

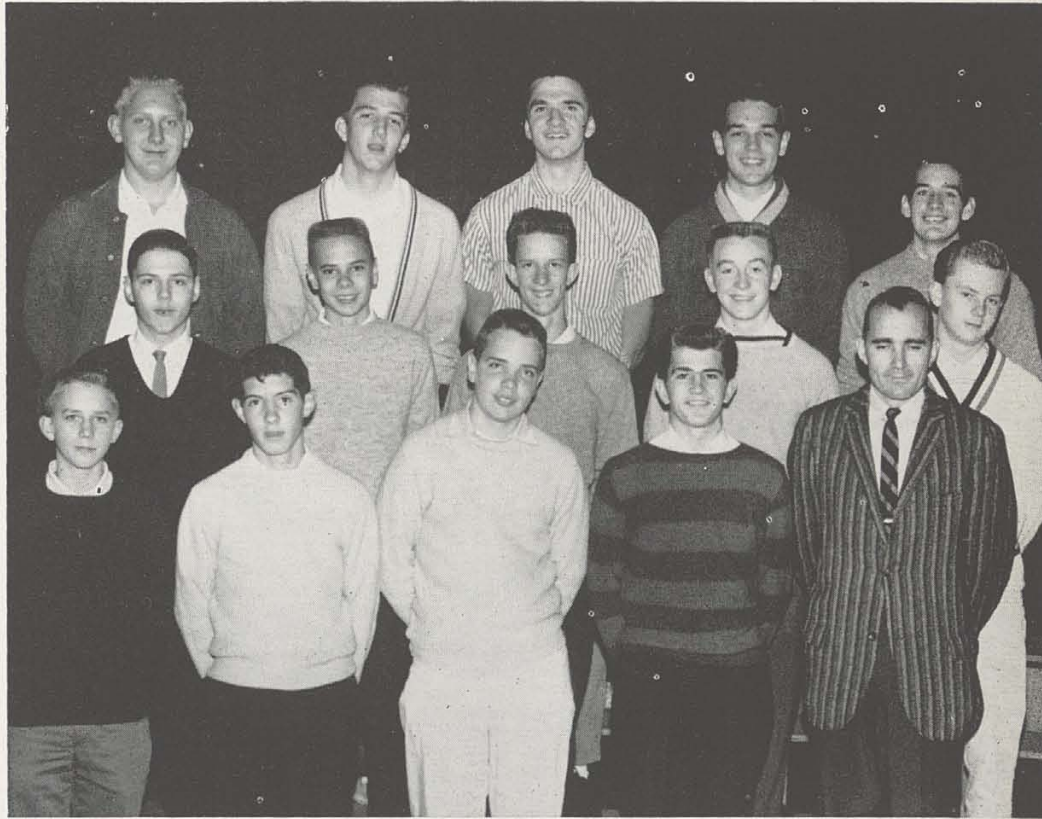
# Krueck Boys Start Needed Project
