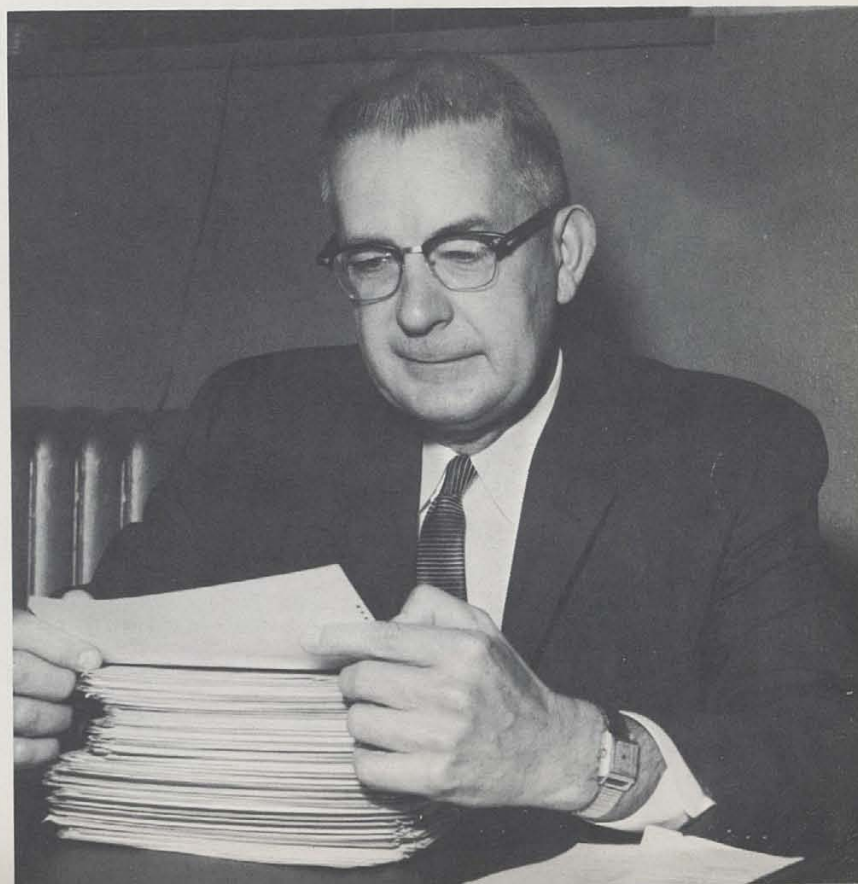
When Mr. Jones can find time to spare from his daily duties, he enjoys reading and fishing. He is also a member of the Cincinnati Schoolmasters Bowling League.

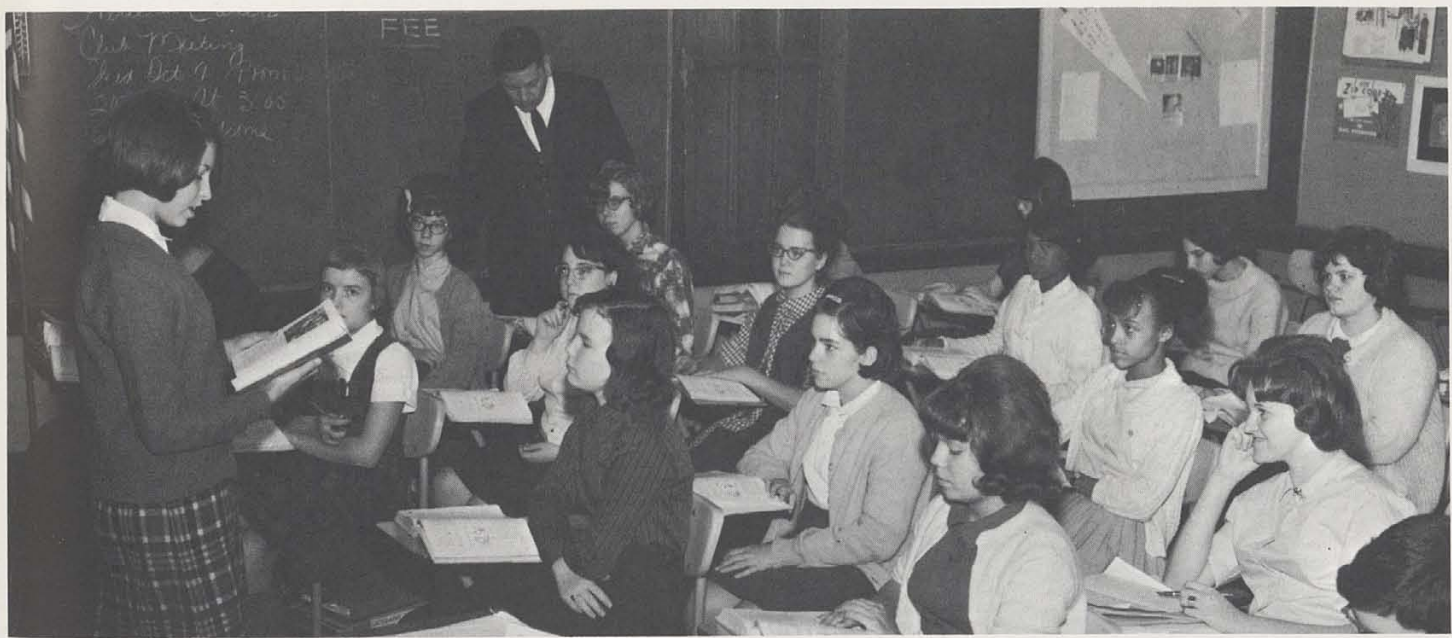

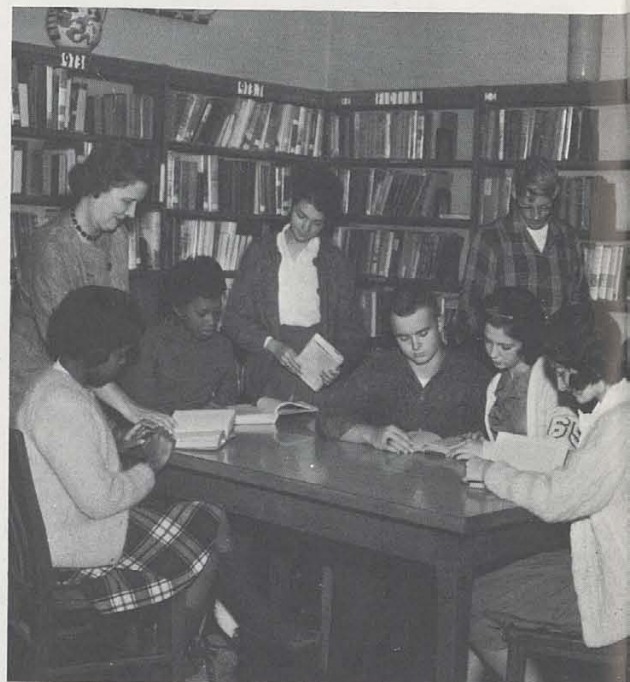

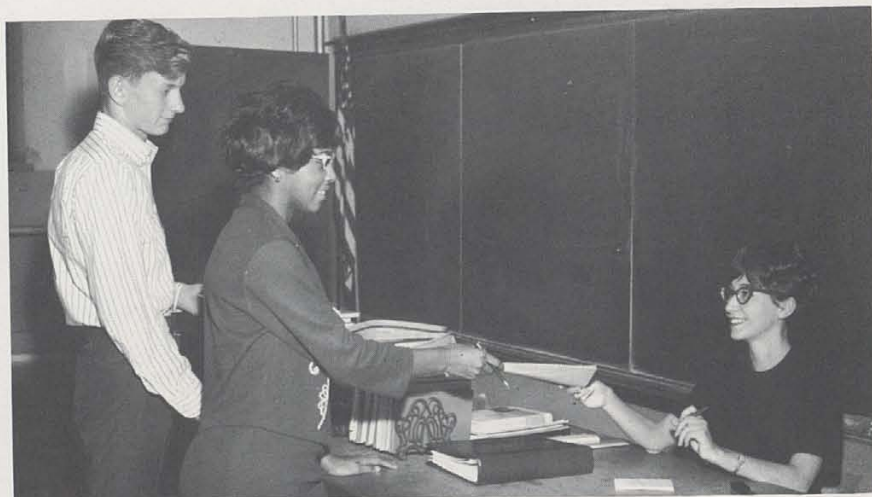

In this scientific age every one should have a working knowledge of science. The courses provided at Hughes are general science, biology, botany, zoology, physiology, physics and chemistry. The chemistry laboratory work enables students to learn by first-hand experience the reactions of compounds and elements. In physics lab, principles governing forces, heat, sound, and electricity are studied.

