ACADEMIC PROGRAMS

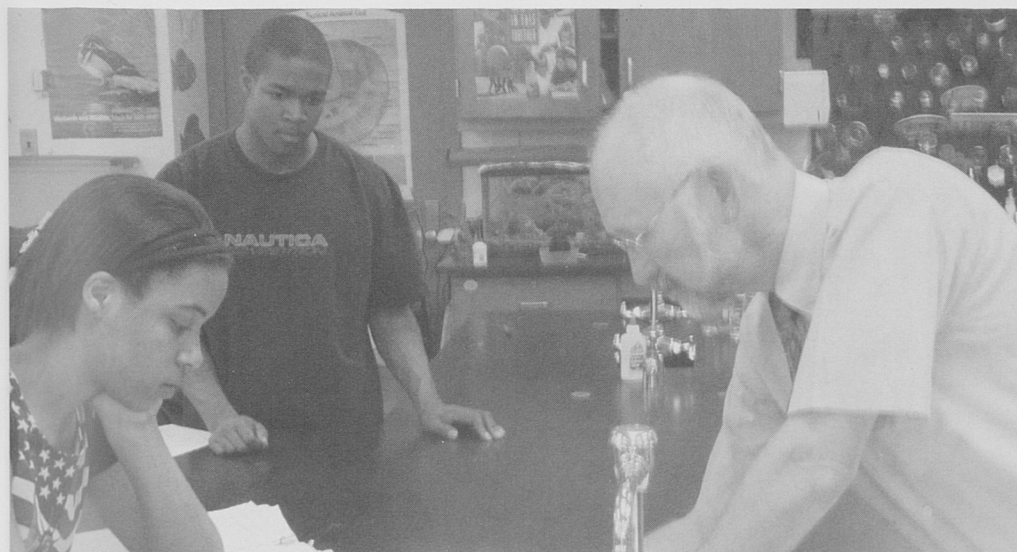
The Withrow IB Program is one of more than 1,000 International Baccalaureate World Schools located in nearly 100 countries around the world.

Students in the IB program have the opportunity to earn college credit or advanced standing in college for their work.

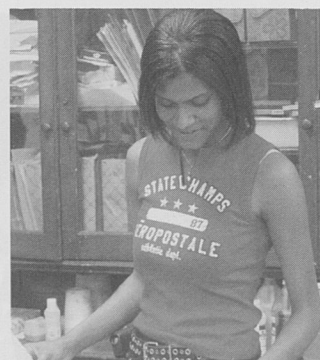
The IB program is available to Juniors and Seniors.
