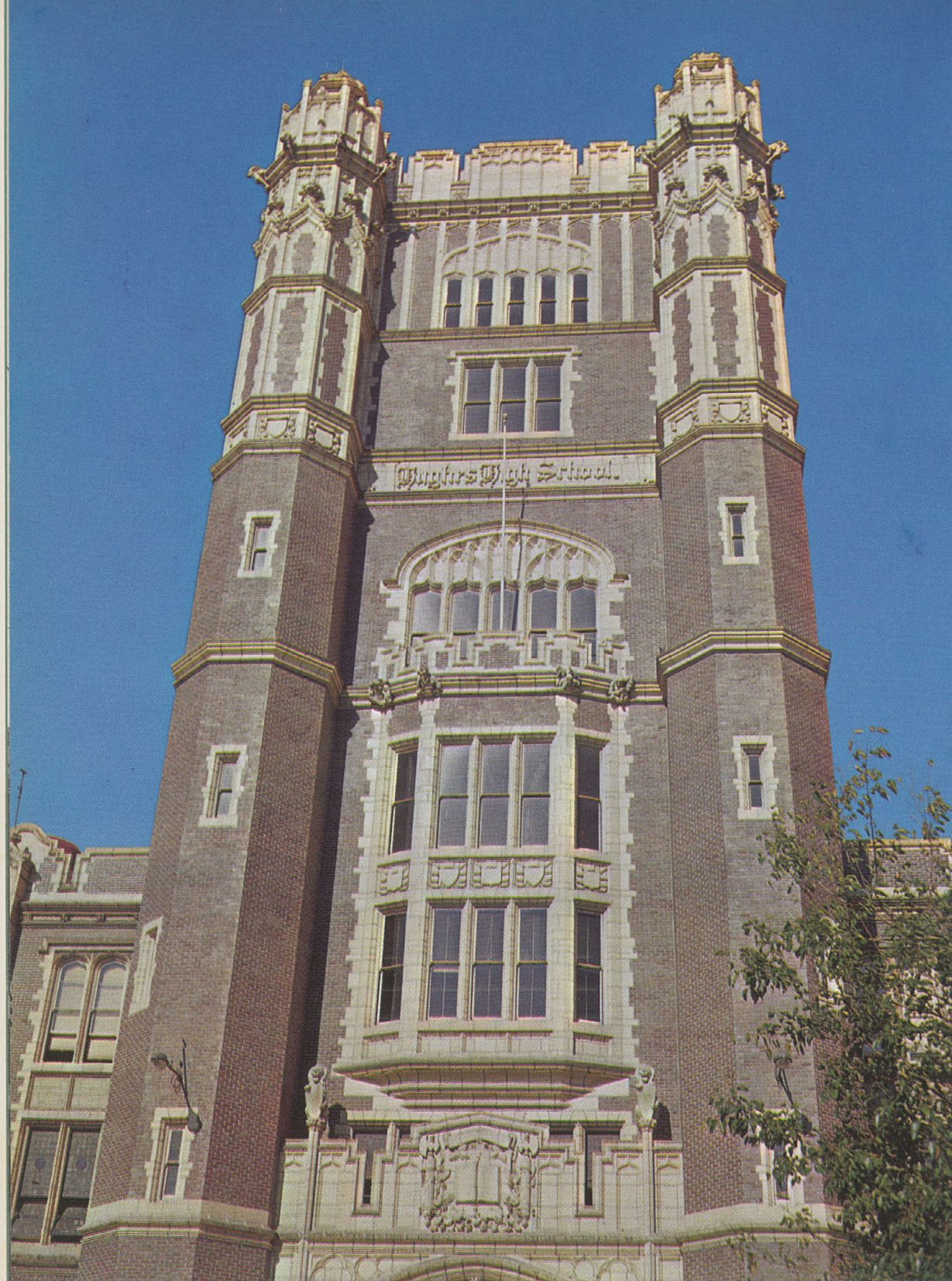

Mr. Hobson, Mr. Jones Supervise All Student Activities

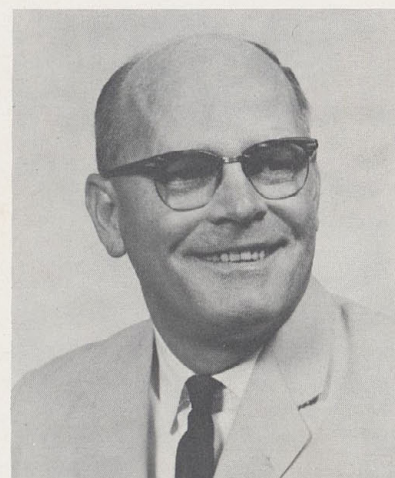

Enlarged Counseling Staff Offers Beneficial Guidance



Three new counselors came to Hughes this year. All have had experience as teachers, and all possess master degrees from various universities.

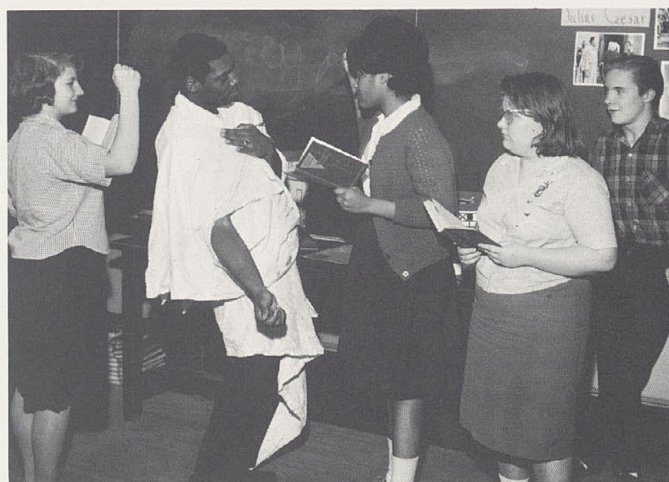

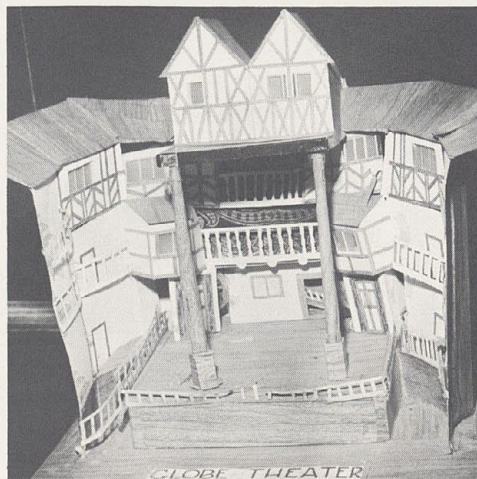


Hughes Joins Rest of World in Celebrating 400th Anniversary of Shakespeare's Birth

