

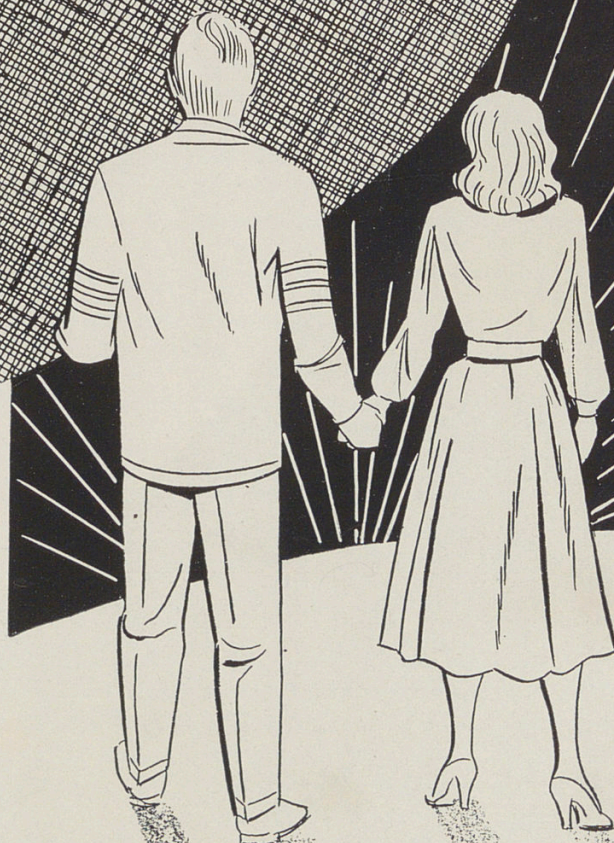

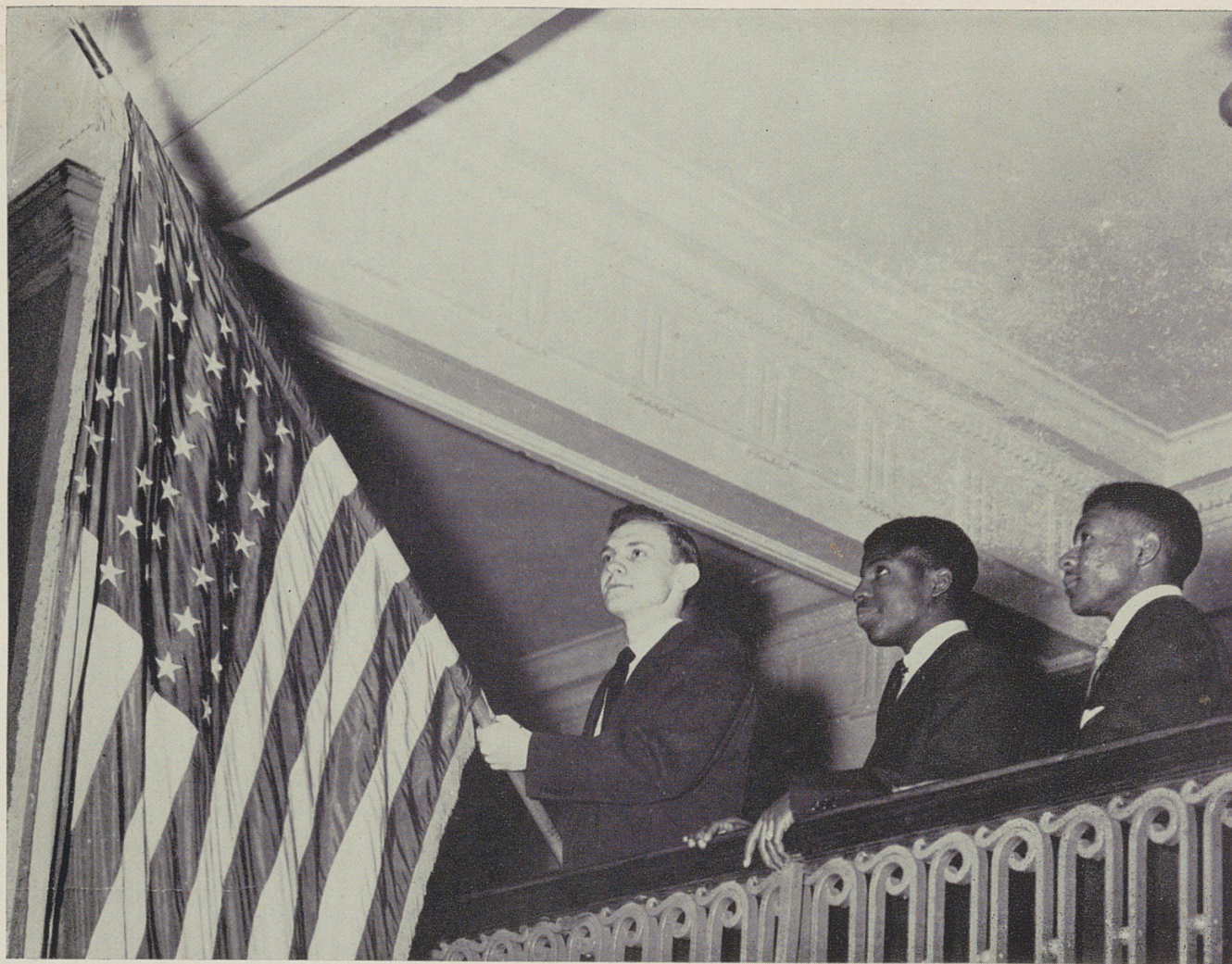

INTRODUCING ...

