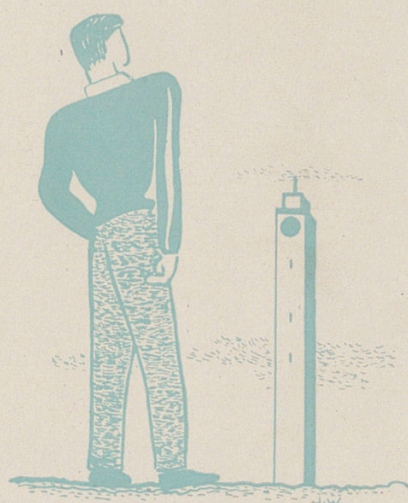

Mr. Walter Peoples, Principal 1933 to 1947

Withrow mourned for a great man and staunch friend when, on November 24, 1947, her principal, Mr. Walter Peoples, died. To him this Book is dedicated.

When Withrow opened in the fall of 1919, Mr. Peoples came from Madisonville School to be assistant principal of "East High", as our school was called at that time. It was fourteen years later, in 1933 that he was appointed Withrow's principal. From the first, his interest in every phase of the life of the school was keen. There was nothing, either in the academic field or in that of athletics, which was not his vital concern. During his early years at Withrow Mr. Peoples supervised the golf team and was never known to miss a football game. He was a constant seeker after all that was worthwhile in educational progress and encouraged pupils to be sincere students.

We are proud of the fact that Mr. Peoples was president, of the South Western Teachers' Association for the year 1946-1947, and of the way he presided at the convention.

We are proud of his many splendid achievements in the field of education, but we like also to think of the kindly, human side of his nature. In our memories of him, he appears often with a twinkle in his eyes and laughter on his lips. We quote an incomparable description of him from the issue of the Tower News which announced his appointment as principal: "He is stern, yet kind; pupils admire and respect him as their principal and feel free to associate with him as a friend."

The words with which he opened his principalship are typical of his attitude through all his years here: "Withrow begins the year of 1933-34 with the largest enrollment in her history, but all of us know that numbers alone cannot make a great school. There need be no long list of rules and regulations to have Withrow a good school. If the pupils are honest and industrious and if their conduct is guided by what they know to be right, we shall have a school of which to be proud."

May Withrow never fail his trust in her!

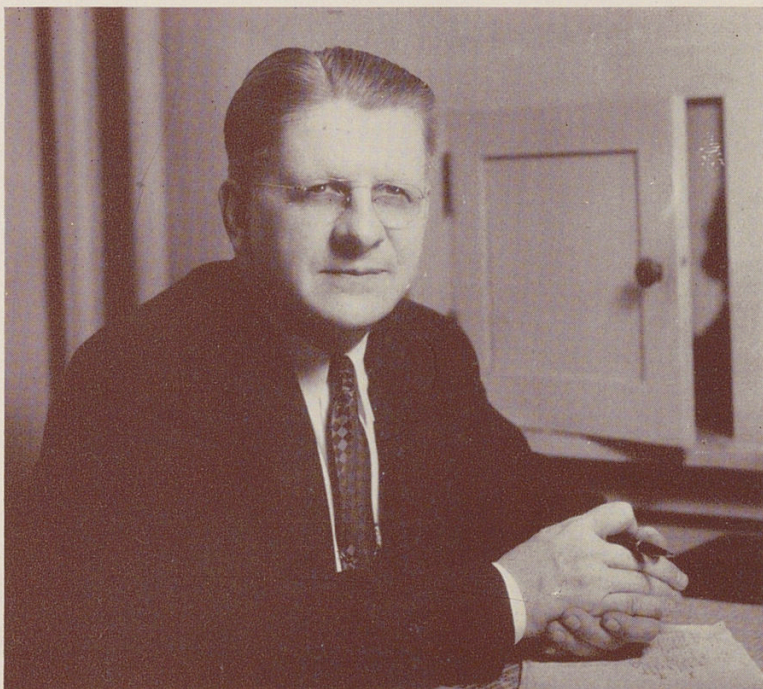


YOU And Your Office Staff...