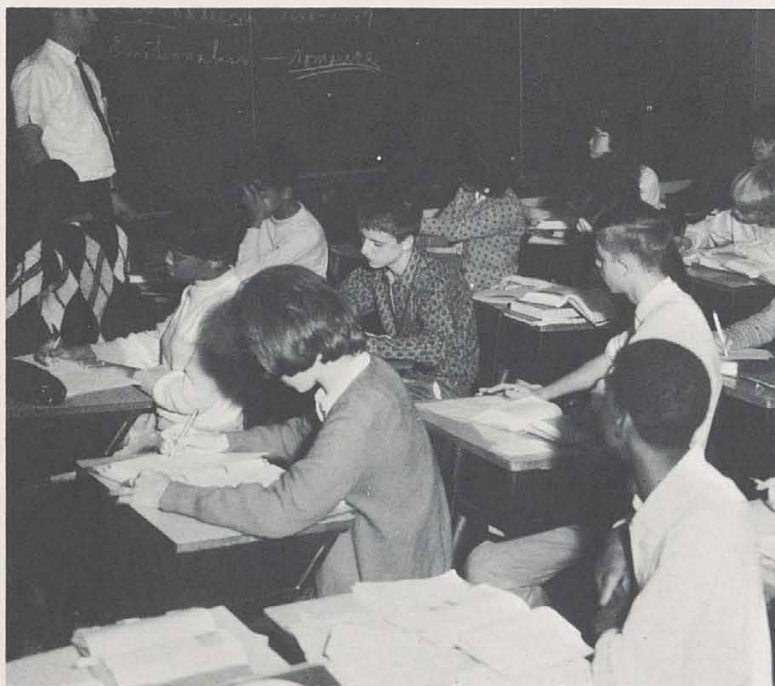

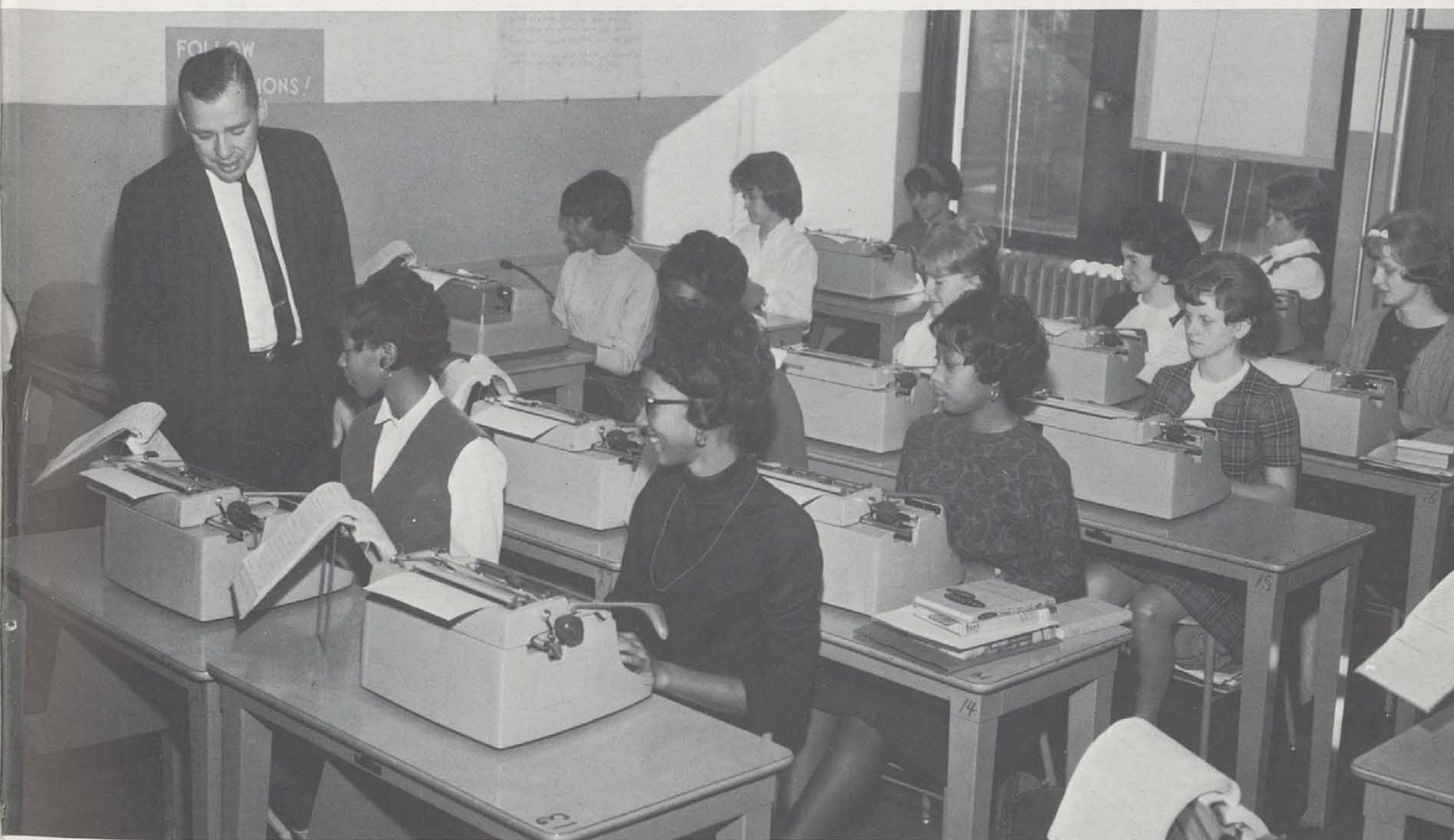

Health, a requirement in tenth and twelfth grades, presents sufficient anatomy for the student to understand the basic structure of his body and enough physiology to understand its functions. First-aid instruction, given with a course in home-nursing for all types of diseases and injuries, teaches students proper procedure for taking care of themselves in emergencies.

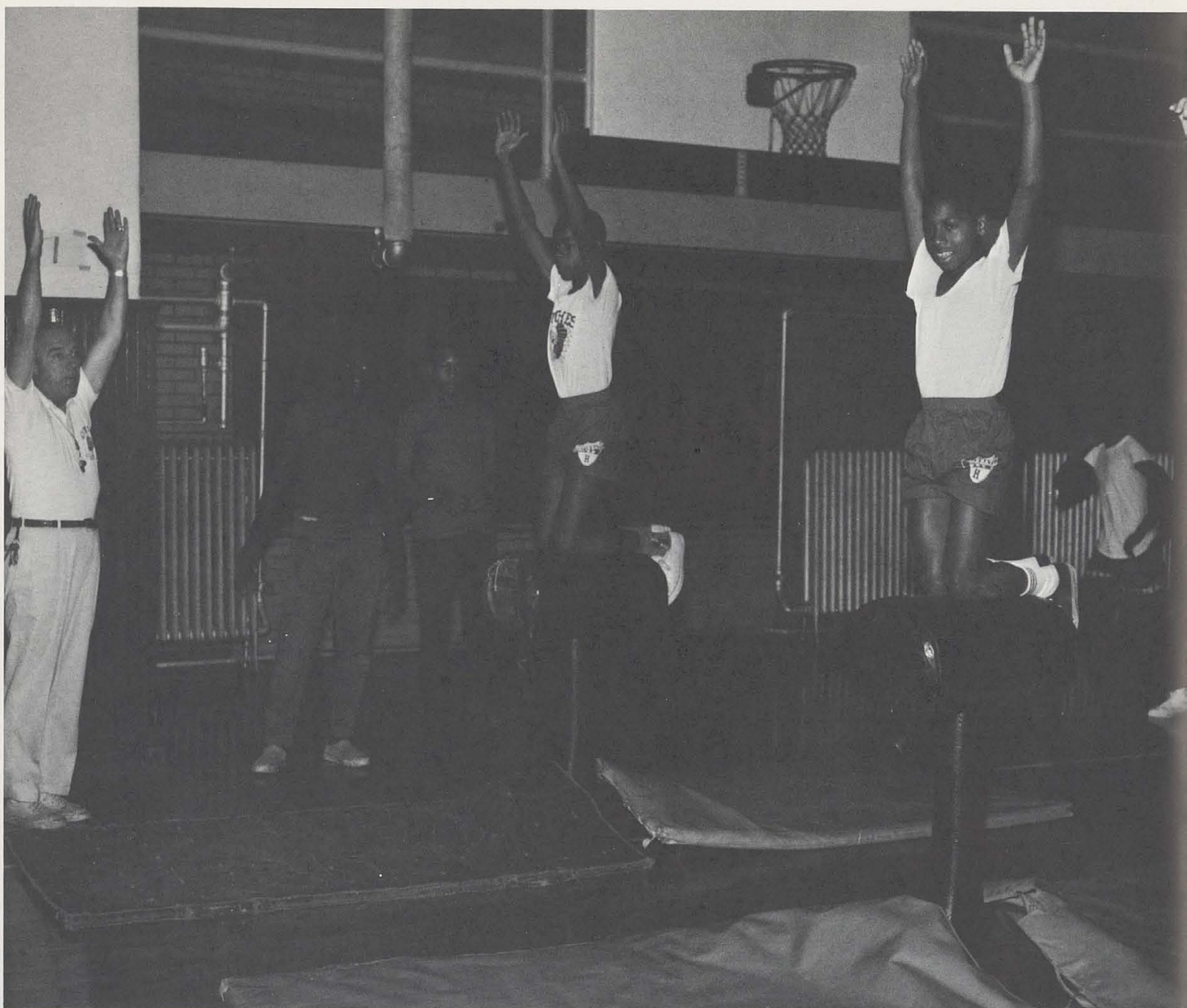
## Family-centered Program Stressed in Home Economics

