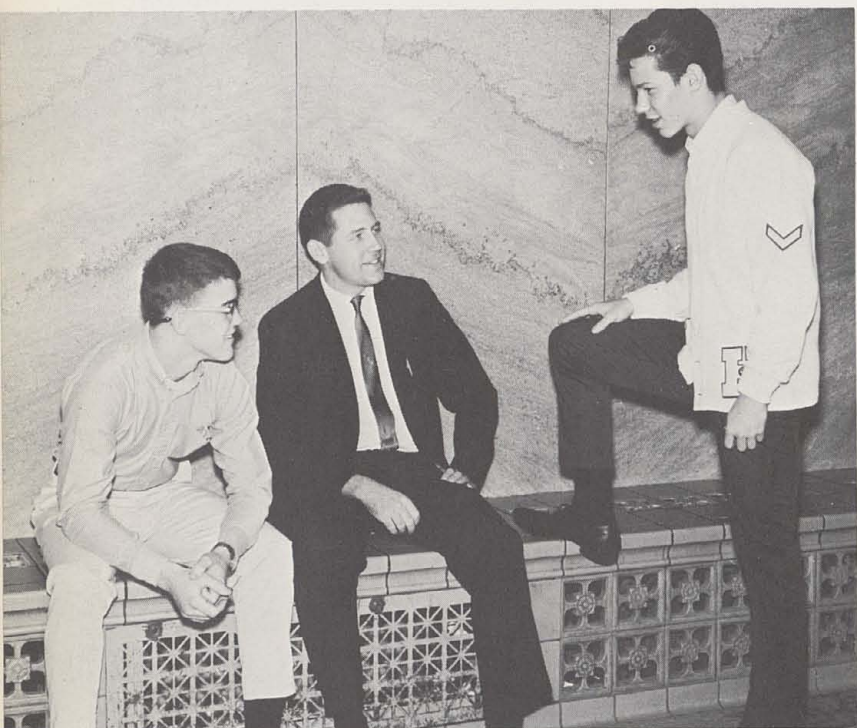

Coach Otto's Little Reds Tie Taft for Reserve Championship



The Hughes Reserve team, under the leadership of Coach Ron Otto, shared the 1965 city championship with Taft.

Hughes defeated Woodward in its first encounter by a score of 14-6. Western Hills followed the path of Woodward by losing 16-0. The little Reds suffered their first and only loss to Taft in an 18-0 game.

The reserve squad came back strong to defeat Courter in the fourth game and Walnut Hills in the sixth. Although Hughes really lost its fifth game to Withrow by a score of 6-0, the Tigers forfeited the game because they used ineligible players. In the final game of the season, Hughes beat Aiken 20-0 to clinch a Little Reds tie with Taft for the Reserve city championship.

Outstanding men on the team were Ricardo Williams, whom the coach considered one of the best backs he'd ever seen, Fred Armstrong, quarterback, Phil Harrison and Jerome Lee. This year the Reserves bettered their usual high standing in the League.