Miss Madeline Berling

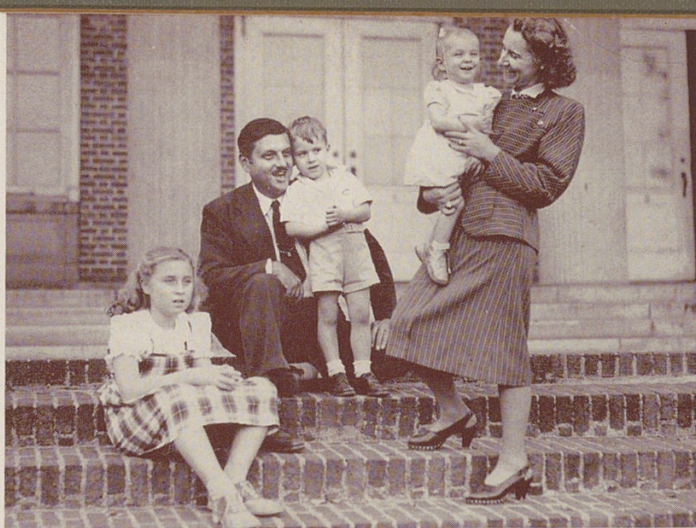

The Glee Clubs Gather For The Joy Of Singing

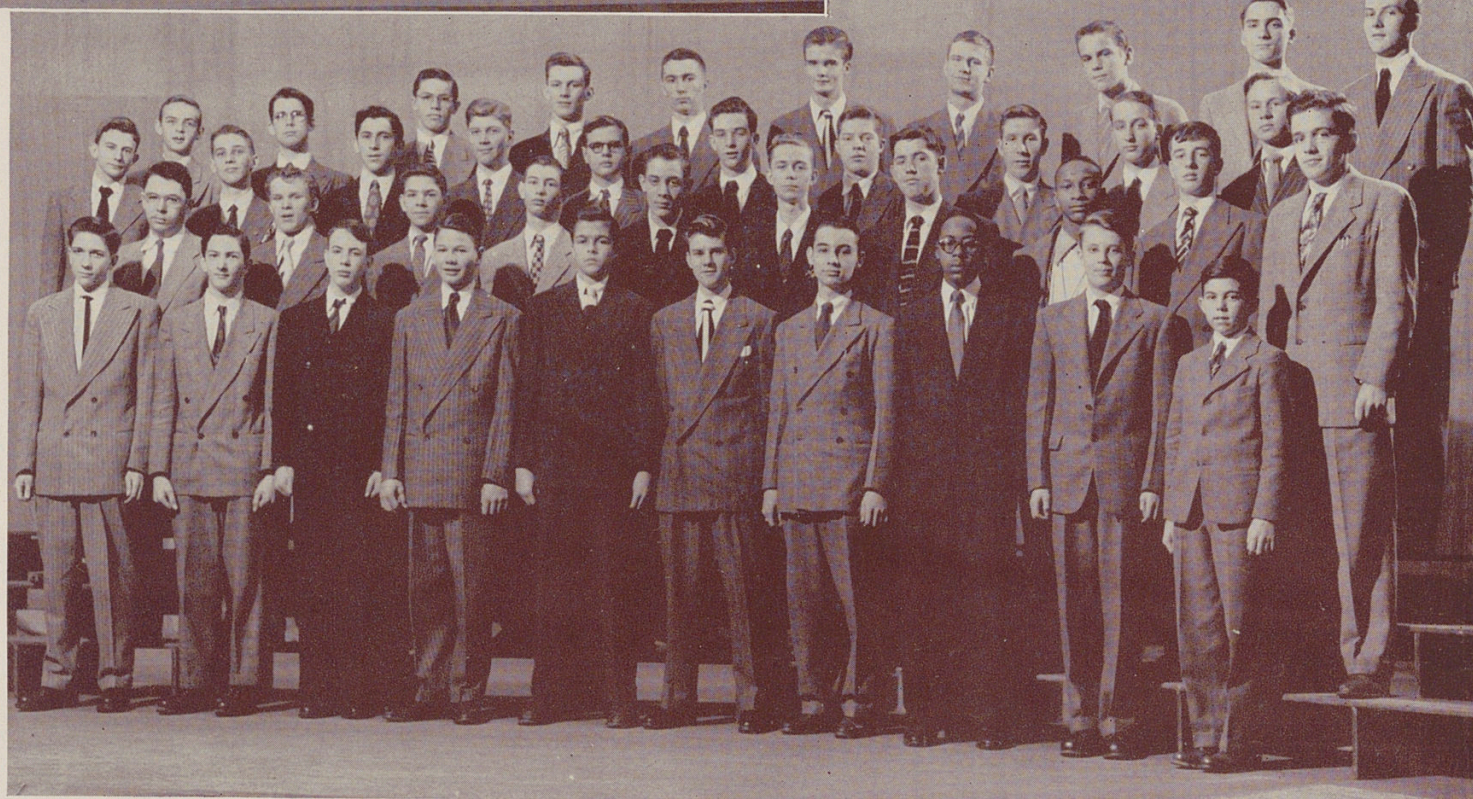

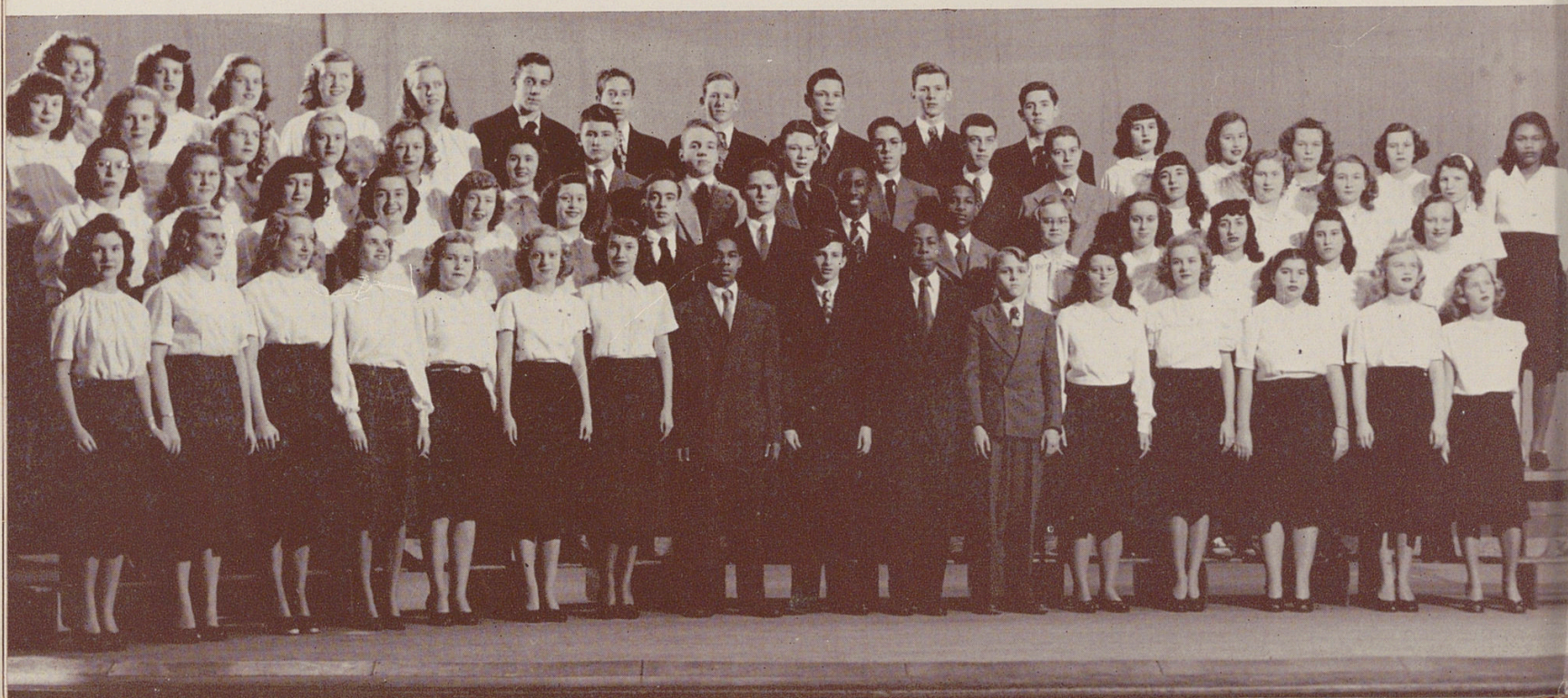

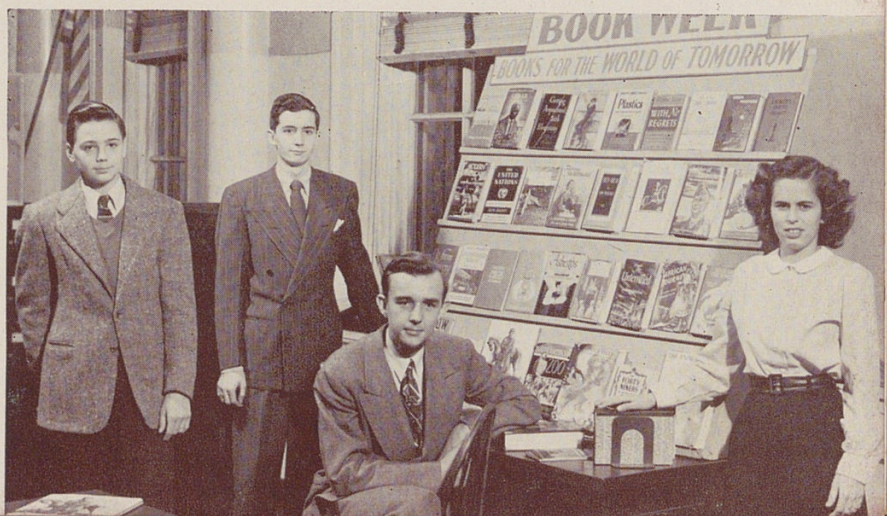

This year for six consecutive nights the Withrow Minstrels presented its eighteenth show. Few of us at Withrow know how the show got its start. Therefore we here present a brief history of Withrow's greatest tradition. In 1929 Mr. George G. Smith, a young, ambitious musician with generations of musical background and his inherited nickname—"Smittie," came to Withrow as a part time band director and harmony teacher. In 1930 the Withrow alumna association wanted a little musical program for part of its entertainment. Mr. Nelson Walkie was the director and Smittie had the job of handling the musical end of the program.

The first stage set; a very simple one, was merely a backdrop of grey curtains with a painted wooden moon hung in the center of

the stage above the orchestra. There were a few soloists, but the major part of the program was handled by the orchestra alone. That performance was such a success that it was decided to repeat the show in order to make money for the band. With the contribution of a piccolo from Tower News, Smittie and the orchestra set out to build up the show. The Ponies were added along with more soloists, and the entire program rounded out. In 1932 the minstrels had no equipment, but they rented lights and had Mr. Paul Heckel with them. Mr. Heckel was a master at set design and produced some beautiful, imaginative backgrounds for the show. The first pony costumes were made of oil cloth and were knee length. The show was a scintillating hit. Smittie and his Minstreleers did

wonders for school spirit and school pride. 1932 was the "opportunity year" for the show. The Wurlitzer music company offered a prize, a trophy, and a week at the R.K.O. Albee in Cincinnati plus an engagement in the R.K.O. Keith's in Cleveland. The students begged, teased, tormented and finally succeeded in persuading Smittie to enter the orchestra in the contest—it won the "opportunity review." That gave the show its great boost. For eighteen years the show has grown and prospered, but it has done so only through the tireless efforts of Mr. and Mrs. George G. Smith. They'll always be "Smittie" and Thelma to Withrow

