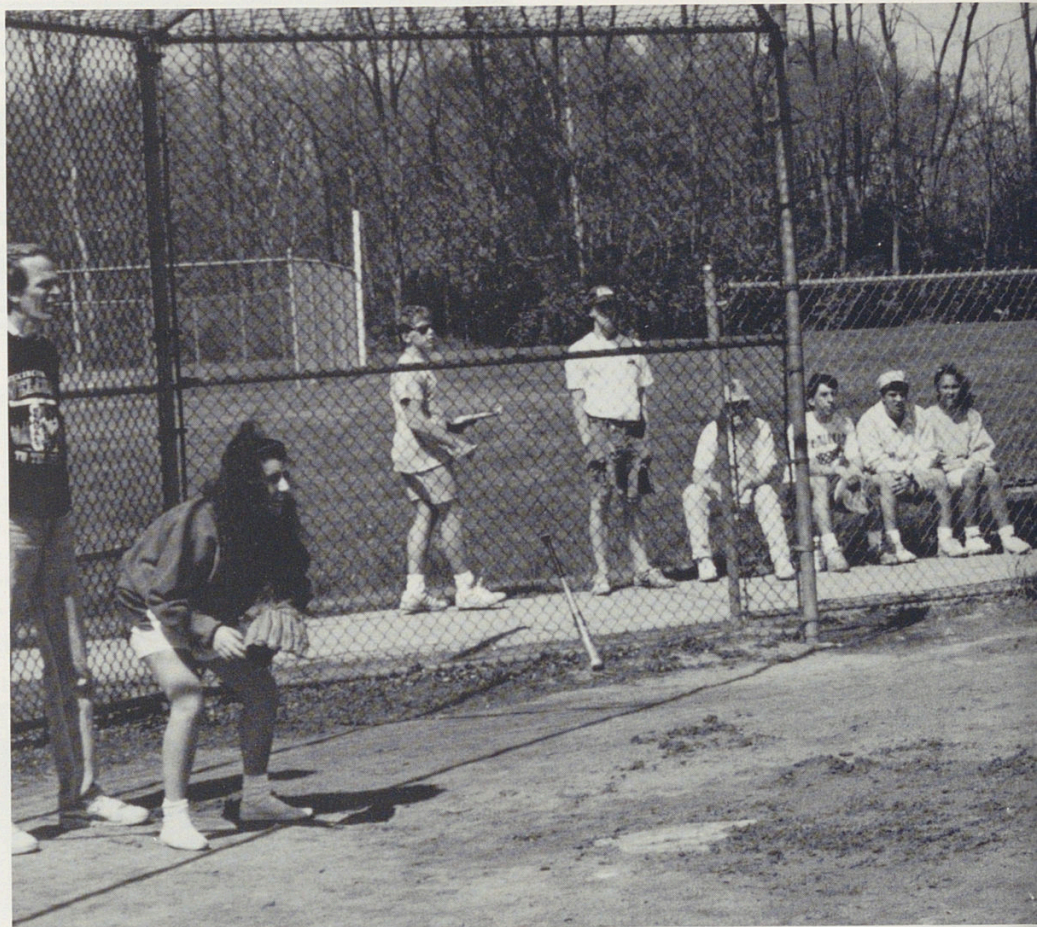
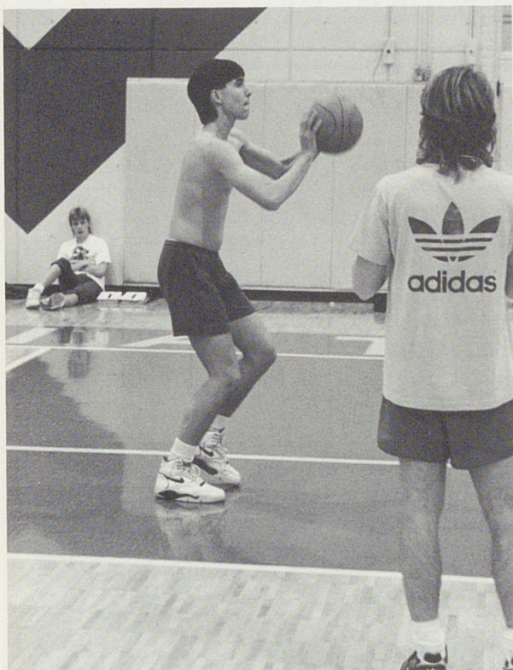


It's a hit! Senior David Moss impresses his teammates, including girlfriend Emily Sexton, with a line drive.
