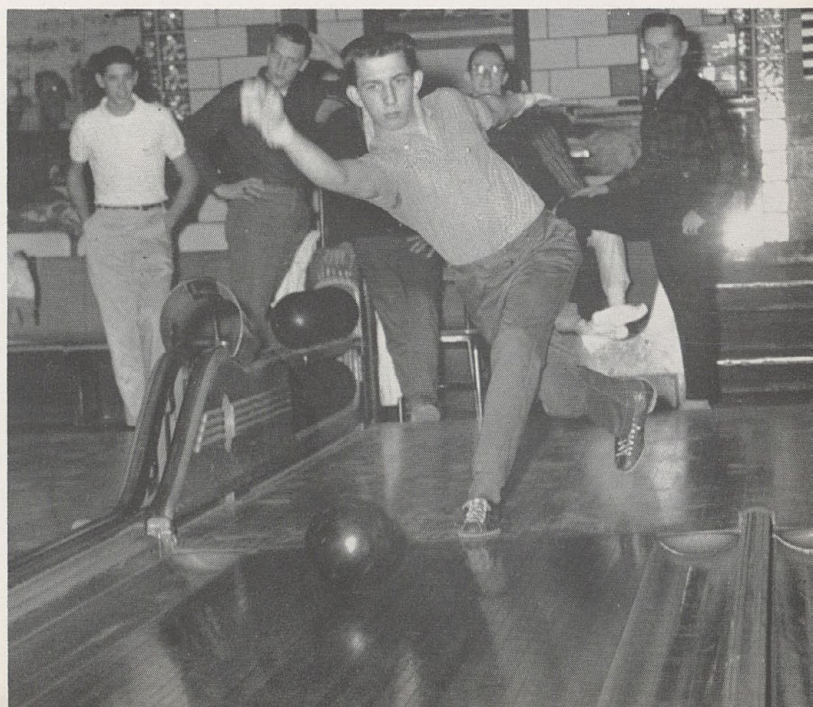

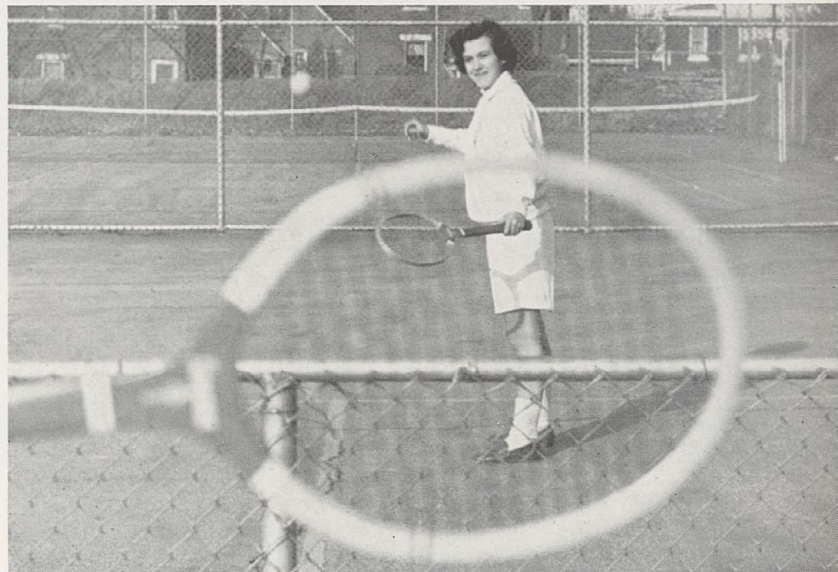


## Tennis

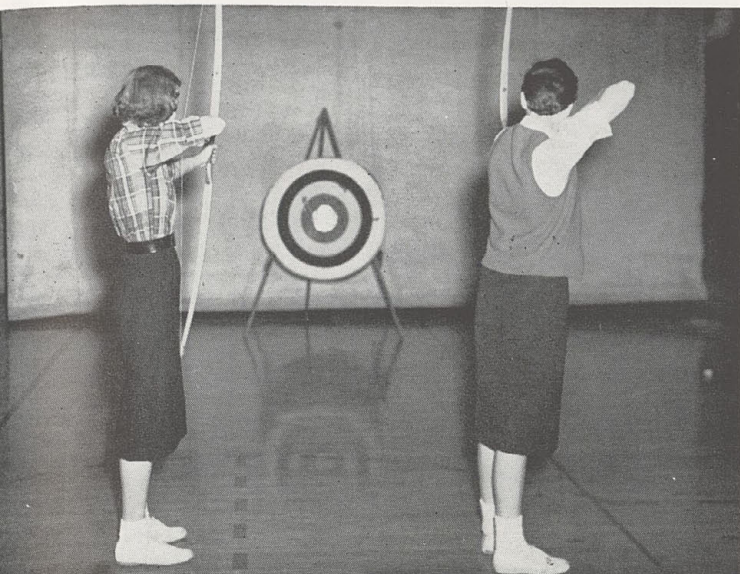
Paula Neumann

