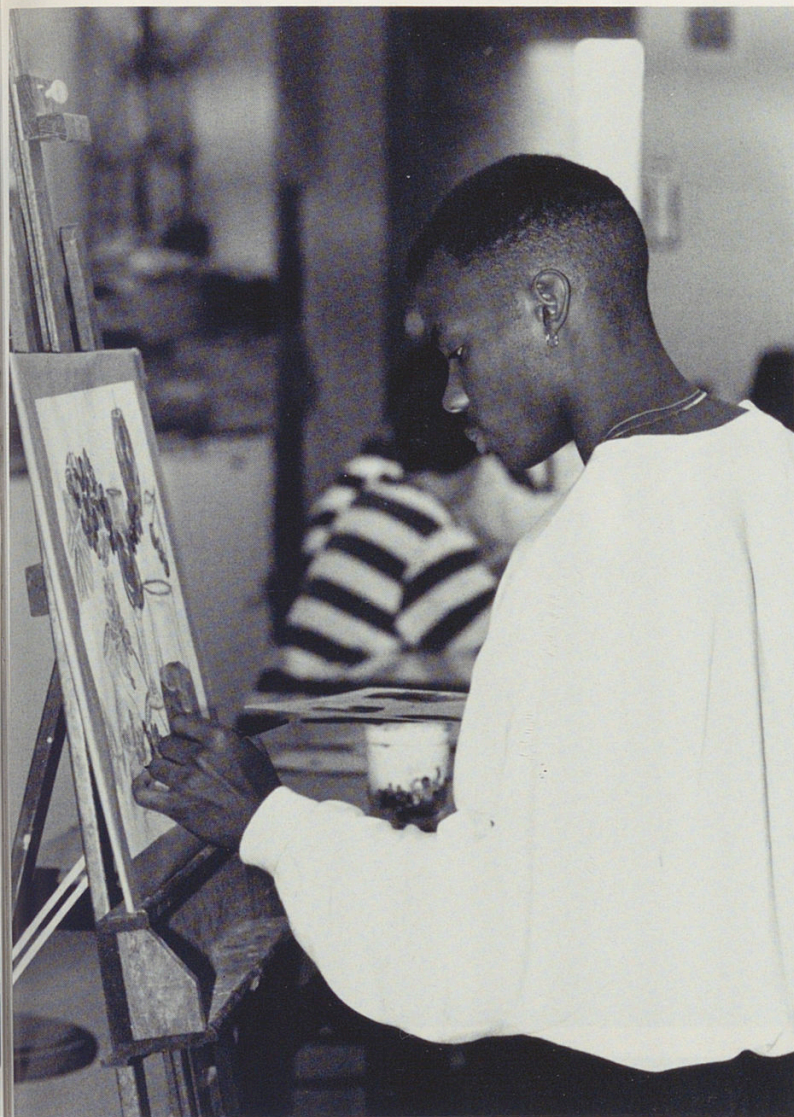

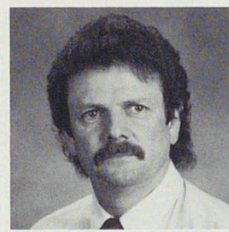

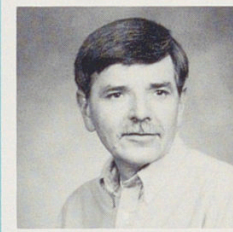
This is a national society which has scholarship possibilities to students who wish to pursue that avenue of study. This year 12 members were part of the Art Honor Society.