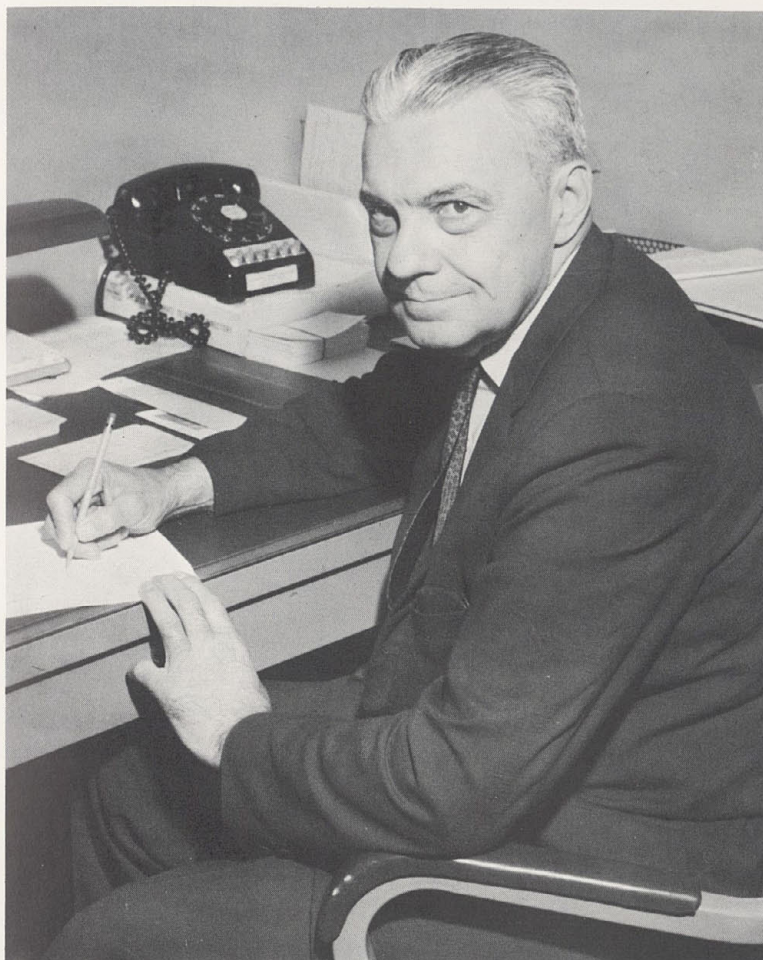
IN MEMORIAM

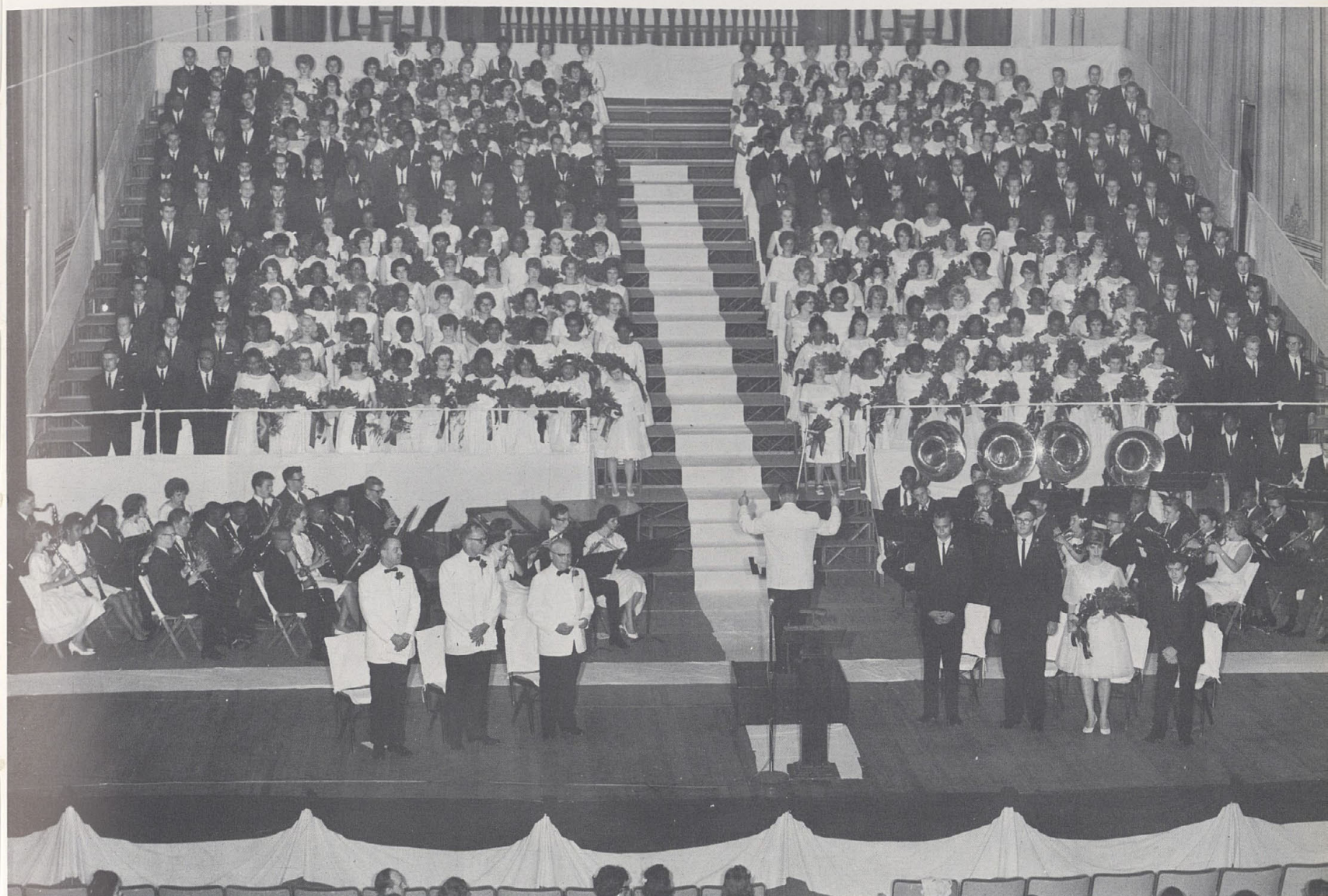

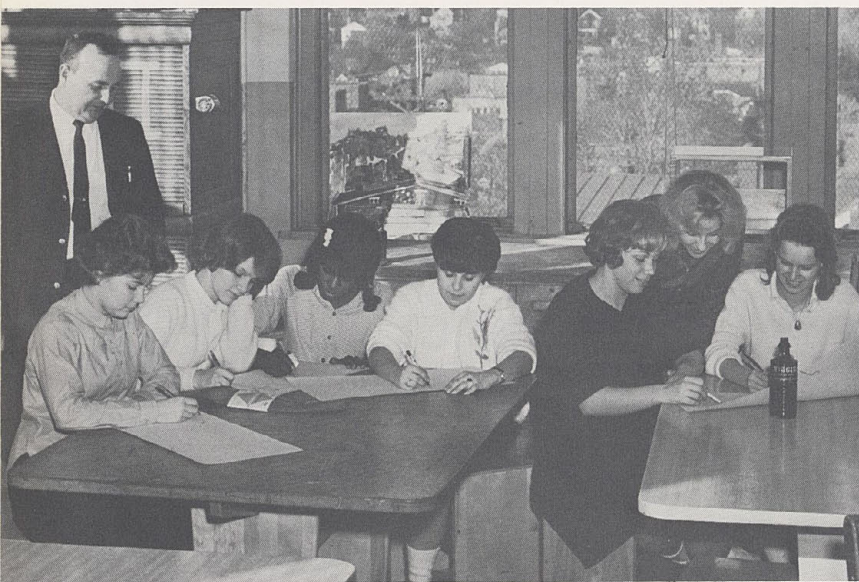

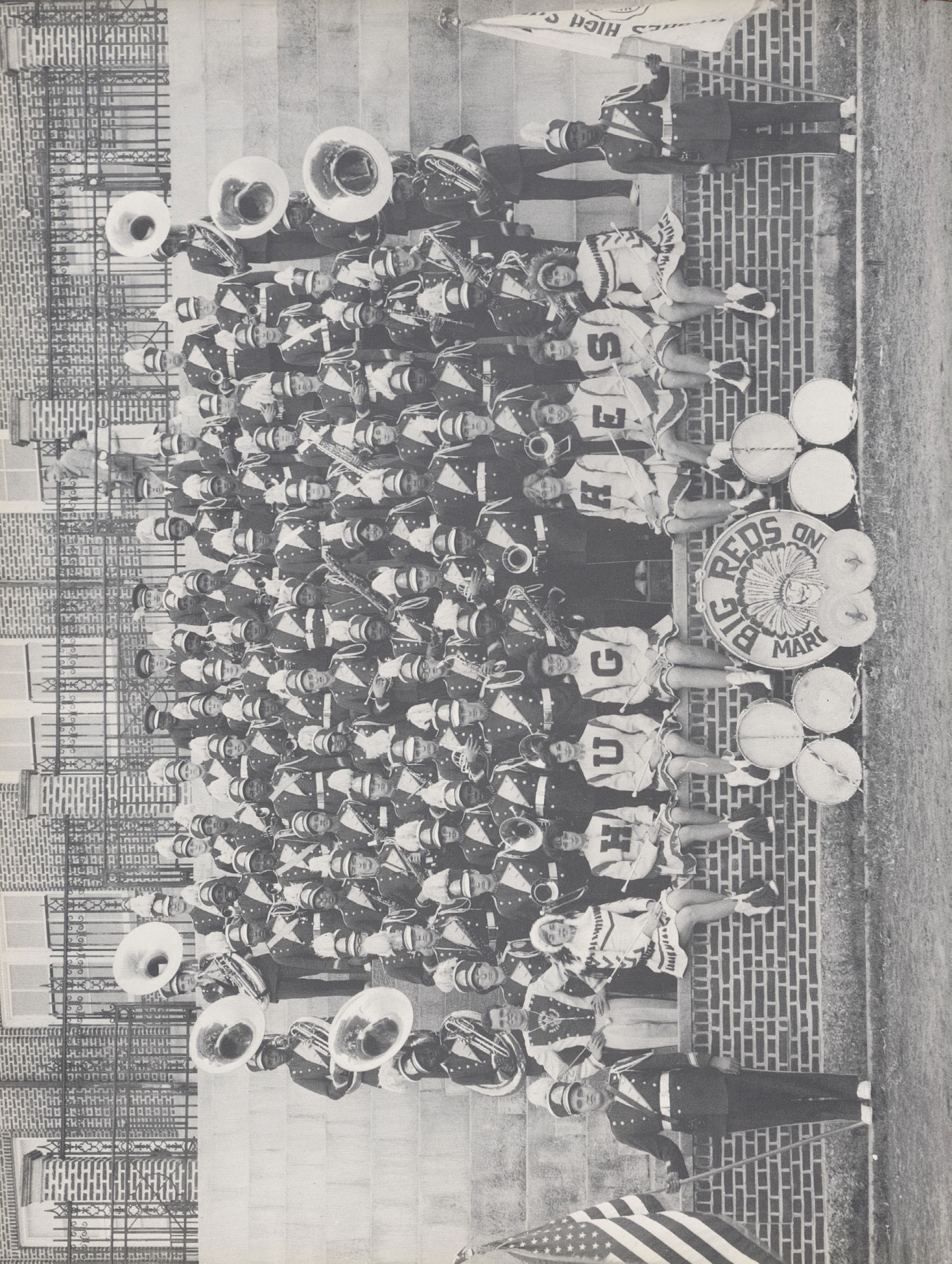

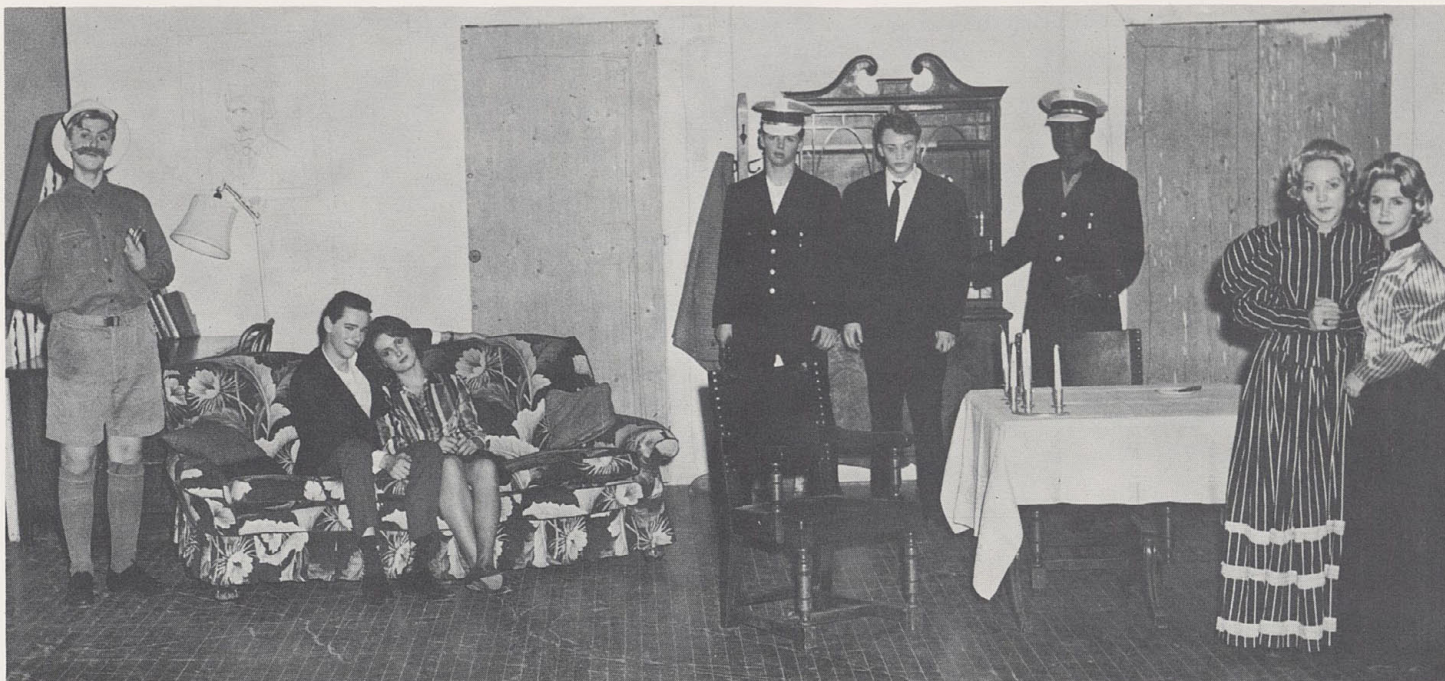

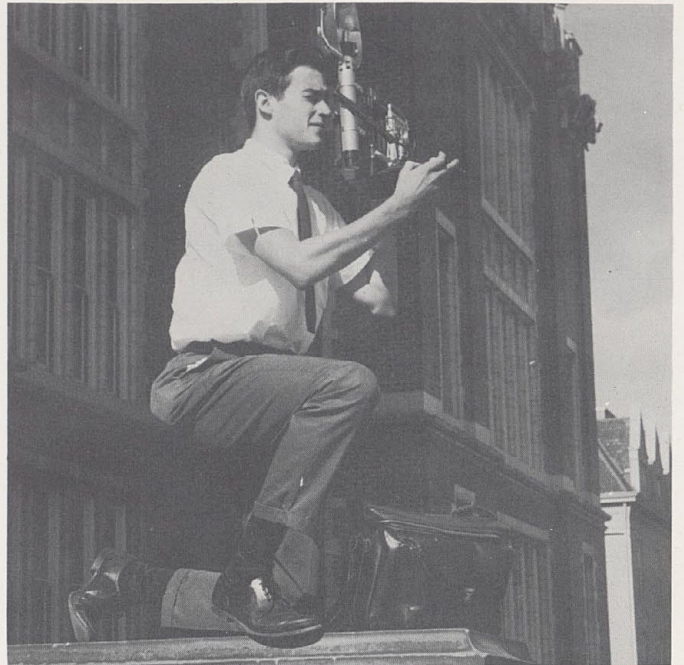
Facts and Fancies of '64

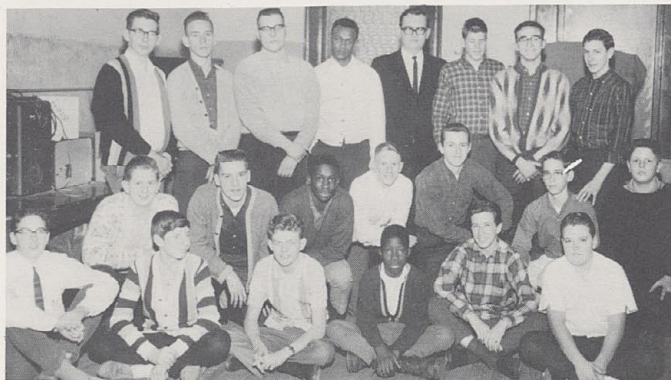