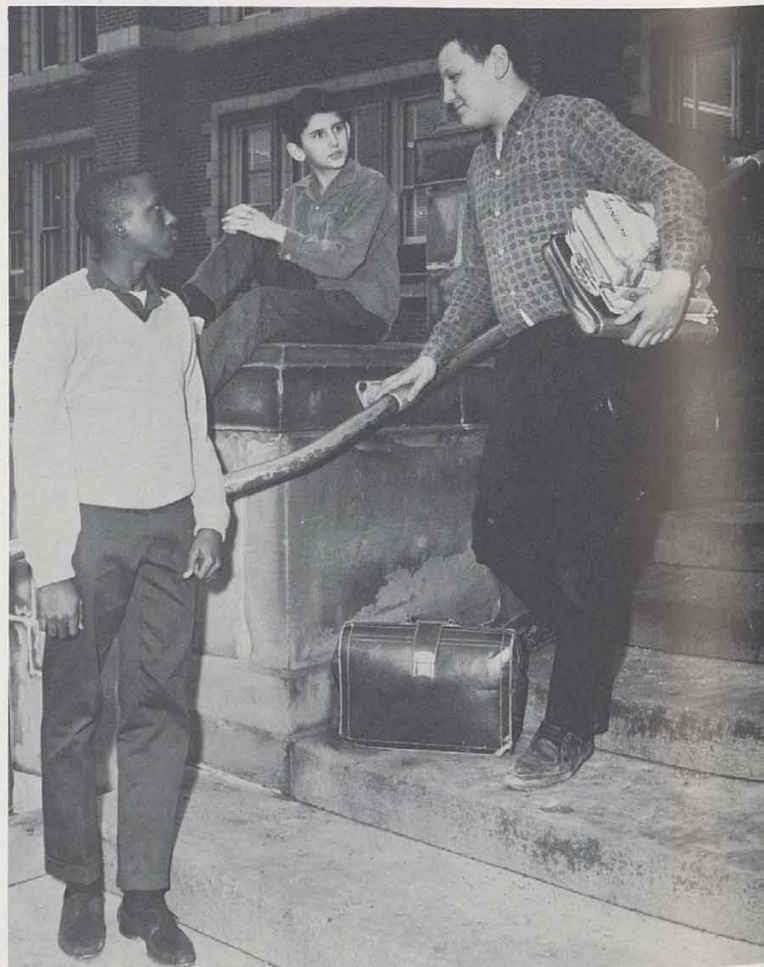

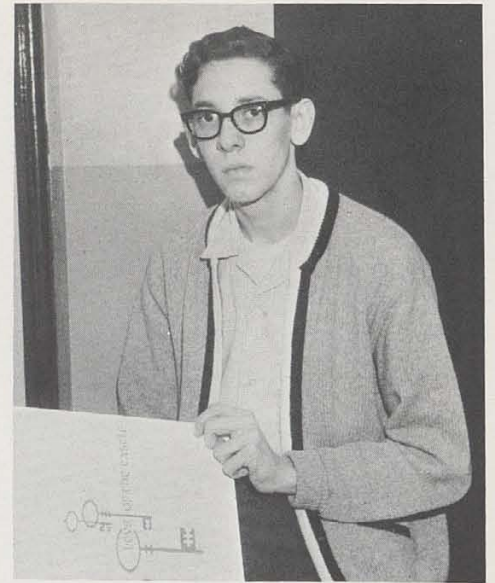

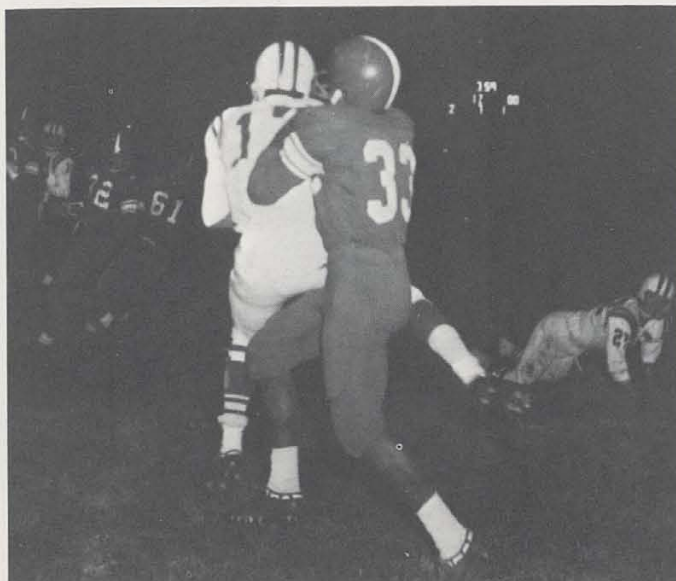

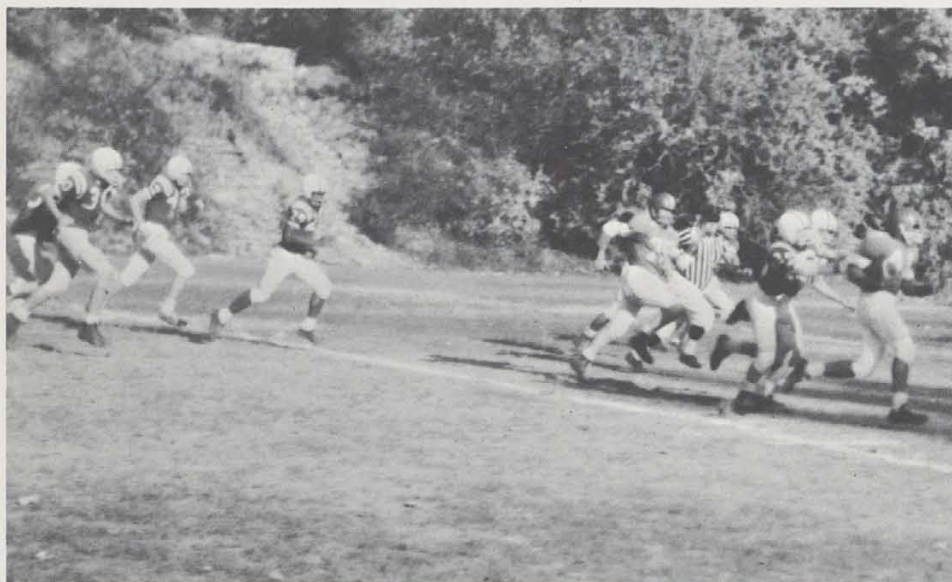

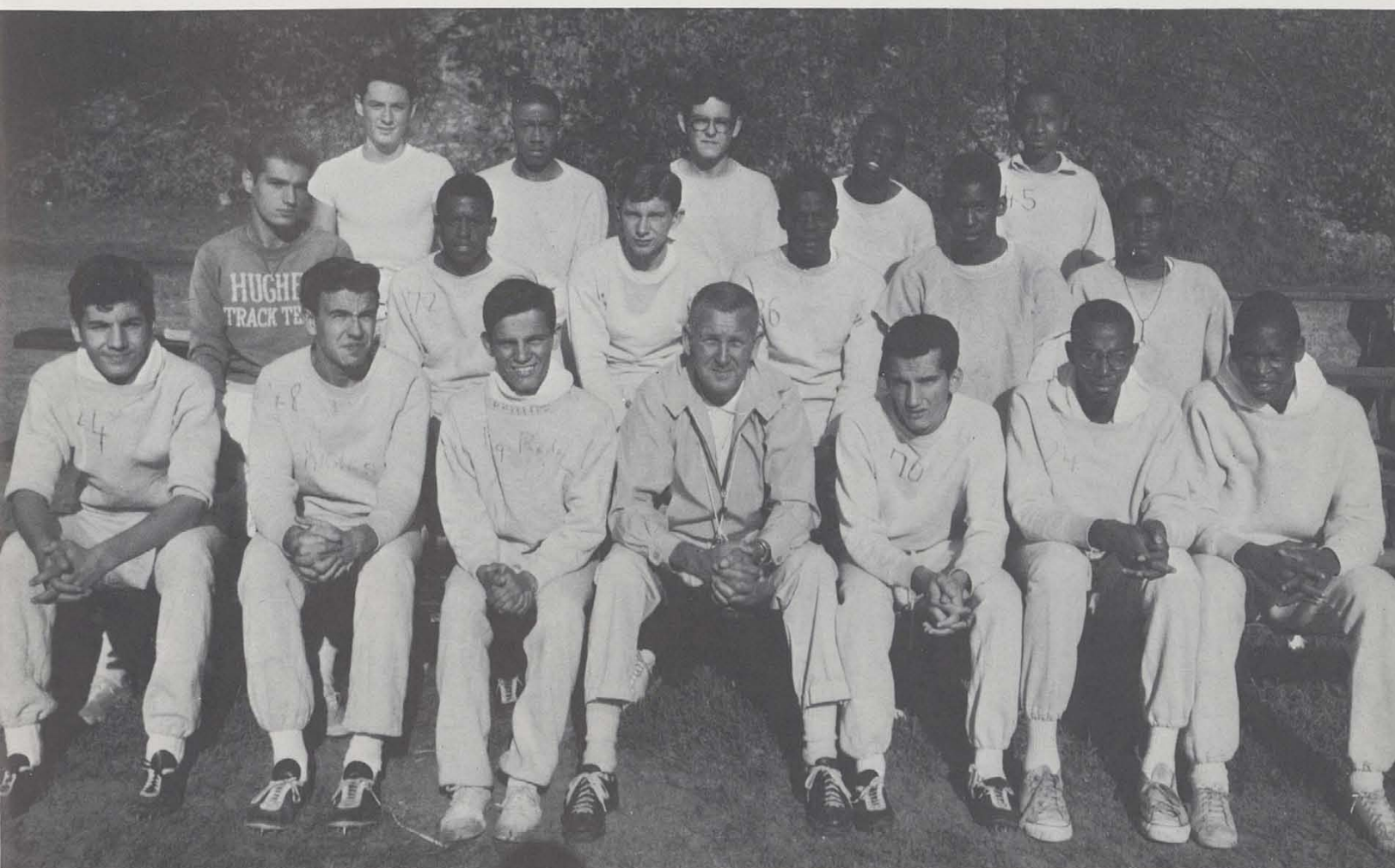

In League competition, the Big Reds lacked speed and stamina, but they did not lack spirit and determination.