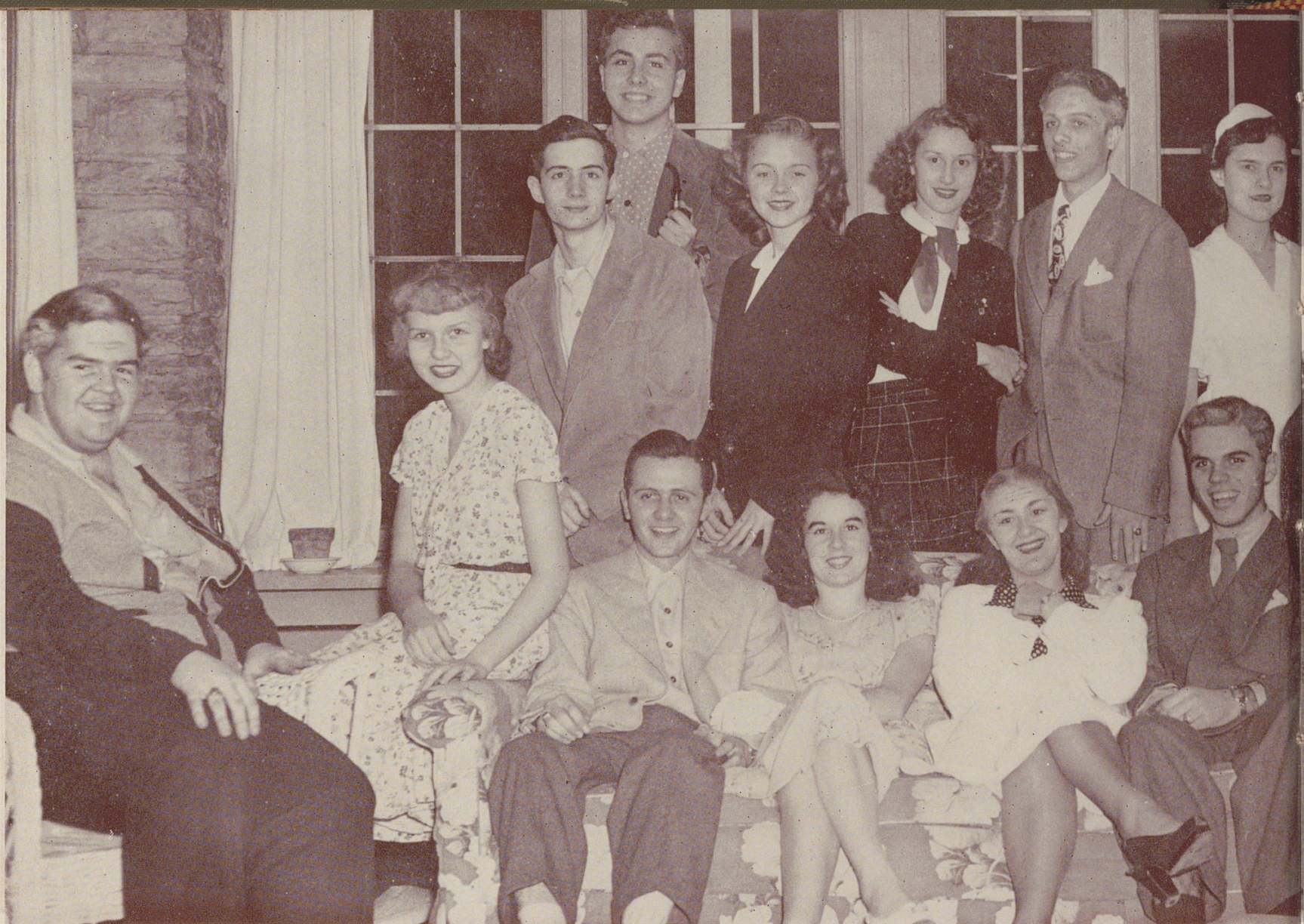
Withrow Players

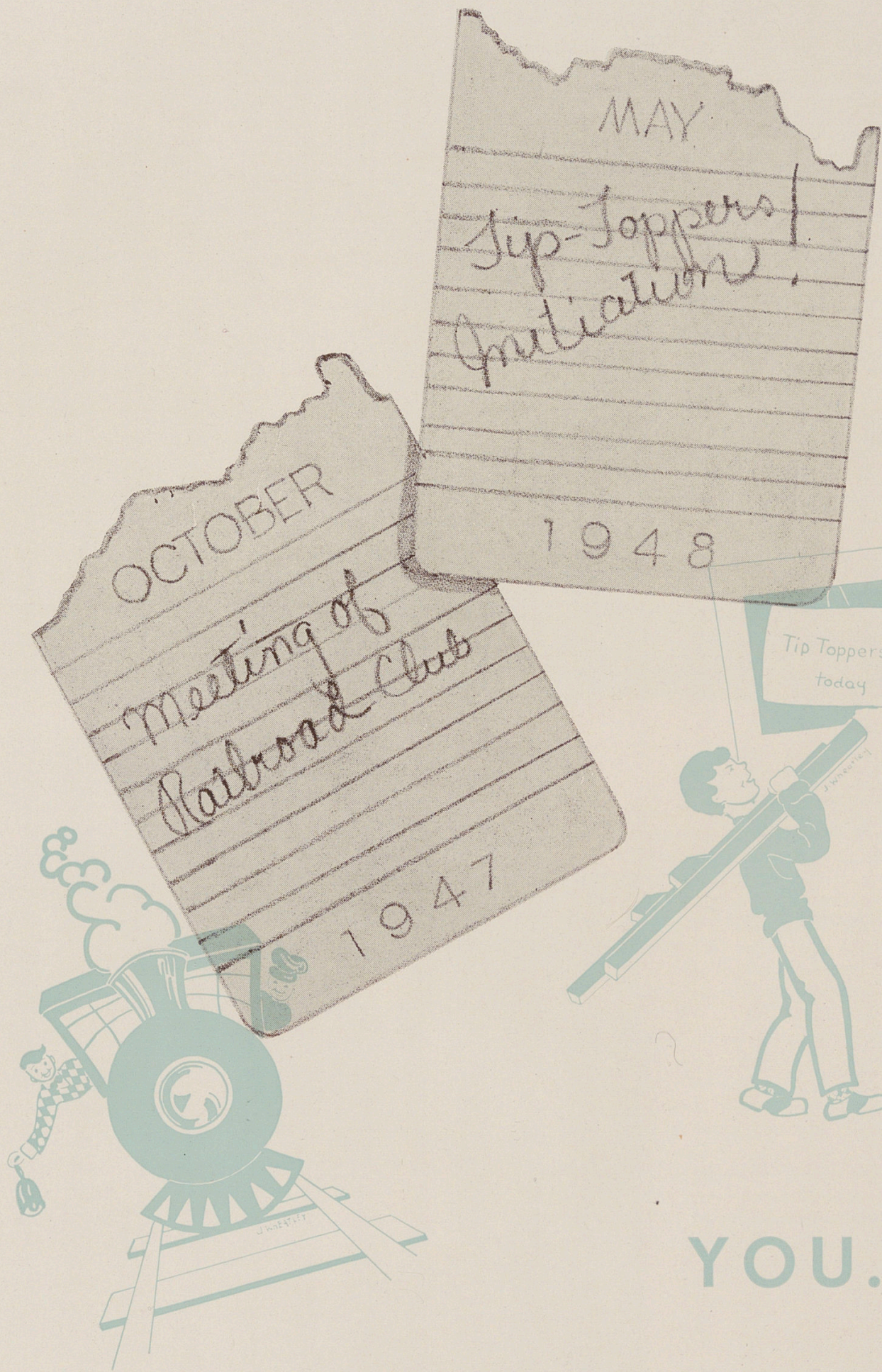

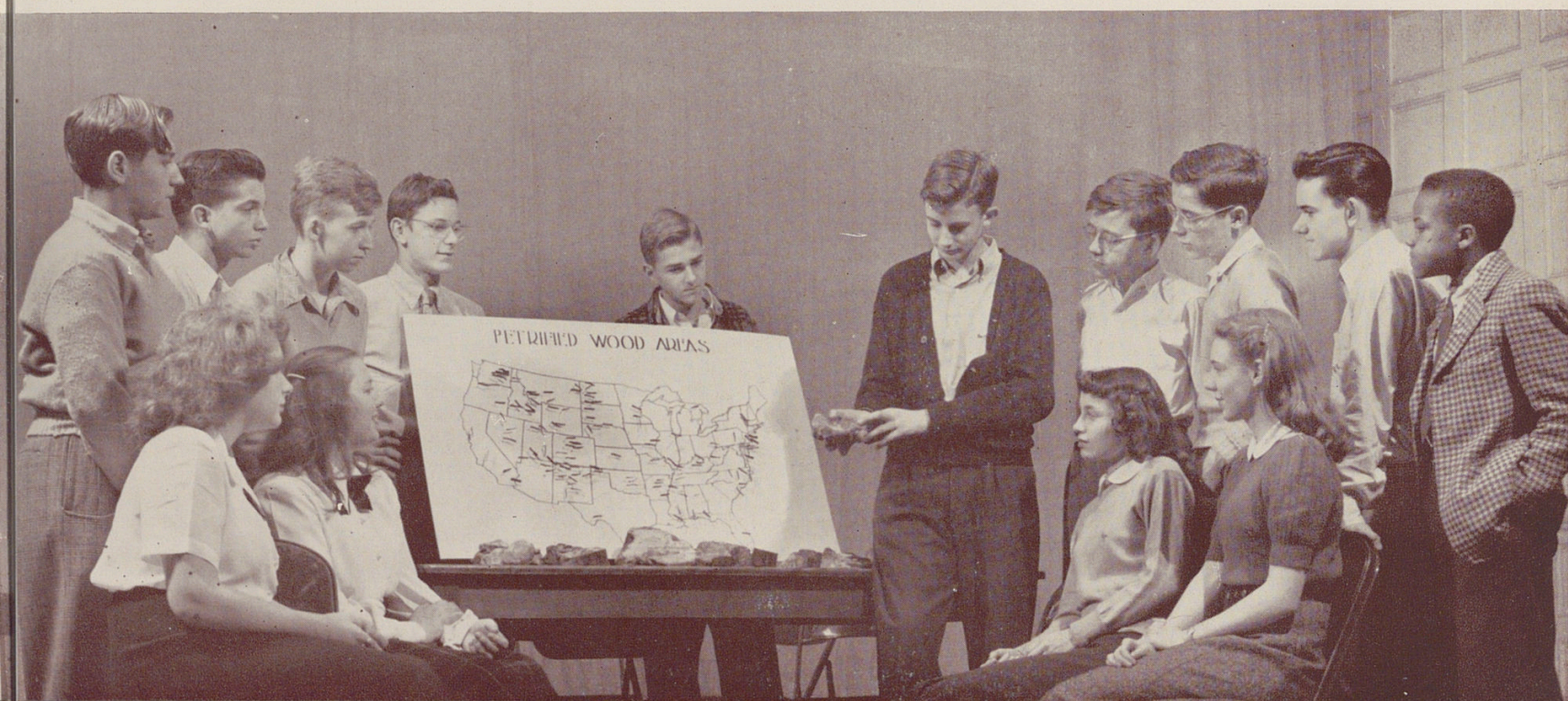
Lovers Of Mother Nature, This Club Is For You!