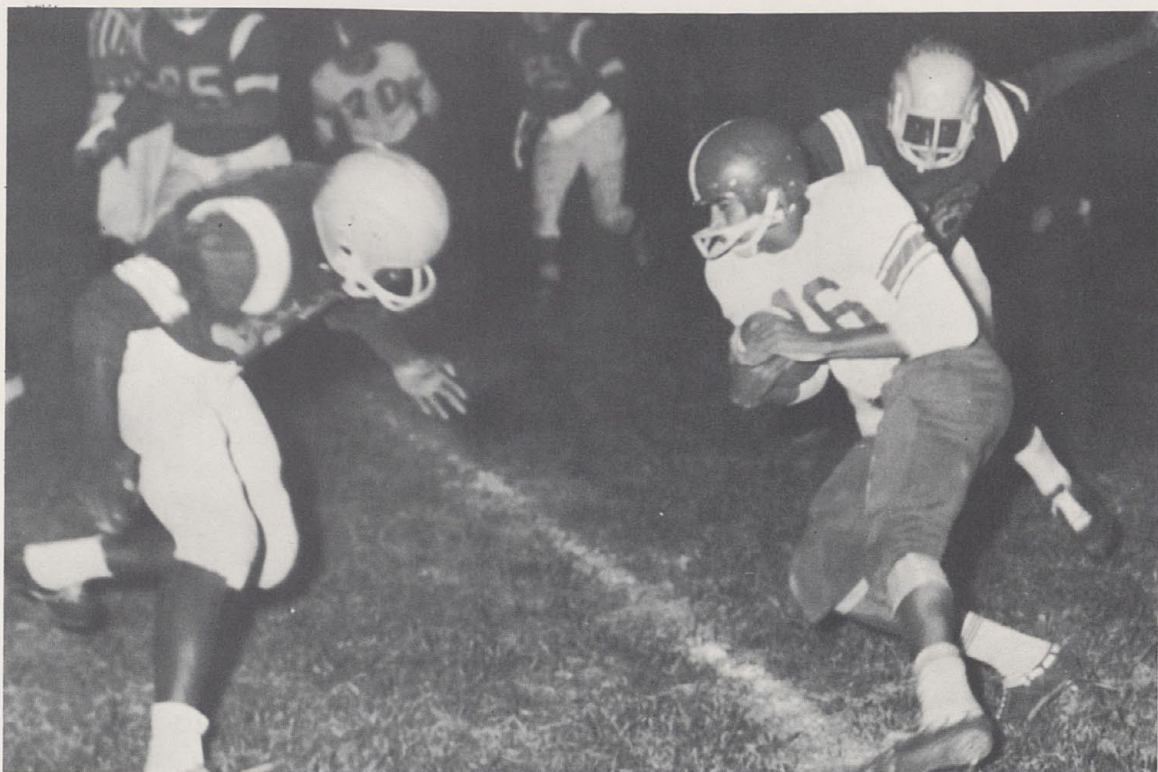
The most consistent runners for the team were John Ziegler, Herbert Thompson, Woodrow Fairbanks, and Bill McElory.

The final Reserve meet of the year found Gregg Ziegler, John's younger brother, finishing first for Hughes and ninth in the over-all field of runners.



