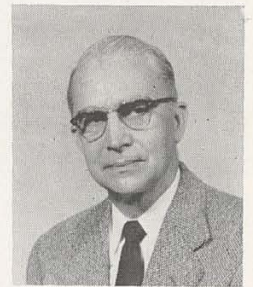


Students, Enlightened About American Way
