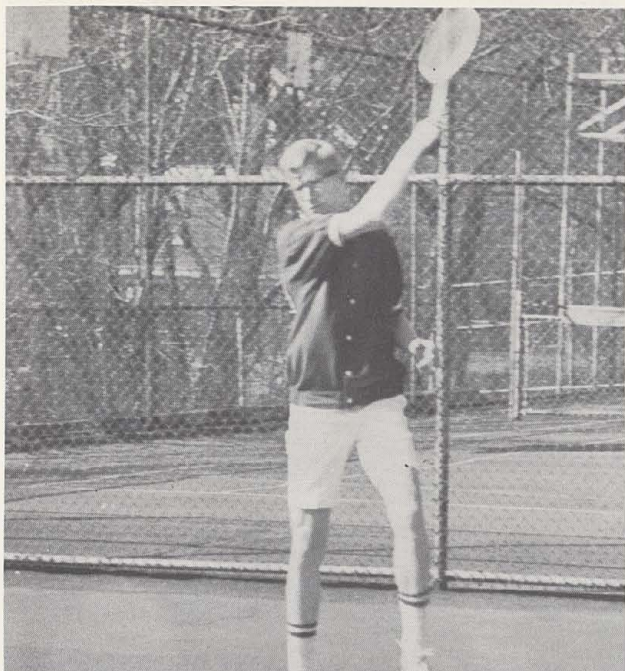
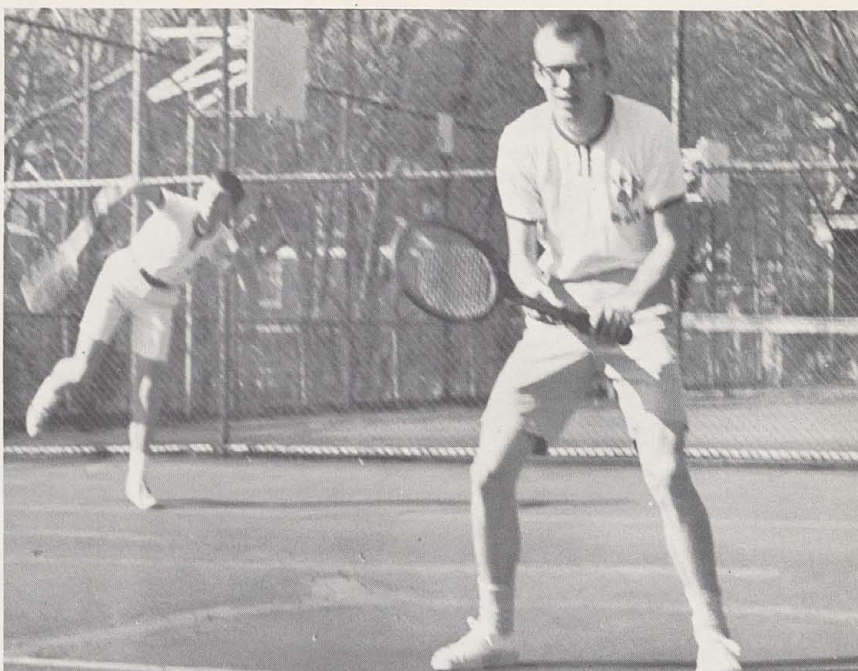


Here's the strong serve of Terry Gear, top singles man.

Netters Swing Those Rackets for All They're Worth

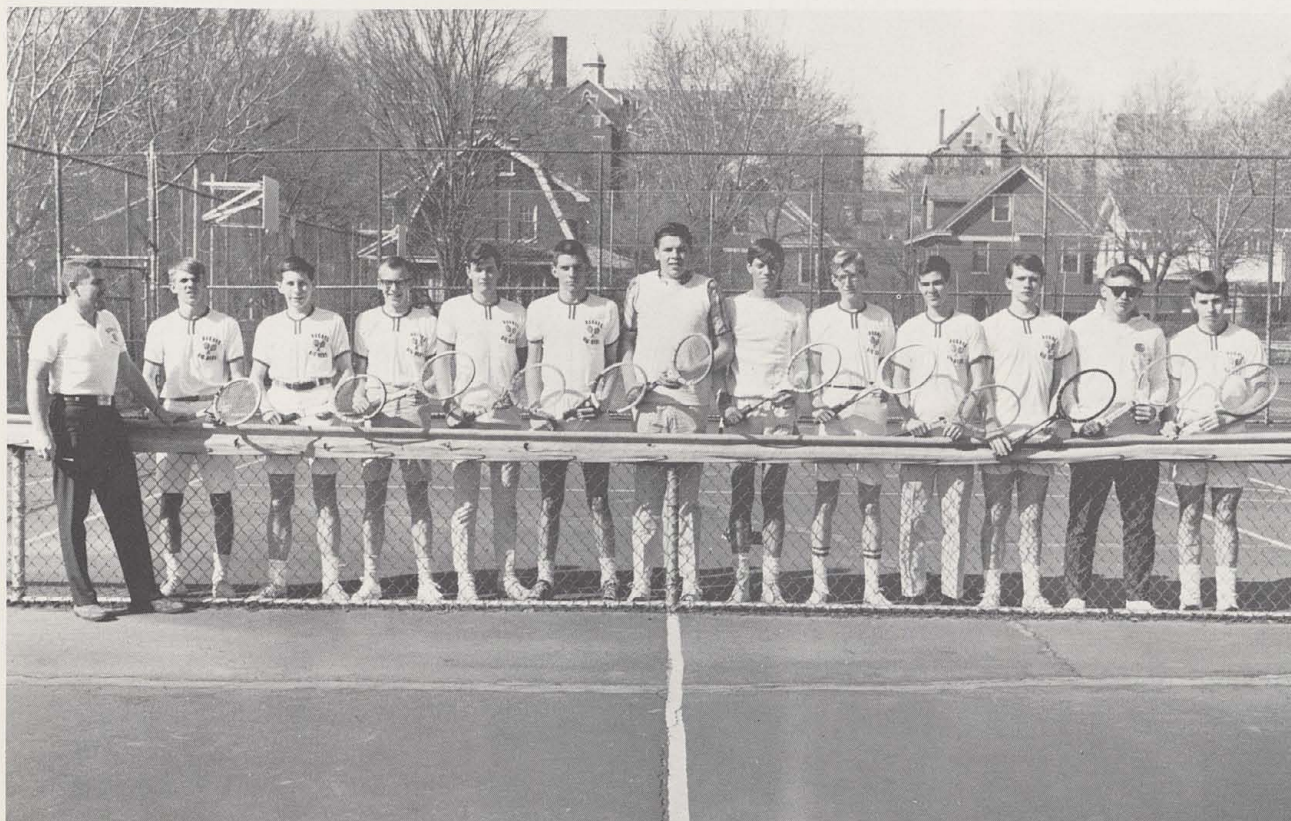
