STUDENT COUNCIL

Last year after much talk concerning a **student council** here at Withrow, a committee was selected to develop this project. The committee chosen by deans and home room teachers and based on general academic standards wrote to various schools to obtain their student council constitutions for study. As the constitution was written, it was decided that the aims of council would be to encourage leadership and high scholarship, to create a greater sense of responsibility among students, to further school spirit, and to foster a spirit of understanding and co-operation between the students and the members of the faculty. After the plan gained the acceptance of the school, elections were held in May. A representative was selected by each home room, and a number of members at large were chosen so that each class would have equal representation. The new council officers, meeting the council standards, were: **Bob Surman**, President; **Tom Chapopoulo**, Vice-President; **Mariann Newbold**, Treasurer; and **Ann Rice**, Secretary.

Helping with the money on any project is the purpose of the **Finance Committee**. These and all council projects are supervised by their able advisers, **Miss Tilford, Mr. Srofe, and Mrs. Konrad**. In their monthly meetings the group as a whole plans many things. A clean-up campaign was promoted last year and has been continued throughout the current year. This fall the council launched a drive for more school spirit. To promote this drive, they gave an exciting outdoor pep assembly, complete with orange and black crepe paper shakers and a march to "The Square." Other council measures included two more pep assemblies, planned yuletide caroling, a survey concerning a junior prom and an attempt to get a phone in the main hall. Through these activities it is apparent that the goals of the council are being fulfilled and appreciated.

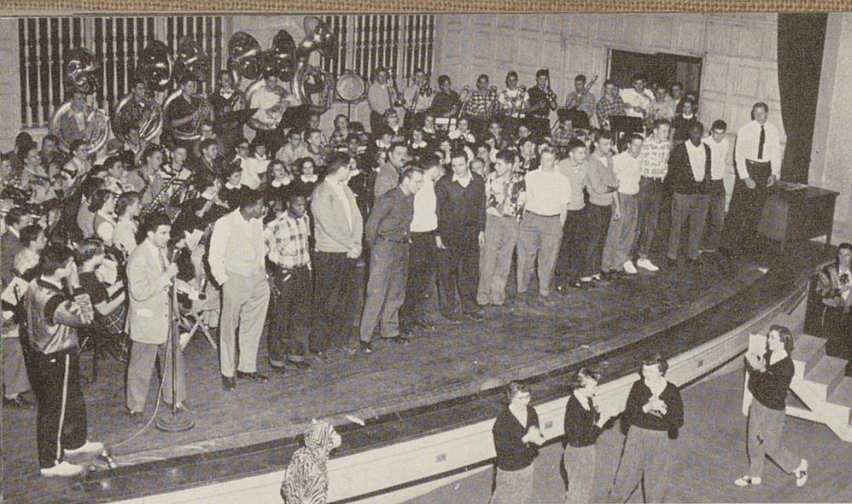
HOURS OF BACK-BREAKING PRACTICE.

