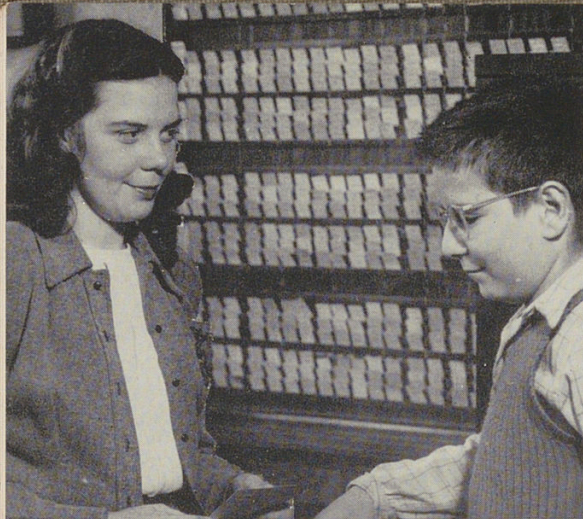
student councilors ●

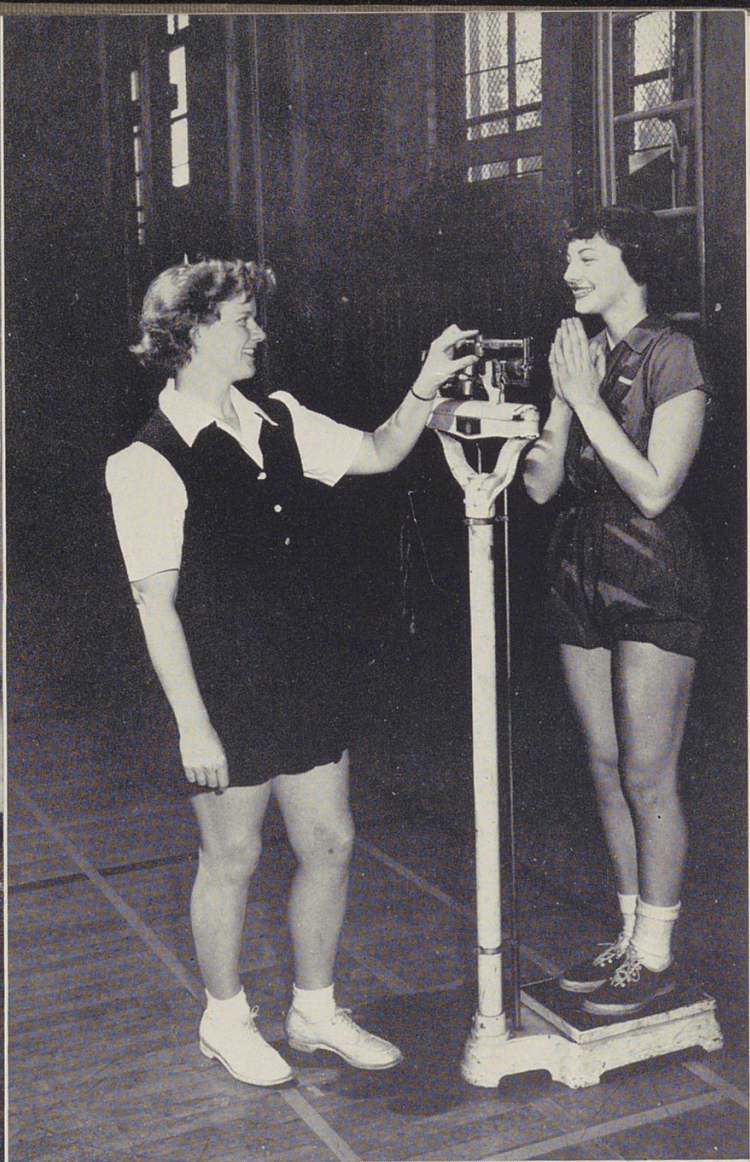

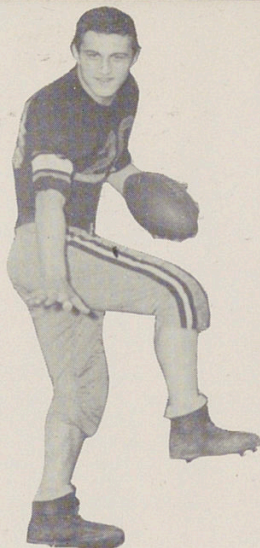
● tigers tally successful season

