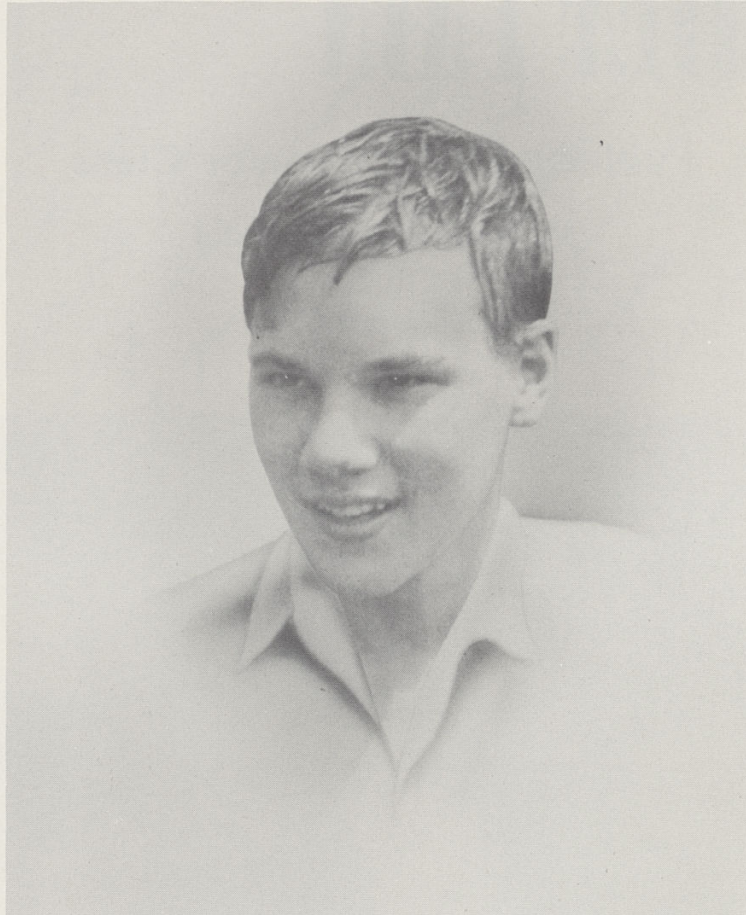

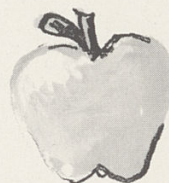
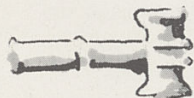
What is the purpose of this, your 1957 Chieftain? Why did the editors work all year putting it together, and why did you buy it?

be a real challenge to next year's freshmen.

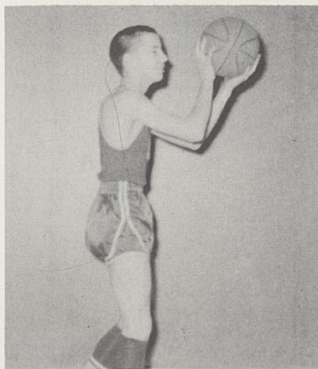
