

The Woodward Color Guard has been in existence since 1893. In May of each year, three boys of high character and scholastic attainment are chosen to share the responsibility of caring for the school's flag throughout their senior year. The ceremony of the giving of the flag by the old Color Guard into the custody of the new occurs on Class Day and again at the commencement exercises.

In accepting the task of protecting the colors, the guard promises to see that the flag is in its proper place each morning at the beginning of school and that it is returned for safekeeping to the office of the assistant principal each evening. The guard also provides for the burning of any American flag within the school that is no longer in condition to be displayed.

To be appointed to the Color Guard is one of the highest honors a Woodward student can attain.
