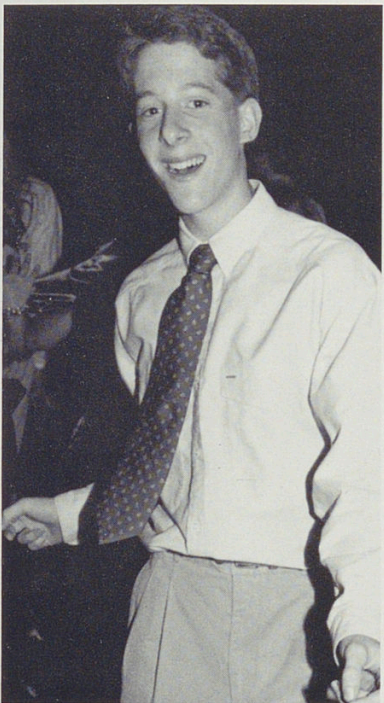


David Levy "gets down" to the sounds of Shanarah, breaking for a moment from the excitement for a smile.