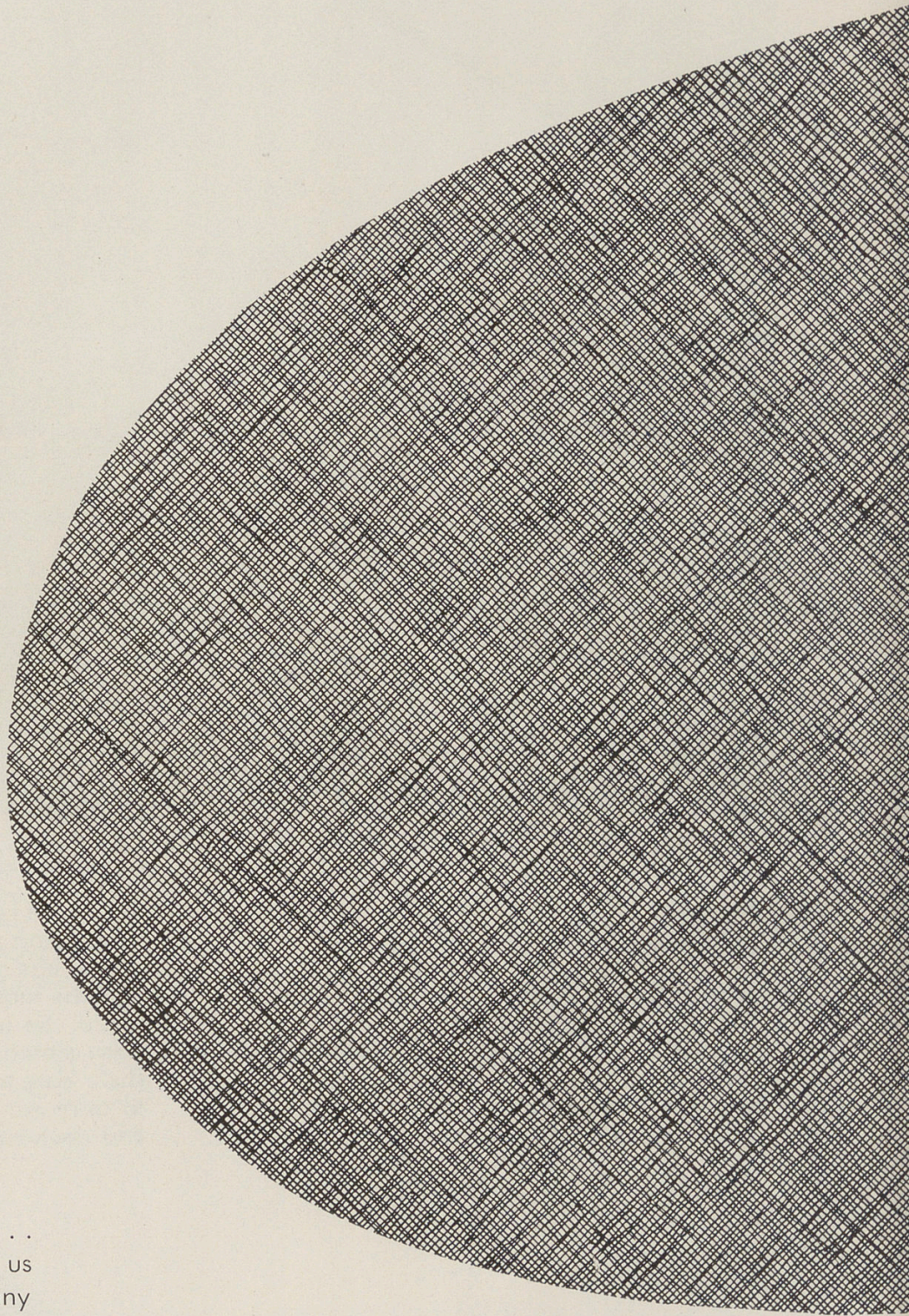

INEZ BRYANT. Interested in Student Council and Big Sister. Inez knows how to throw a real party!

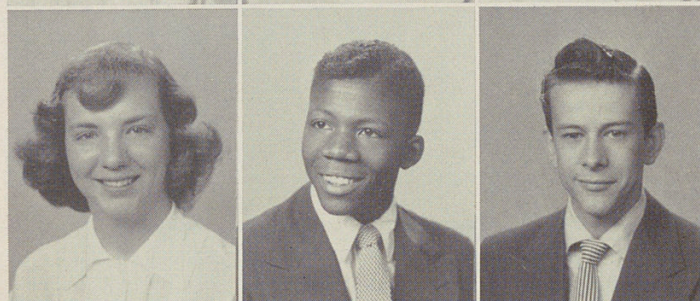

HAROLD FORD. Hal is quite a "jazzbo" on the "sax". Keep your ears tuned for more of the same.

