

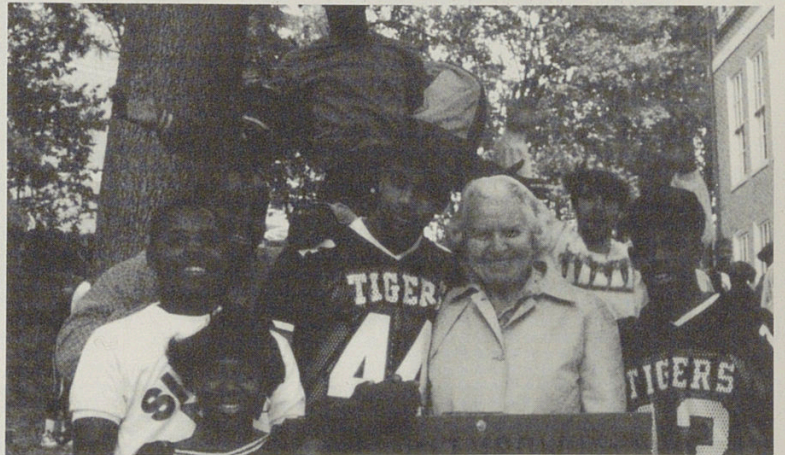
Something's Happening With
