Thus sons of Mary drawn from each walk of life can be formed, by a complete donation of self to Mary, into an effective organization with a very broad scope of apostolate.

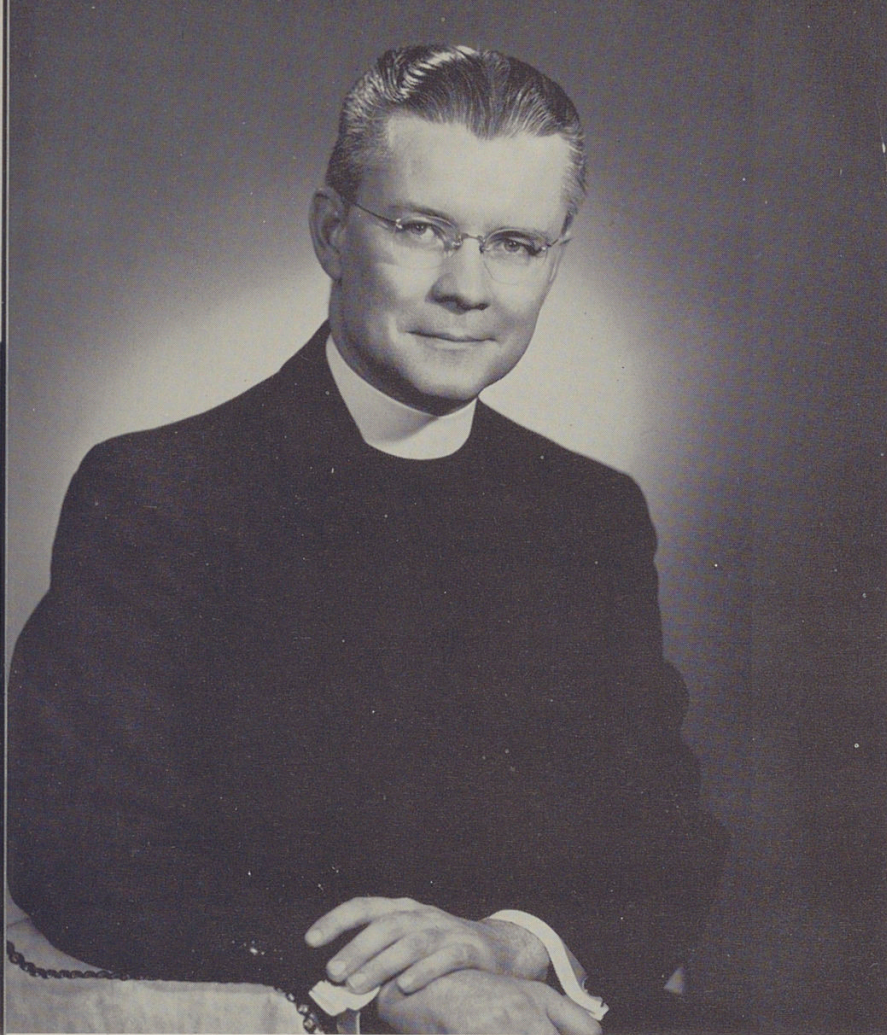

