There were also changes in academic areas. The foreign language department offered Japanese and social studies classes experimented with Hypercard in the computer lab.

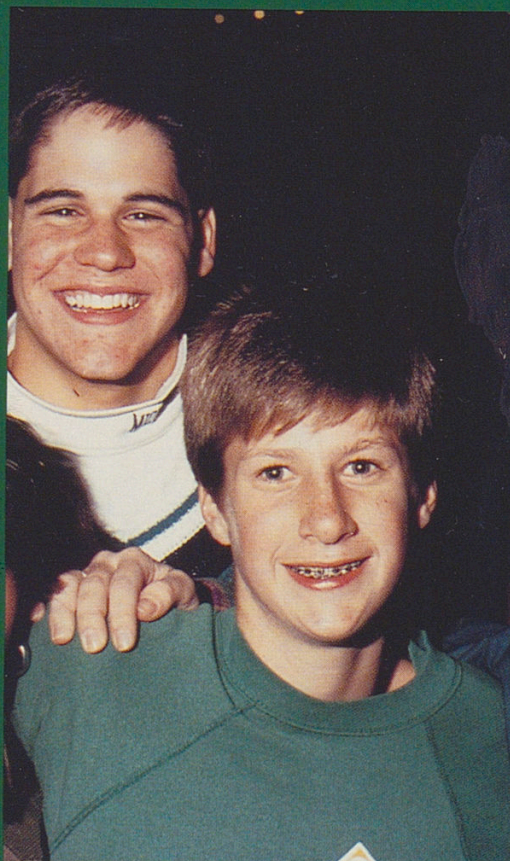
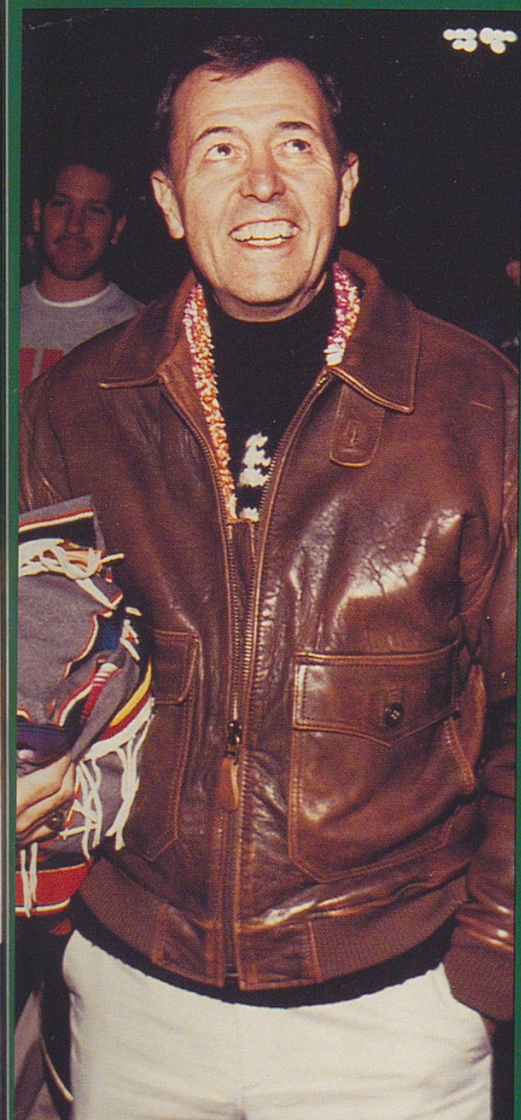
Another change was the retirement of our principal, Tutt Lambert. In his six years as Sycamore's principal, his personable manner helped him become involved in the student body.