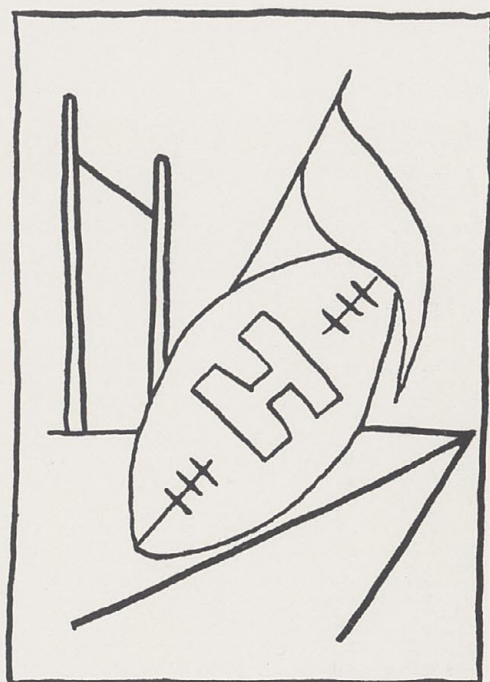

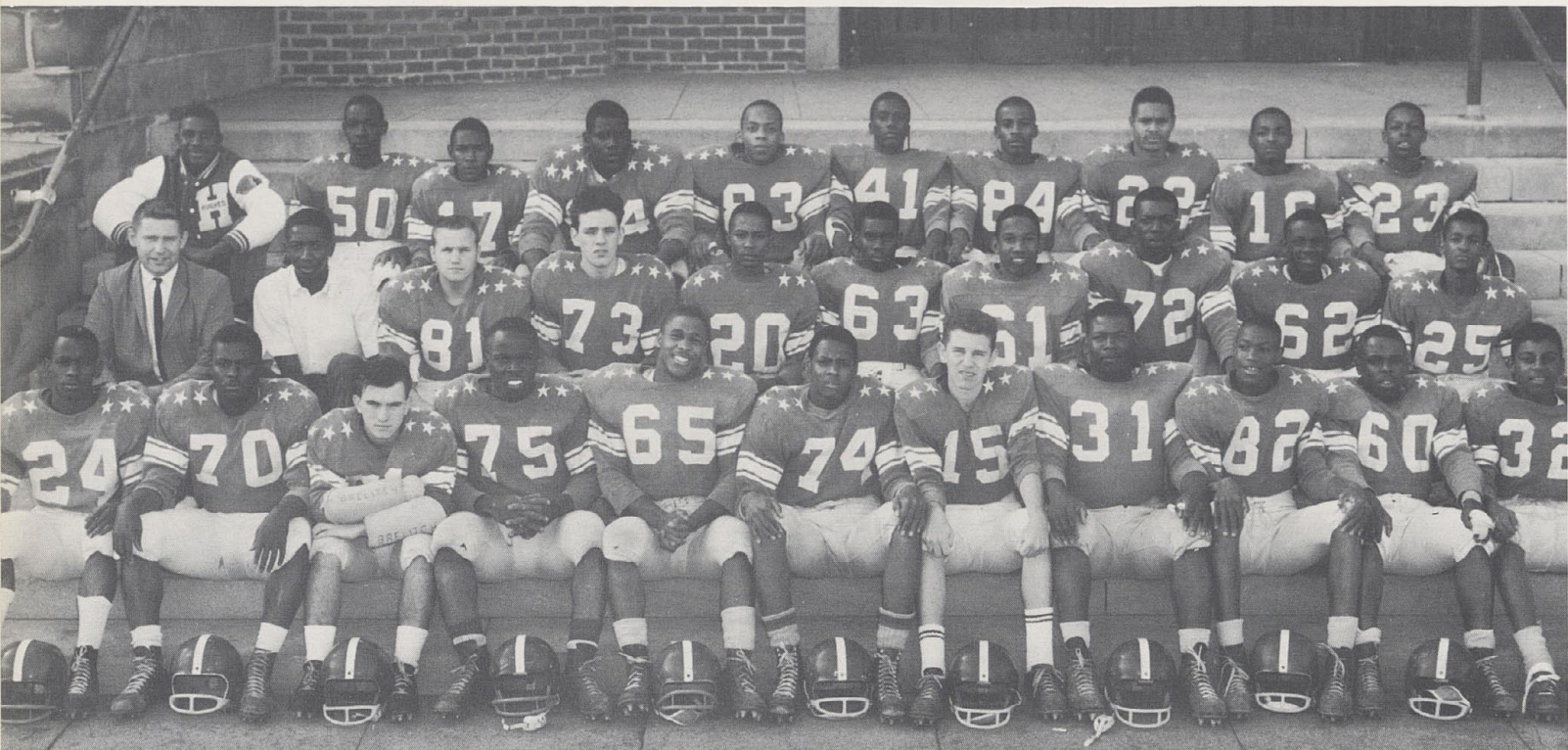

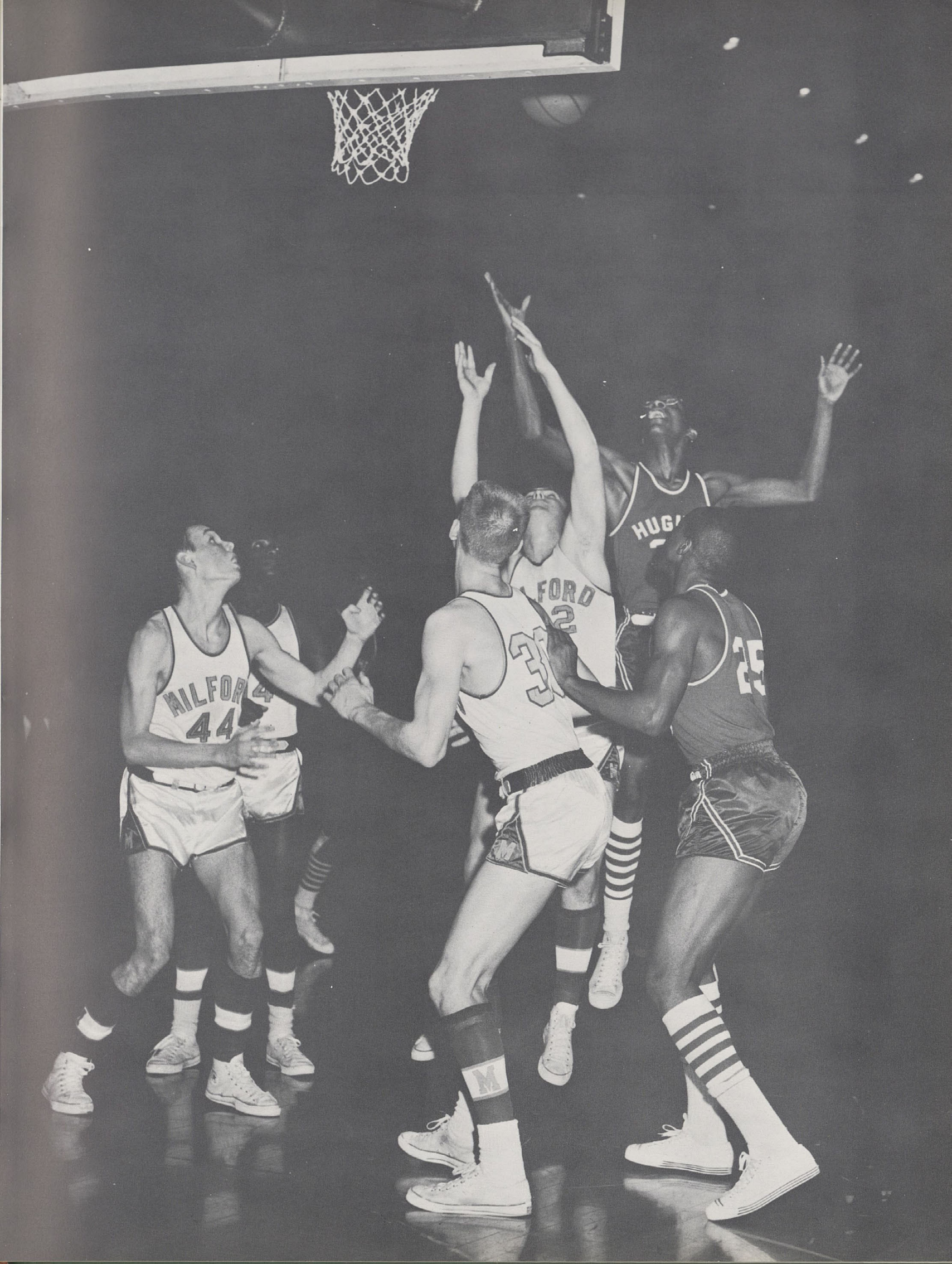
Big Reds Go "Forward '64" to Finals of Tournament