## Individual Sports

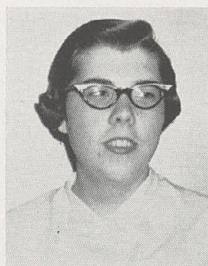

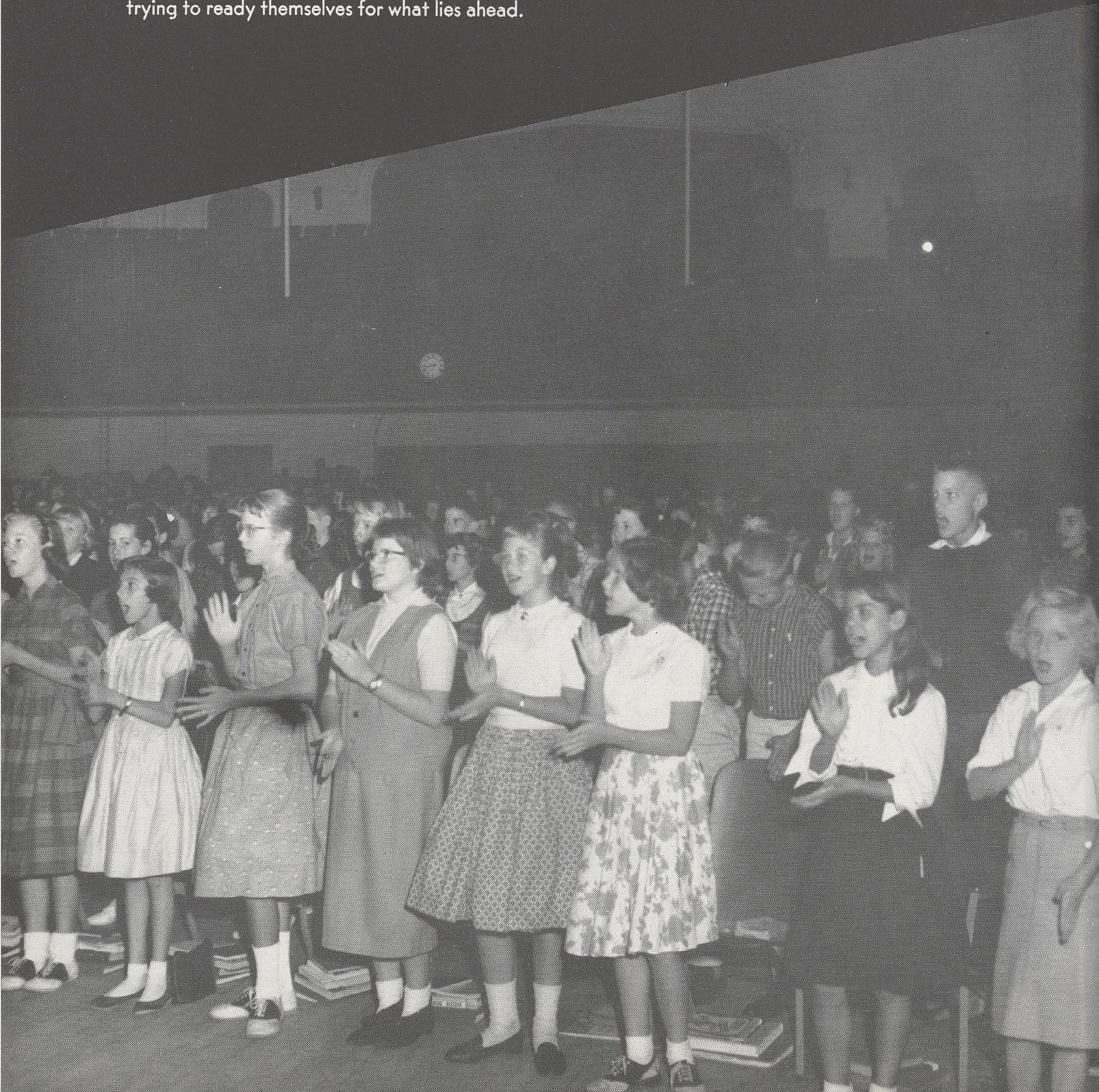

trying to ready themselves for what lies ahead.











