

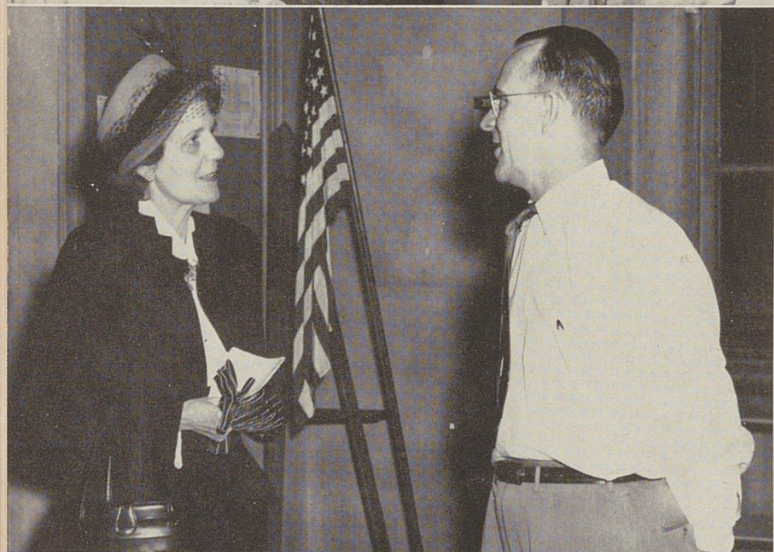
Parents Night