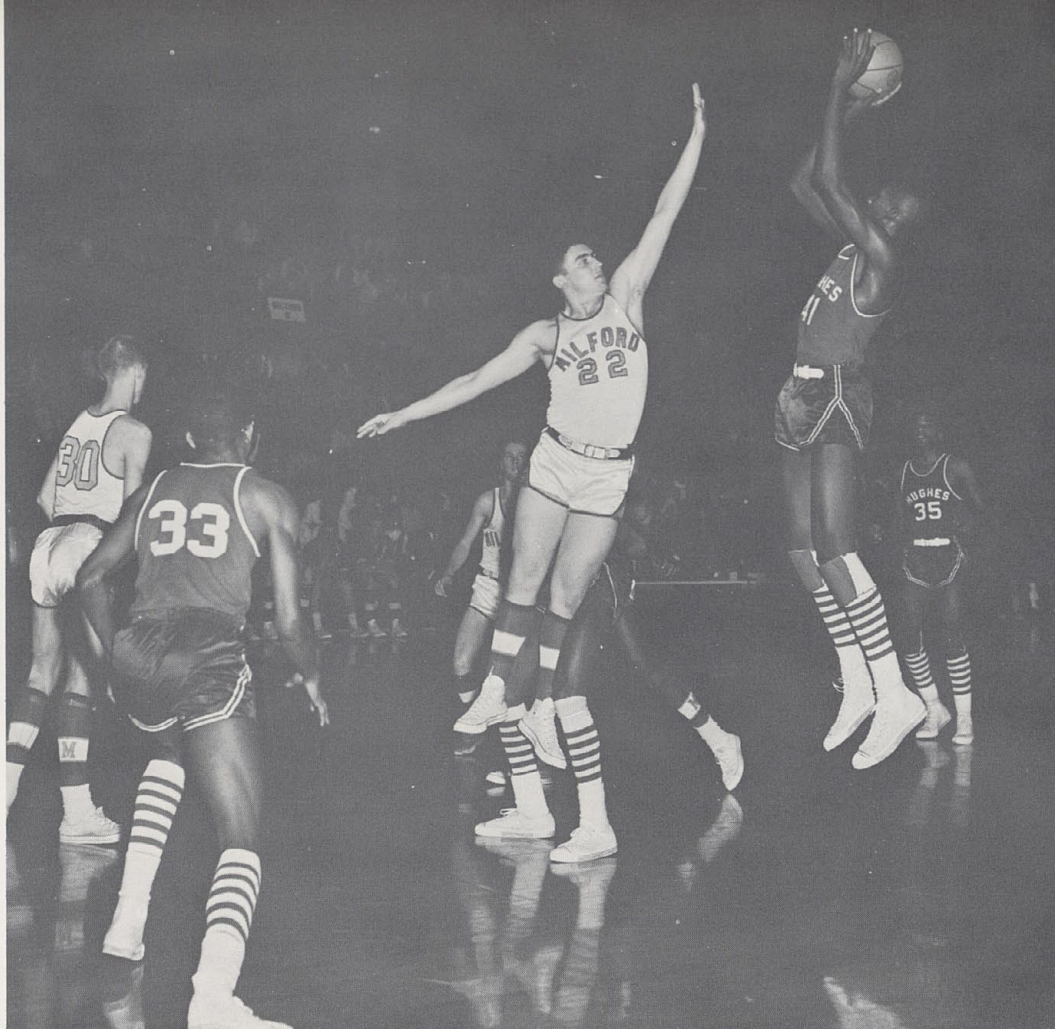

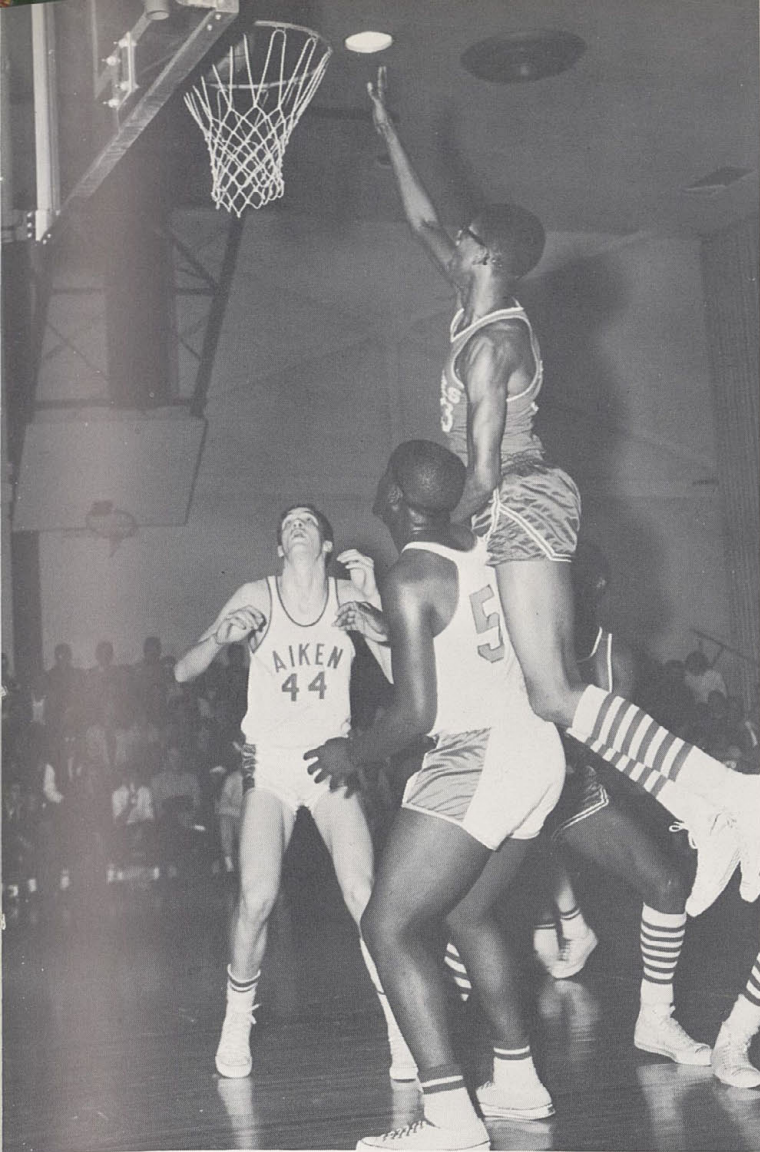

Season in Fifth Place

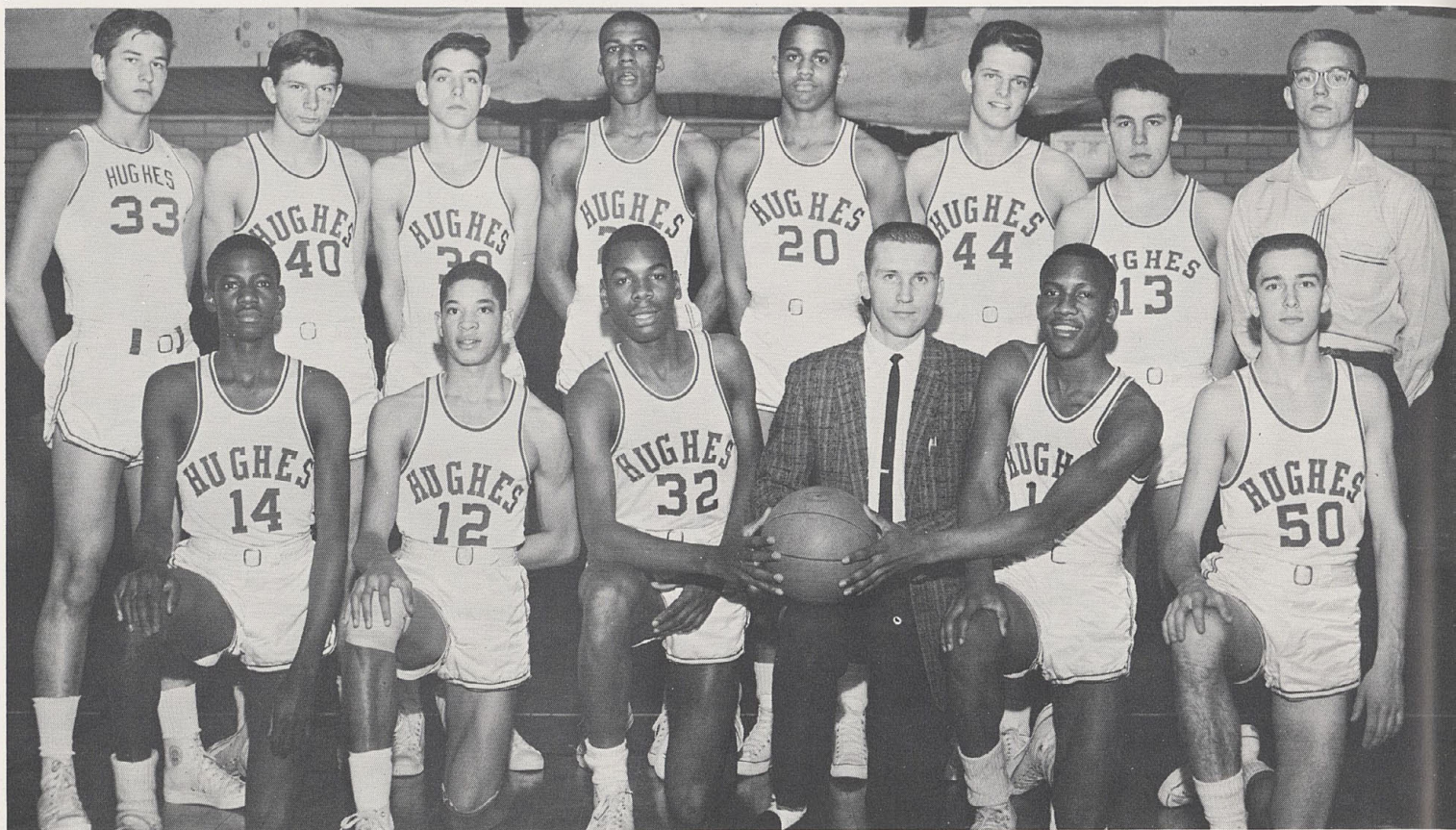
The reserve team finished the season with a 7-11 overall record and a 6-8 record in the Public High School League. This record placed them in a fifth-place position in the Public High School League for the season.