● As once again the last remnants of summer vanished, carrying with them cherished, carefree holidays, Football, idolized king of sports, assumed the rein of public interest. 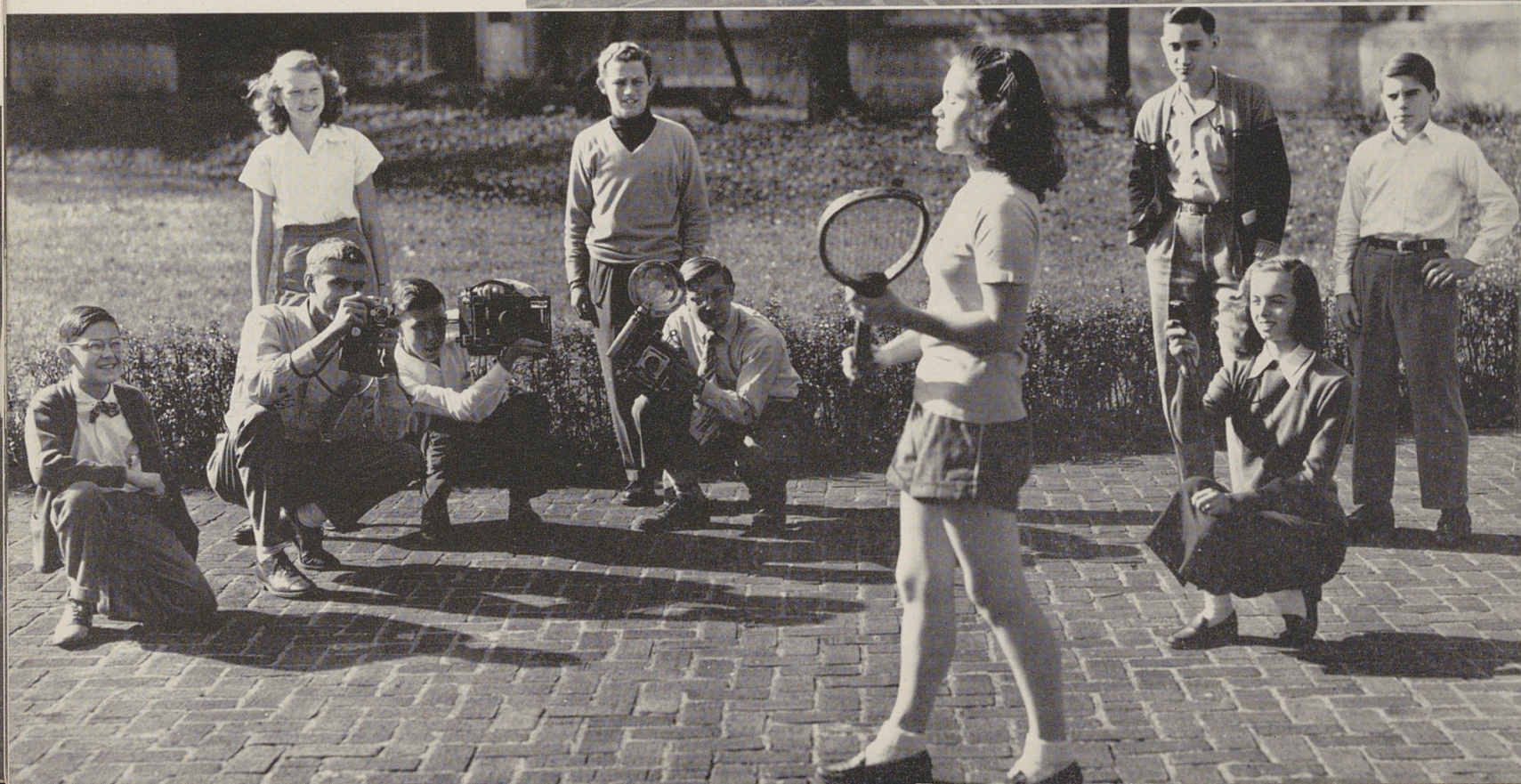
