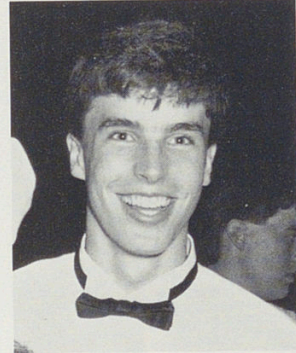
An Evening of Enchantment
