A Chain of Memories

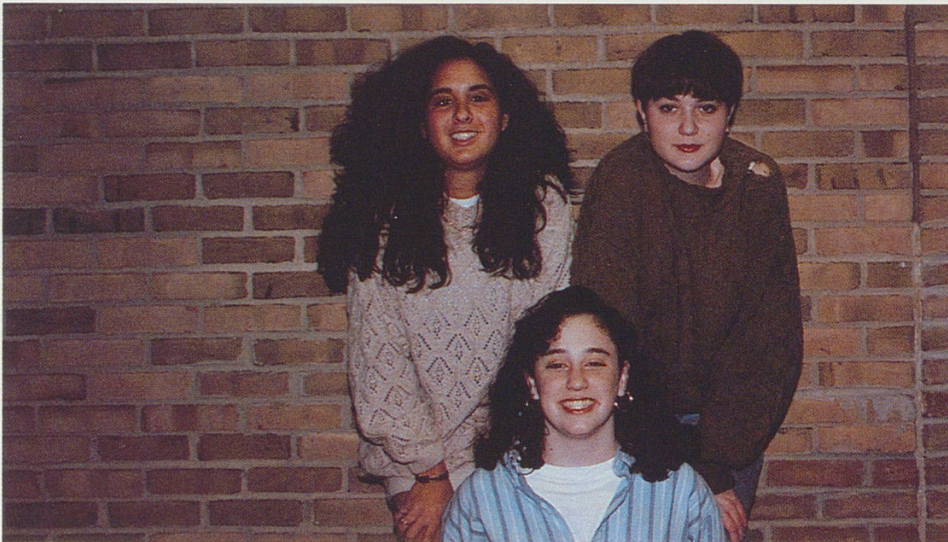