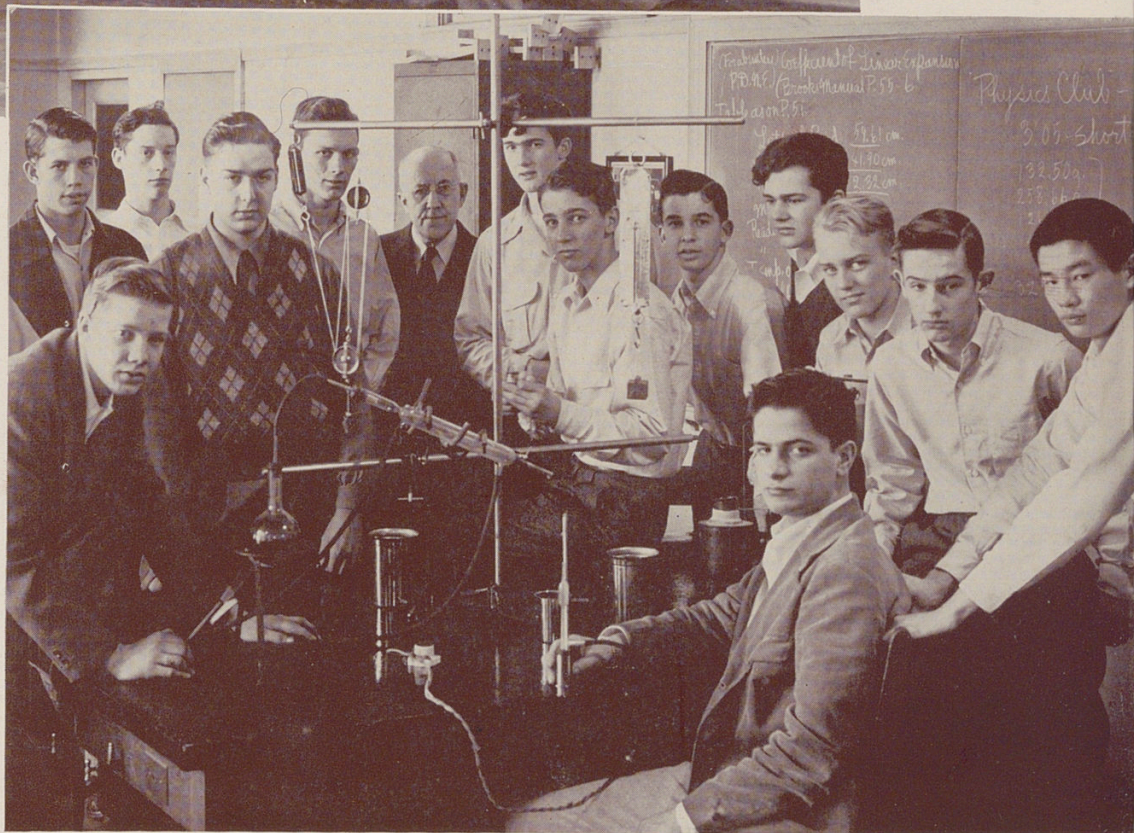

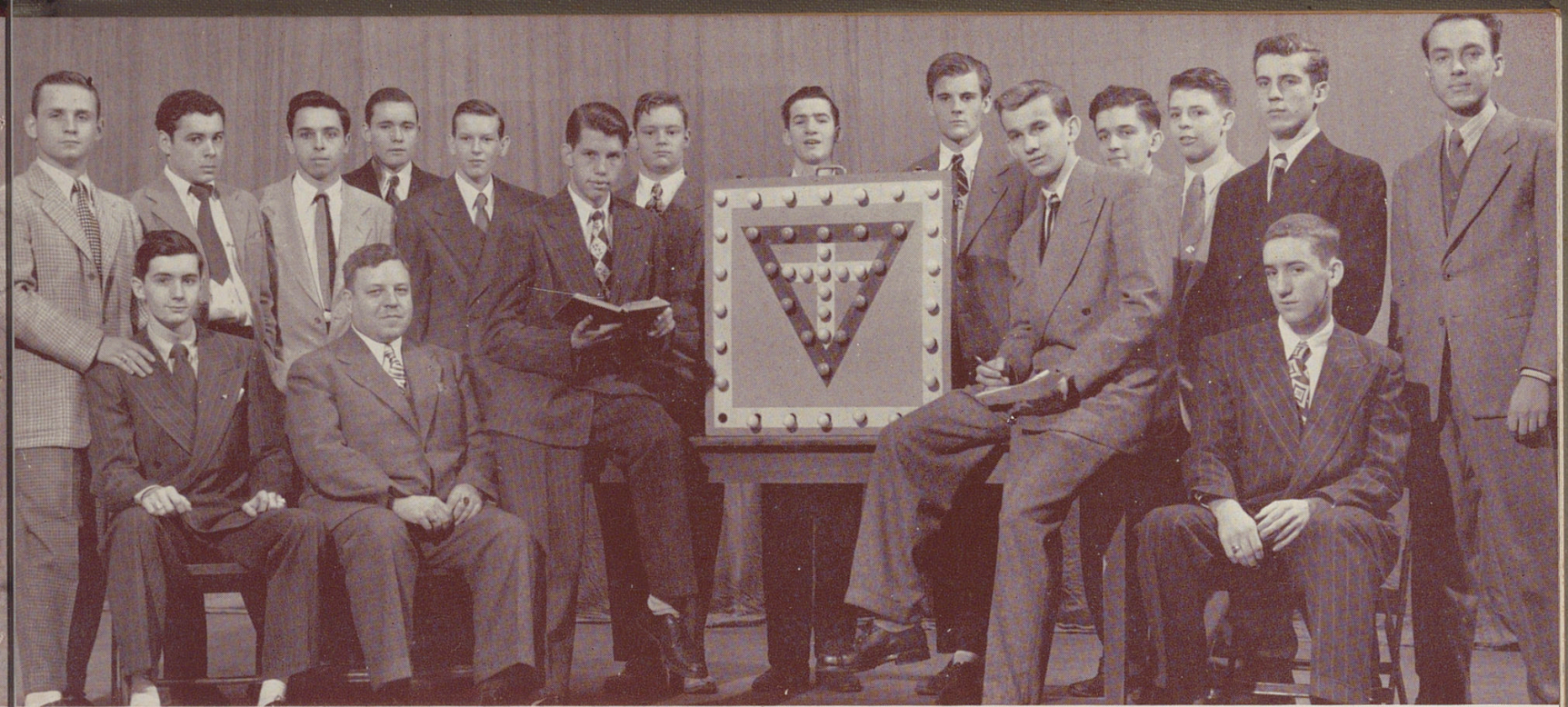

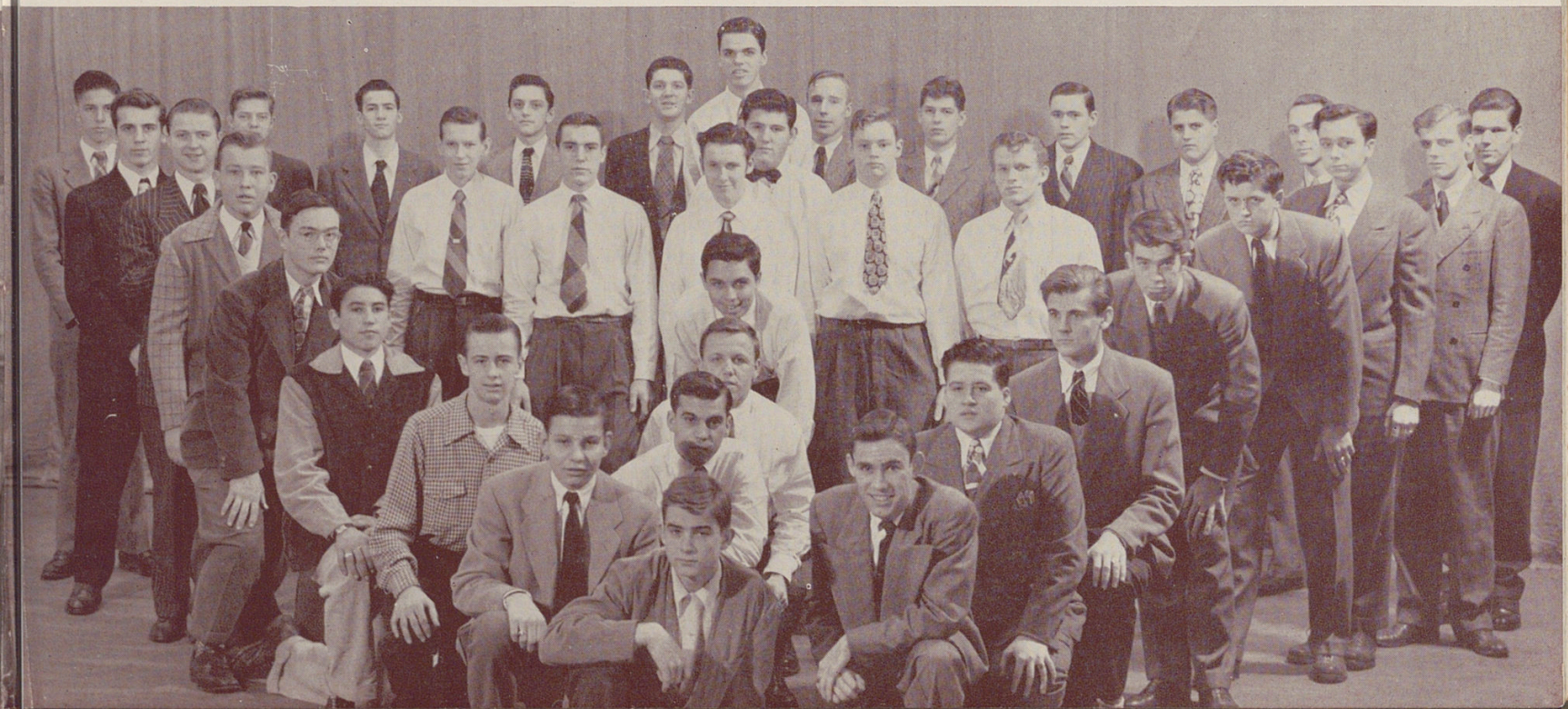

A Group Of Pupils Spent Easter In Washington

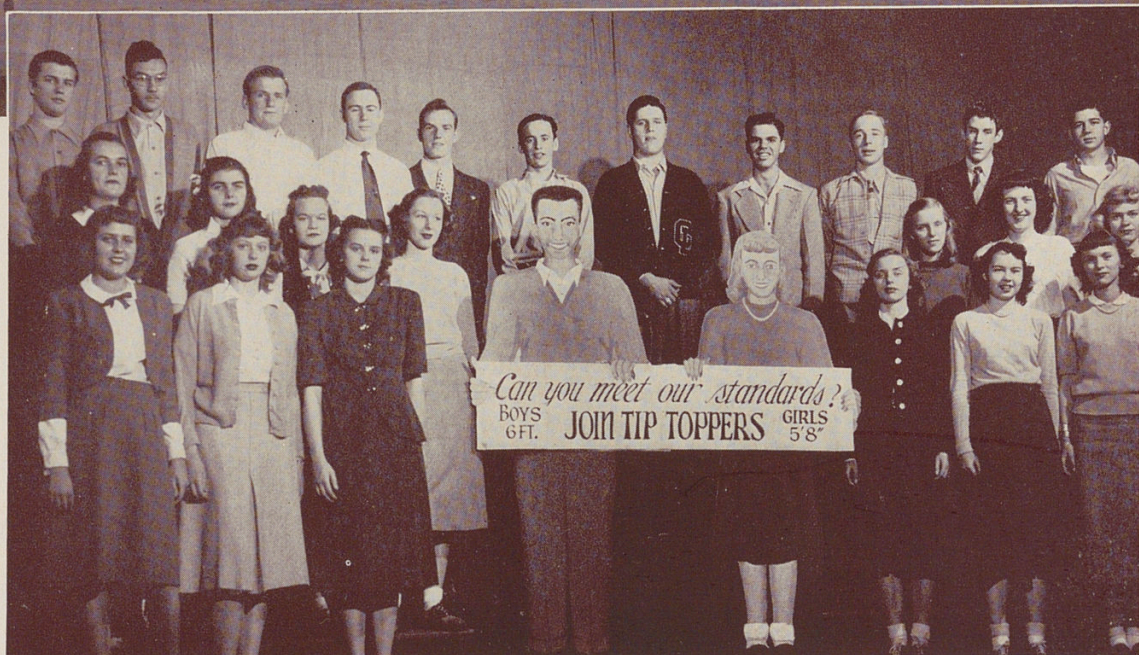

Top Coaches Of A Winning Team

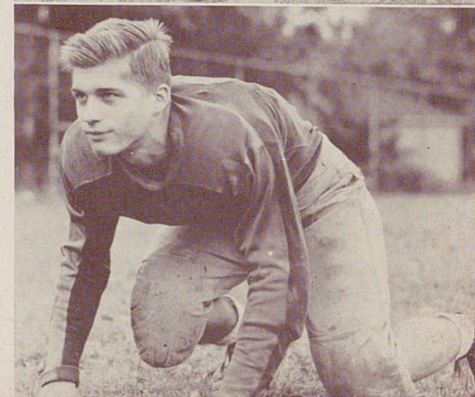
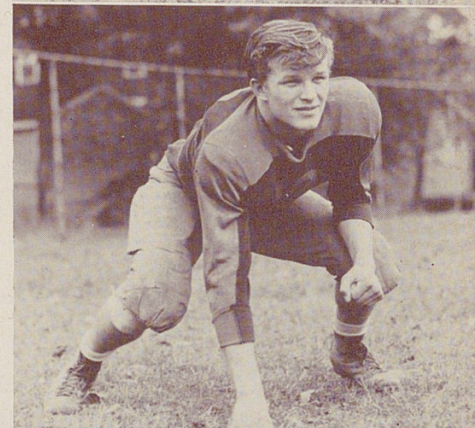

Withrow Closes Season, Winning P.H.S.L. Title

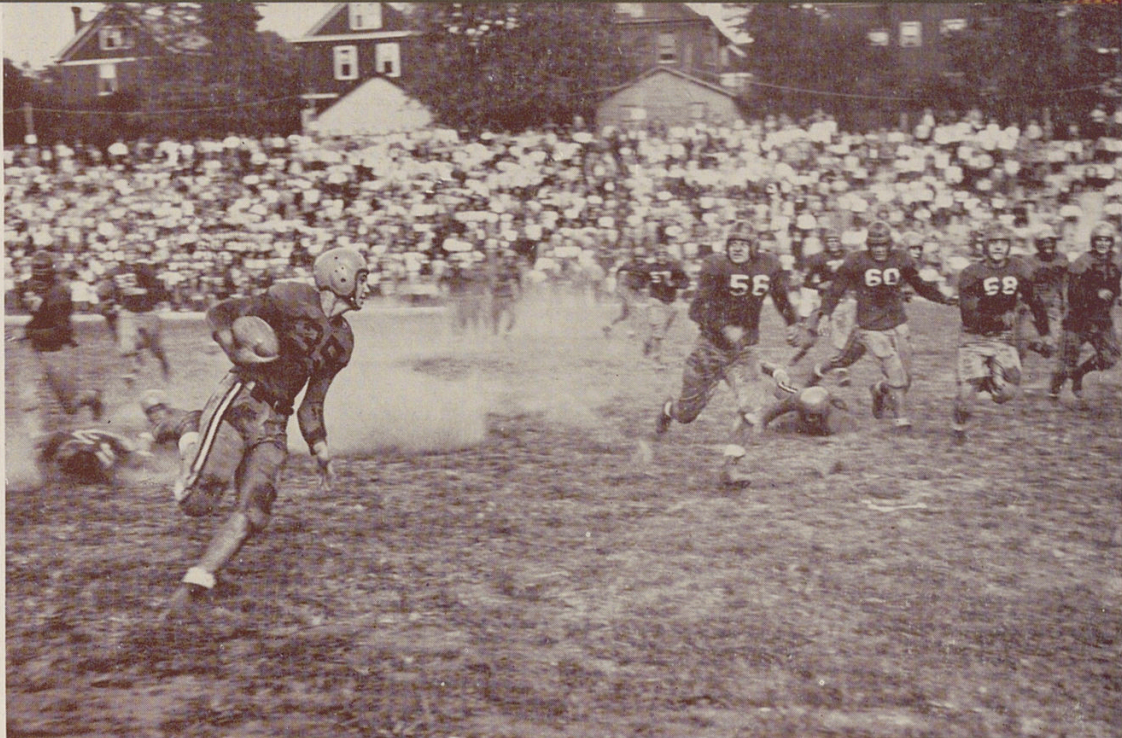
As cool, crisp, autumn breezes vied with humid heat for supremacy, and summer waned, Withrow's attention unanimously focused upon the National Sport—FOOTBALL. Football—the game which extends an invitation to everyone; the stouthearted may expend excess energy while their more timorous companions spend an enjoyable afternoon observing the game. In Tigertown proper the coaches, in preparation for the opening tilt of the coming saga, applied finishing touches to what was considered an extremely grid-iron squad.

The boys had worked exceedingly hard to condition themselves for the rough sixty minute battles that were to follow, and now that school was well under way the opening encounter loomed foremost in everyone's mind. This was to be the test of the material which long weeks of training had produced.

The campaign was launched with un hoped for success; and overrated Reading High fell beneath the shifty Tiger eleven, 35-0, as Charlie Meyer, rugged blocking back, tallied four markers. The Orange and Black continued to show power against Central Vocational in a 35-0 lopsided victory over the Hornets. Quarterback Jim Neison sparked the offense from the T formation, while George Fry was the unsung hero of the forward wall. The first month of school having passed, Withrow launched full scale into pigskin entertainment. After passing over their first two opponents with comparative ease, the Tigertown boys suffered their first setback of the season at the hands of St. X. in a heartbreaker under the lights at Xavier Stadium. This traditional tilt was close, 21-12, and hard fought all the way. The pigskin toters retaliated, however, the following week and moved back into the win column by upsetting a highly praised Elder eleven, 25-0. The play was rugged and it took Willard Van Epps and Norm Phillips to blast the opposing line for pay dirt, so that Withrow wound up on the long end of the score with its third victory in hand. The tables were turned, however, as the Purcell Cavaliers dealt out a severe trouncing to our boys, who failed to break the jinx which has been maintained for the past

four consecutive years. The potent combination of tough Purcell boys and a drizzling rain proved to be just too much for the Tiger squad as they fumbled their way to an 18-0 setback. Hard times seemed to follow the Tigers as they approached mid-season by coming out on the short end of a 19-7 encounter with Shortridge. The game was exciting and well fought, and our hats are off to the Indiana boys for their good sportsmanship.

