KING BASKETBALL REIGNS IN TIGERTOWN,

At this the 1951-52 edition of the Withrow Tigers was incredible. In 25 contests the cat cagers meshed 1564 points, an average of 62.5 per game. Led by Dave Plunkett with 476 points and captain Willie Ernst who pitched in 370, the aggregation posted a 21-4 mark for the campaign in which was included an all-conquering 9-1 slate in PHSL, a district, and a regional championship, and a trip to Columbus for the state tournament, where it took Middletown, the subsequent state champ, to stop Withrow's terrific Tigers.