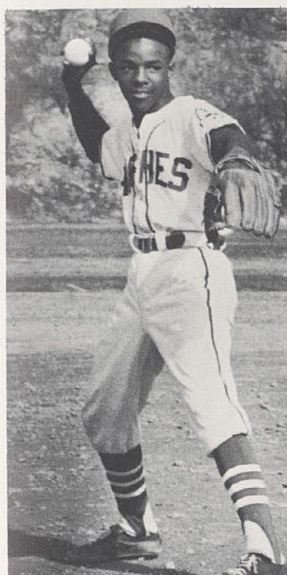

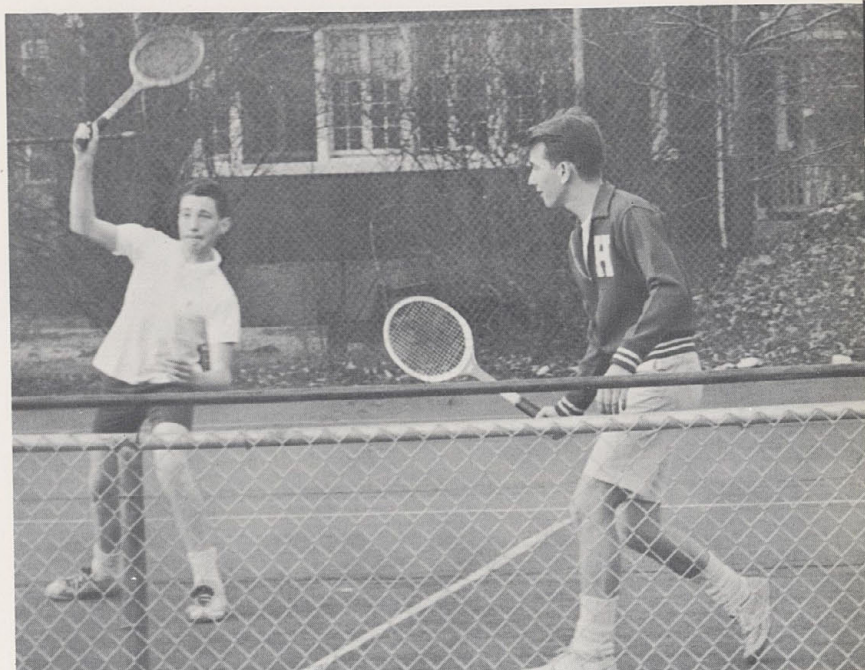
The '64 squad is a young team made up of all sophomores and juniors, with no seniors on the roster.

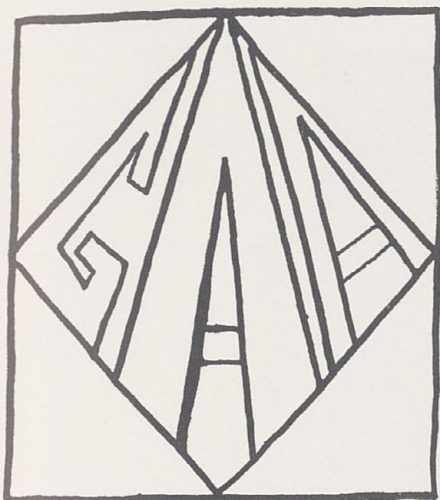
Sponsors, Board Members Work Diligently Together

