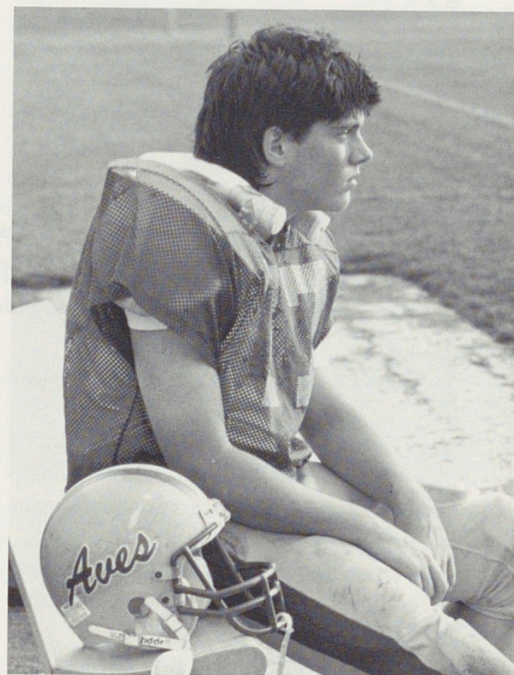




Pass Off! Quarterback Bob Wheeler hands off to his running back while Doug Brock is ready for any Hamilton defensive player.
