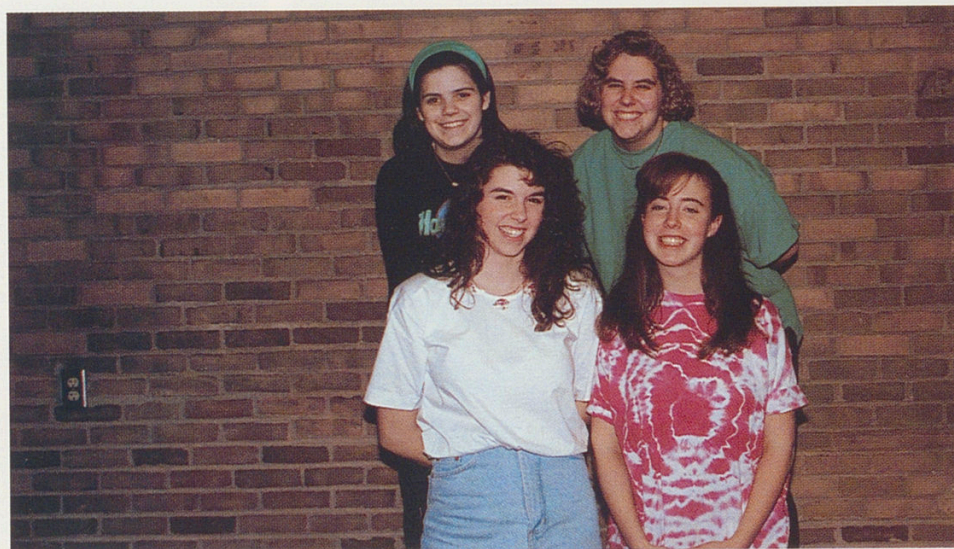
At the beginning of the year, juniors returned with the privileges that they had been waiting for.