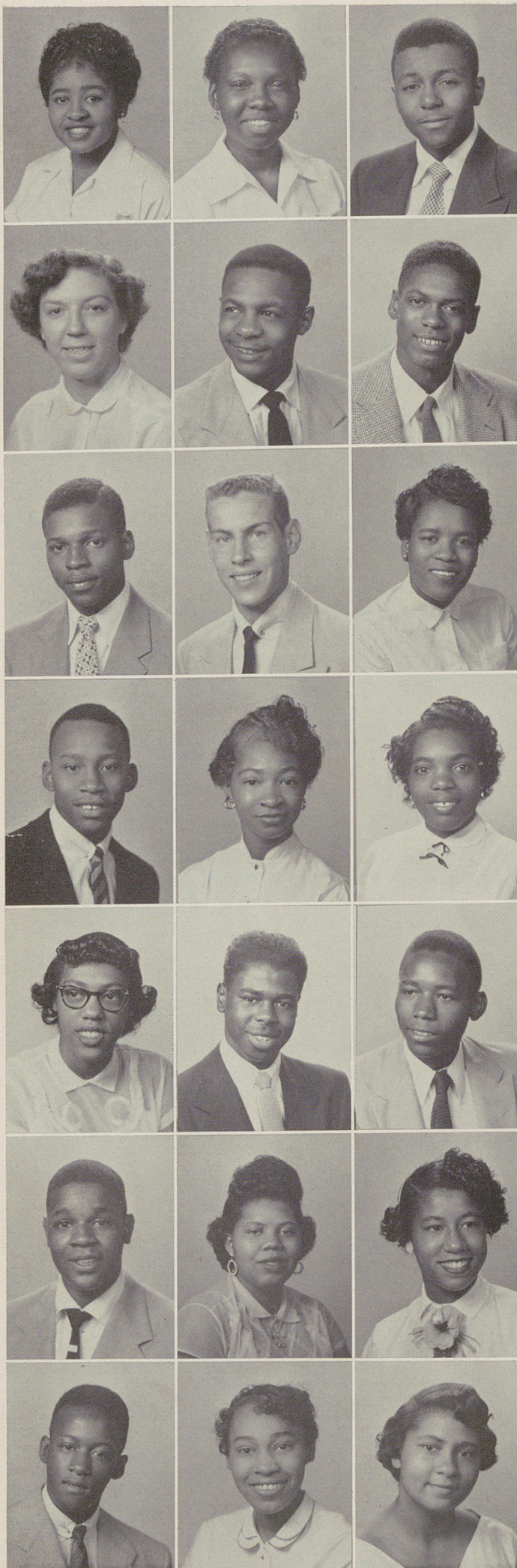

HENRY L. JONES. Our advice to Henry — be a good musician and you'll be richer than the richest.