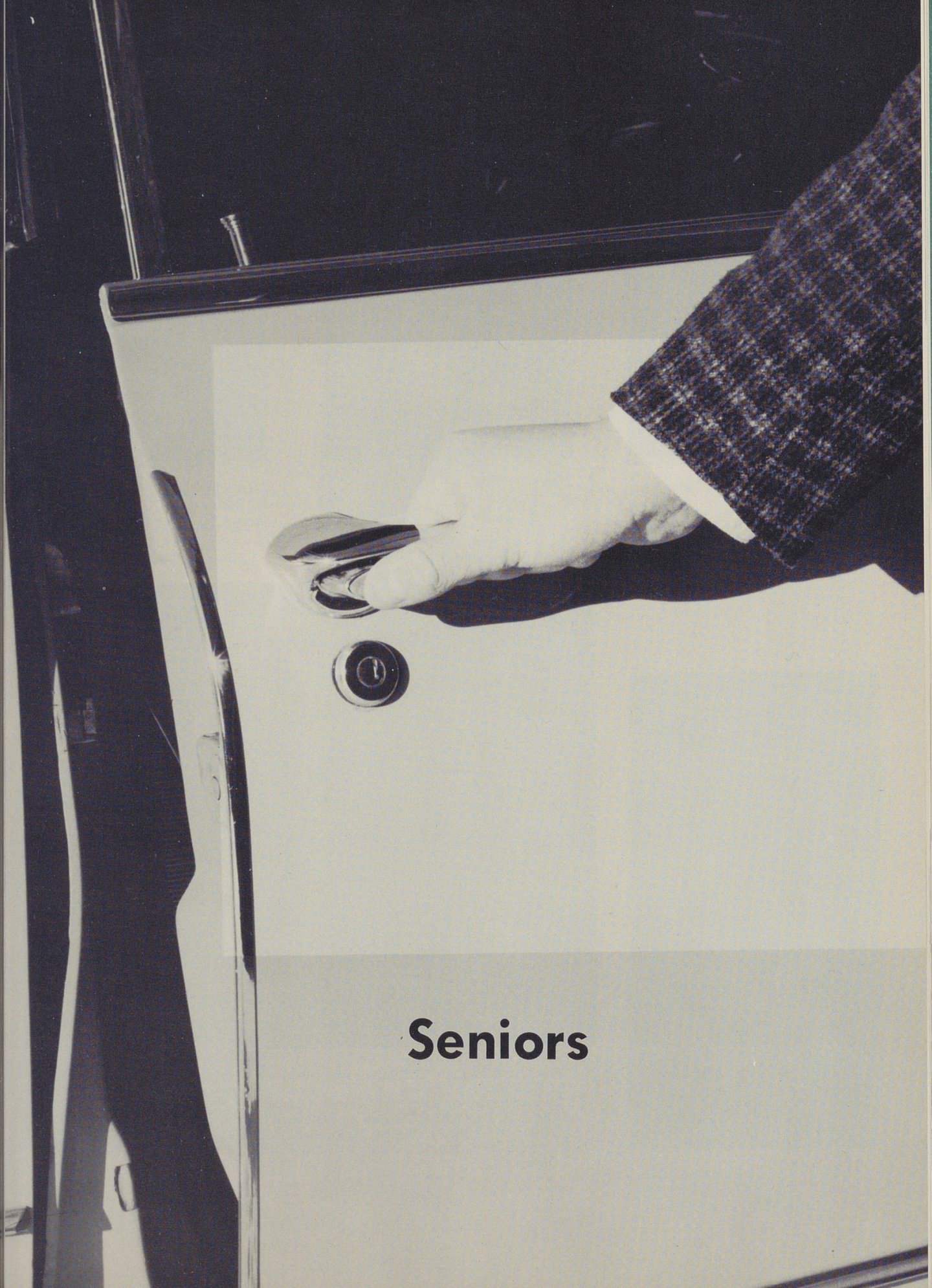
Actually, we start to cry whenever we think that we may never again be able to hear, see, or do many of the things that have become second nature to us during our four years at C.C.H.