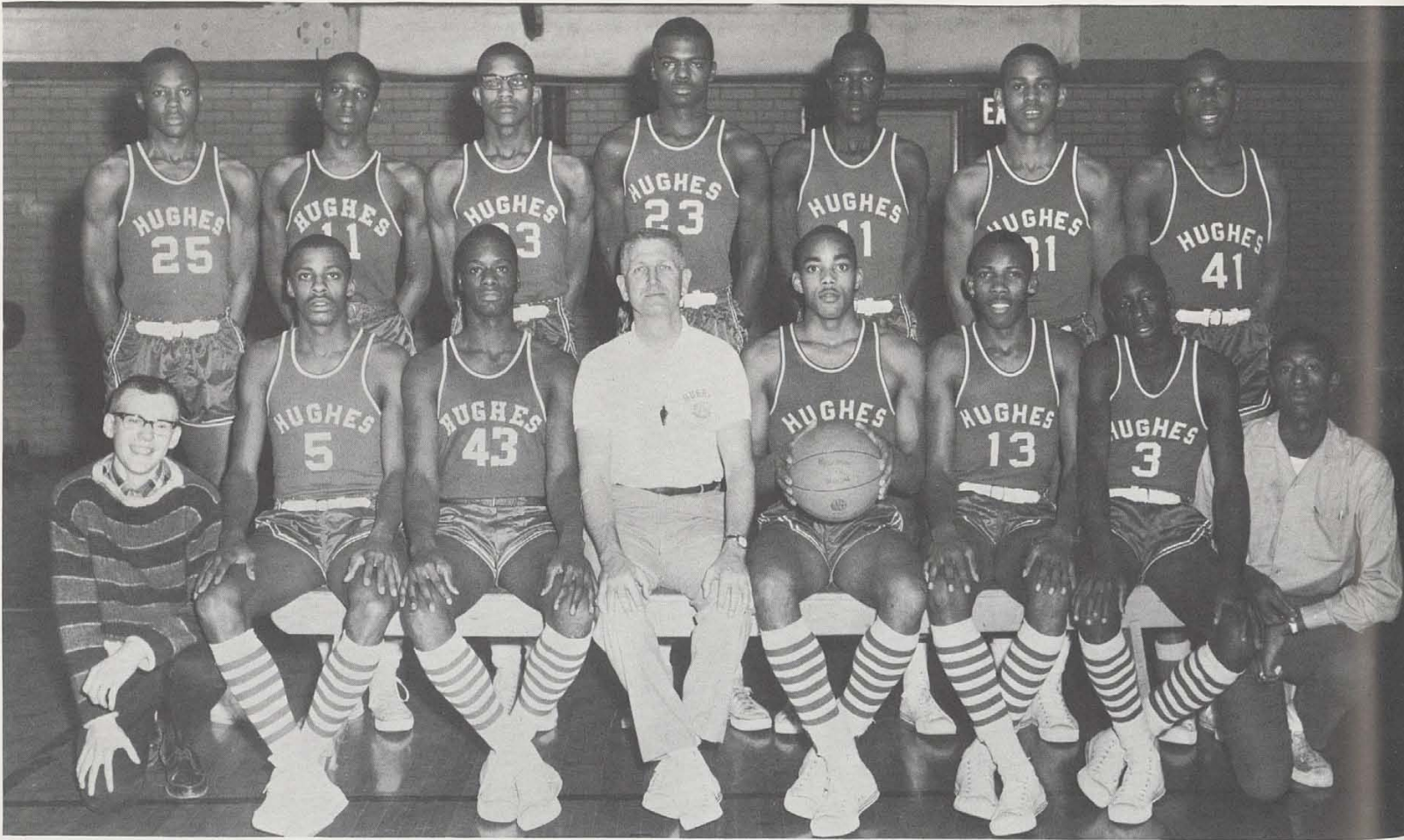

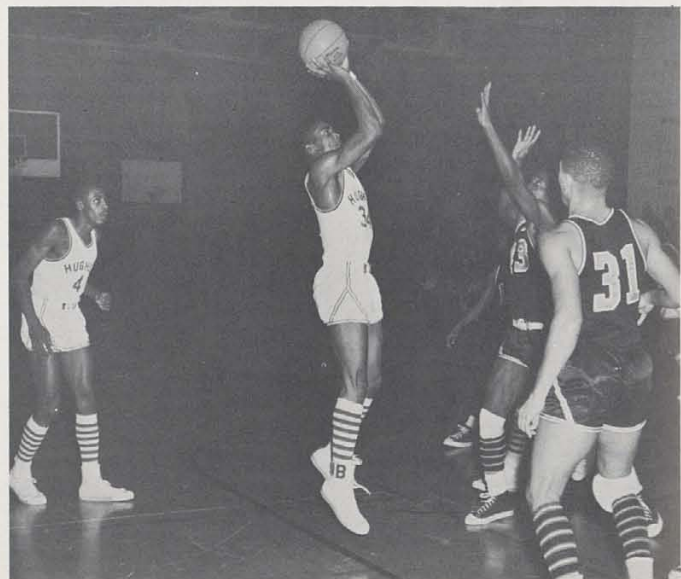

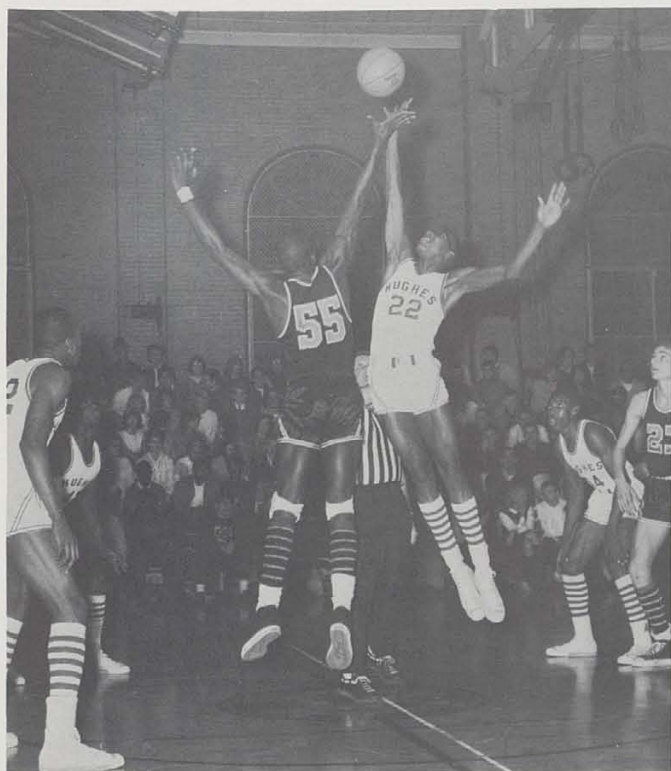

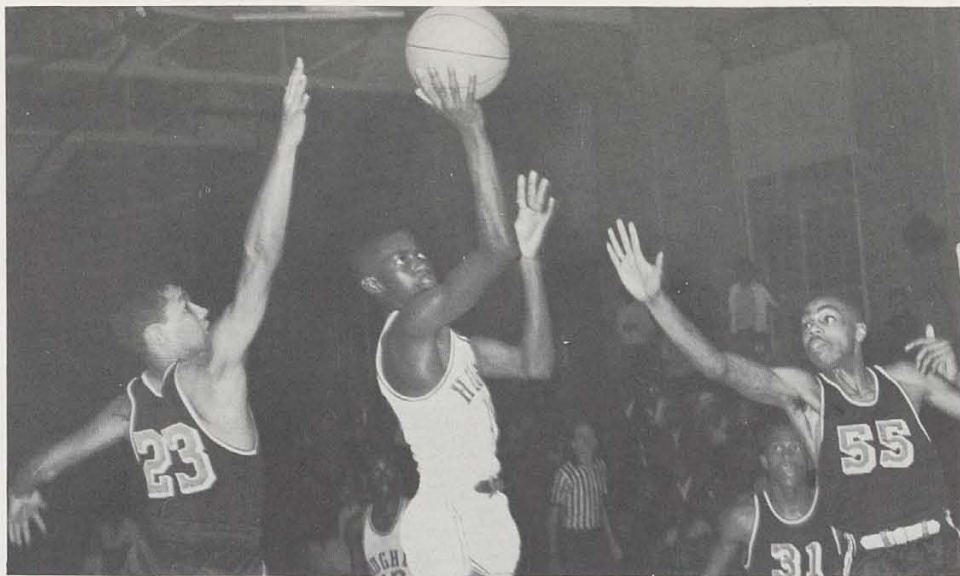

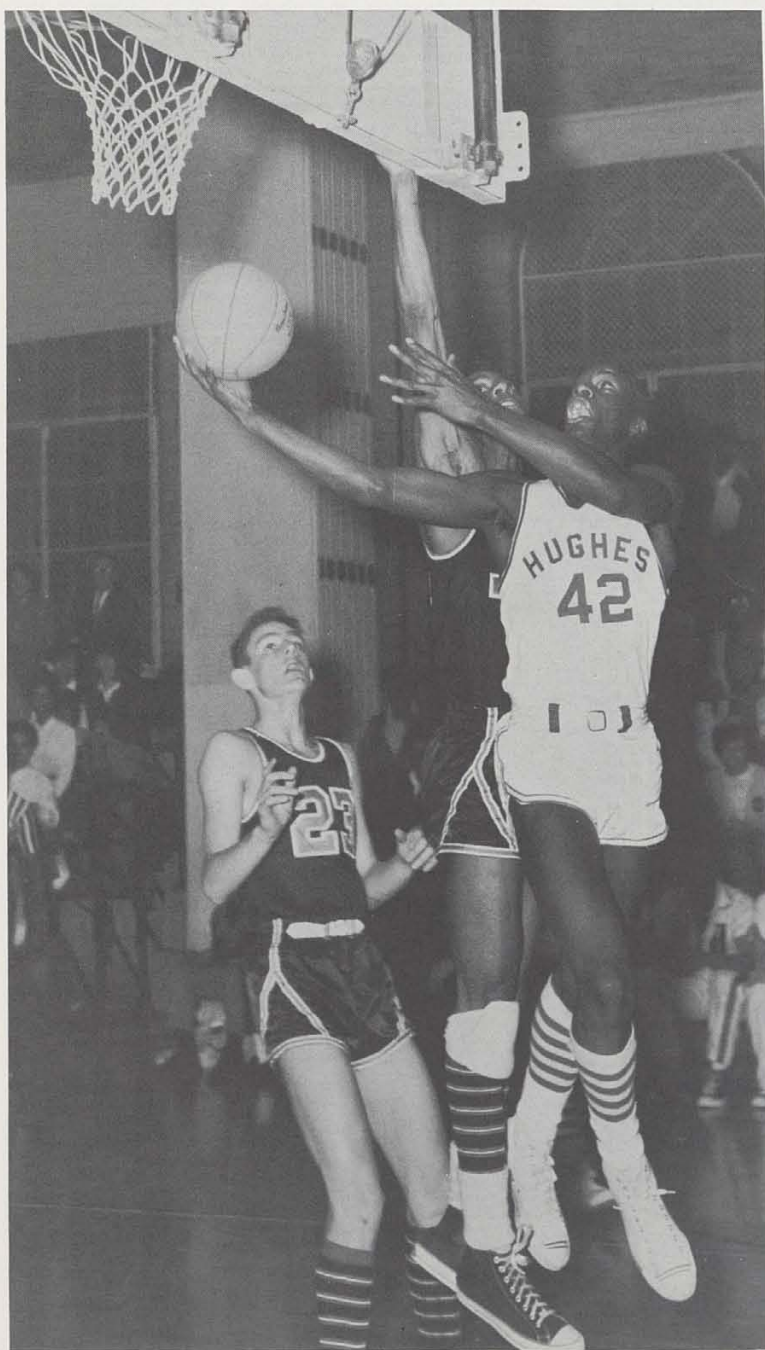