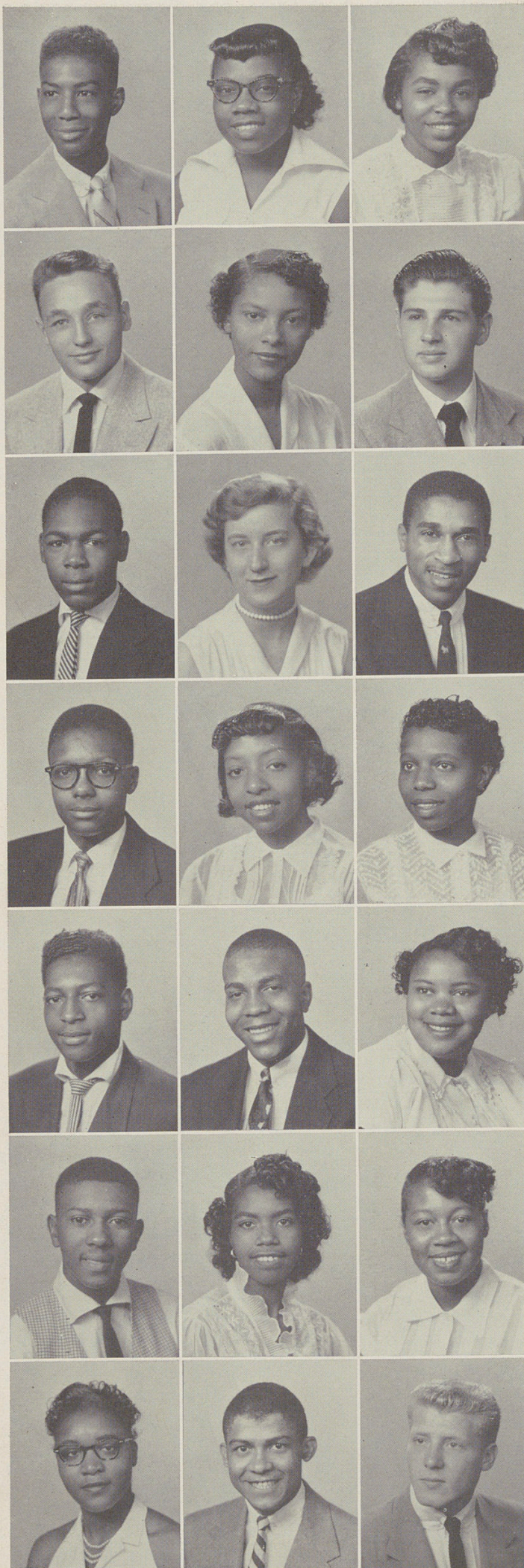

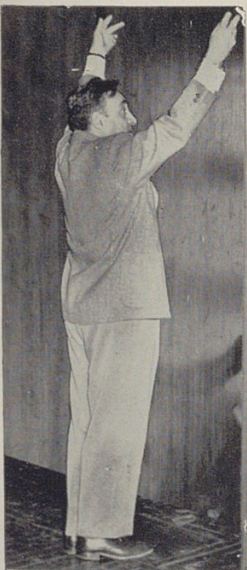


A CAPPELLA SENIOR CHOIR

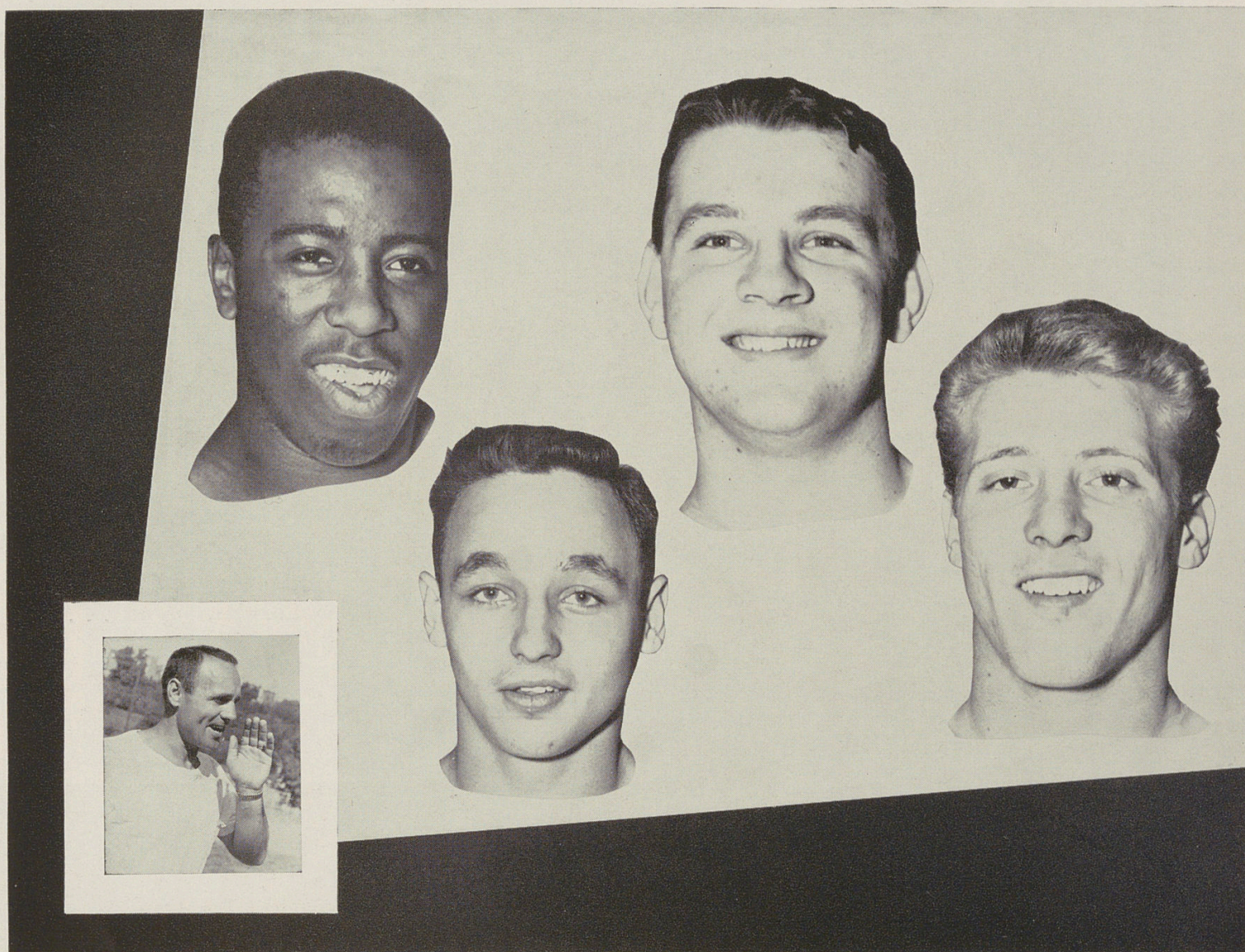

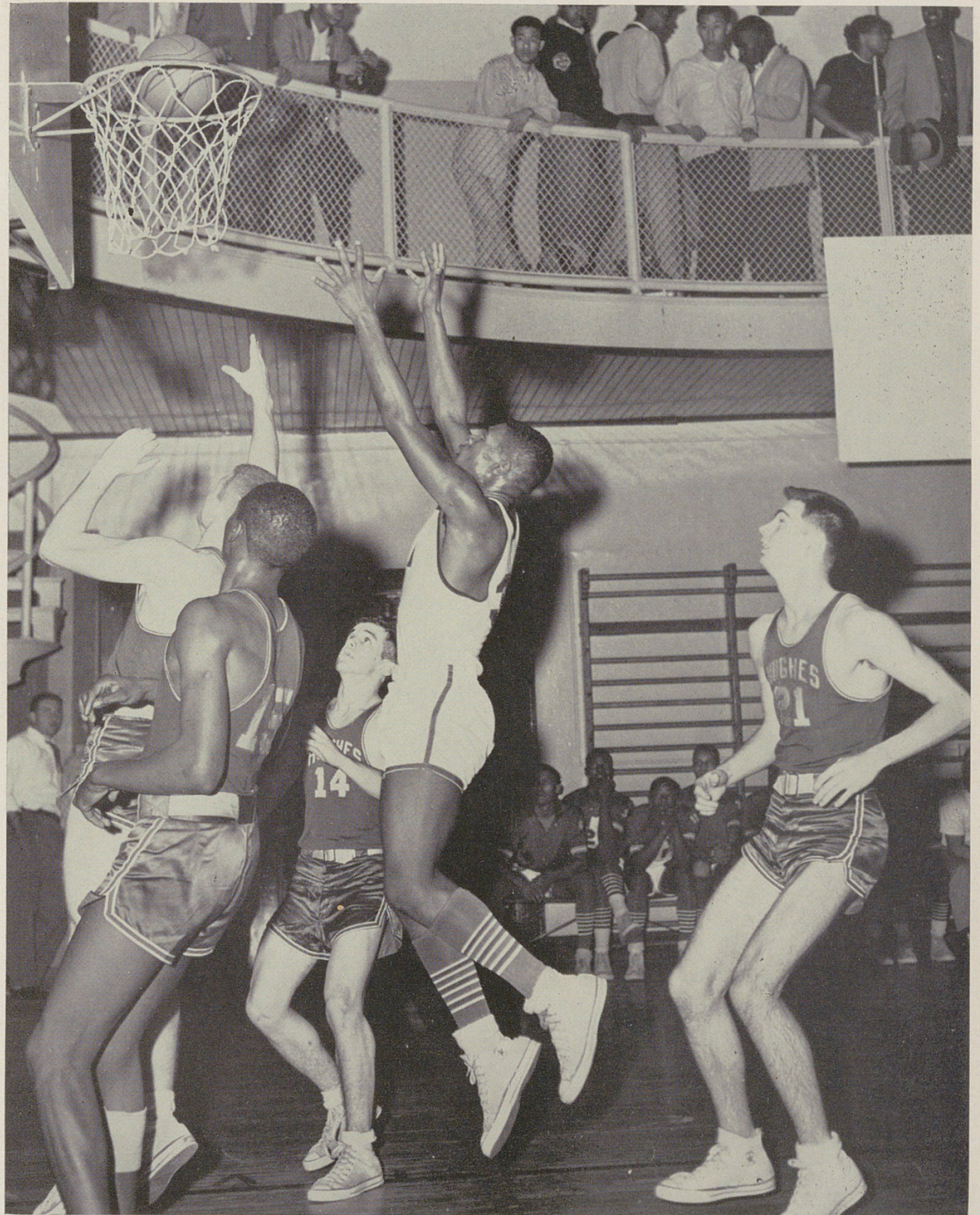

