

Junior History

THE members of the present Junior Class organized as Freshmen on November 1, 1900. There were sixty-one names on the class-roll and, of these, fifty-five were present at the first meeting. Mr. B. A. Long, of Pennsylvania, was chosen temporary chairman. A committee was appointed to draft a constitution and by-laws. The constitution and by-laws as presented by this committee were adopted on Monday, November 5th, with a few minor changes. The class then organized permanently and elected the following officers to serve for the first half of the scholastic term: President, Mr. Paul Cassidy, Kentucky; Vice-President, Mr. G. M. Bachelor, Michigan; Secretary, Miss Jennie Jenkins, Ohio; Treasurer, Mr. Fred Lush, Ohio.

This class followed the precedent established some years ago and gave to each of the janitors a large turkey for Thanksgiving. Mr. I. D. Best made the presentation speech, and both Jim and Dick were, of course, very much pleased. Dick said he was "tickled almost to death." He was always being "tickled," as you will probably remember.

On January 22, 1901, the following officers were elected to serve for the remainder of the year, the constitution requiring elections to be held semi-annually: President, Mr. J. E. Middleton, West Virginia; Vice-President, Mr. Orvis Singmaster, Kentucky; Secretary, Miss Jennie Jenkins, Ohio; Treasurer, Mr. Fred Lush, Ohio.

Out of the sixty-one members of the Freshman class of last year, fifty-two returned this year as Juniors, while twenty new names were added to the class-roll.
