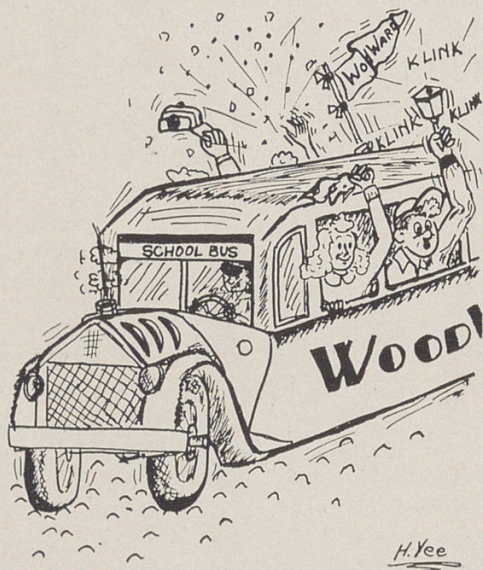


OCTOBER