Although Withrow's chances for a 1948 district championship had waned considerably, the entire school waited in keen anticipation for the concluding games of the season, which would decide the outstanding public and parochial teams of the year. Thus it was felt that the coming tilt with Western Hills would be decisive in the hotly contested race for the PHSL championship. However, before a large crowd at the University Stadium, the Tigers and Maroons fought to a 6-6 deadlock, allowing the outcome of the race to remain in doubt. The following week Withrow played host to a lightly underrated Walnut Hills eleven and, although play was close for the first three quarters, the Tigertown boys, sparked by Norm Phillips, finally smashed through to a 14-2 victory. The Tigers then took time out from Cincinnati competition to journey up-state to Chillicothe, Ohio, to try their hand. The Cavaliers showed an exceptional passing ability which, combined with their ground power, proved too much, as we dropped the tussle, 33-20. Nevertheless the game was a thriller, and a number of our boys played spectacular ball. After returning home, Withrow's grid eleven was confronted with the Hughes Big Reds in the decisive tilt of the season. We were host on that chilly November day as Withrow's ample stadium was filled with ardent supporters of the opposing teams. Play was tight throughout every second of the sixty minutes, and the crowd was especially tense as the closing minutes waned. However, the Orange and Black maintained an early fourth quarter lead, and as the gun sounded, by defeating their oldest rival, Hughes, Withrow became 1948 Public High School Champions. 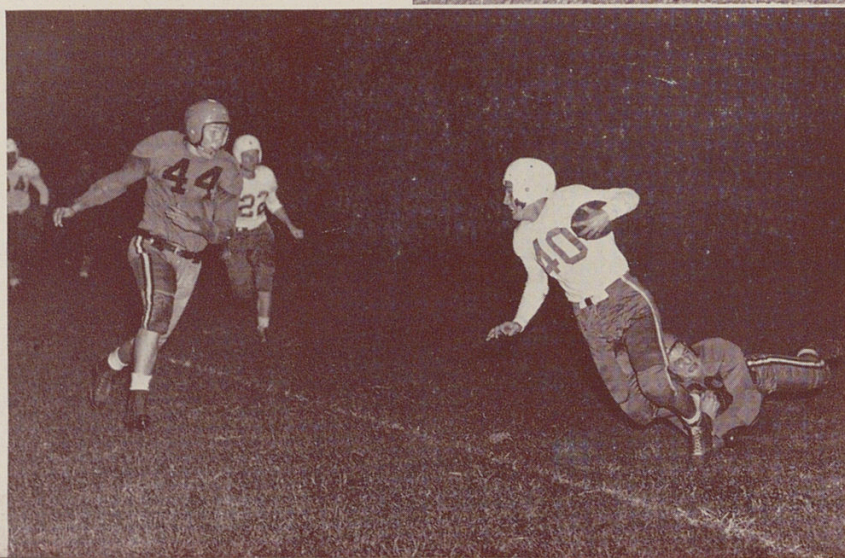

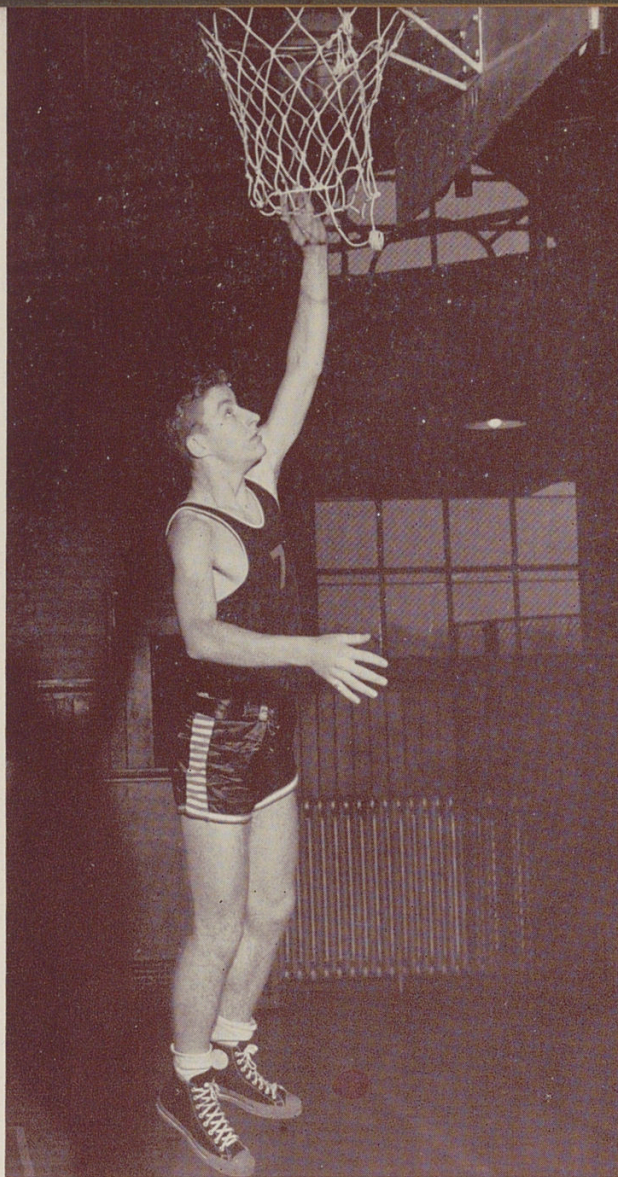

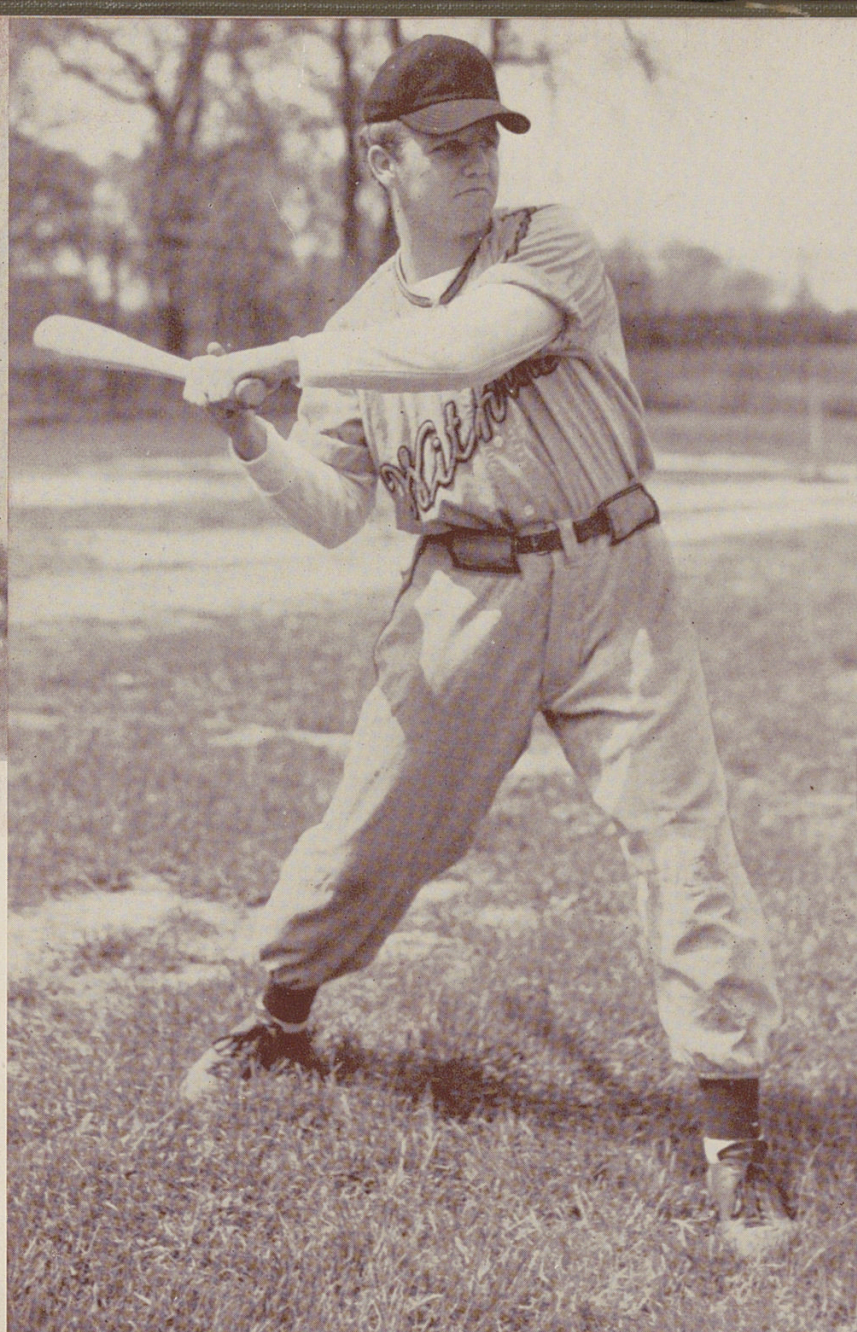
These Boys Uphold Withrow's Track Precedent

