






MR. MARION WALLACE MR. KENNETH BAHLER


MR. GIERHART was graduated from Wittenberg College. He will complete his Masters Degree this summer. He teaches arithmetic and Industrial Arts.

MISS SMITH, our home economics instructor, attended Earlham College at Richmond, Indiana and is a graduate of Ohio State University.






In May, our activities as a Junior Class were climaxed by the Junior-Senior farewell.







We are indebted to Mr. Bahler for the assistance he has given us in getting the pictures for the annual and also to many others who have helped in the publication of our book.











Chorus




The purpose of our club is to strive to become better homemakers.








The Germantown Cardinals have indeed had a very successful season.