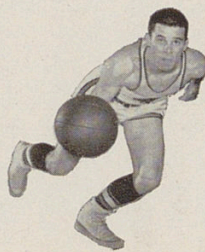

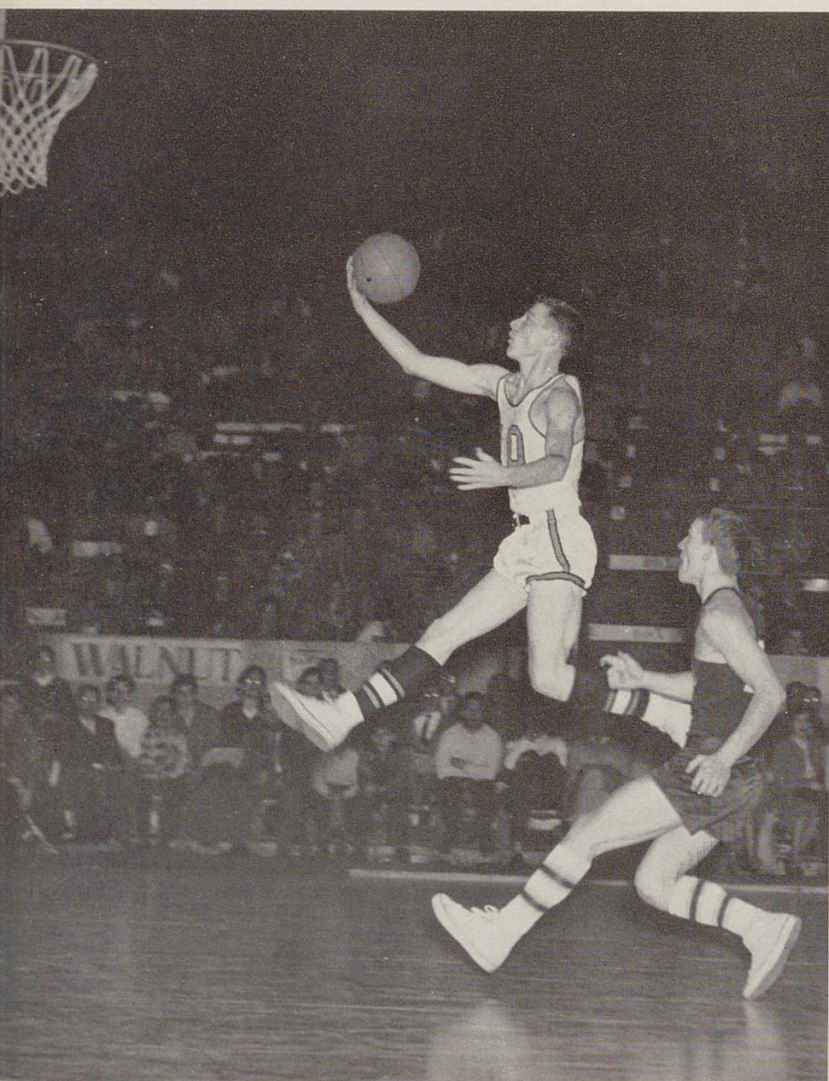

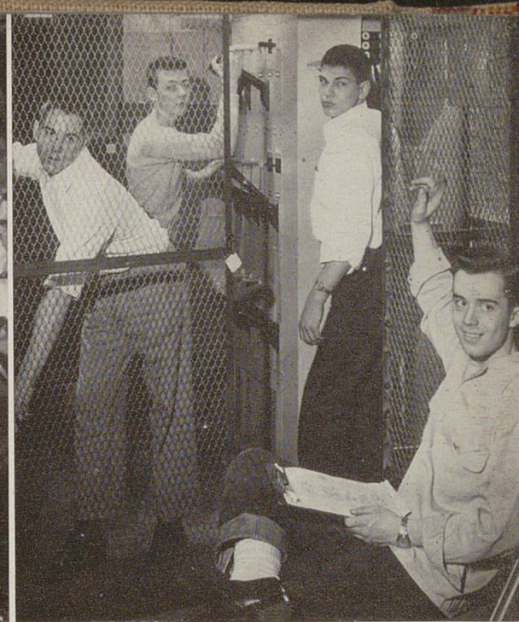

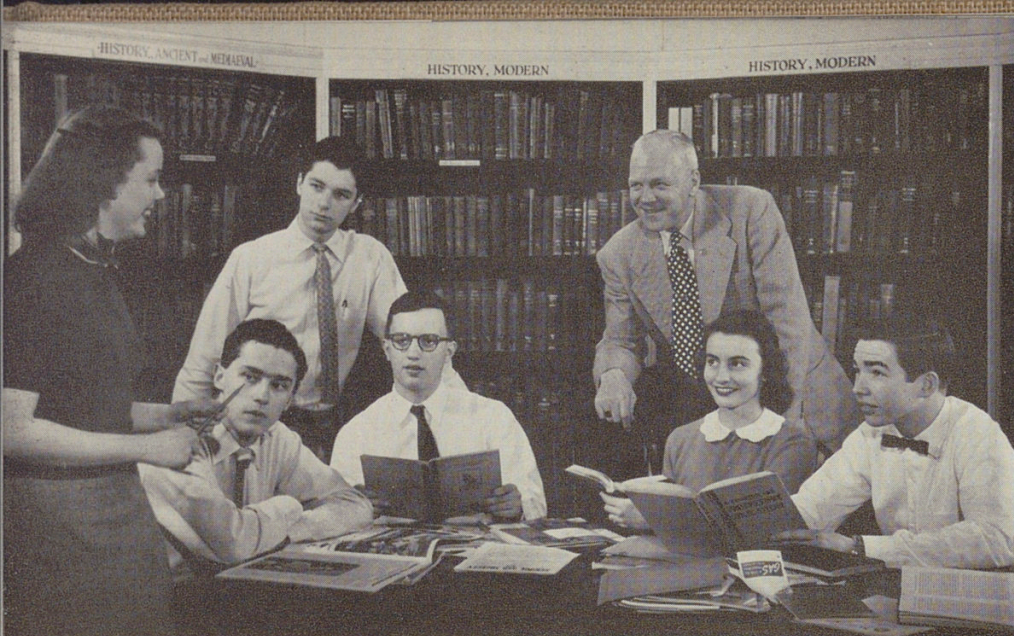
