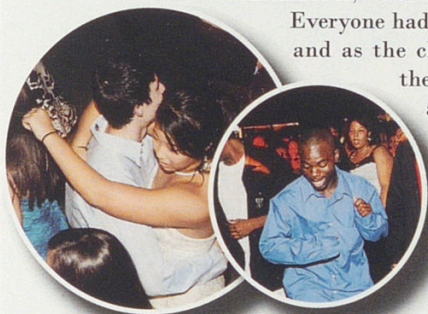

Everyone had an amazing night and as the clock struck 12:00 the students thought about their next dance...



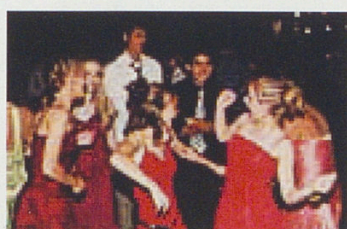
Couples boogie it down. Students always had the dance grooves to show off. They were anywhere from the robot to the new bump and grind.



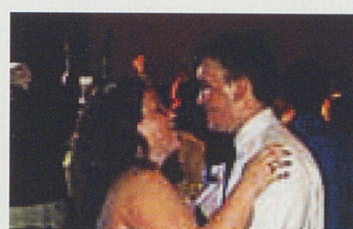

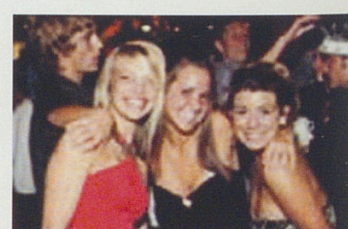

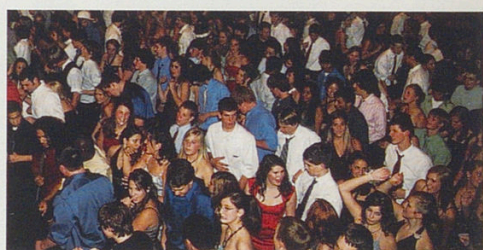

"We had a water polo tournament that day, so a group of us from the team got ready and went to the dance together. It was a lot of fun going with a group of girls!"

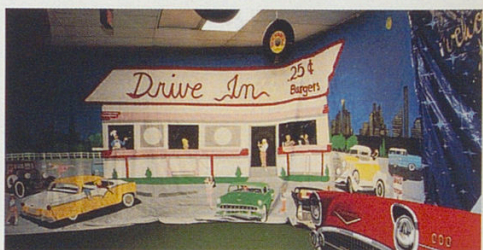
