Although it has enlarged its physical size, from four to six, sometimes even to ten or twelve pages on special occasions, it is still operating on the general plan of the students in Journalism contributing the lion's share of its material, although other Woodwardites, both students and teachers, have been welcomed contributors.

During the past seven years, The Woodward Bulldog's Staffs have won large numbers of prizes and honors, some city, some state, some national, in editorial and feature writing. The paper itself has been honored many times with awards of many kinds.