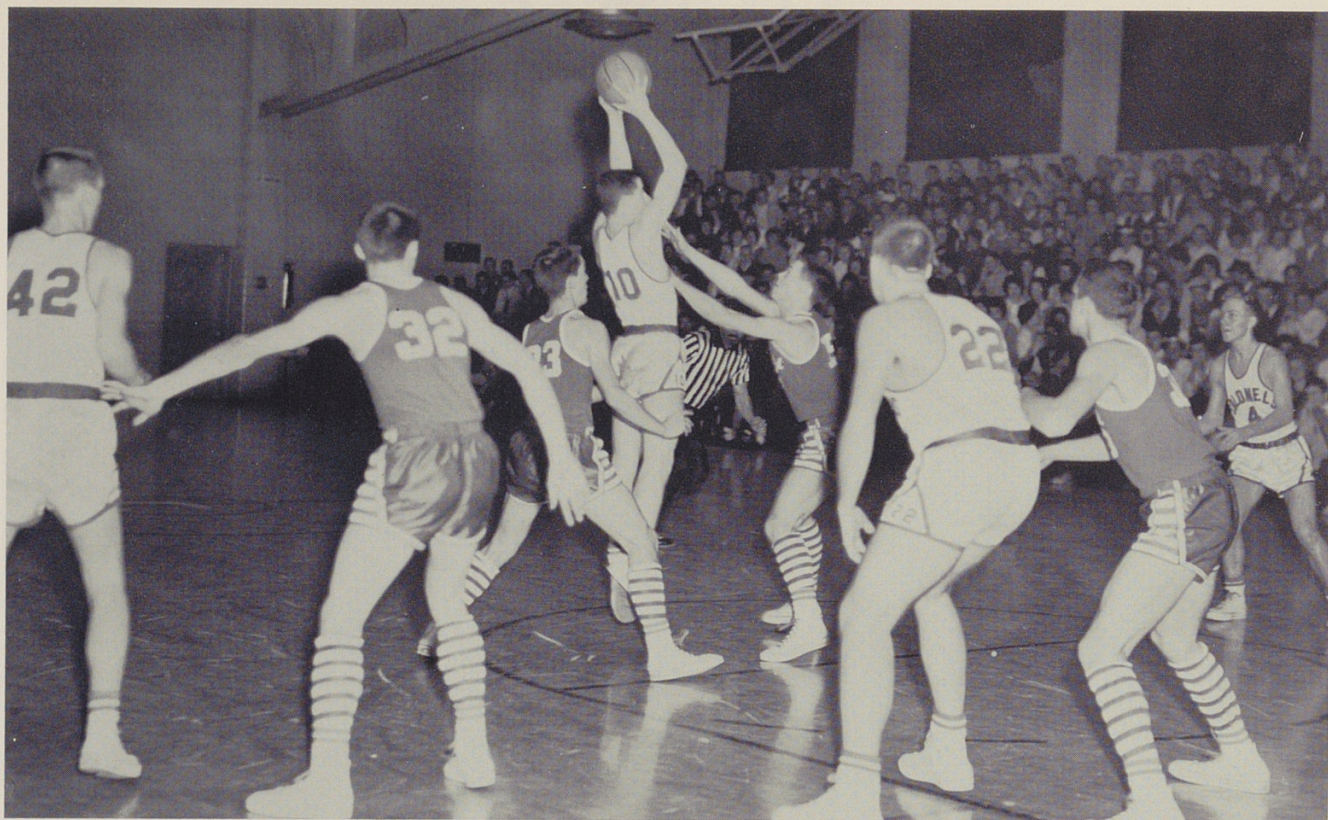

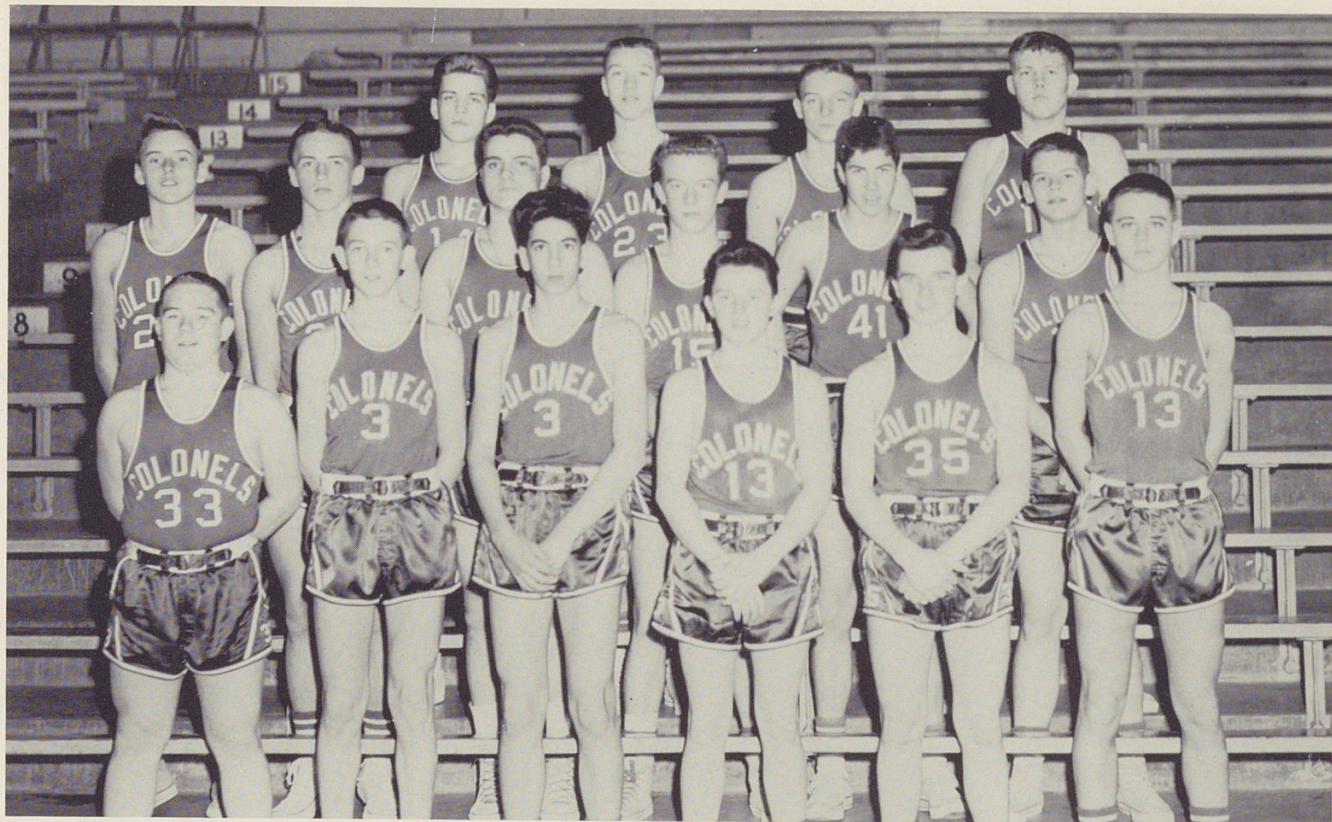