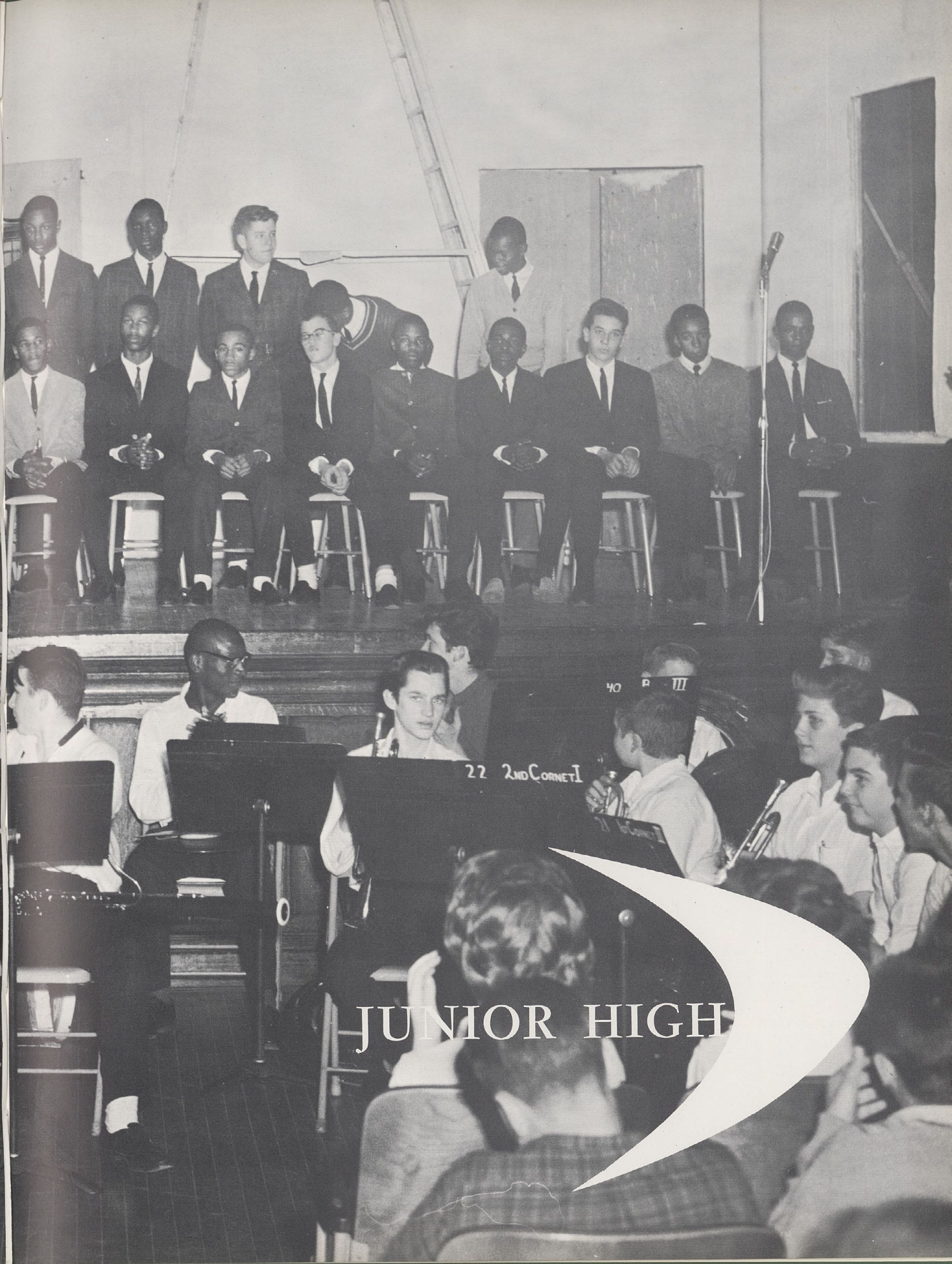

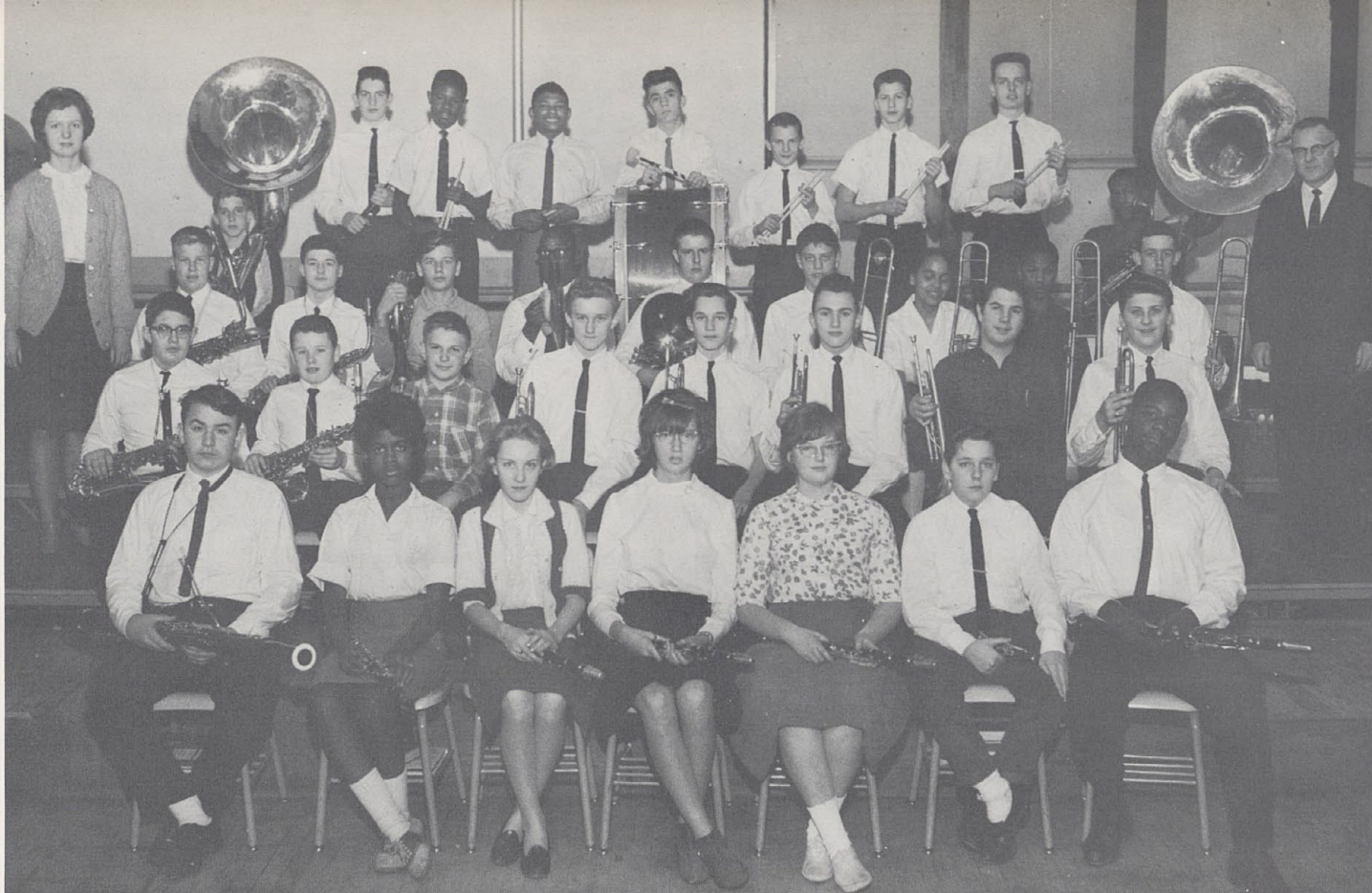

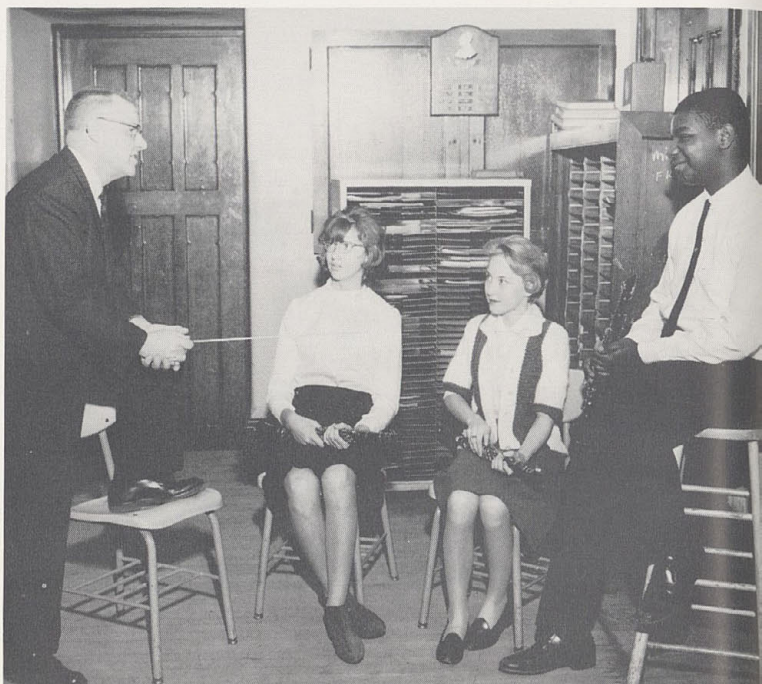

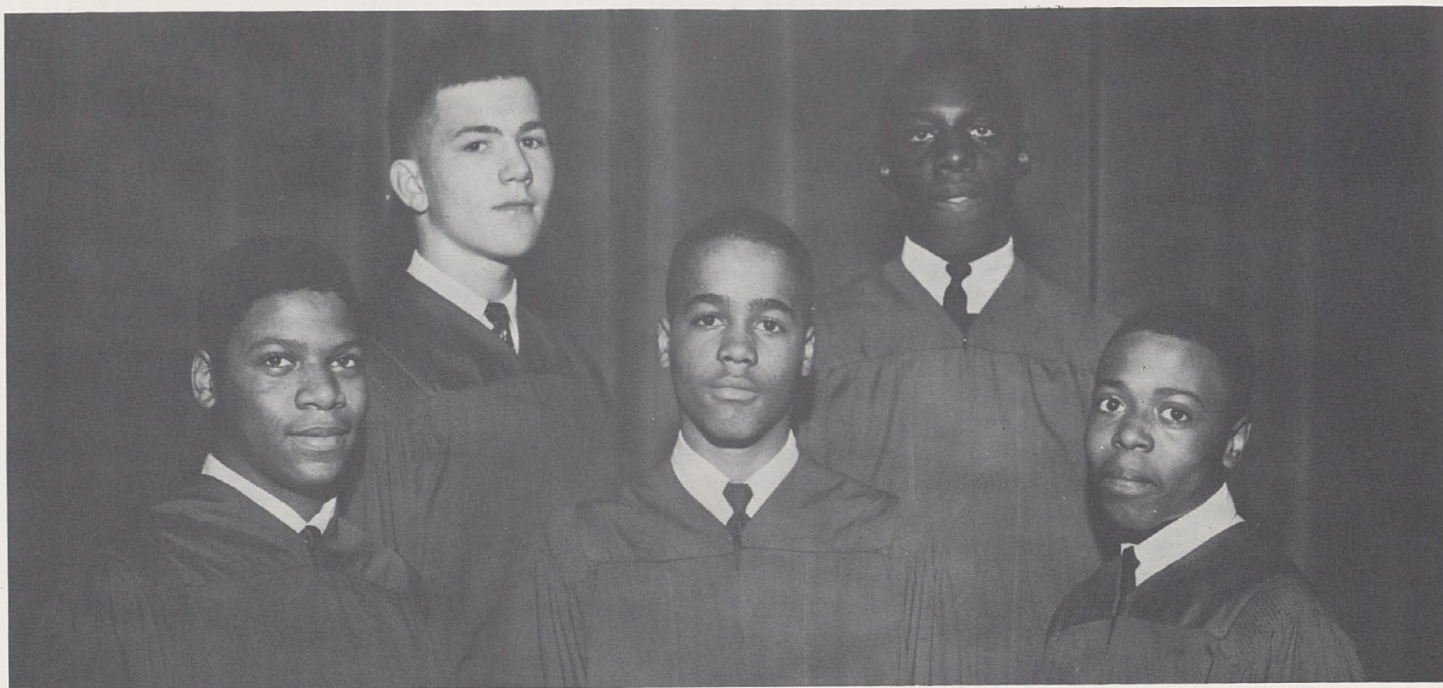

