FLASHING OVER THE HARDWOOD FLOORS SPEEDY TIGERMEN TALLY ANOTHER BASKET

Withrow's Varsity basketball team opened the 46-47 season by a game with Roger Bacon, which was played here. The 500 fans that attended the contest saw the Tiger team start the scoring early in the first period on Art Jauch's charity toss and a field goal by Norm Phillips. The second half opened with both teams on even terms for about the first six minutes; then Bacon opened up and piled up a score of 29-23. In the fourth period Withrow's Art Jauch and Jim Wuenker fouled out early—and the game ended with a score of 42-34 in favor of the Spartans. The first victory of the season for the Tigers was the Woodward game, when our boys downed the Bulldogs 36-34. Jim Wuenker was the top

scorer with twelve points; Forbriger was second with eleven. In the third game of the season Walnut Hills proved too much for the Tigers. Wuenker, Jauch, and Forbriger led the high scorers, but the game ended 51-35 despite their efforts. The Withrow squad moved into second place in the P. H. S. L. when they downed Western Hills on January 10, by taking the lead 57-33. The season moved on and the Tiger victory over Central was their eighth in 18 starts and the seventh P. H. S. L. victory in ten games. The season closed on March 8, 1947, as the district tournaments ended. Six of our boys qualified for varsity letters. They were: Jim Wuenker, Bill Forbriger, Art Jauch, Norm Phillips, Jim Nieson and Jim Colwell.