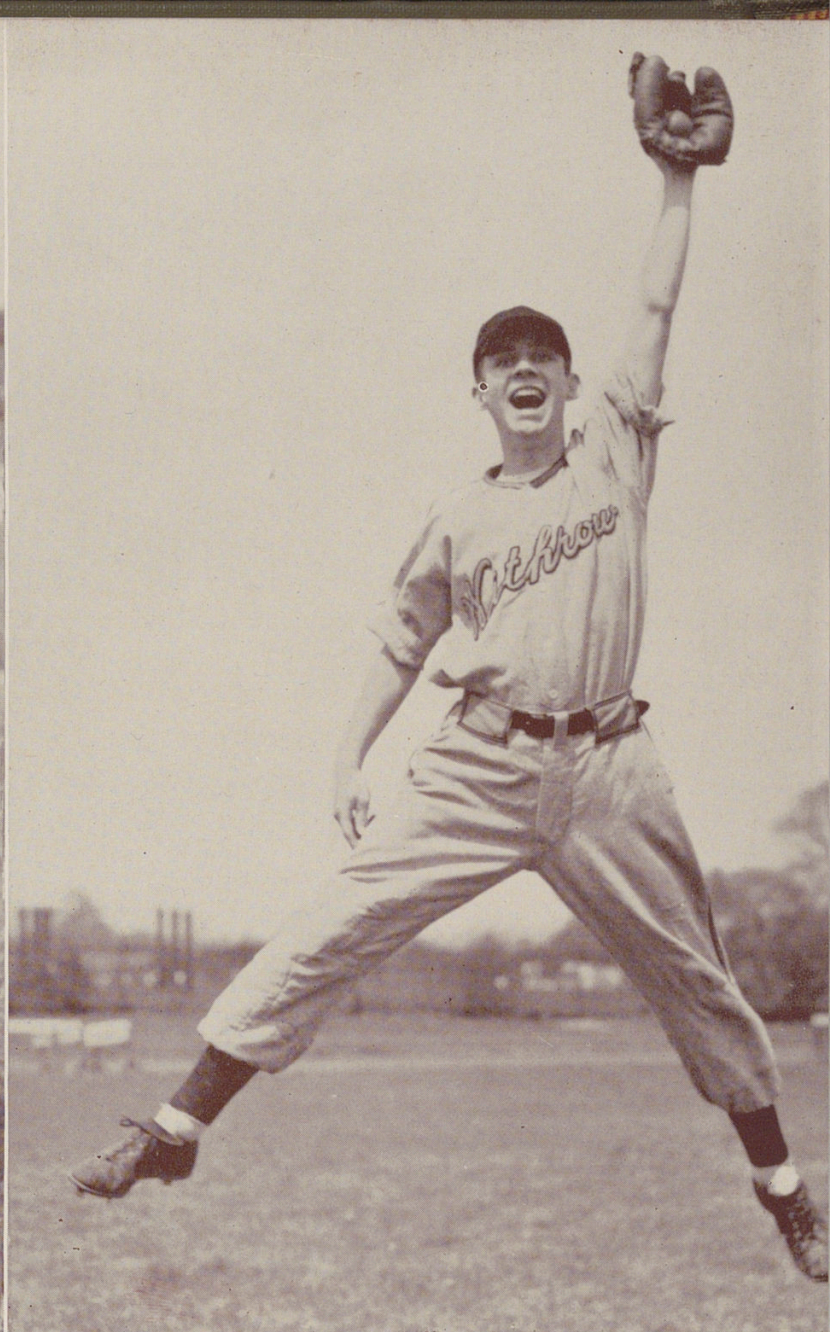

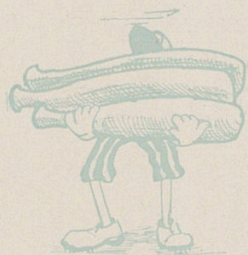

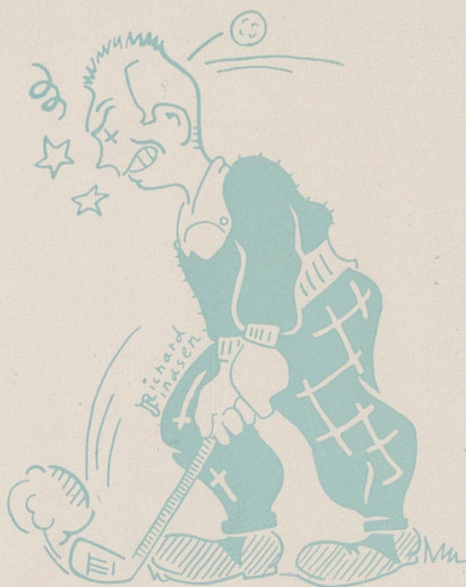
Golf Team Tees Off

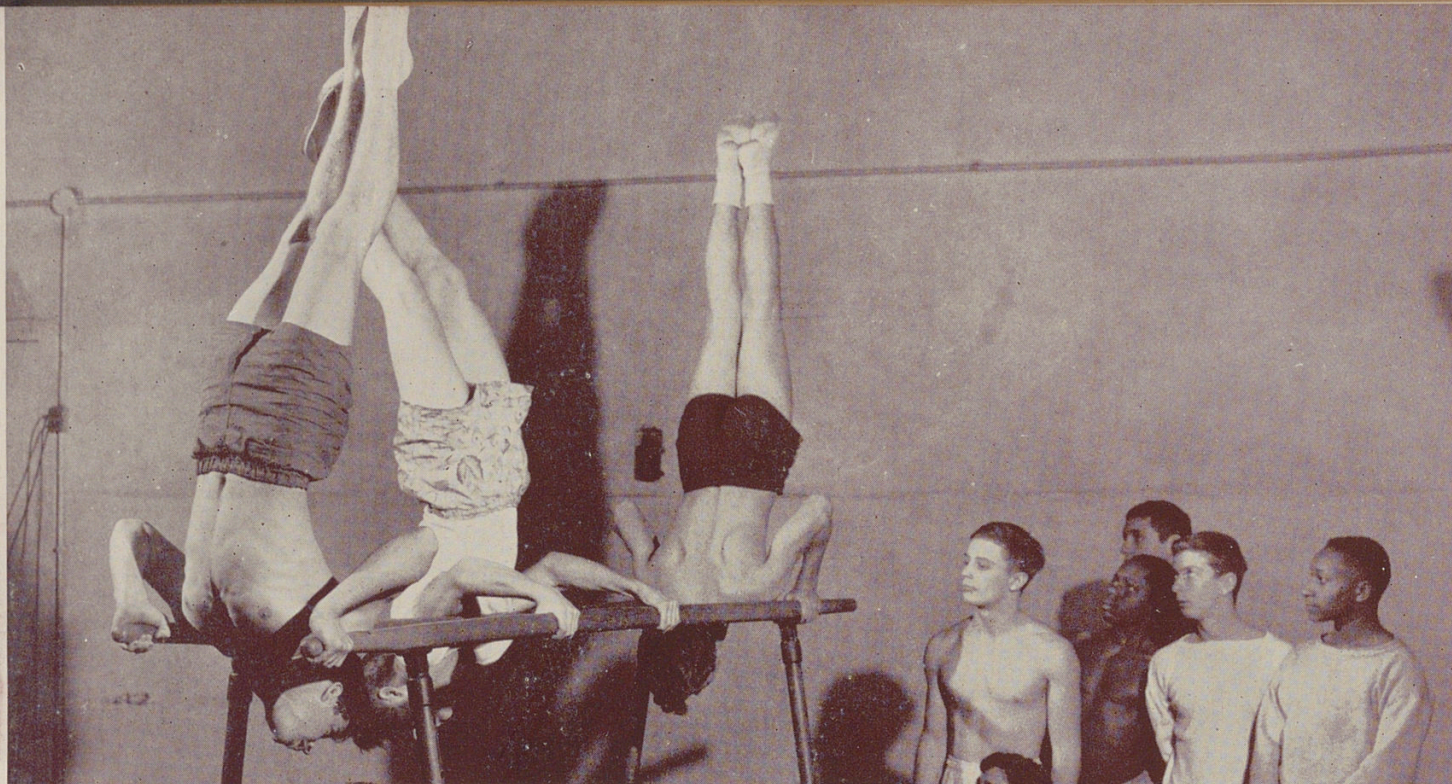

