Q. How many hours a week do you work?

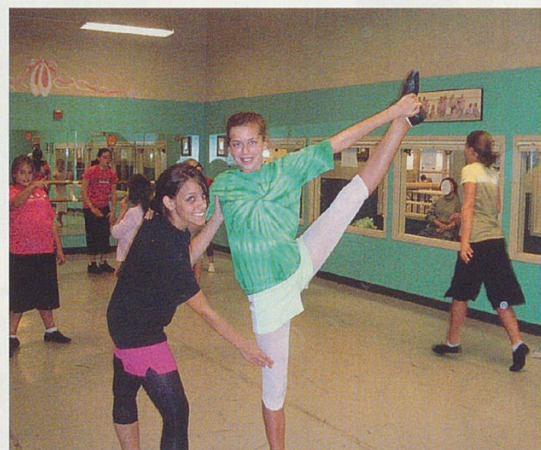
A. During the school year I only work on Sundays, so it's not bad, but during the summer I worked a lot.