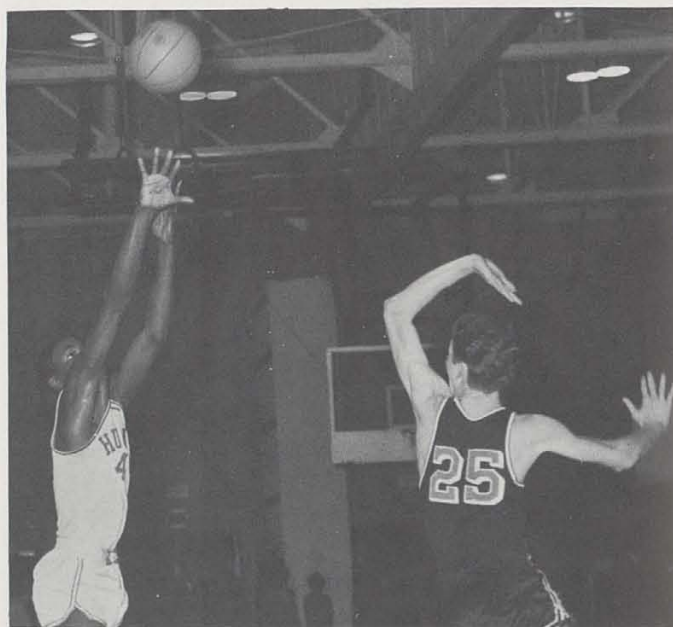

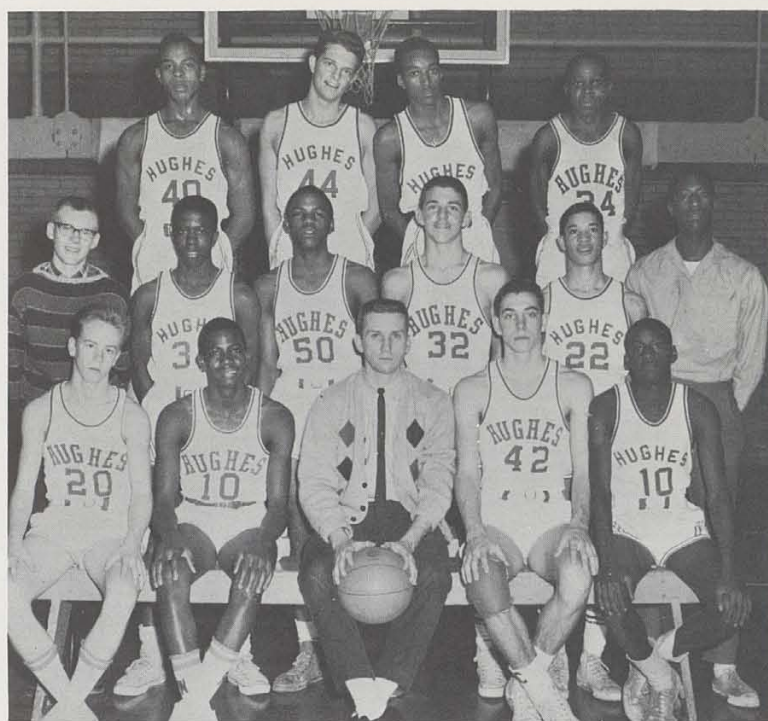

## Experienced Tracksters Return to Action in '65

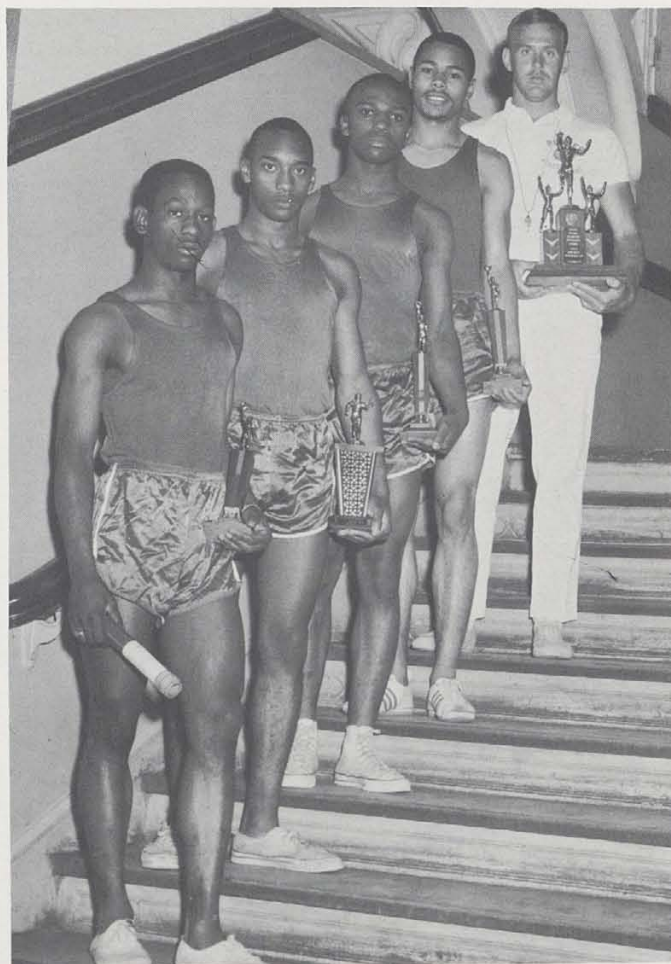