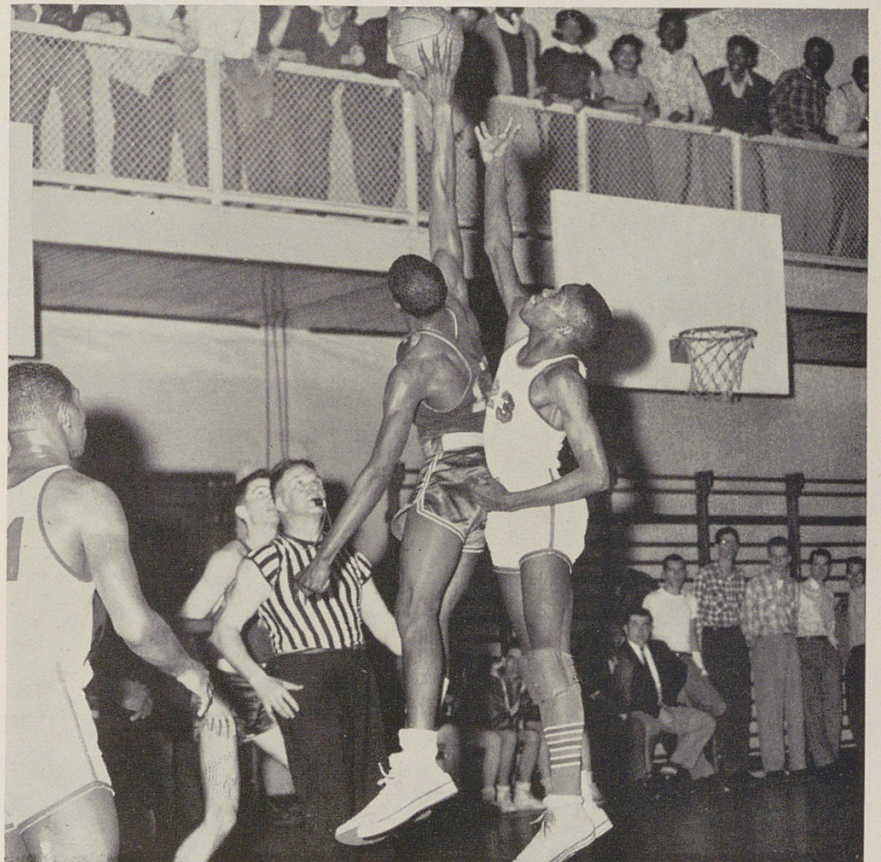

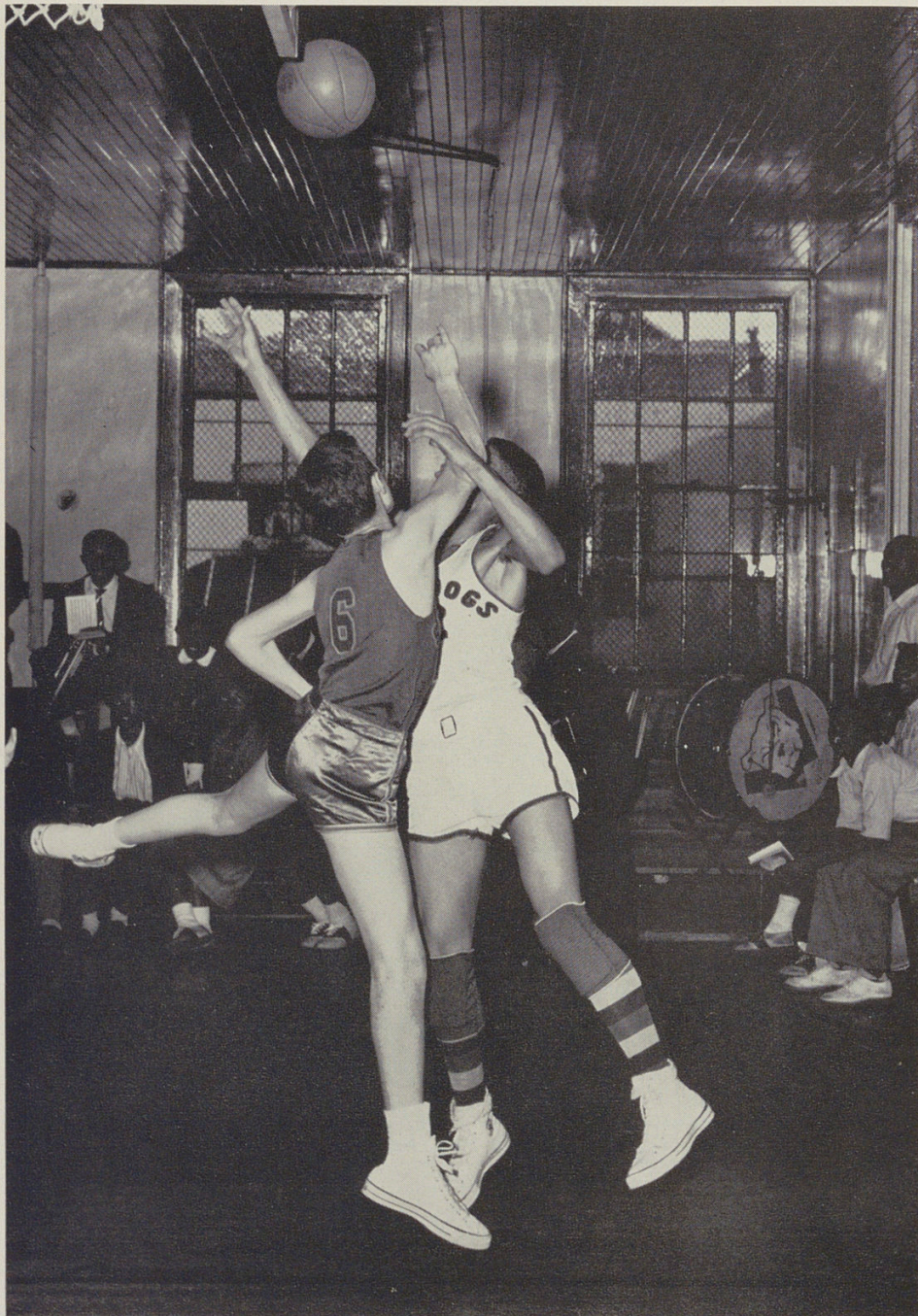

Whenever spring rolls around and the weather becomes warm you can hear that magic sound of wood against horsehide and the familiar cry, "Play Ball."