G. A. A. Members Find Tennis A Fine Sport

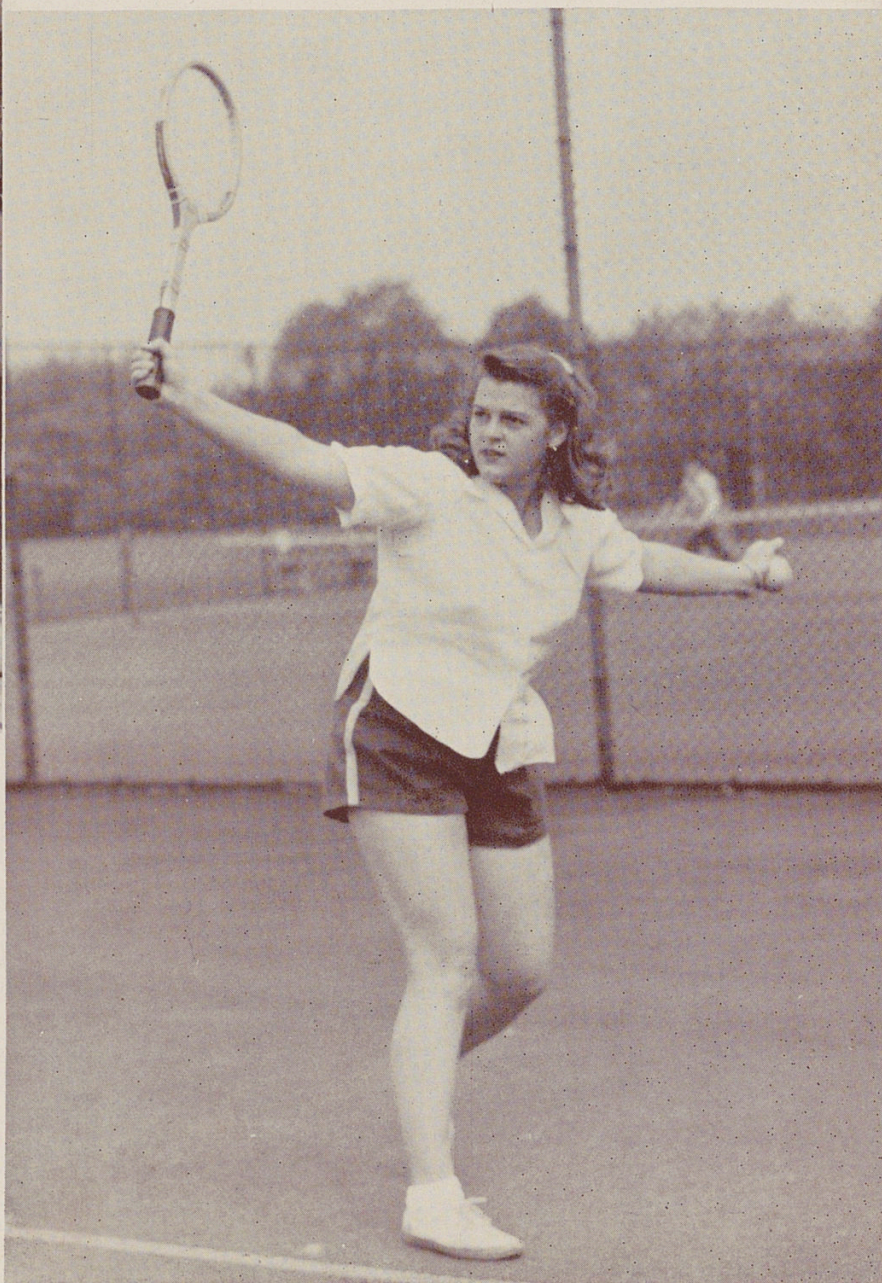

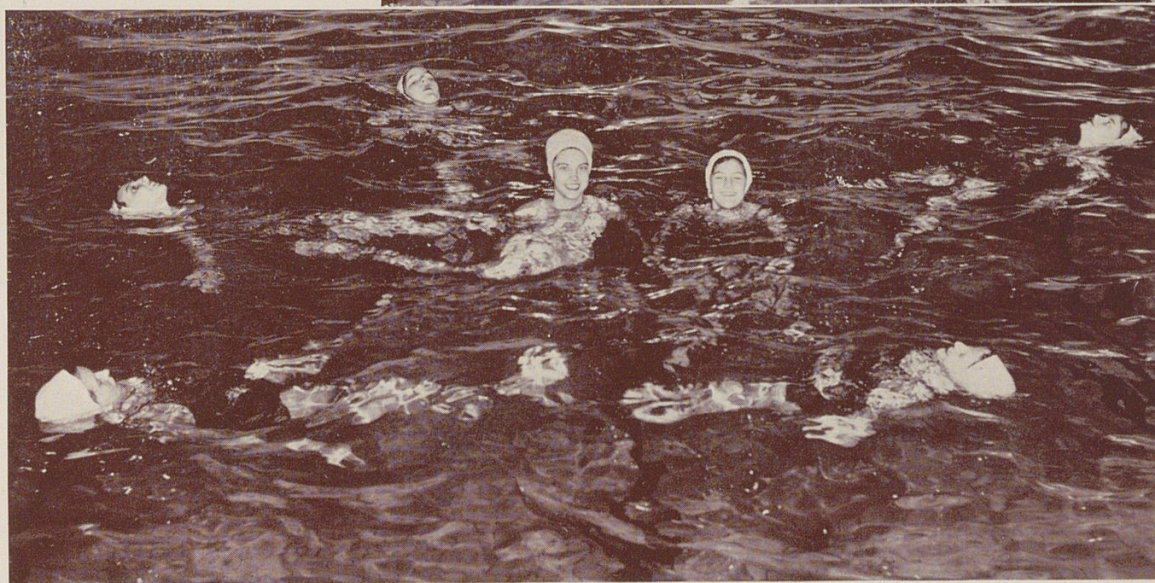

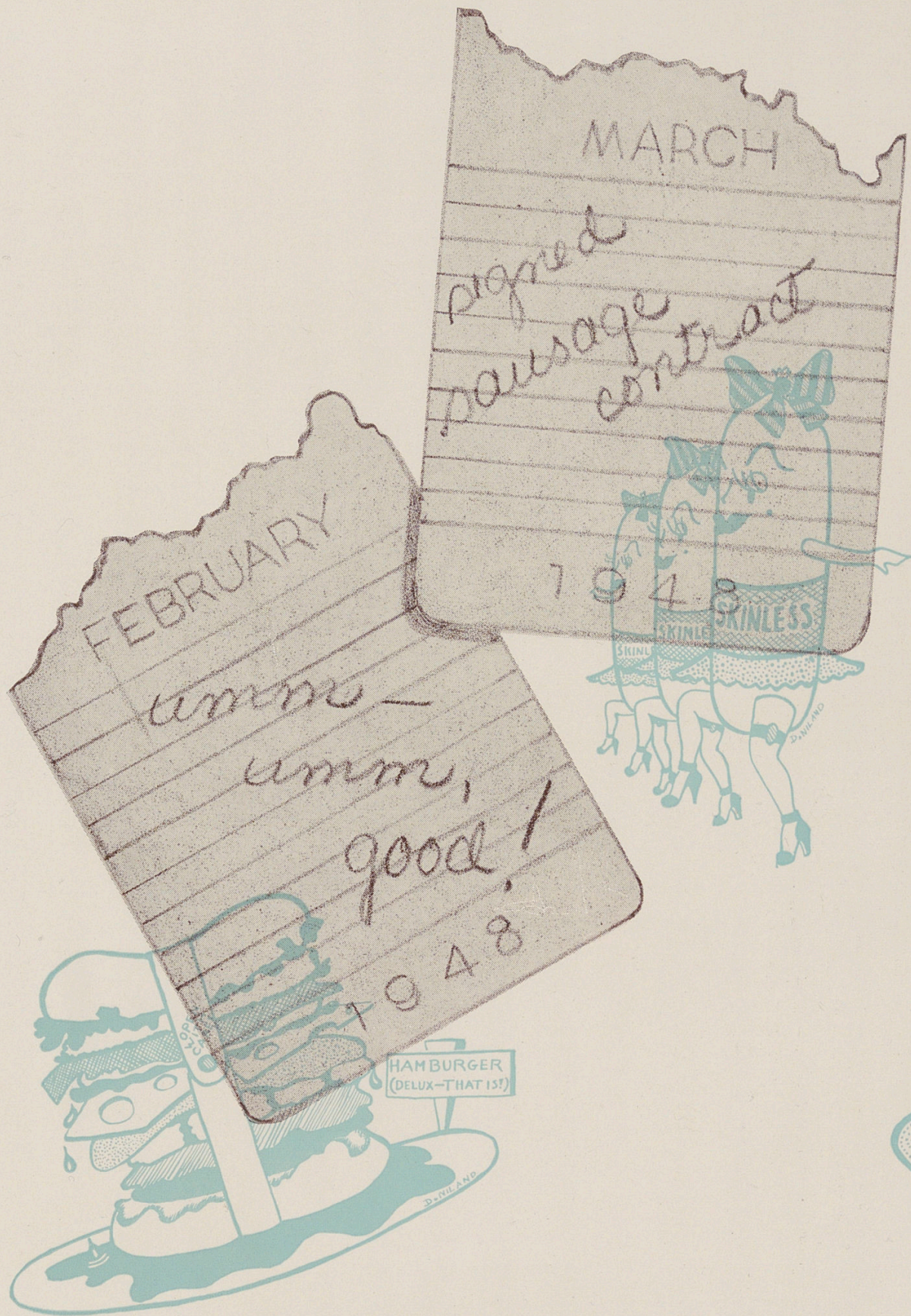