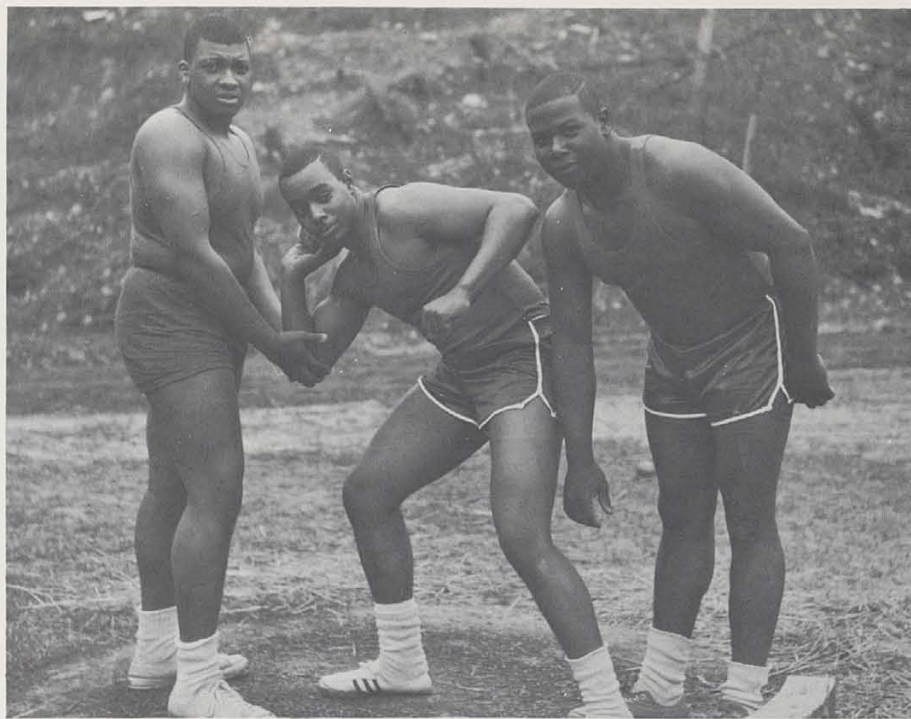

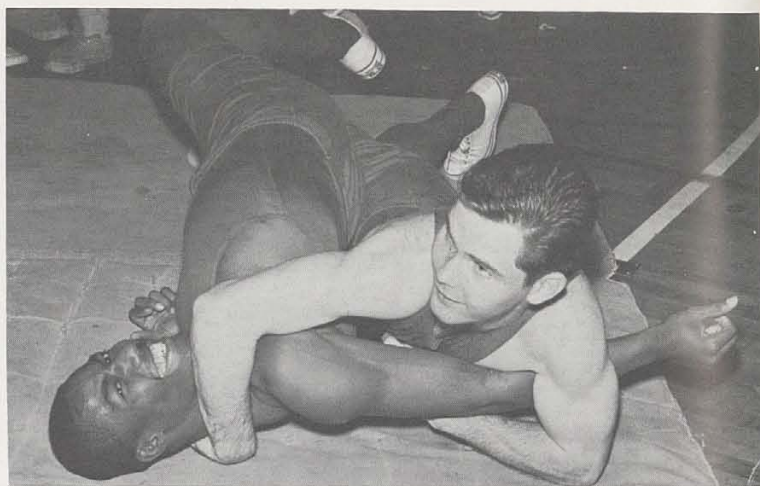

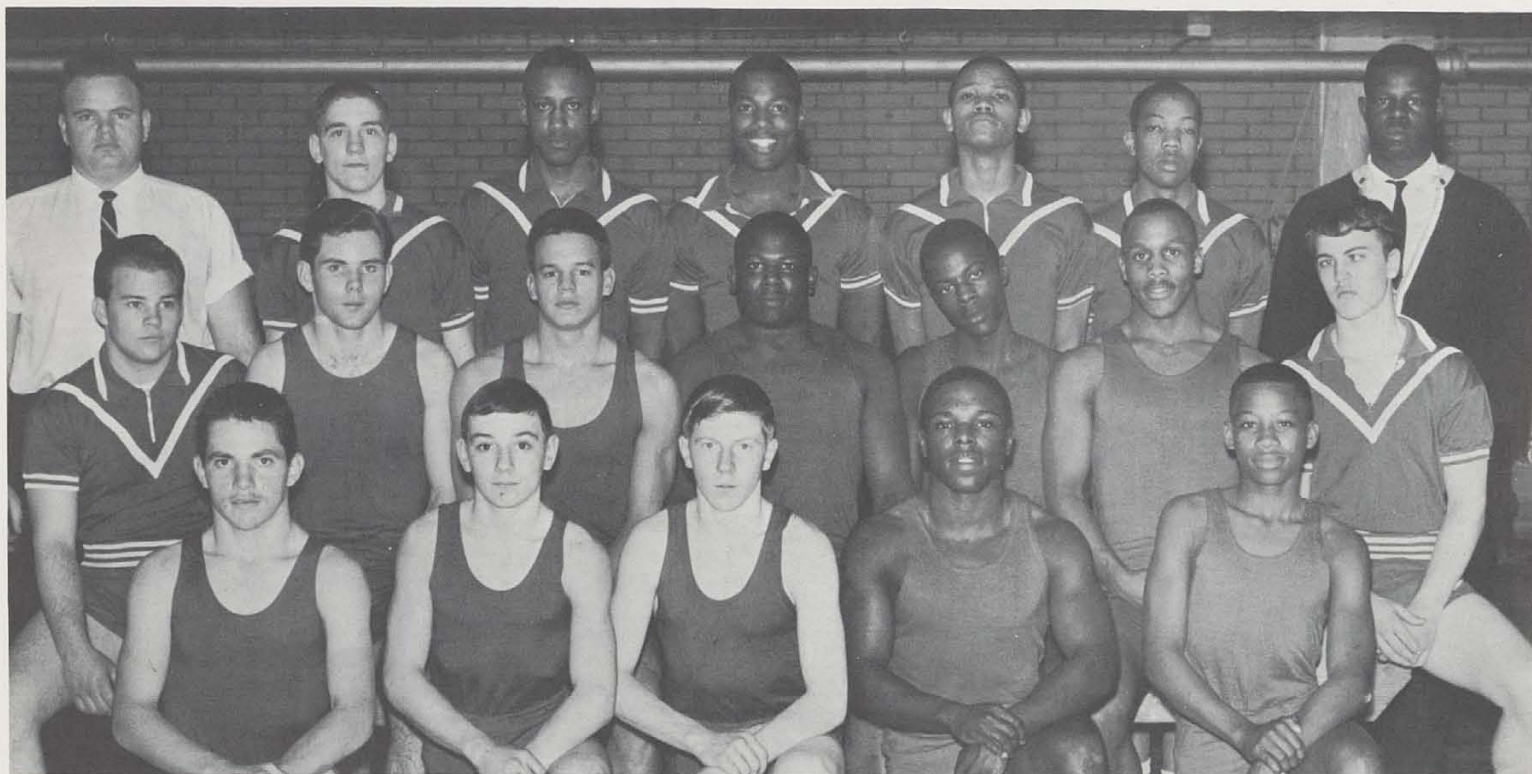


Bill Benton puts the pin on Benny Miles in a practice match.

