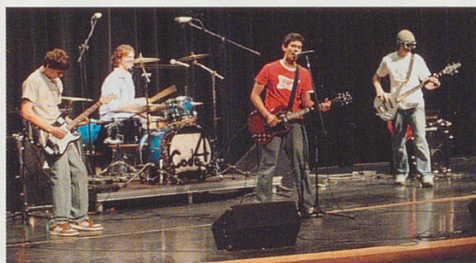
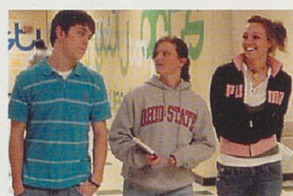
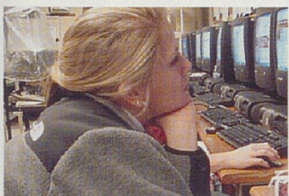

q) Do you think Periscopes deserved to win?

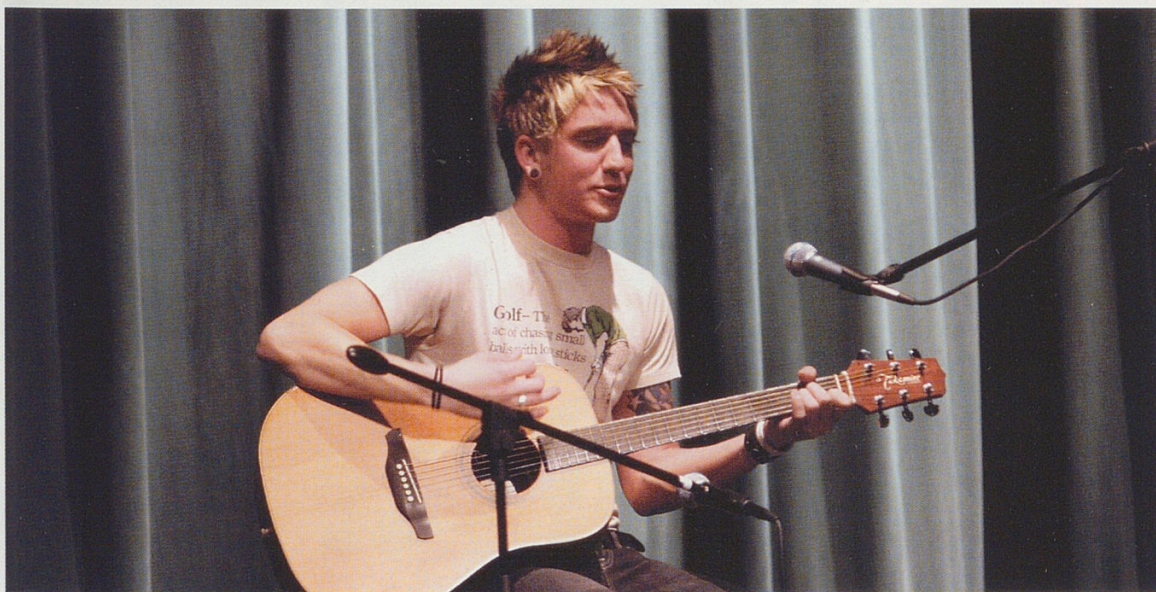
a) Yeah, they played a killer show, they were my favorite in the whole competition.