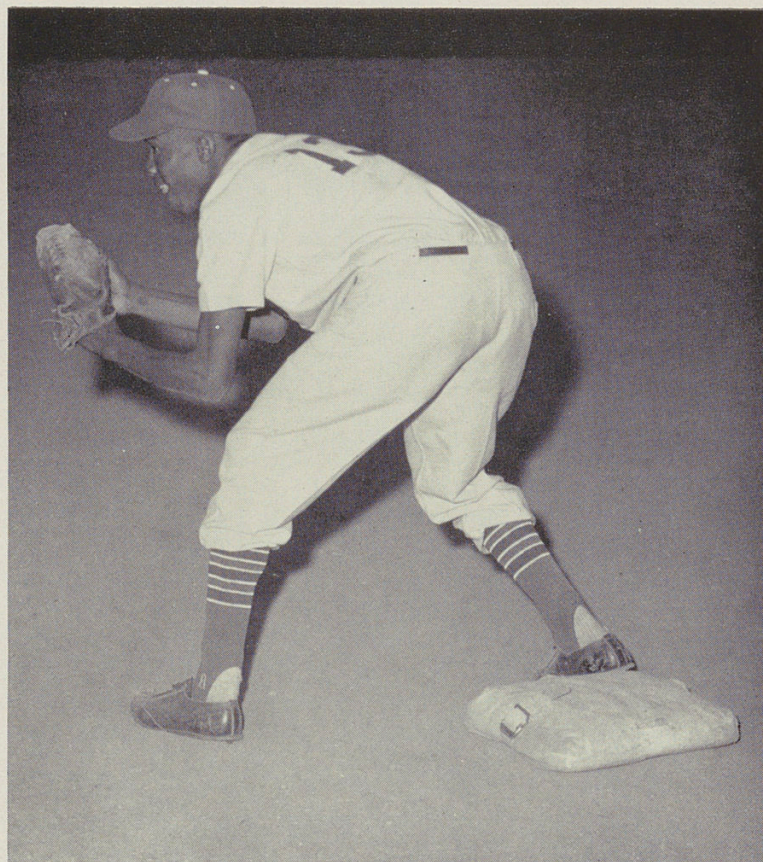

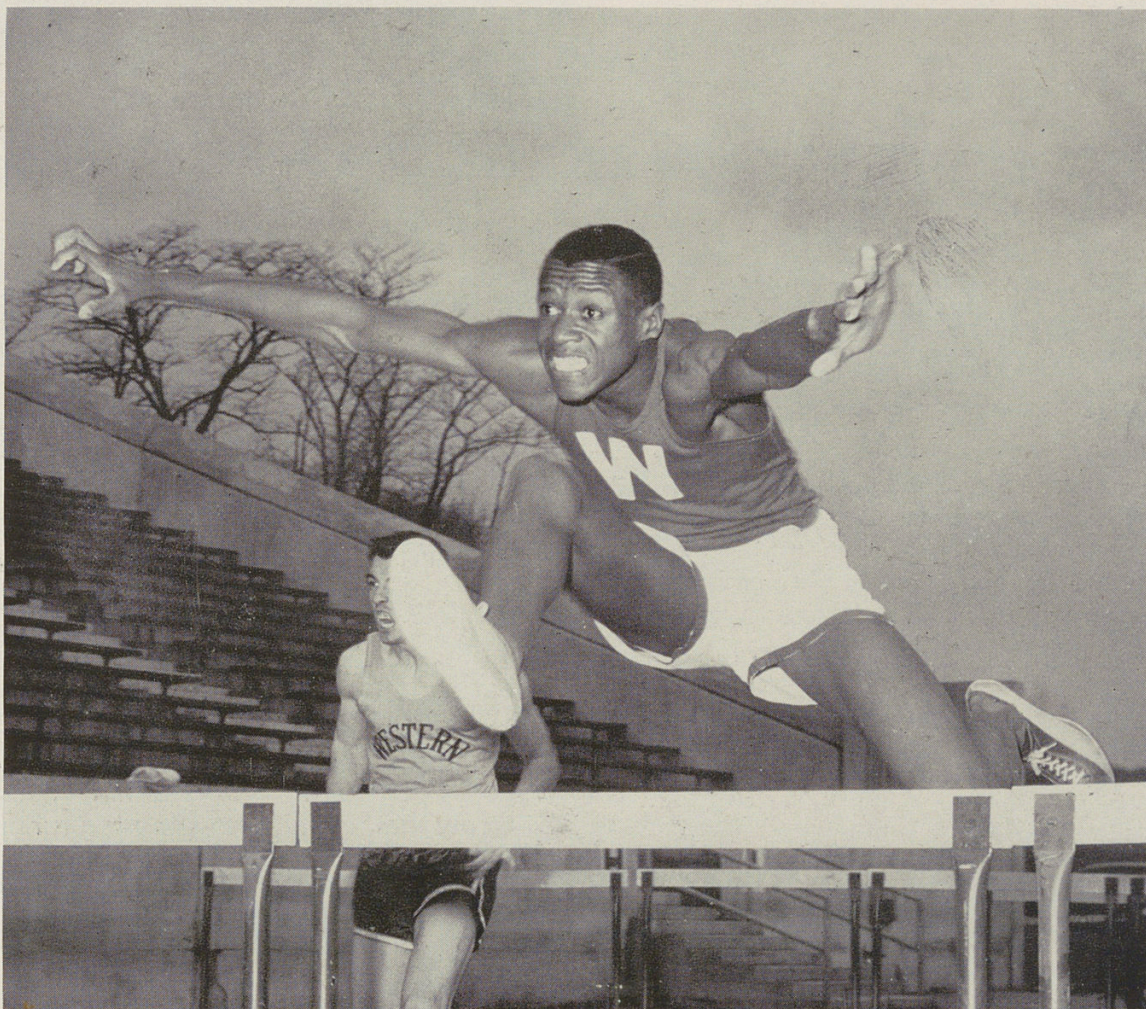


Initial guardian, Sid Broadnax, anxiously awaits throw that will nip the opposing runner at first.

Perhaps you have passed our gymnasium doors some evening and thought the building was falling apart. That was only the track team having their daily workout.