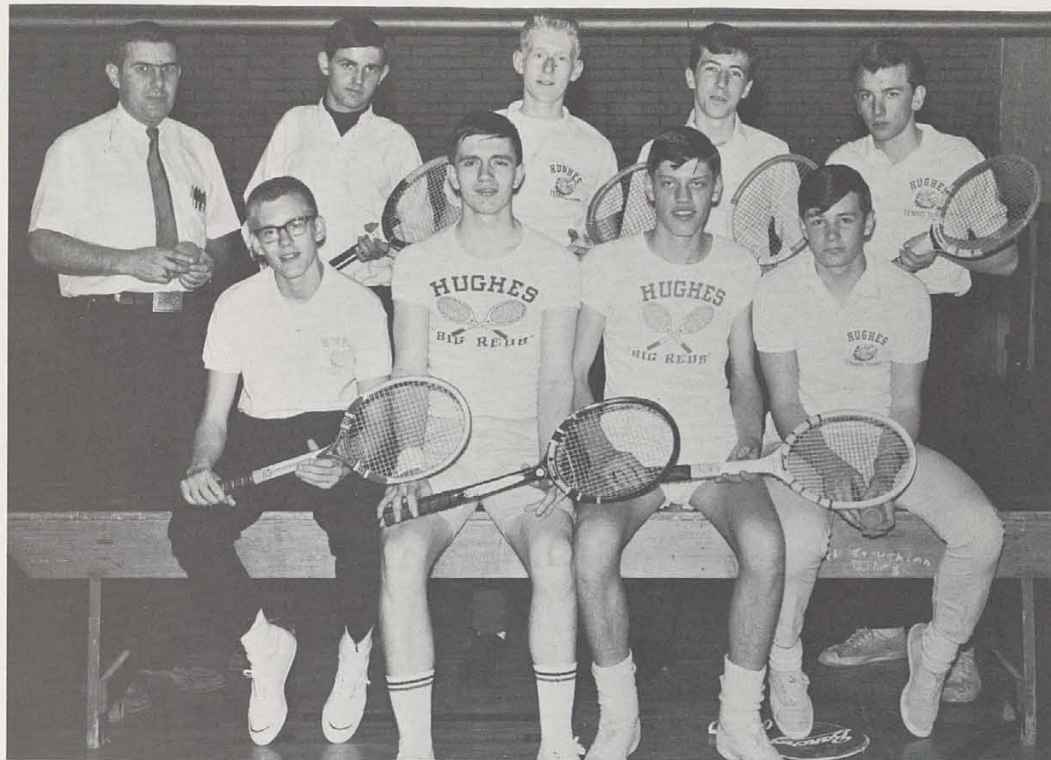

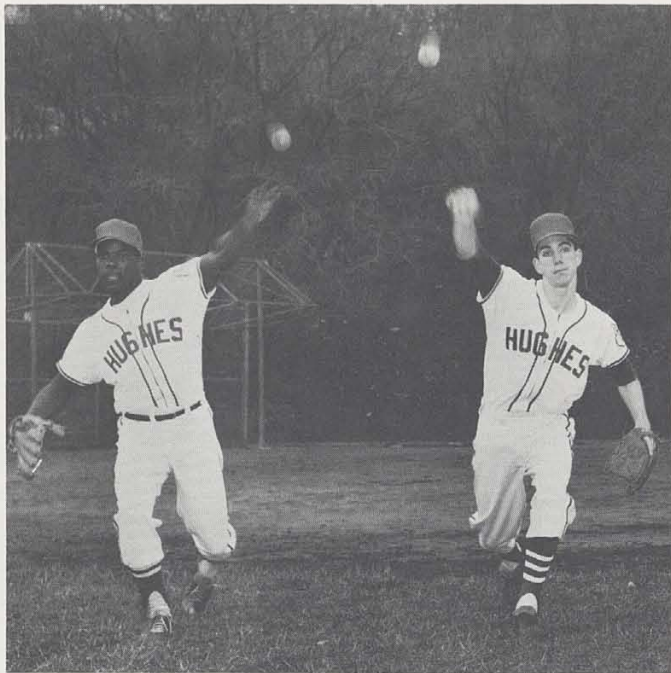
## Netmen's Wins Numbered

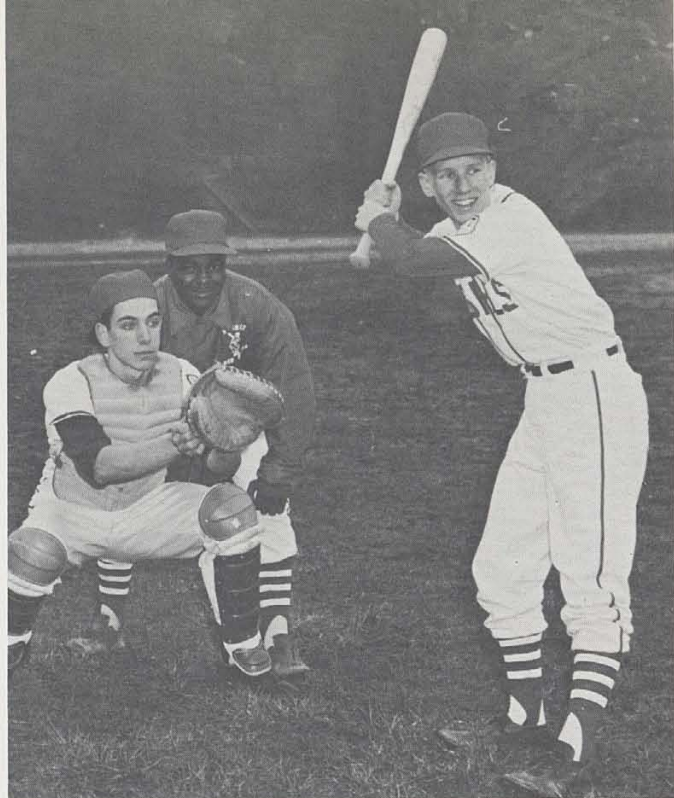

## Success of Hughes Nine Depends on Sophomore Potential

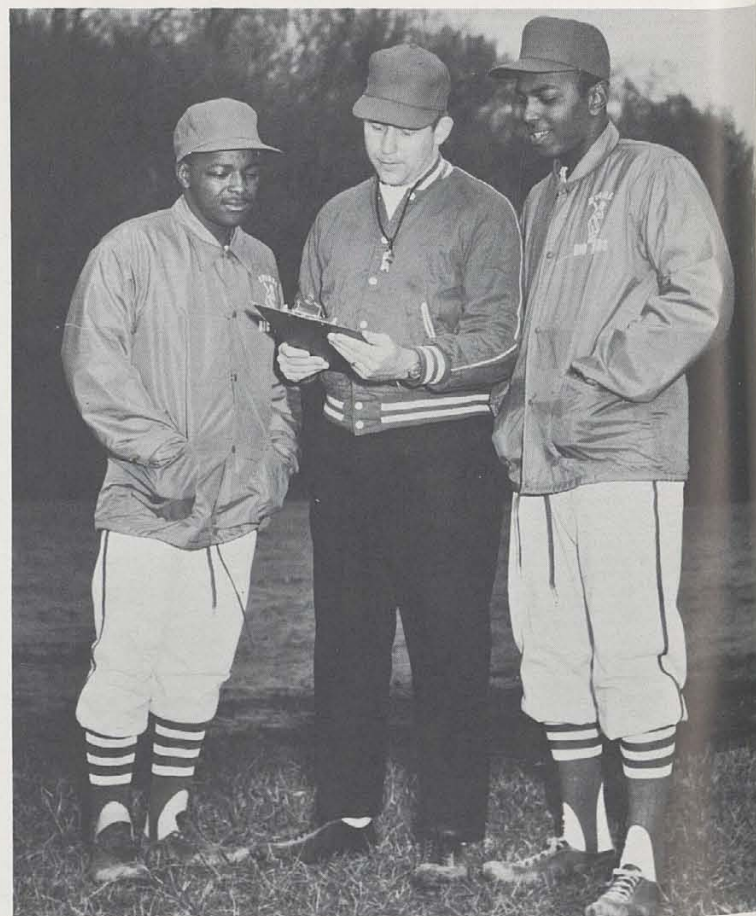
After a 1964 season of sixteen wins and fifteen losses, the Hughes baseball team hopes for an improved record this year.