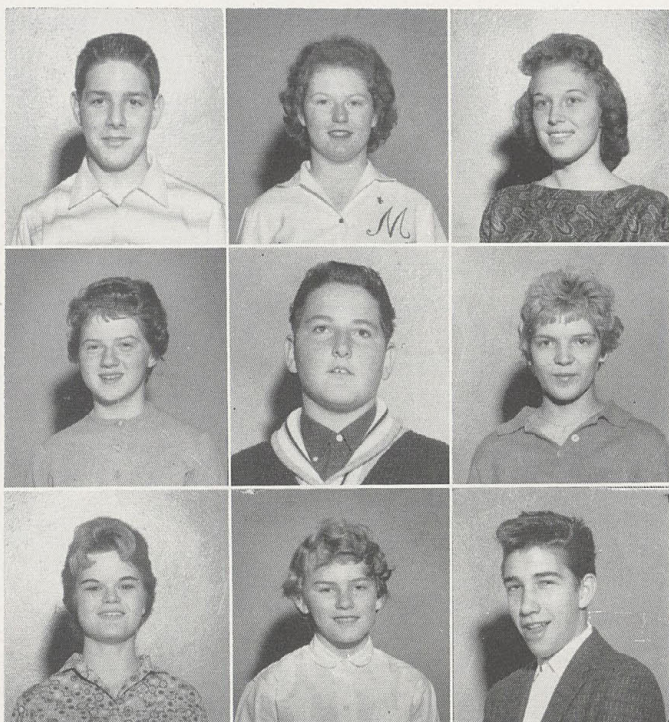

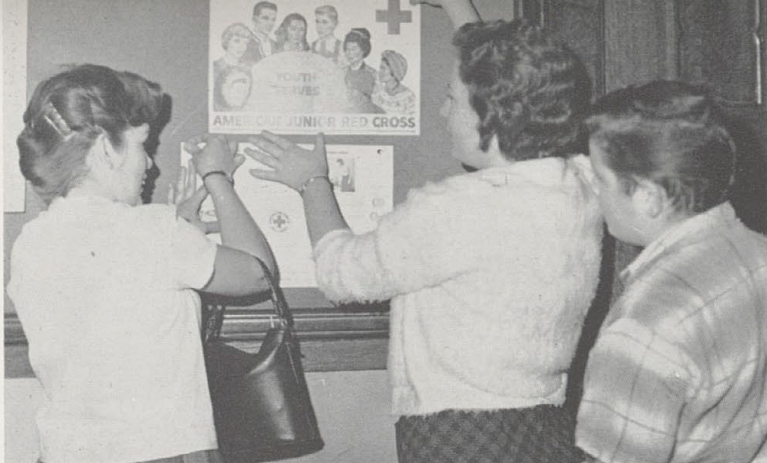
## Honor For High Grades