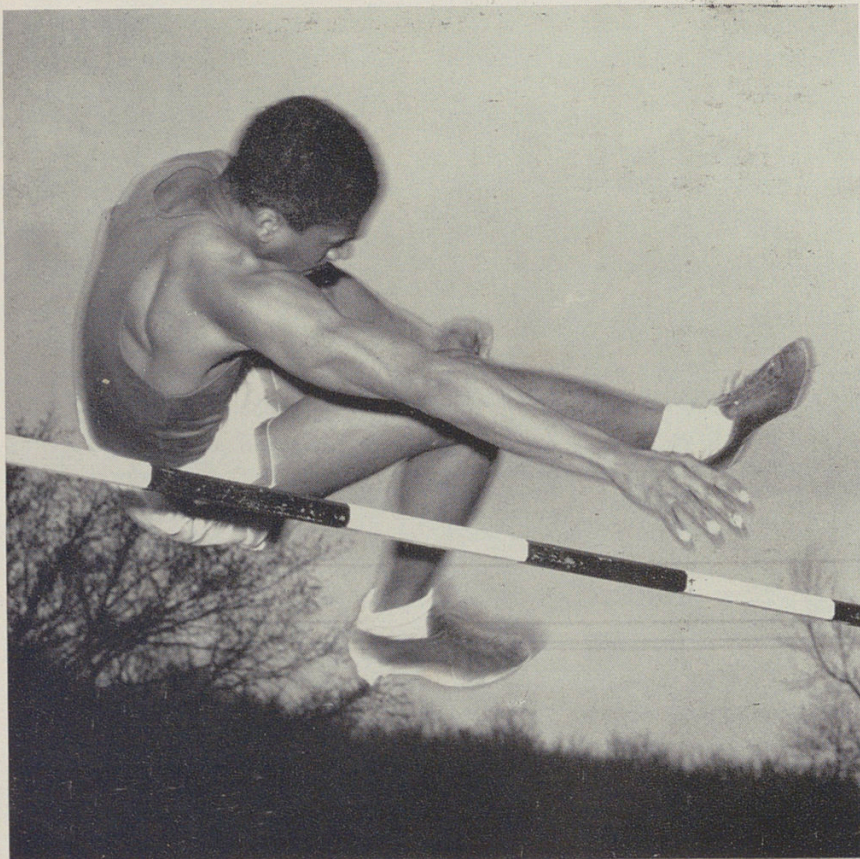

Leon Thornton, Marion Edwards, Lonnie Bell, and Exelon Shaw (who won two events in our last track meet) are the mainstays of the team.

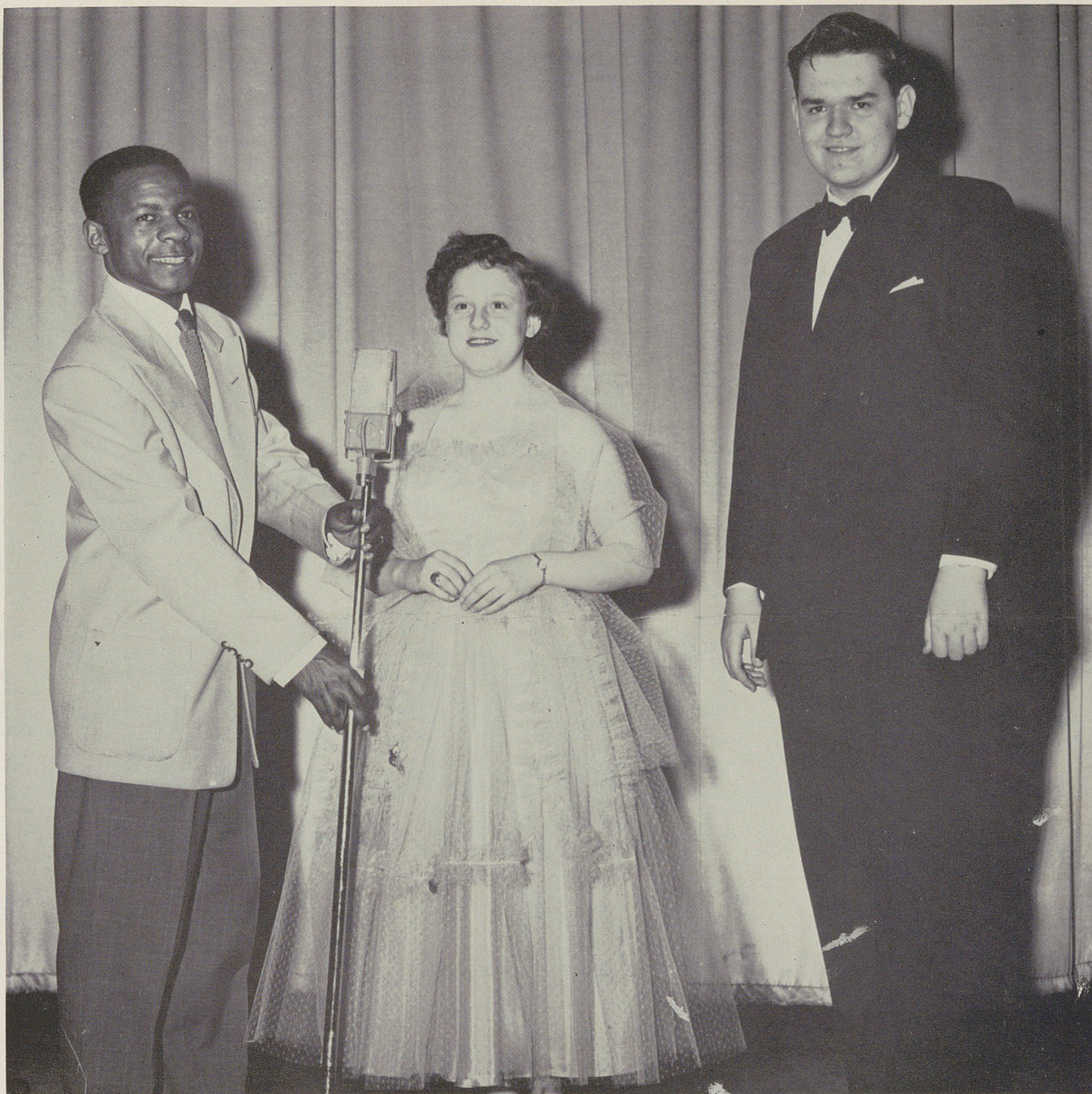
The teams in the Public High School League are evenly balanced this year and with a few breaks our team could win the championship.