## Basketball

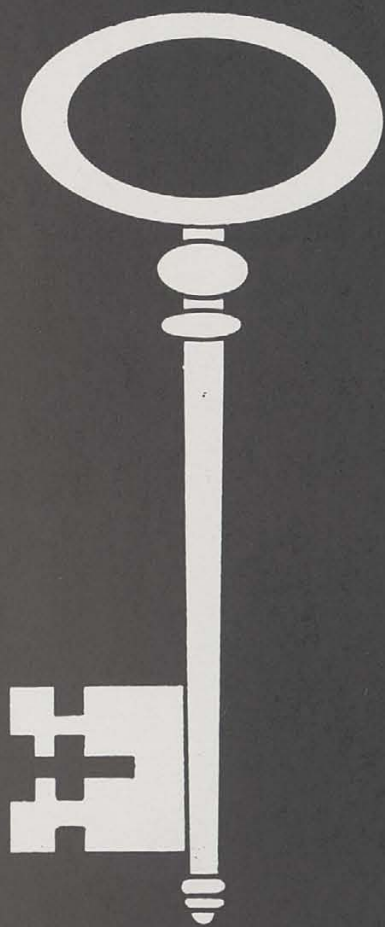
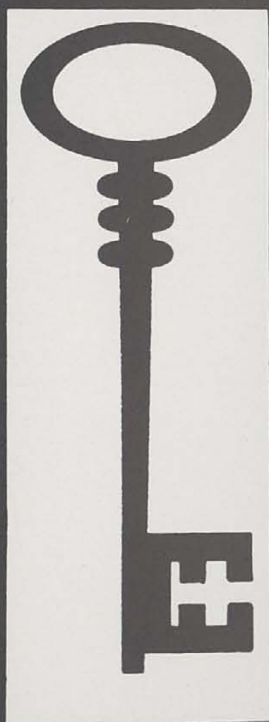

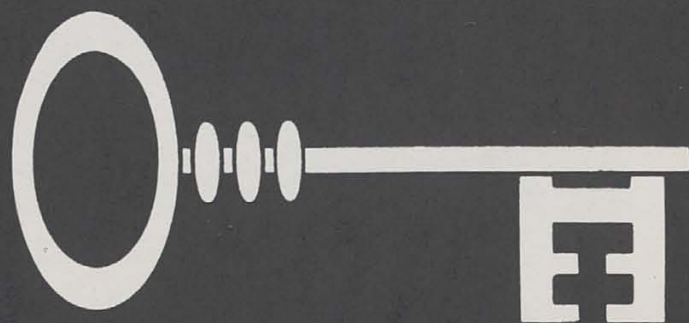
## Archery

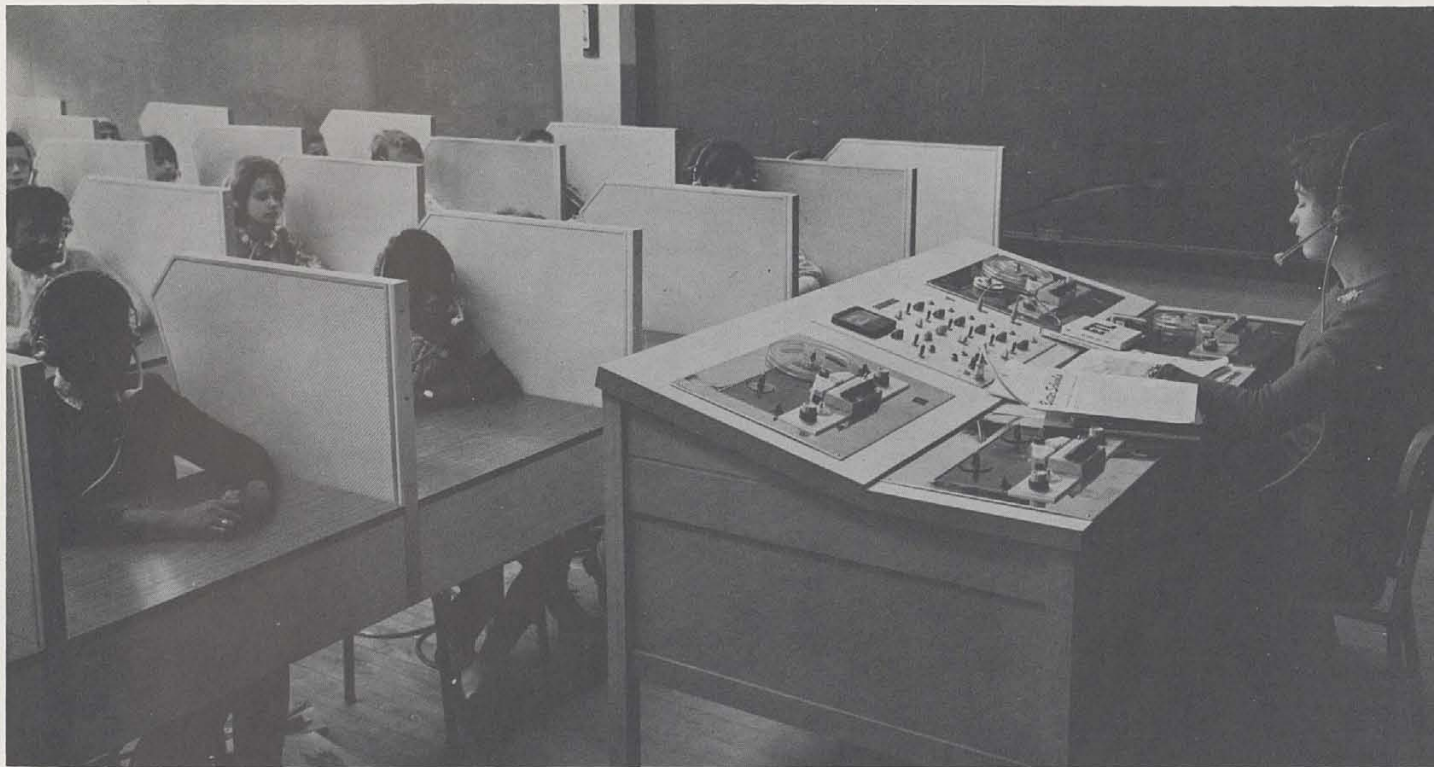

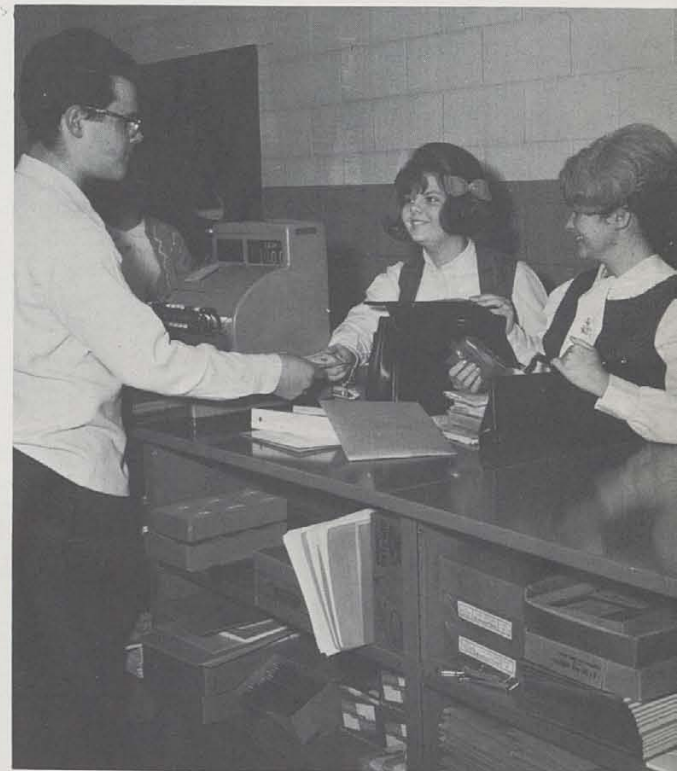
