

# STUDENT COUNCIL

The Student Council of Woodward High School is composed of forty members, ten representatives from each grade. The members are nominated by petition and are elected by the members of the grade which they represent. Qualifications for membership include satisfactory grades, good citizenship, and willingness to serve.

The Student Council is divided into two groups, the Executive Committee and the Assembly. The Executive Committee is composed of ten members elected by the members of the council. The purpose of this committee is to conduct such business as needs immediate attention between regular meetings of the Council. The officers of the Executive Committee serve also as officers of the entire Council when it is in session. The Assembly, which is made up of the forty members of the Student Council, meets every month. It hears the reports of the Executive Committee, ratifies any decision the smaller group has made since the last general meeting, and discusses and takes action on all other business.

The Student Council serves Woodward in many ways. It is always ready to aid any school organization which requests its assistance in accomplishing anything for the benefit of the school and its students. One of the most important projects which the Student Council has aided is the War Memorial to Woodward alumni, students, and teachers who lost their lives in World War II. Work toward the erection of a War Memorial has been going on for several years. The Council undertakes any task assigned to it by the school administration. Among the projects which the Student Council has undertaken this year was the sending of representatives to the Institute on Better Human Relations, to the Safety Institute, and to Fountain Square to aid the campaign for the Infantile Paralysis Foundation. Council has also sent many volunteer workers to the Red Cross, distributed cheer to the unfortunate at Christmas, and helped the Woodward Athletic Association by selling sandwiches at the games.

The Student Council is an outgrowth of the wartime activities of Woodward Students. The activities during the war were sponsored by student organizations under the guidance of the Victory Corps and planned by the Student Wartime Council. During this time, classes of First Aid, Home Nursing, Child Care, Camouflage, and an Air Raid Wardens' Committee for the safety of the students during air raid drills and in case of air attacks, were organized. Since the end of the war, many of the wartime activities have been turned over to different departments — for example the First Aid and Home Nursing classes were turned over to the Physiology department. Originally intended to assist in the war effort, the Council developed into the present organization, vitally interested in all school activities.

The officers of the Student Council for the year 1947-48 were: James Peppers, President; Rose Yee, Vice-President; Otto Frees, Secretary. Miss Curry is the faculty advisor.