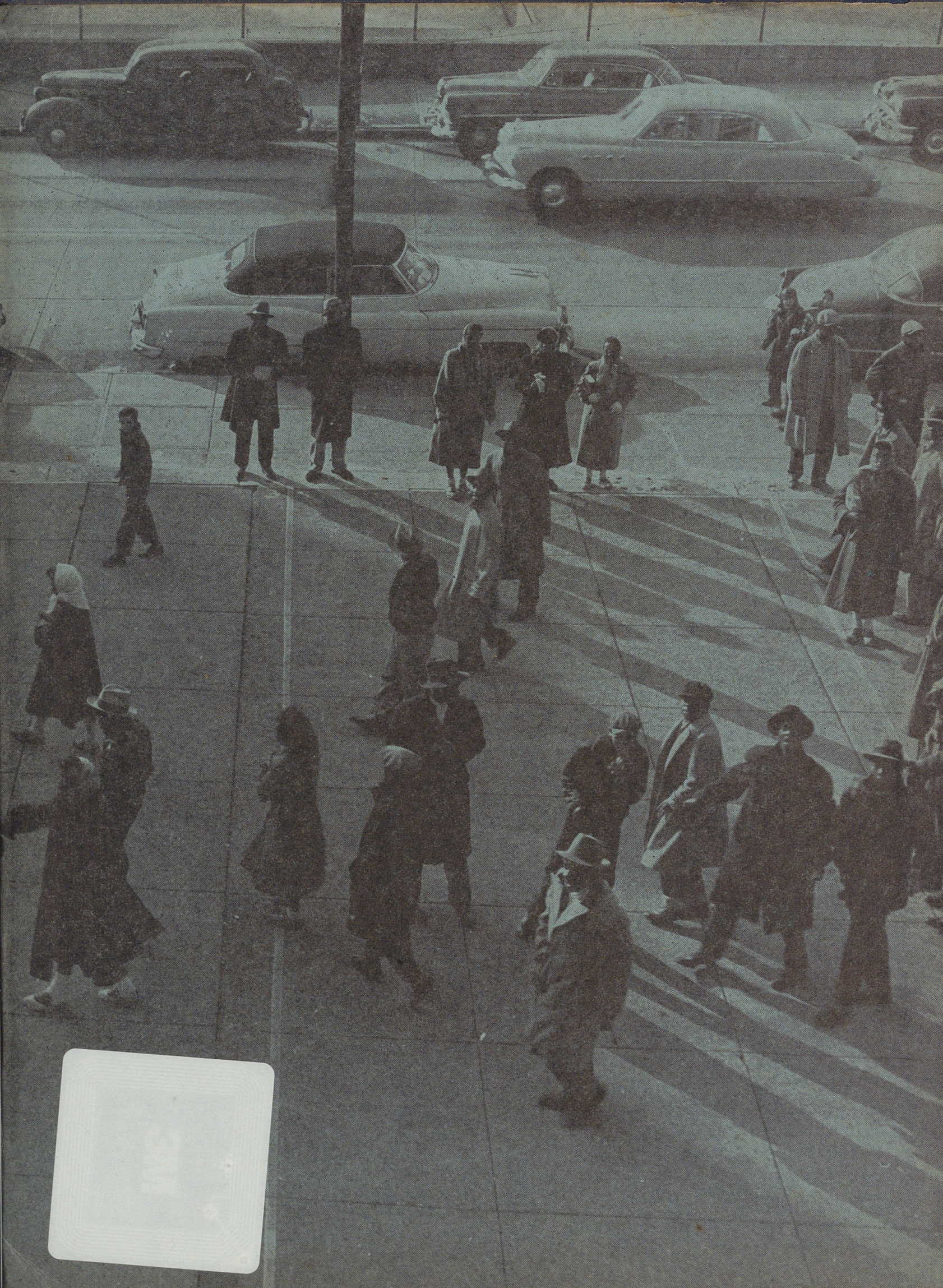