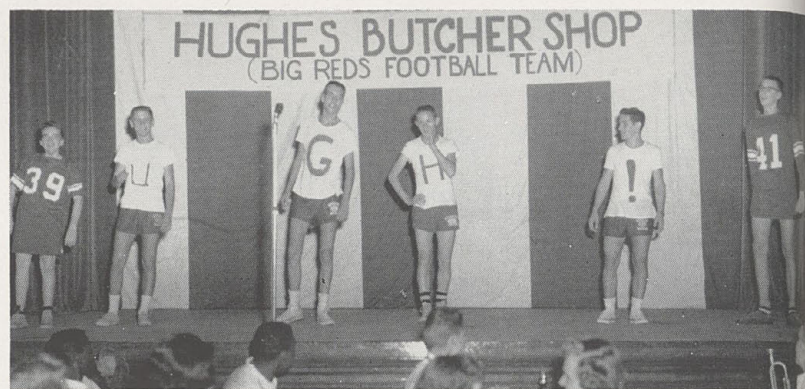

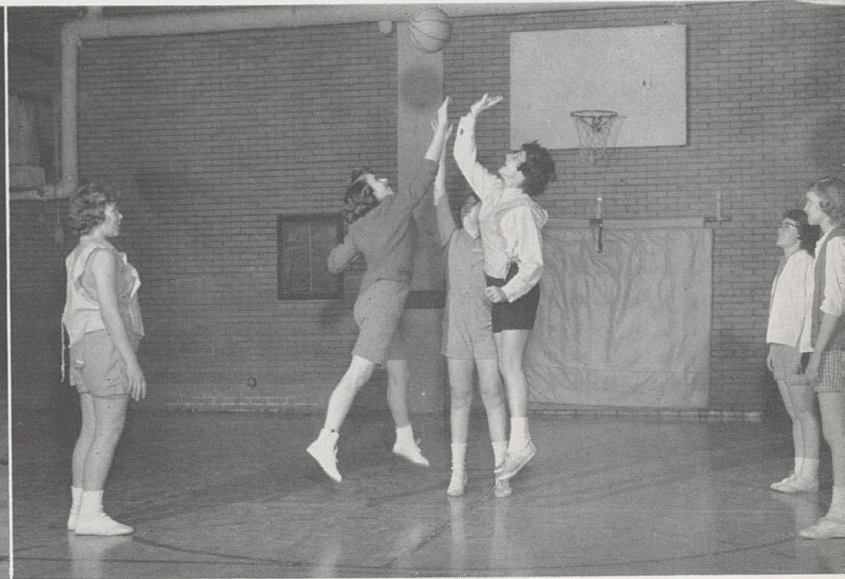

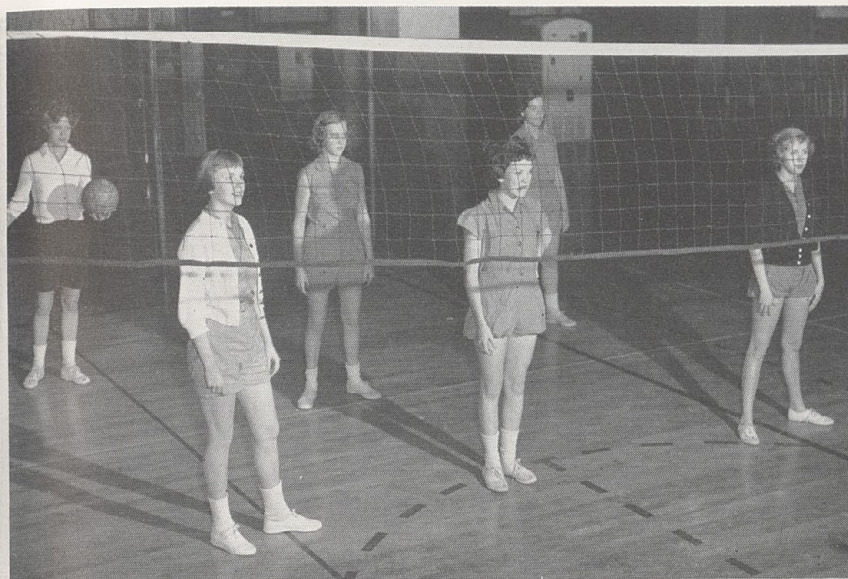