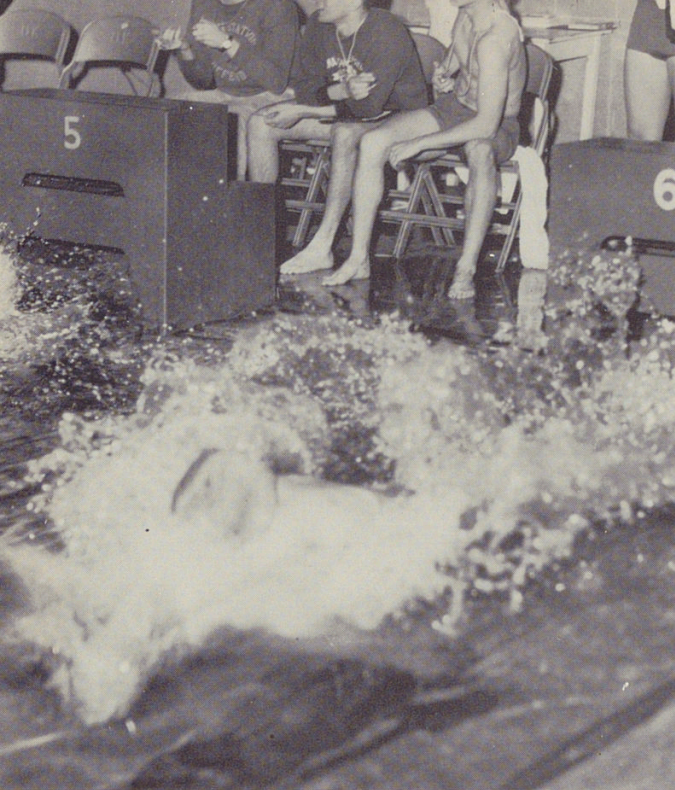