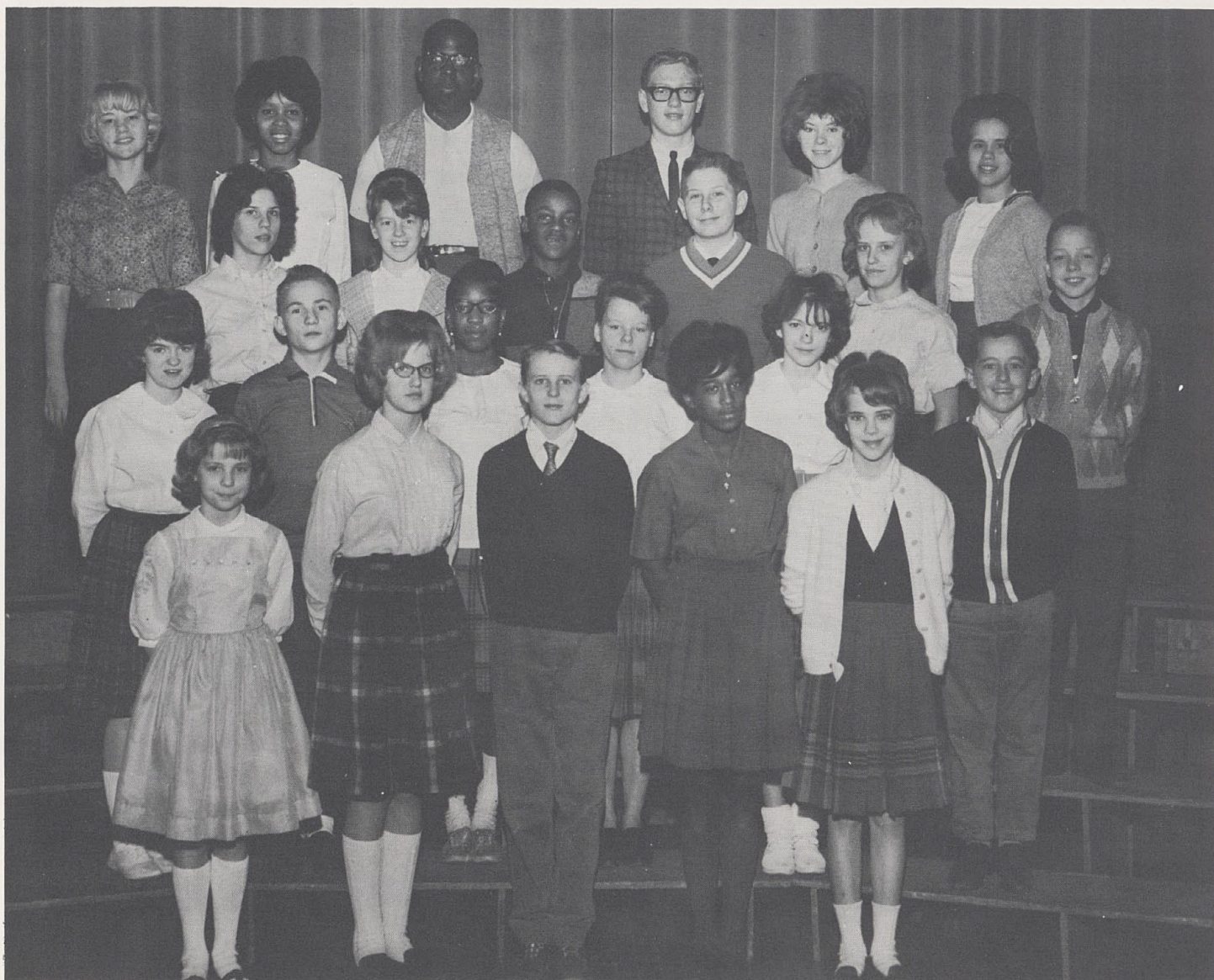

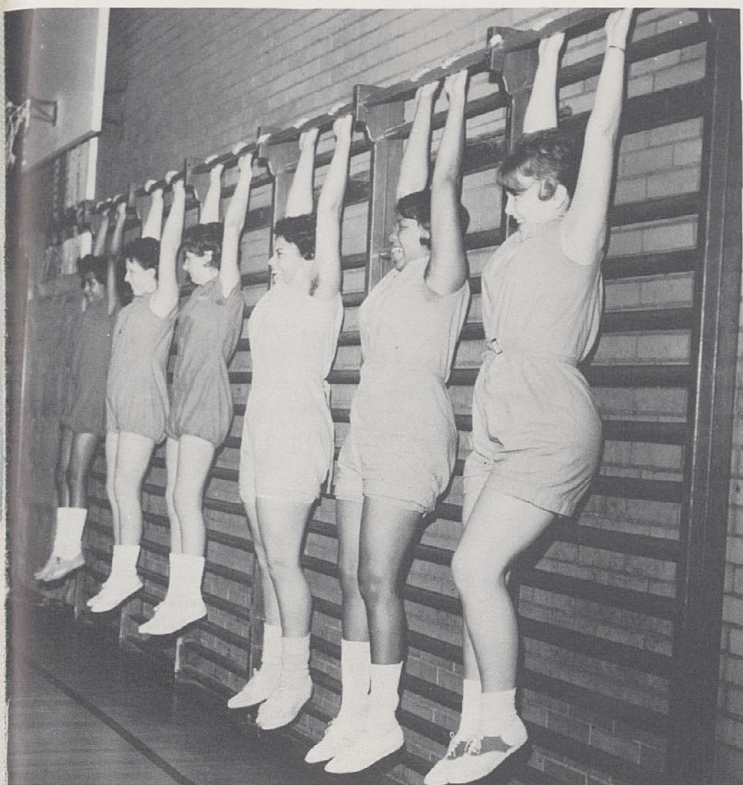

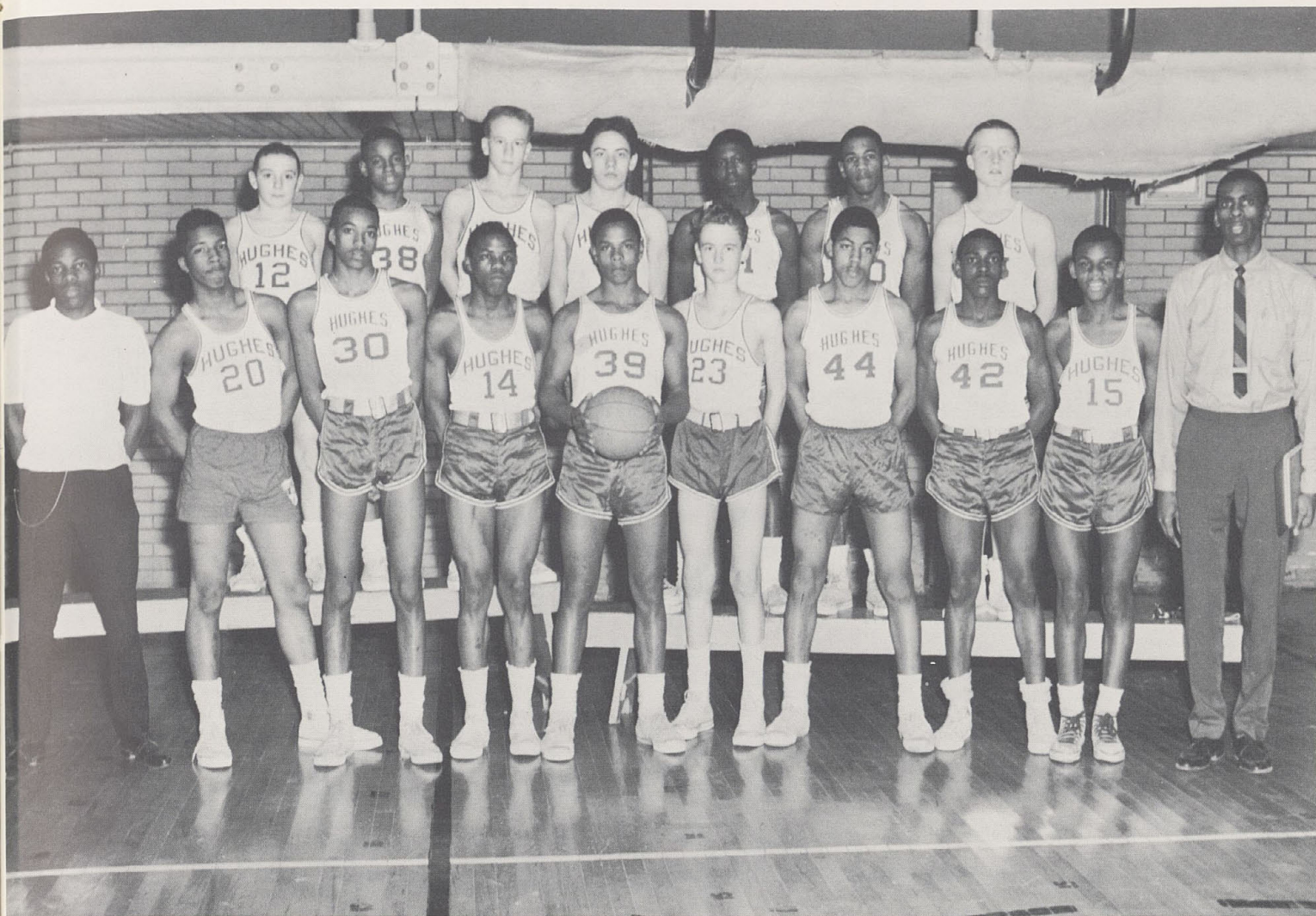

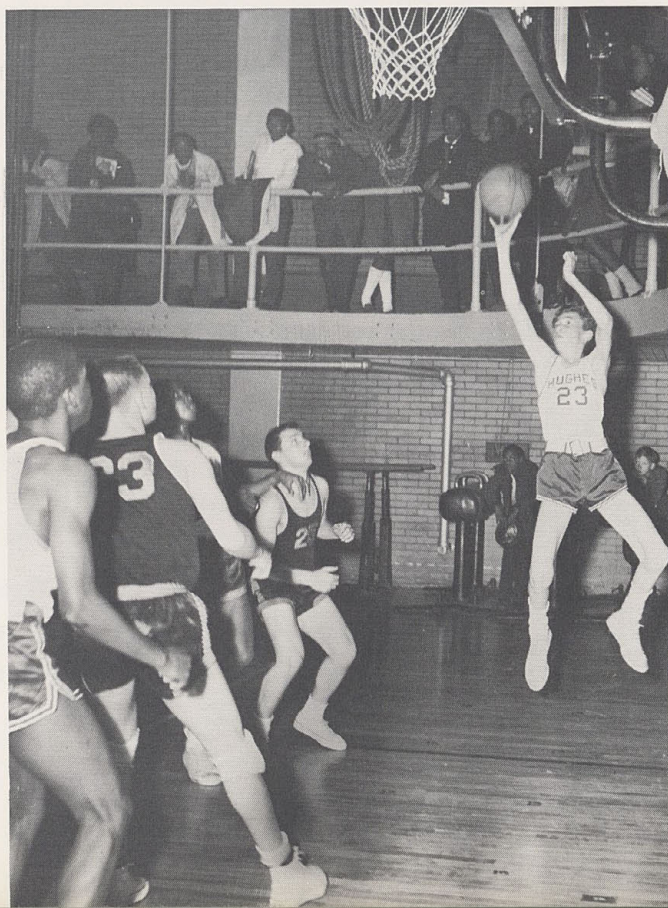