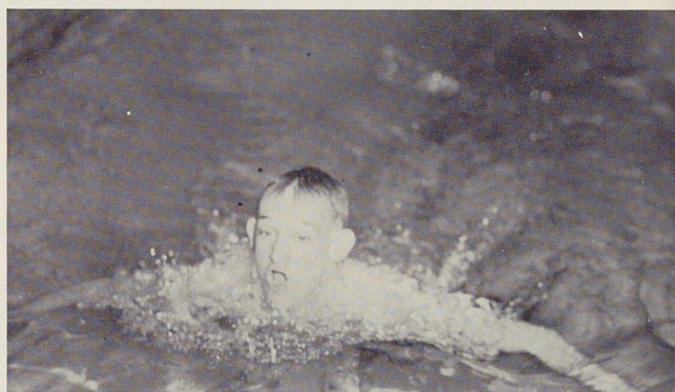

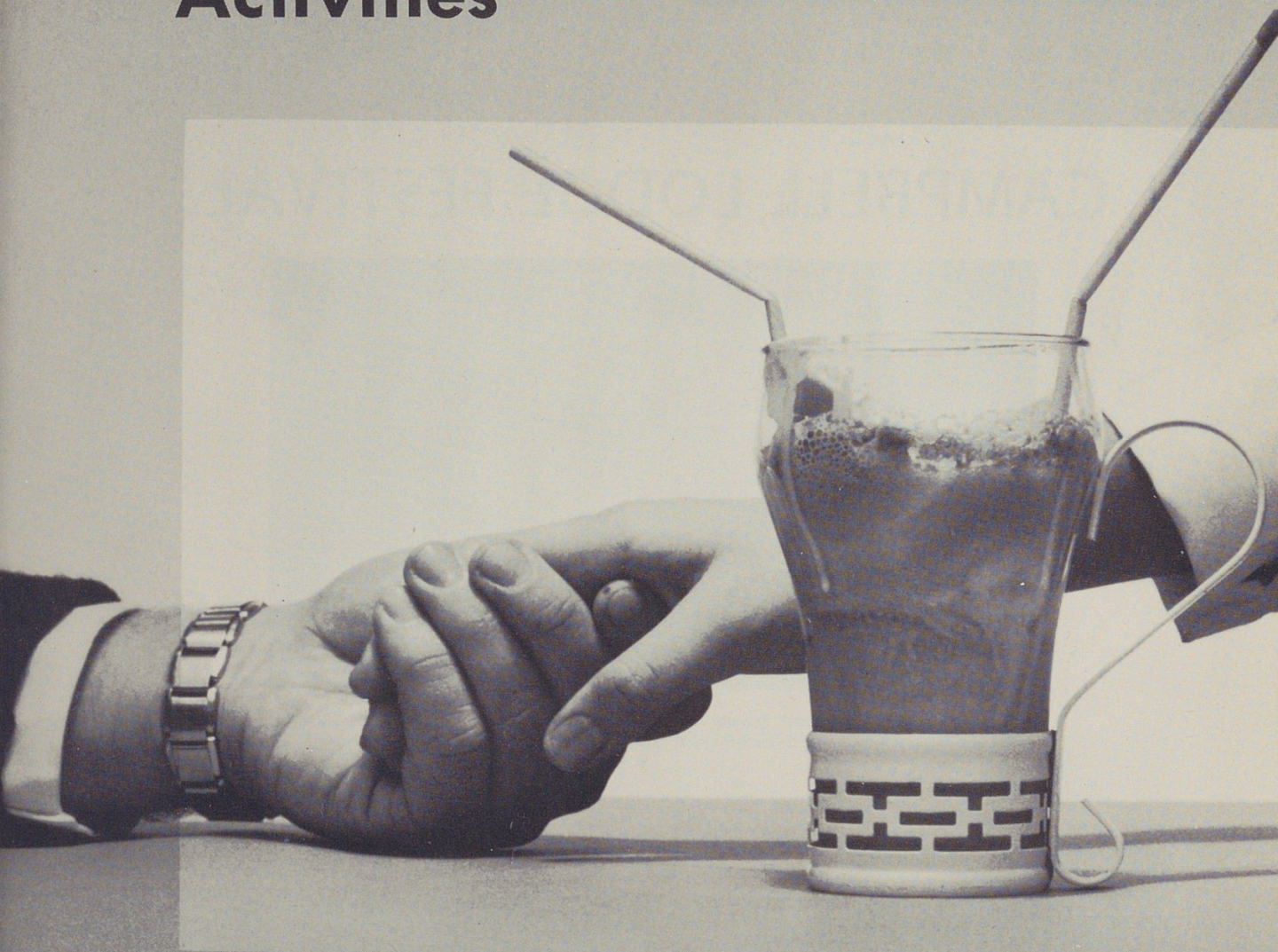
